The Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Senate and the House of Representatives have, by resolution, under the provisions of Section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Cap. 199), as modified by Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, declared that the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Cap. 199), shall be in force within the area defined in the Schedule hereto.

This Order shall apply within the aforesaid area as from the first day of January, 1953.

SCHEDULE

All that area known as the Hiripitiya-Ganewatta Bazaar area, situated in the Hiripitiya village area in the Kurunegala District of the North-Western Province, and bounded as follows:—

North: By a line drawn from a point 440 yards north of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the Wariyapola-Hiripitiya Public Works Department Road at the 7½ mile post on the said road eastwards parallel to and at a distance of 440 yards from the said centre line of the said road and the centre line of Hiripitiya-Kumbukgete road to a point 440 yards north of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the Hiripitiya-Kumbukgete road at culvert No. 10/5 on the said road.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards crossing the Hiripitiya-Kumbukgete road at culvert No. 10/5 on the said road to a point 440 yards south of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the said culvert.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards parallel to and at a distance of 440 yards from the centre line of the Hiripitiya-Kumbukgete road to a point 100 yards east of the centre line of the Hiripitiya-Wellawa road; thence southwards parallel to and at a distance of 100 yards from the said centre line of the said road, to a point 100 yards east of and on a line perpendicular to the said centre line of the said road at the 12th mile post on the said road; thence westwards crossing the said road at the said mile post to a point 100 yards west of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the said mile post; thence northwards parallel to and at a dis-

tance of 100 yards from the centre line of the said road to a point 440 yards south of the centre line of the Wariyapola-Hiripitiya Public Works Department Road; thence westwards parallel to and at a distance of 440 yards from the centre line of the said road to a point 440 yards south of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the 7½ mile post on the said road.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards crossing Wariyapola-Hiripitiya Public Works Department road at the 7½ mile post on the said road to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

ORDER

With effect from January 1, 1953, the limits of the village area of Hikkaduwa in the Wellaboda pattu in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Wellaboda pattu are hereby altered and redefined by the exclusion from that village area of the portion specified in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule

That portion of the village area of Hikkaduwa in the Wellaboda pattu lying within the administrative limits of the Hikkaduwa Town Council as defined in the Order under sections 2, 5, 6 and 15 of the Town Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, published in *Gazette* No. 10,440 of August 29, 1952, and bounded as follows:—

North: By a line drawn from a point on the centre line of Hikkaduwa-Baddegama road and on a line in prolongation of the western boundary of Maradanagewatta claimed by D. E. Andiris Silva and others eastwards along the centre line of the said road to its junction with Jananandaramaya Temple approach road.

East	By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Jananandaramaya Temple approach road to the northern boundary of the temple premises, thence westwards and southwards along the northern and western boundaries of the said temple premises, thence south-westwards and south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the marshy land to the centre of the approach road to Mr. Rajapakse's house, thence south-eastwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the said approach road to the centre of its junction with Wawlagoda road, thence eastwards along the centre line of Wawlagoda road to the centre of its junction with Wewala-Wawlagoda road.		
South	By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards and south-westwards along the centre line of Wewala-Wawlagoda road to the centre of its junction with Galbokkuwa road, thence south-westwards along the centre line of Galbokkuwa road up to the 61½ mile post on the eastern boundary of the railway reservation.		
West	By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the eastern boundary of the railway reservation to the northern boundary of Wawlagoda road, thence north-eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road to a point on the western boundary of Bogahawatta claimed by E. David and others, thence north-westwards along the western boundaries of the said Bogahawatta claimed by E. David and others and Buriyagewatta alias Kudagoda-welabodawatta claimed by E. Francis and others to the land mark on the south-western corner of lot 10 in P. P. 11,477, thence north-westwards and northwards along the western boundary of the said lot to the iron pillar on the railway reservation at the north-western corner of the said lot, thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of lot 1 in P. P. 11,477, eastwards along the northern boundaries of lots 2, 7, 8 and 9 in P. P. 11,477 to the land mark at the north-eastern corner of lot 9 in P. P. 11,477, thence north-eastwards to the land mark on the south-eastern corner of lot Q 11 in P. P. 9,321, thence northwards and westwards along the eastern and northern boundaries of the said lot Q 11, thence through Bogahawatta claimed by Mrs. Sera Jayawardena to the eastern boundary of Bogahawatta claimed by Mrs. N. Weerasingha, thence along the said eastern boundary to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.
