GREETINGS:

WHEREAS it appears to me to be necessary to appoint a Commission for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, Herwald, Baron Soulbury, Governor-General, reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence, ability and fidelity, do in pursuance of the provisions of section 2 of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, No. 17 of 1948, by these presents appoint you to be my Commissioners for the following purposes, that is to say—

- (1) to inquire into and report on the question whether it is necessary or desirable, in the interests of the more efficient administration of justice, that the Supreme Court below or re-constituted as to consist of two or more Divisions each charged with different powers, functions and responsibilities, and
- (2) in the event of the inquiry disclosing that such re-constitution is necessary or desirable—
 - (a) to make recommendations as to the manner of the distribution, between the proposed Divisions of the Supreme Court, of the jurisdiction, powers, functions and responsibilities which are by law vested in or exercisable by the Supreme Court or the Judges thereof, as to the constitution of each of the proposed Divisions of the Supreme Court, and as to such other matters connected with the proposed re-constitution as you may consider appropriate, and
 - (b) to furnish the draft of the legislation necessary to give effect to such recommendations.

And I do hereby appoint you, the said Alan Edward Percival Rose, to be the Chairman of the said Commission:

And I do hereby authorise and empower you, the said Commissioners, to hold all such inquiries and make all such investigations into the aforesaid matters as may appear to you to be necessary, and require you to transmit to me, as early as possible, a report thereon under your hand.

And I do hereby direct that such part of any inquiry relating to the aforesaid matters as you may in your discretion determine shall not be held in public:

And I do hereby require and direct all public officers and other persons, to whom you may apply for assistance or information for the purposes of your inquiries and investigations, to render all such assistance and furnish all such information as may properly be rendered and furnished in that behalf.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, under the Seal of this Island, this Third day of September, One thousand Nine hundred and Fifty-two.
