PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir JOSEPH WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

✓ **W**HEREAS by section 8 of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to declare that any road, canal, or river shall be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and that such road, canal, or river shall from the time specified in such Proclamation be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the road leading from Gonawatta ferry to Rájawela, in the Central Province, a principal thoroughfare for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation declare that the road leading from Gonawatta ferry to Rájawela, in the Central Province, shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare from and after the 1st day of January, 1897.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Fifteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-six.

ABSTRACT OF SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 1896.

NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

KURUNEGALA DISTRICT.

Katugampola Hatpattu.—A small area of fields has been sown with paddy.

Dambadeni Hatpattu.—Some fields are being ploughed and some have been partly sown.

Weudawili Hatpattu.—About 2,000 acres have been sown and some fields are yet being ploughed.

Hiriya Hatpattu.—The fields are being ploughed and sown with paddy, and a fairly good crop is anticipated.

Wanni Hatpattu.—Cultivation unsatisfactory; for want of sufficient rain a small area has been cultivated.

Dewamedeni Hatpattu.—A small area has been sown.

Prospects of good harvest unfavourable in Katugampola, Dambadeni, Weudawili, Dewamedeni, and Wanni hatpattus, owing to want of seasonable rain.

Dry grain: in some parts of the district the chenas have been abandoned for want of rain, particularly in Dambadeni hatpattu.

The chenas in Katugampola and Hiriya hatpattus are thriving fairly well.

It rained in Katugampola and Weudawili hatpattus for five and fourteen days respectively; in Dewamedeni hatpattu a few showers fell off and on.

Health: the health of the people has been fairly good. There were a few cases of chest cold, ophthalmia, and ordinary fever.

Cattle: health of cattle fair, except in Katugampola and Dambadeni hatpattus, where cases of murrain are reported.
