SCHOLARSHIPS IN MECHANICAL ENGINEERING, CHEMICAL ENGINEERING AND COMMERCE OFFERED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF NEW ZEALAND

APPLICATIONS are invited for the award of two Scholarships in Mechanical Engineering, two Scholarships in Chemical Engineering and one Scholarship in Commerce offered by the Government of New Zealand under the Colombo Plan Technical Assistance Scheme. Applications, which should be on a special form obtainable from this office, and in the applicants own handwriting, should reach me on or before November 14, 1952.

2. *Terms of Award and Course of Study.*—(i) The selected scholars will be required to follow degree courses in Mechanical Engineering, Chemical Engineering and Commerce at an University in New Zealand. The duration of the course of study may extend for a period of three years or more depending on the course.

(ii) The expenses of the scholars for study in New Zealand and the cost of passages to and from New Zealand will be provided by the Government of New Zealand. The following tentative allowances have been fixed by the New Zealand Government to be paid to scholars:—

- (a) Maintenance allowance of £ (NZ) 300 per annum
- (b) Internal travelling allowance of £ (NZ) 25 per annum.
- (c) Initial clothing allowance of £ (NZ) 60 per annum, and
- (d) Admission, tuition, examination, and other compulsory fees.

3. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (a) is a Ceylonese A “Ceylonese” is—
 - (i) a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; or
 - (ii) a person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration, and is deemed by the Ministry of Defence and External Affairs to have a prima facie entitlement to such citizenship;

(b) is under 25 years of age on November 14, 1952. Officers in the Public Service may apply provided they are under 35 years of age on this date;
