The Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance

THE following resolution passed by the Senate at a meeting held on December 4, 1947, and by the House of Representatives at a meeting held on November 27, 1947, is published for general information:—

This Council resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199) that from the 1st day of January 1948, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within the area defined in the Schedule hereto:

SCHEDULE

All that area of land situated in Divulapitiya Village in Dasiya Pattu of Alutkuru Korale North (B), in the Colombo District, Western Province, and bounded as follows:—

North: By a line drawn from a point on the left bank of the Imbulgasmula Ela at the south-western corner of the tract of paddy fields claimed by D. S. Kumarasinghe and others and Don Dias and others north-eastwards to the point where it takes a turn in a south-easterly direction.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the southern boundary of the tract of paddy fields claimed by Don Dias and others and crossing the Minuwangoda-Giriulla Public Works Department road to a point on the eastern boundary of the said road, 3 chains 10 links north of the 27th Mile Stone, thence by a line drawn south-westwards along the eastern boundary of the Minuwangoda-Giriulla Public Works Department road to the 27th Mile Stone, thence by a straight line drawn south-eastwards to the north-western corner of the paddy field claimed by Mrs. C. A. Jayakoddy, thence by a line drawn southwards along the western boundary of the said paddy field till it meets the Negombo-Mirigama road, thence by a line drawn across the said road and south-westwards along the western boundary of

the tract of paddy fields claimed by J. A. M. Guan Appuhamy and others and S. Abeywardena and others till it meets the Wewagedaragodelle Ela.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the northern boundary of Wewagedaragodelle Ela which forms the northern boundary of a tract of paddy fields claimed by S. Abeywardena and others, Louis Jayawardena and others, J. M. P. Goonewardena and others, D. P. Ekanayake and others and crossing the Minuwangoda-Giriulla Public Works Department road to a point on the said Ela 4 chains 75 links west of its crossing with the said road, thence by a line drawn north-westwards through the Jotikarama Temple premises to a point on the eastern boundary of Wewagedaragodella Ela about 6 chains 75 links measured south-west along the said Ela from the southwestern corner of the paddy field claimed by D. J. Subasingha and others.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards along the left bank of the Wewagedaragodella Ela to the point where it meets another Ela south of the paddy field claimed by D. J. Subasinghe and others, thence north-eastwards along the left bank of the said Ela till it meets the southern boundary of Walawekumbura claimed by P. U. Ratnatunga and others, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of the said paddy field, crossing the Negombo-Mirigama Public Works Department road at a point 2 chains 50 links west of the Divulapitiya junction and northwards along the eastern boundary of the paddy field claimed by C. D. Jamis Silva and others to a point where it joins the Imbulgasmula Ela, thence north-eastwards along the left bank of the said Ela which forms the eastern boundary of paddy field claimed by C. D. Jamis Silva and others to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

BY-LAW made by the Municipal Council of Colombo under sections 267 and 272 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947, approved by the Minister of Local Government under section 268 of that Ordinance, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, and confirmed by the Senate and the House of Representatives under the said section 268 as so modified.

BY-LAW

The by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 10,096 of April 21, 1950, are hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) by the substitution for the word "Commissioner", wherever that word occurs in those by-laws, of the word "Council"; and
- (2) by the insertion, immediately after by-law 4 thereof, of the following new by-law:—
"5. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these by-laws, premises used for the storage or manufacture for sale, other than by retail, of any one of the following articles, that is to say, jaggery, sherbet, sweetmeats, papadams, or delicatessen, shall be exempt from the requirements of the appropriate provisions of by-laws 1 (2), 2 (2), 3 (2) and 4 (2), if those premises had been used in that behalf on or before April 21, 1950."

Posts—Vacant**LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE****Examination for Electrical Foremen, Grade II****Date of Examination—**

A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter Grade II of the Local Government Electrical Foremen's Service will be held in Colombo on January 17, 1953. The examination will be conducted by the Local Government Service Commission.

2. (i) *Salary*.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts in Grade II of the Local Government Electrical Foremen's Service to serve Local Authorities (other than Village Committees) on the salary scale of Rs. 744 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 42 to Rs. 1,416 per annum, with an efficiency bar before Rs. 1,080 per annum. Rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance will be payable in accordance with Government rates and conditions.

(ii) *Conditions of Service*.—(a) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws and regulations of the Local Authority subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder.

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on one year's probation, and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in a Local Authority drawing a salary higher than the initial salary assigned to the post of Foremen, Grade II, may be placed on a suitable step on this salary scale.

3. The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

4. *Eligibility*.—(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese*.

(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least—

(a) the 7th Standard in English or higher examination;

(b) either should have had at least five years' of practical experience in an electrical engineering firm or under a Chartered Electrical Engineer or under Government or Local Supply Authority, or should possess technical qualifications of the Ceylon Technical College or its equivalent; and

(c) should have a knowledge of the operation and maintenance of high tension and low tension distribution system, transformers, diesel engine plant and switchgear, testing of consumers' installations, and house service metres. Should also possess a working knowledge of the safety rules and I.E.E. Regulations for electrical equipment and buildings.

Note.—Applications from persons holding permanent posts in a town lighting scheme of a Local Authority having the necessary technical knowledge and experience will be considered, irrespective of general educational qualifications, if forwarded through the Chairman of the Local Authority.

(iv) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph 5 (iv) except that, if necessary—

(a) Service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilized service in the last war from their age.

5. *Applications*.—(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from the Office of the Local Government Service Commission, Room No. 29 1/5, Gaffoor Building (First Floor), Colombo, up to December 27, 1952, and forwarded by registered post to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than January 3, 1953. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

(ii) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments or under Local Authorities, must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments or the Chairmen of Local Authorities in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so he will be regarded as disqualified.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 3.

(iv) The following document must be attached to the form of application:—

(a) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born not earlier than January 17, 1913, and not later than January 17, 1936.

Note.—(1) Affidavits will be ordinarily be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(2) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth, under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, (Cap. 94), will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the

birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, applications should be made to the Registrar-General or to the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office in the district in which the birth took place, under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance for the amendment of the entry in cage 2 of the birth registration entry, and in other cases application should be made to the District Court under section 20 for rectification of the entry in cage 2.

- (b) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a Member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, or generally speaking some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.
- (c) The original certificates of or regarding candidate's educational qualifications.

N. B.—Applications will be rejected in the absence of one or more of these documents.

(v) The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, will issue admission forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time table and the rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Supervising Examiner on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination he should communicate without delay with the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, informing that he has not received the admission form and giving the following particulars:—

- (1) Name of examination.
- (2) Full name.
- (3) Full postal address.

6. Should any of the particulars furnished by the candidates be found to be false within their knowledge they will, if appointed, be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalized.

7. *Withdrawal and refunds.*—In no circumstances will a refund of the value of stamps be made.

8. *Leave to Officers to attend Examination.*—Heads of Departments and Chairmen of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant to officers of their Departments and of Local Bodies whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, duty leave to present themselves at the examination.

9. *Subjects.*—The subjects for the examination are as follows:—

| (2) Viva Voce Test—Candidates are required to produce at the viva voce test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission to the Local Government Service Examination for Electrical Foremen, Grade II | 100 |

10. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the viva voce. The number to be called at the viva voce examination will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission. The viva voce examination will be held in Colombo.

11. *Medical examination.*—The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

Post of Engineering Overseer (Waterworks), Waterworks Department, Municipal Council, Colombo

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Local Government Service Commission for the above post.

2. Applications should be made substantially in the form as per specimen given below, and should reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, on or before December 23, 1952.

3. Salary and Allowances:—

Salary Scales—

Grade I: Rs. 1,680—7 of 120—Rs. 2,520, efficiency bar before Rs. 2,040 per annum.

Grade II: Rs. 840—10 of 72—Rs. 1,560, efficiency bar before Rs. 1,200 per annum.

Grade III: Rs. 660—16 of 42—Rs. 1,332, efficiency bar before Rs. 996 per annum.

A candidate possessing any of the technical qualifications prescribed below will be placed on salary points as follows:

Certificate of the Junior Technical Officers' Course, or the Diploma Course in Municipal Engineering or the Building Construction Course of the Ceylon Technical College, or an equivalent qualification, will be placed on the step Rs. 1,344 per annum, on the scale for Grade II Overseers mentioned above. The salary payable to those candidates who have completed parts

of the above Courses is given in paragraph 5 below. Those who have not passed in Plumbing in any of the above Courses will be required to pass in that subject before they receive their first increment.

ALLOWANCES—

Rent allowance, a temporary cost of living allowance and a special living allowance will be paid in accordance with Government rates and conditions. A transport allowance for the maintenance and use of a bicycle for official travelling will be fixed by the Commission.

4. The post is permanent and pensionable, and the candidate selected will be required to contribute to the Local Government Service, W. & O. P. Fund.

5. *Conditions of Service.*—The selected candidate will be required to carry out such work and duties as may be allotted to him by the Engineers under whom he is placed. He will be required to attend evening classes at the Ceylon Technical College, if he does not already possess a recognized technical qualification, and to follow the Diploma Course (Evening) in Municipal Engineering. While following the first year course he will be paid a salary of Rs. 660 on the scale for Overseers, Grade III. On passing the first year sessional examination of the Municipal Engineering Course, he will be paid a salary of Rs. 1,200 per annum, on the scale for Overseers, Grade II. He will receive the next increment on that scale on passing the second year sessional examination and the increment following on obtaining the Diploma. On successful completion of the three year Course by obtaining the Diploma in Municipal Engineering, he will be eligible for promotion as a Sub-Inspector on the scale: Rs. 1,440—120—3,000 per annum, on the occurrence of vacancies.

6. If he fails to pass the First Year Sessional Examination of the Municipal Engineering Course, he will continue to draw salary on the scale for Overseers, Grade III, provided his conduct and work are satisfactory, and has passed the Practical Plumbing Course of the Ceylon Technical College. He will be considered for promotion to Grade II and thereafter to Grade I along with others on the occurrence of vacancies, but he will not be eligible for promotion to the grade of Sub-Inspector.

7. The selected candidate will be required to enter into a bond with two sureties for a sum of Rs. 500 to serve the Local Government Service for a period not less than three years after obtaining the Diploma of the Technical College.

8. *Qualifications required.*—(1) Applicants must be citizens of Ceylon as prescribed in the Citizenship Act, No. 18 of 1948;

(ii) They must not be less than 18 years and not more than 30 years of age on December 23, 1952;

(iii) They should have passed the Senior School Certificate (English) or the London Matriculation, with Mathematics as a subject of the examination passed. Preference will be given to candidates who have, in addition, passed in Physics/Mechanics and/or Applied Mathematics.

9. Applications will also be entertained from Probationary Overseers in the employ of the Waterworks Department, Municipal Council, Colombo, and from Waterworks Overseers in the Local Government Service who have passed the J. S. C. (English) Examination or the E. S. L. C. Examination or a higher examination and have completed three years satisfactory service.

10. In the case of Ceylonese ex-Servicemen, the period of their mobilized service will be deducted from their ages for purposes of eligibility.

11. The selected candidates will be on two years' probation or trial and will be subject to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the regulations made thereunder.

12. Applications from those in a Local Body or in a Government Department should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or the Chairman of the Local Authority or the Head of the Department in which they are serving.

13. Anyone who desires to recommend a candidate should do so by giving him a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

2. The posts carry a salary of Rs. 660 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 42 to Rs. 1,668 per annum, with an efficiency bar before Rs. 1,206 per annum. A rent allowance in accordance with Government rates and conditions, a temporary cost of living allowance and a special living allowance at Government rates will be paid.

3. The posts are permanent and the appointments will be on a provident fund basis.

4. Applicants must be Ceylonese* and not less than 17 years nor more than 25 years of age on December 1, 1952, and should have passed at least one of the following examinations:—

- (a) the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon; the Cambridge Junior; the Commercial Certificate Examination, either Certificate or Higher Stage (either section of the London Chamber of Commerce or Ceylon Chamber of Commerce); or
(b) a Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a school approved by the Education Department for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or
(c) they should hold some higher educational qualifications.

5. Applications will also be considered from females holding permanent posts in the clerical service of a Local Authority irrespective of age, provided they are otherwise qualified for the posts.

6. Applications from those in a Local Body or in a Government Department should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority or the Head of the Department in which they are serving.

7. The selected candidates will be on two years' trial and will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the regulations made thereunder.
