PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir Joseph West Ridgeway, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by the 19th section of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by the 6th section of Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that when the following events have occurred, viz.:—

(a) The period fixed under section 7 of the said Forest Ordinance No. 10 of 1885, for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and

(b) If such claims have been made, the periods fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and

(c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 of the said last mentioned Ordinance have become vested in the Crown—the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient to constitute the Crown lands specified in the schedule hereto a

reserved forest:

And whereas the period fixed for preferring claims has elapsed, and no claim has been

preferred:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do by his Our Proclamation declare the Crown lands situated in the villages Attangane, Pankulawa, Migahawadiya, Vendakaduwa, Adippola, Andanan-kattuwa, Pahalakola Eliya, and Bandarahena, and specified in the schedule hereto, to be a reserved forest, as from and after 1st June, 1896.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-six.

Railway Probationers' Examination.

OTICE is hereby given that an Examination for the admission of Probationers into the Railway Service will be held at the Colombo School of Agriculture

on June 29 and 30 next, commencing at 11 A.M.

A fee of Rs. 2:50 must be paid by candidates who present themselves for examination if not already in the Railway Service. This fee must be paid in revenue stamps, to be affixed to each application for leave to undergot the examination. undergo the examination.

The examination will consist of-

(1) English Dictation and Handwriting.

(2) Arithmetic.

(3) A General Paper to test the knowledge of the

English Language.

(4) Conversation and interpretation between an Englishman and a native of Ceylon, either Sinhalese or Tamil.

(5) Shorthand-writing. (Special marks will be awarded for a competent knowledge of this subject.)

Candidates who fail to satisfy the Examiners in sections (1) and (2) will be ineligible for the remainder of the examination.

All candidates must apply for certificates of admission to the examination on printed forms, which will be supplied by the Director of Public Instruction. These forms must be filled up and forwarded by the candidates

to the Director of Public Instruction not later than noon of Wednesday, June 10.

Candidates not already in the Railway Service must be between the ages of 18 and 25. They should forward to the Director of Public Instruction, with their application forms

(1) Certificates of the registration of their birth (affidavits will not be accepted), showing them to be between the ages of 18 and 25 on June 29.

(2) Certificates of good character signed by the candidates' Teachers or Schoolmasters by preference, or a Member of the Public Service, Justice of the Peace, or Minister of religion.

When the results of the examination are made known, the successful candidates must present themselves at the office of the Principal Civil Medical Officer for examination as to physical fitness.

The amount of the bond and all other necessary information in respect of plans, specifications, &c., can be ascertained upon application at the office of the Provincial Engineer, Kandy.

The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

Time required for the completion of the work should be stated in the tender.

Persons whose tenders are accepted by Government will be required to bear the expenses of having security bonds prepared for the due performance of their contracts, which bonds will be subject to the approval of the Attorney-General, but may be drawn by the tenderers' own lawyers, and when bonds have been drawn by the tenderers' own lawyers the nearest order of the process. tenderers' own lawyers, the name or stamp of the proctor who drafted the bond should be affixed to the document.

Any alterations made in the tender form should bear the initials of the tenderers, and all tenders containing alterations not bearing the tenderers' initials will be treated as informal and rejected.
