WHEREAS by section 6 of "The Cemeteries Ordinance, 1862," it is enacted that whenever a cemetery under the provisions of section 5 of the said Ordinance is established, the Governor may, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, order that, after a time to be mentioned in the order, burials in all or certain of the burial grounds within such place and limits shall be wholly or partially discontinued :

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 29th day of December, 1893, a General Cemetery was, under the provisions of section 5 of the said Ordinance, established in the town of Taggalla, Southern Province, within the limits specified and defined in the schedule thereto :

It is hereby notified that the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, has, by virtue of the powers conferred upon him by section 6 of the said Ordinance, ordered that from and after the First day of June, 1896, all burials in the burial ground in the town of Taggalla, specified and defined in the schedule hereto, shall be wholly discontinued.
