## RULE

The rules relating to Money Orders and Postal Orders, published in *Gazette* No. 6,408 of October 28, 1910, as amended by any subsequent rule, are hereby further amended, with effect from January 1, 1953, as follows:—

- (1) in rules 11, 12, 13 and 15, by the substitution, for the figures and word "10 cents", wherever those figures and word occur collectively therein, of the figures and word "20 cents"; and
- (2) by the insertion, immediately after rule 10, of the following new rule:—  
"10A. (1) If a claim for the payment of the amount of an Inland Money Order is

not made within six months from the last day of the month of issue of the order, such order shall cease to be valid:

Provided, however, that if a claim for the payment of the amount of any such order is made within six months of the date on which the order ceased to be valid, the amount of such order shall, notwithstanding the provisions of section 45 (2) of the Post Office Ordinance, be paid, subject to the payment of commission equivalent to the commission paid in respect of that order at the time of its issue.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 45 (2) of the Post Office Ordinance, if a claim is made for the payment of the amount of an Inland Money Order at any time during the period commencing one year from the last day of the month of issue of the order and ending at the termination of the second year from such day, the Postmaster-General may entertain such claim if he is satisfied that the delay in making the claim was due to exceptional circumstances.

(3) Where any claim in respect of an Inland Money Order referred to in paragraph (2) is allowed, the payment of the amount of the order shall be subject to the payment of commission of 5 per centum of the face value of the order or twenty cents, whichever is higher."

### The Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950

#### Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, read with section 12 (1) (b), I, Arthur Rajakumar Ratnavale, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Matale District, do, by this order:—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date all my previous price orders in respect of maximum wholesale and retail prices of sugar within the Revenue District of Matale,
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto increased by the price specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule to be the maximum wholesale price per cwt. gross and the maximum retail price per pound respectively above which the articles of the description and grade in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the respective places and areas in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto,

- (3) direct that the provisions of this Order shall apply to the description and grade of sugar mentioned in the First Schedule hereto ;
- (4) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
- any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale or any sale in a quantity of one hundred-weight gross or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - any sale of any quantity of sugar less than one hundredweight gross for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
  - the maximum prices fixed by this Order for sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is sold wholesale by one hundredweight gross or more at a time shall include the container in which the sugar is sold ;
  - " sugar " shall exclude all forms of jaggery.
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quantity ;
- (6) direct that every trader who at any premises within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, exposes for sale sugar of any description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade ;
- (7) direct that every trader who within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, sells any sugar of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall on demand, give to the purchaser of that article, a receipt on which there shall be set out—
- the date of sale,
  - the quantity of sugar sold by weight,
  - the description and grade of sugar sold,
  - the price for the quantity of sugar sold,
  - and the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

- (vi) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells any sugar by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any sugar by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of the sale.
  - (b) the quantity, the description and grade of the sugar sold (by weight).
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold; and
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

The Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, read with section 12 (1) (b) of that Act, I, Cyril Joseph Serasinghe, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Mannar District, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated October 26, 1943 published in *Gazette* No. 9,191 of November 5, 1943, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed for sale of sugar in the first schedule hereto;
- (ii) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight (gross) and maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade specified in column 2 of the schedule hereto; shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the schedule hereto;
- (iii) direct for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale or any sale of sugar in a quantity of one hundredweight (gross) or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar less than one hundredweight (gross) for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
  - (c) "sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery;
- (iv) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order no person shall sell sugar which is adulterated with any other article;
- (v) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader who has any sugar in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices for sugar fixed by this Order in that area;
- (vi) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells any sugar by wholesale or by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of sale;
  - (b) the quantity of sugar sold (by weight);
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold; and
  - (d) the nature of transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

### Report of the Auditor-General on the Accounts of the Agricultural and Industrial Credit Corporation of Ceylon for the Year ended September 30, 1951

My report on the accounts for the year ended September 30, 1951, is furnished as required by Section 46 (2) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1943. The Balance Sheet, duly certified in accordance with Section 46 (i) of the Ordinance, and the Profit and Loss Account are also submitted. Except where specific reference is made in this report, the items in the Balance Sheet and in the Profit and Loss Account do not call for comment.

#### BALANCE SHEET : LIABILITIES

2. *Treasury Advances—Rs. 19,807,000.*—This sum represents the total amount outstanding on September 30, 1951, on account of sums advanced by the Treasury in terms of Section 22 of the Ordinance towards the Funds of the Corporation. These amounts were verified by reference to Treasury Books and are within the limit of 30 million rupees prescribed by the Agricultural and Industrial Credit Corporation (Amendment) Act, No. 22 of 1950.

3. *Reserve Fund—Rs. 256,740.*—A sum of Rs. 90,946—representing 75 per cent. of the profits for 1950–51 after providing a sum of Rs. 106,125·80 for Income Tax and Profits Tax was added to this fund by a resolution of the Board of Directors passed at the meeting held on November 26, 1951. With the sum of Rs. 165,795 carried forward from the previous year the total to the credit of the Fund stood at Rs. 256,740. It was decided by a resolution of the Board of Directors dated November 26, 1951, that the Reserve Fund moneys should be invested in long-term Government Loans.

4. *Contingencies Fund—Rs. 10,000.*—A sum of Rs. 10,000 was transferred from the 1950–51 surplus to a Contingencies Fund by a resolution of the Board of Directors dated November 26, 1951.

5. *Unexpended balances on Loan Applications—Rs. 113,426·85.*—This sum represents the unexpended portion of the deposits made by the applicants for loans for the purpose of paying valuator's fees and legal adviser's fees and it relates to applications which had not been finally disposed of by the end of the year of account.

6. *Other Creditors—Rs. 813·65.*—This sum includes Rs. 237·01 which is payable to the Chief Accountant, Railway, and also Rs. 432·52 representing various amounts in Suspense Account awaiting settlement.

7. *Provision for Taxation—Rs. 170,000.*—This is made up of Rs. 59,874·20 for the previous year's provision and two sums of Rs. 106,125·80 and Rs. 4,000 reserved out of the profits of the year 1950–51.

8. *Profit and Loss Account—Rs. 155,806·02.*—The accumulated surplus up to September 30, 1950, amounted to Rs. 139,491·28. A sum of Rs. 4,000 was set apart for meeting additional Taxation due to increase in Rates up to September 30, 1950, thus leaving a balance of Rs. 135,491·28. After taking into account the profits of Rs. 227,385·54 for the year 1950–51 and deducting Rs. 106,125·80 provided for Tax liability and Rs. 90,945 and Rs. 10,000 transferred to the Reserve Fund and "Contingencies Fund" respectively, the accumulated surplus at the end of the year stood at Rs. 155,806·02.

#### ASSETS

9. *Loans on Mortgages—Rs. 19,734,003·74.*—This sum represents the total amount outstanding on September 30, 1951, on account of the loans granted by the Corporation. It was seen that the loans granted and the rates of interest charged were in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance. The recoveries of instalments of loans and interest are proceeding satisfactorily except in a few cases where the Board of Directors have taken necessary action.

10. *Arrears of Interest—Rs. 51,393·08.*—This represents the amount of interest due but not paid up to September 30, 1951.

11. *Sundry Debtors—Rs. 22,479·26.*—Included under this head are :—

*Authorised Business of the Corporation:*

The Corporation is authorised to transact several kinds of business specified in section 60 of the Ordinance. The main business transacted is to grant loans to any person or body corporate for the following purposes:—

- (1) the purchase or lease, or the cultivation, development or improvement of any land used or to be used for any purpose of agriculture or for the exploitation of the mineral resources thereof;
- (2) the purchase or lease, or the construction, repair or renewal of any building, factory, mill, mine, machinery or equipment used or to be used in connection with any agricultural or industrial undertaking;
- (3) the manufacture or preparation of any agricultural or industrial product or commodity for sale in the market;
- (4) any purpose incidental, accessory or ancillary to any purpose mentioned in any of the foregoing sub-paragraphs;
- (5) the liquidation or any debt already incurred for any purpose mentioned in any of the foregoing sub-paragraphs.

Loans are granted on a primary mortgage of property the title to which should be acceptable to the Board. Undivided properties are not accepted as security unless all the co-owners become parties to the application.

The minimum sum that may be granted as a loan to any person is Rs. 500.

The rates of interest levied in terms of rule 2 of the Rules framed under section 85 (1) (k) of the Ordinance are as follows:—

*Funds:*

*Working Expenses.*—The working expenses during the year under review amounted to Rs. 113,527·38 and were met from the Corporation's funds.

*Loans:*

In terms of section 22 (1) of the Ordinance as amended by Act No. 22 of 1950, the Corporation is entitled to borrow from the Consolidated Fund sums not exceeding Rupees 30 million in the aggregate. During the period under review a sum of Rs. 5,690,000 was borrowed to finance the issue of loans.

During the period October 1, 1950 to September 30, 1951, 165 loans amounting to Rs. 9,455,133·36 were granted—vide Appendix "D" which indicates the number of loans and the amounts granted in the different categories.

In order to ensure that the moneys lent are utilized by borrowers for the approved purposes, special inspections are carried out both before and after disbursement of loans.

*Repayments.*—Twenty-five loans were repaid in full during the year and the respective mortgage bonds were duly cancelled and discharged.

*Interest paid to the Treasury on advances from the Consolidated Fund.*—A sum of Rs. 602,024·32 was paid to the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury on advances made to the Corporation out of the Consolidated Fund. The full amount borrowed as at the close of the financial year was Rs. 20,457,000.

*Interest on loans granted.*—Interest during the year on loans granted amounted to Rs. 894,124·69.

*Debentures.*—Though the Corporation is authorised to raise money by the issue of debentures not exceeding Rupees 50 million in the aggregate in terms of section 24 (1) of the Ordinance no issue has yet been made in view of the fact that funds are obtained from the Consolidated Fund.

*Profits.*—The net profit for the year ended September 30, 1951, was Rs. 227,385·54.

*Taxation.*—The Corporation's income is subject to Income and Profits Taxes. Rs. 106,125·80 has been provided for Income Tax and Profits Tax liability for the year under review. The total provisional liability from the inception of the Corporation amounts to Rs. 319,164·56.

*Reserve Fund.*—75 per cent. of the net profit for the year ended September 30, 1951, after providing for taxation, has been transferred to the Reserve Fund which now stands at Rs. 256,740. The Reserve Fund moneys are invested in long-term Government loans.

*Contingencies Fund.*—It was decided to establish a Contingencies Fund. A sum of Rs. 10,000 out of the year's profit was transferred to this Fund.

Two main difficulties are encountered in granting loans to applicants recommended by the Debt Conciliation Board. Firstly, the experience of our lawyers is that title of these applicants, at the time their applications are forwarded, is invariably unsatisfactory. In the result both time and expense are involved in obtaining necessary documents and in remedying defects in title. Secondly, the properties tendered as security are either uneconomic units or the encumbrances thereon by way of mortgages and other charges, inclusive of accumulated interest, exceed a reasonable proportion of the value of the properties.

In terms of the Scheme loans are not granted outright but only in instalments to meet costs incurred under the approved programme of replanting.

In the case of the 7 loan applications (4 granted and 3 approved) the amount authorised for disbursement is Rs. 132,750 in the aggregate. Of this sum Rs. 32,500 has already been paid to the borrowers. The loans authorised will be utilized to replant 10 acres in tea and 153 acres 3 roods 12 perches in rubber.

In Appendix M will be found the audited statements of account in respect of the scheme's first year of operation.

In the Government estimates for the financial year 1951-52 a sum of Rs. 100,000 has been provided for the grant of loans under this scheme. This sum is only sufficient to meet the disbursements during the current financial year in respect of loans already authorised. As there are no funds allocated to issue fresh loans, no further loans under this scheme can be granted at present.

*Re-Inspection of Properties Hypothecated.*—In terms of rule 11 (a) and (b) of rules framed under section 85 (1) (k) of the Ordinance, every property hypothecated shall be inspected at regular intervals for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not it has depreciated in value after the loan was granted.

During the year 198 properties were inspected, and, where necessary, the mortgagors concerned were advised of the improvements that should be effected to maintain their properties in good condition.

#### REVIEW OF THE CORPORATION'S WORK

In the opinion of the Board it would be appropriate at this stage to comment briefly on the work of the Corporation from the point of view of the objects and reasons for which it was established and the extent to which it has fulfilled its purpose within the limits imposed by its statute and in the context of local conditions.

In their correspondence in 1936 on the question of a State-aided Bank the Board of Ministers and the Secretary of State for the Colonies agreed that there was a real need in Ceylon for an Agricultural and Industrial Credit Corporation "designed to help in the development of new industrial enterprises, and in the refinancing of agricultural debt" of the entire Ceylonese community. The then Minister of Agriculture and Lands in urging the enactment of the Debt Conciliation Bill expressed the view that the class of people whose debts exceeded Rs. 25,000 were most in need of relief—the then Governor had recommended that Government assistance should be restricted to those whose debts did not exceed Rs. 25,000—vide Sessional Paper XXII of 1941. In short the Corporation was set up with two aims in view, firstly to refinance the debts of those agriculturists who could not obtain any relief from the then available sources of long-term credit, and secondly to aid industrial development.

Since the commencement of business in December 1943 up to June 30, 1952, 635 loans amounting to Rs. 33,280,485 have been issued for agricultural purposes. Of this amount about Rs. 15 million has been granted for the redemption of debts incurred for agricultural purposes alone. The number of loans issued in the category below Rs. 25,000 has been consistently high. In the year under review 112 loans out of a total of 165 have been authorised in sums under Rs. 25,000. The following table gives the number of loans granted in the category under Rs. 25,000 expressed as a percentage of the total number of loans issued in each of the years 1947-1951.

The Corporation's statute requires that before any loan is issued the Board should satisfy itself that the borrower has "valid title" to the security tendered. Legal title in Ceylon is generally far from "perfect". It is the Board's policy to accept sound marketable titles provided the borrowers are able to furnish documentary title without a defect for about 40 years. There are, however, cases in which the Board accepts a title when it is satisfied on documentary evidence that there is a presumption of prescriptive possession. An alternative method of the Corporation satisfying itself as to the title by obtaining the necessary documents without cost to the borrower in the case of applications for loans below Rs. 10,000 is being investigated.

Mortgage financing in Ceylon is confronted with two major risks. One is the uncertainty of title to land in the absence of a system of registration of land titles. Investigation into title is usually an expensive and exhaustive process. The existence of several laws relating to matrimony and inheritance also tends to complicate the process of investigation of title. The other major risk is the result of wide fluctuation of land values. For example between 1941 and 1946 the average profit margin varied between Rs. 20 and Rs. 40 per candy of copra and the value of coconut land per acre rose from about Rs. 300 in 1941 to Rs. 800 in 1946. The average marketable values at which transactions have taken place were perhaps higher. In 1949 rubber fell to about 50 cents per pound while in 1951 after the Korean conflict it rose to Rs. 3 or even higher. In these conditions it is quite possible that the marketable value of the Corporation's investments may rapidly and steeply fall and it may not be adequately covered by lending even 50 per cent. of the assessed value.

It is essential that the Corporation should build up substantial reserves in the quickest possible time to cushion possible losses in its investments due to sudden fluctuations of the market. Unfortunately the Income and Profits Taxes do not permit the Board to strengthen the Reserves as rapidly as it would wish. The provisional liability on account of income and profits taxes since the inception of the Corporation is Rs. 319,164.56. The Reserve Fund stands at Rs. 256,740 and the amount issued on mortgage and due as at September 30, 1951, is Rs. 19,734,003.74. It is clear that the present reserves are inadequate in relation to the amount invested in loans. In view of the fact that the Board is empowered to lend up to 75 per cent. of its valuation, and does so lend chiefly to small borrowers, a rapid build up of reserves is a matter of utmost urgency.

In the field of industrial credit the Corporation since its inception in December, 1943, up to June 30, 1952, has issued only 92 loans amounting to Rs. 4,198,650. During the same period only 253 applications have been received for financial assistance for industrial purposes of all kinds. Of these 107 were withdrawn by the applicants themselves for reasons not specifically mentioned. Twenty-five have been rejected for the following reasons:—4 because of defective title, 12 owing to the fact that the purpose in each case was not one that could, in terms of the Ordinance, be construed as industrial, and 9 because the security offered was not acceptable. Twenty-nine applications are under consideration. The 92 loans issued by the Board for industrial purposes authorised the disbursement of Rs. 4,198,650 in the aggregate; the total amount applied for in these 92 loan applications was Rs. 4,478,000.

In the short period in which the Corporation has conducted business every possible effort has been made to provide credit facilities for the authorised purposes on such terms and conditions as the provisions of the Ordinance permit and the reserves warrant.

Our attention has been drawn to the following observation in the Report of the World Bank's Mission to Ceylon (Part II Chapter 15. Page 259):—

"Establishment in 1943 of the Agricultural and Industrial Credit Corporation was expected to offer some relief. This organisation was given the specific function of promoting industrial ventures by underwriting share capital and even undertaking management. The Mission finds, however, that it has failed to discharge its function. *Entrepreneurs* who have solicited credit from it for capital equipment and expansion have found it impossible to arrange acceptable security and terms".

In point of fact, however, the legislation under which the Corporation is constituted, viz., Ordinance No. 19 of 1943, does not empower the Corporation to participate in "industrial ventures" as stated by the Mission. Indeed, this defect was commented on in the Report on the State Mortgage Bank (Sessional Paper VII of 1951) where "new legislation" for this purpose was suggested, and the following comment was made:—

"The Credit Corporation can be the nucleus of the organization which it is recommended should be formed to fill the gap in investment finance. It should be empowered to undertake promotion of new ventures in industry, commerce and agriculture, grant loans on the security of movable and immovable property, underwrite and take up capital issues, provide technical assistance and even participate in management or supervision of concerns in which it has acquired an interest. *New legislation will be necessary for this purpose.* One may conceive the new lending institution, so established, even inviting publicly requests for financial assistance by individual *entrepreneurs* willing to develop particular lines of industry or agriculture, which its authorities are satisfied, on evidence available to them from Government and other sources, have the best prospects of success".

### RULES

#### Part I—Preliminary

These rules may be cited as the Census (Financial Institutions) Rules, 1952.

2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—"Census" means the Census of Financial Institutions, 1952; "Ordinance" means the Census Ordinance (Chapter 118); "Superintendent" means the Superintendent of Census; "establishment" means an insurance company or a finance company or other establishment carrying on the business of pawnbroking or money lending.

#### Part II—General

3. The Census directed to be taken in the year 1952, shall be taken during the period commencing on the 1st day of October and ending on the 30th day of November.

4. The Superintendent shall, for the purpose of obtaining information for the Census, serve or cause to be served during the period mentioned in rule 3, a schedule on the owner or manager of every establishment or the person in charge of the place where the business of the establishment is carried on.

5. For the purpose of these rules the Superintendent may, in his discretion regard a branch of any establishment as a separate establishment and serve or cause to be served a separate schedule in respect of each such branch establishment.

6. Every schedule required to be served under rule 4 shall be deemed to have been duly served—(a) if the schedule is delivered by a census officer to the owner or manager of the establishment, or person in charge at the place of business of that establishment, or (b) if such schedule is sent by registered post addressed to such owner or manager, or person in charge at the place of business of that establishment.

7. Every person on whom a schedule is served under rule 6 shall—(a) if the schedule has been delivered to him by a census officer, return, within 21 days from the date of such delivery, the schedule duly filled in and signed to the enumerator or supervisor authorised to collect the schedule, or (b) if the schedule has been sent to him by registered post, return, within 21 days from the date of such posting, the schedule duly filled in and signed by registered post addressed to the Superintendent at his office in Colombo.

8. The owner, manager or person in charge of any establishment shall, when required to do so by the Superintendent, furnish any further information or explanation of the particulars entered by him in any schedule relating to that establishment.

#### III—Duties of Census Officers

1. Any power or duty conferred or imposed on the Superintendent by the Ordinance or any rule made thereunder may, under the general or special direction of the Superintendent, be exercised or performed by a Deputy Superintendent of Census throughout the Island or by an Assistant Superintendent of Census within such areas as are allotted to that Assistant Superintendent.

2. Any power or duty conferred or imposed on a Commissioner by the Ordinance or any rule made thereunder may be exercised or performed by an Assistant Commissioner of Census within the area for which he is appointed, under the general or special direction of the Commissioner of that area.

3. **RULES***Part I***Preliminary**

1. These rules may be cited as the Census of Agriculture Rules, 1952.
2. In these rules unless the context otherwise requires—
  - “Census” means the Census of Agriculture (including animal husbandry and manufacture of tea and rubber on estates);
  - “Commissioner” means a Commissioner of Census;
  - “estate” means a holding of not less than twenty acres in extent;
  - “holding” means a block of land used wholly or partly for the purposes of agriculture or for purposes of husbandry including the keeping or raising of livestock or poultry and the cultivation of fruits, vegetables and the like and operated as a distinct economic unit by one person or by several persons jointly or by a body of persons;
  - “small holding” means a holding of less than twenty acres in extent;
  - “Superintendent” means the Superintendent of Census;
  - “Ordinance” means the Census Ordinance (Chapter 118).

*Part II***General**

3. The Census shall be taken during the period commencing on the first day of October, 1952 and ending, on the thirty-first day of December, 1952.
4. The particulars regarding which information shall be obtained for the purposes of Census are the following:—
  - (a) *In respect of small holdings.*—Location of small holding, name and address of the holder; the nature of tenure and acreages under different titles; land utilization—acreages under arable, pasture, wood and forest land and permanent orchard and other tree crops, acreages under cultivation of particular seasonal, non-seasonal tree and industrial crops with their yield for the year 1951, number of livestock classified as to genus, species, sex and age; dairy products; power, irrigation; number of persons employed.
  - (b) *In respect of estates.*—Location; name and divisions; name of person-in-charge and owner; nationality of owner; if owned by company, place of incorporation of the company; names and addresses of agents and secretaries; elevation; the nature of tenure and acreages under different titles; housing and other facilities; extent irrigated by minor and major irrigation works; acreages under different types of crops and their yield for the year 1951; extent affected by slaughter tapping and oidium; livestock and dairy products; capital structure as at December 31, 1951; employment, wages and salaries; power; fuel and factory equipment; quantity and value of materials consumed; chemicals and packing materials; quantity and value of manufactured produce.
5. (a) The schedule relating to small holdings shall be in Form A set out hereunder.  
(b) The schedule relating to estates shall be in Form B set out hereunder.
6. The schedule relating to an estate may, in the discretion of the Superintendent, either be delivered to the owner, superintendent or person in charge of that estate to be filled up by such owner, superintendent or person in charge with particulars required in the schedule, or be filled up by a census officer authorised in that behalf.
7. A schedule shall be deemed to have been duly served on the owner, superintendent or person in charge of an estate if delivered by a census officer to such owner, superintendent or person in charge, or if such schedule is sent by registered post addressed to such owner, superintendent or person in charge to his last known address.
8. The owner, superintendent or person in charge of an estate on whom a schedule has been served under the provisions of these rules shall—
  - (a) if the schedule has been delivered to him by a census officer, within twenty-one days from the date of such delivery thereof, return the schedule duly filled in and signed, to the enumerator or supervisor authorised to collect the schedule; or
  - (b) if the schedule has been sent to him by registered post, within twenty-one days from the date of such posting, return the schedule duly filled in and signed by registered post addressed to the Superintendent at his office in Colombo.
9. Where a census officer is required to fill up a schedule whether in respect of estates or small holdings he may ask all such questions of all persons within the limits of his local area as may be necessary to enable him to fill up the schedule.
10. The owner, superintendent, person in charge or the agents and secretaries of any estate shall, when required to do so by the Superintendent, furnish any further information or explanation of the particulars entered by him in any schedule relating to that estate.

*Part III***Duties of census officers**

11. Any power or duty conferred or imposed on or assigned to the Superintendent by the Ordinance or any rule made thereunder may, under the general or special direction of the Superintendent, be exercised or performed by a Deputy Superintendent of Census throughout the Island or by an Assistant Superintendent of Census within such areas as are allotted to that Assistant Superintendent.

## ORDER

1. The Proclamation under section 31 (now section 30) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 94), dated September 12, 1935, and published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,146 of September 20, 1935, is hereby amended in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto.

2. This Order shall come into effect on the first day of January, 1953.

*Schedule*

Schedule I to the Proclamation dated September 12, 1935, and published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,146 of September 20, 1935, is hereby amended by the substitution, for the definition of the limits of Ratnapura Town, under the heading "Province of Sabaragamuwa—Ratnapura District", therein appearing and reproduced in column I of the definition appearing in column II hereunder.

S. P. P. 31.

East : From the last-mentioned point along the south-eastern boundaries of lots 58 and 144, the northern and western boundaries of lot 145 to where it meets lot 149B ; thence along the western boundary of lot 149B to where it meets lot 149 ; thence along the northern boundaries of lots 149, 149A, the western boundary of lot 149A to where it meets lot 245 ; thence along the western boundary of lot 245 till it meets lot 247 ; thence along the northern boundary of lot 247 to where it meets lot 247C ; thence westwards along the northern and western boundaries of lot 247C and the western boundary of lot 247D to where it meets the Kongaha-ela ; thence along the Kongaha-ela and southwards along the Ehelapolawella to where it meets the western boundary of lot 247G ; thence along the said boundary and the western boundaries of lots 247I, 247J, and 247N ; thence westwards along the northern boundaries of lots 247N and 247O ; thence along the western and southern boundaries of lot 247T to where it meets the western boundary of lot 247R ; thence southwards along this boundary to where it meets the Ehelapolawella and along the Ehelapolawella (old) to where it meets the Ketan-dola and along the Ketan-dola until it meets the Dodangaha-ela.
