The Orphanages Ordinance, No. 22 of 1941

REGULATION made by the Minister of Home Affairs under Section 17 of the Orphanages Ordinance, No. 22 of 1941, as amended by Ordinance No. 45 of 1946, and modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, and approved by the Senate and the House of Representatives.

REGULATION

The Orphanages Regulations, 1943, published in *Gazette* No. 9,204 of November 26, 1943, as last amended by regulation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,023 of September 28, 1949, are hereby further amended, as follows :—

(1) in regulation 8, by the substitution, for paragraph (3) of that regulation, of the following new paragraph :—

“(3) The amount to be paid for any year as a maintenance grant under Section 16 of the Ordinance in respect of each orphan or deserted child in a registered orphanage shall be—

- (a) two hundred and forty rupees, if that orphan or deserted child is a female, or is a male under the age of sixteen years on the first day of January of that year ; or
- (b) sixty-five rupees, if that orphan or deserted child is a male who is not under sixteen years of age on such day :

Provided that where any orphan or deserted child has resided in a registered orphanage for any period of less than a year, the maintenance grant payable in respect of that orphan or deserted child shall be the amount payable as maintenance grant under the preceding provisions of this paragraph for a year, reduced by one-twelfth part for each complete calendar month of the period during which such orphan or deserted child was not in residence in the orphanage ; and

(2) by the rescission of regulation 8A.

The amendment made in regulation 8 by the preceding provisions of this regulation shall be deemed for all purposes to have come into force on the first day of January, 1952.
