#### The Butchers Ordinance

REGULATIONS made by the proper authority in that behalf, to wit, the Haputale Urban Council under section 22 of the Butchers Ordinance (Chapter 201), and confirmed by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

#### Regulations

1. The public slaughter-house proclaimed under Section 21 of the Ordinance shall be in charge of the Sanitary Inspector of the Council. That officer shall be responsible for the discipline and sanitary conditions within such slaughter-house.

2. (1) No person shall slaughter any animal at the slaughter-house—

(a) unless such animal has been inspected by the officer appointed by the Council for the purpose, and approved by him as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption, or

(b) except between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 a.m.:  
Provided that the Chairman may in any case authorise the slaughter of any animal at any time other than the time specified herein.

(2) No person shall slaughter any animal at the slaughter-house—

(a) at any time after the expiry of a period of 72 hours from the time of the approval of that animal under paragraph (1); or

(b) if it has been removed alive from the slaughter-house premises after it was approved under paragraph (1), unless it is again inspected and approved under that paragraph as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption.

3. Every person who brings any animal into the premises of the slaughter-house shall take all such measures as may be necessary to ensure that that animal is adequately fed and watered while it remains in those premises.

4. Every person who brings any animal into the premises of the slaughter-house shall, if the animal is rejected as unfit for slaughter, immediately after such rejection, remove the animal or cause it to be removed from those premises.

5. The Medical Officer of Health for the area or officer referred to in regulation 2, may prohibit the slaughter of any animal if, after it has been approved under regulation 2, it is found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human consumption.

6. If the meat or offal of any animal slaughtered in the slaughter-house is, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health or of the officer referred to in regulation 2, diseased or unfit for human consumption, he shall cause the meat or offal to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent such meat or offal being exposed for sale or used for human consumption.

7. The officer-in-charge of the slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any animal which has not been approved as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption or the slaughter of which has been prohibited as provided in regulation 5.

8. (1) No person shall remove from the slaughter-house, except under the direction of the Medical Officer of Health or the officer referred to in regulation 2, any meat or offal which has been declared under regulation 6 to be unfit for human consumption.

(2) No person shall remove the carcass of any animal intended for human consumption from the slaughter-house, unless such carcass has been stamped on its fore-quarters and hind-quarters with the mark "U. C. Haputale" by the officer-in-charge of the slaughter-house.

9. No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of any other animal or until the carcass of every animal previously slaughtered in the premises shall have been removed or screened off and the premises cleaned.

10. (1) A fee at the following rates shall be paid in advance to the Council for the use of the slaughter-house, and no animal shall be permitted to be slaughtered without an official receipt in proof of payment of the fee:—

	Rs. cts.
For cattle . . . . .	0 75 per head.
For sheep, goats or pigs . . . . .	0 25 per head.

(2) Where an animal has been approved under regulation 2 as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption, the production of an official receipt in proof of payment of the fee shall not be necessary prior to the admission of that animal to the slaughter-house.

11. The keeper of the slaughter-house shall maintain a register in the following form of all cattle removed to the slaughter-house:—

12. In these regulations:—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council;  
 “Council” means the Haputale Urban Council;  
 “Ordinance” means the Butchers Ordinance.

13. The regulations under section 23 (now section 22) of the Ordinance, published in *Gazette* No 7,056 of October 10, 1919, and therein referred to as “Rules”, are hereby rescinded in so far as they relate to the town of Haputale.

**ORDER**

1. Each new Town Council shall be the successor of the old Town Council for all such purposes of the Town Councils Ordinance, No. 3 of 1946, as may relate to the old town.

2. All such proclamations, orders, notifications, rules, regulations and by-laws of or affecting the old town, as are in force on the thirty-first day of December, 1952, shall, so far as they relate to, or so far as they relate to any matter or thing within, a new town and so far as they are not in conflict with the provisions of the Town Councils Ordinance, continue in force as if they had been made in relation to, or in the exercise of the powers of, the Town Council of that new town.

3. One-half of the amount of the cash balance (excluding deposits and securities) of the local fund of the old town on the thirty-first day of December, 1952, and one-half of the amount of the taxes and rates due to the old Town Council on that date shall, on the first day of January, 1953, be credited to the local fund of each new Town Council.

4. Moneys held in deposit or by way of security by the old Town Council on the thirty-first day of December, 1952, in connection with any public service maintained by or in respect of any matter relating to, that Council shall be deemed to be transferred to the new Town Council by which such public service is maintained or to which such matter relates.

5. One-half of all movable property (other than money and property relating to the supply of electricity) vested in or under the control of the old Town Council on the thirty-first day of December, 1952, shall be deemed to be vested in each new Town Council.

6. Property relating to the supply of electricity of the old Town Council shall be divided between

the new Town Councils in proportion to the length of the distribution lines situated within each new Town Council area.

7. Each land, building, or other immovable property vested in, or under the control of, the old Town Council on the thirty-first day of December, 1952, shall be deemed to be vested in the new Town Council within whose area such property is situated.

8. All rights, duties, liabilities and obligations of the old Town Council shall, so far as they relate to any new town, be deemed to be transferred to the Town Council of that new town.

9. In this order—

“distribution lines” means wires used for the purpose of conveying, transmitting or distributing electrical energy;

“new Town Council” means the Town Council of Hikkaduwa or the Town Council of Dodanduwa.

“new town” means the town of Hikkaduwa or the town of Dodanduwa.

“old Town Council” means the Town Council of Hikkaduwa-Dodanduwa; and

“old town” means the town of Hikkaduwa-Dodanduwa.

**BY-LAWS***Regulation of traffic*

1. No person shall pull or push along or drive any kind or class of vehicle on any path or road within the village area at night without a lighted lantern attached on each side to the front of the vehicle.

2. No person shall lead or drive any animal along any path or road within the village area without a light between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

3. When any solo pedal cycle is being ridden or wheeled along by any person on any road or path—

(1) he shall not carry any other person on such cycle, and

(2) no other person shall cause or permit himself to be carried on such cycle.

*Amendments*

4. The by-laws relating to offensive and dangerous trades published in *Gazette* No. 9,969 of April 22, 1949, are hereby amended in by-law 1 as follows:—

(1) in paragraph (1) thereof—

(i) by the substitution, for the item “(b) Storing of perishable articles of food for the purpose of trade by wholesale”, of the following item:—

“(b) Storing of perishable articles of food for the purposes of trade by wholesale or retail”; and

(ii) by the insertion, immediately after the item relating to the "icing of fish", of the following new items:—

- " (q) Manufacture of Koda
- (r) Curing of tobacco
- (s) Manufacture of cigars
- (t) Manufacture of beedies "

(2) in paragraph (2) thereof by the insertion, immediately after item "o", of the following new items:—

- " (p) Oxy-welding
- (q) Charging of batteries "

5. The by-laws relating to tax on vehicles and animals published in *Gazette* No. 9,863 of May 14, 1948, are hereby amended in the Schedule thereto by the insertion immediately after the item relating to bicycles of the following new item:—

" For every hand-cart G. V. A. H. "

6. In these by-laws "village area" means the Galgomuwa village area in the Kurunegala District.

## Posts — Vacant

### Local Government Clerical Service Grade II Examination

*Date of Examination.*—A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter Grade II of the Local Government Clerical Service will be held in Colombo, Kandy, Galle and Jaffna, on April 11, 1953. The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. (i) *Salary.*—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts in Grade II of the Local Government Clerical Service to serve Local Authorities (other than Village Committees) on the salary of Rs. 840 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 2,424 per annum. In this scale efficiency bars operate before Rs. 1,488 and Rs. 2,064 per annum. Rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance will be payable.

(ii) *Conditions of Service.*—(a) The posts are permanent and pensionable and the selected candidates will be eligible for the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension benefits.

(b) Candidates selected for appointment in the Local Government Clerical Service will not be permitted to sit for an examination for entrance to any service under the Government or to apply for or accept an appointment in any Government Department during the first three years of their service in the Local Government Service.

(c) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws and regulations of the Local Authority subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder.

(d) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years' trial or probation. Those appointed to a Local Authority (other than a Municipal Council) will be liable to transfer within an area specified in the Second Schedule to the above Ordinance, and may be posted to any station within the specified area in Ceylon. They will be required to pass a test in type-writing within one year of the date of appointment and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder.

(e) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in a Local Authority may be allowed incremental credit for such service.

3. The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

4. *Eligibility.*—(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese.\*

(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least—

(a) the Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation, or the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or

(b) the final examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or

(c) one of the following junior examinations:—

The Cambridge Junior; the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon, or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a school approved by the Education Department for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; TOGETHER WITH either (i) the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce, or (ii) the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce.

*Note.*—ORIGINAL CERTIFICATES OF EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS SHOULD BE ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION FORM.

(iv) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph 6 (iv) except that, if necessary—

(a) Service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilized service in the last war from their age; and

(b) candidates, who were or are temporary clerks in Government service for any continuous period of 2 years or more, may deduct such period of temporary service from their age provided that they were in such temporary employment on a date subsequent to April 1, 1946.

(v) Candidates should have been resident for at least three years immediately prior to December 31, 1952, within an area specified in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945.

5. *Eligibility of candidates already in the Local Government Service.*—(i) Clerks in the Local Government Assistant Clerks' Service who possess the educational qualifications in paragraph 4 (iii) (a), (b) or (c), above and are under 45 years of age on April 11, 1953.

(ii) Clerks in the Local Government Assistant Clerks' Service who have been confirmed in their appointments on or before December 31, 1952, and are under 45 years of age on April 11, 1953.

(iii) Candidates in the permanent employ of a Local Authority and temporary clerks in Local Authorities with not less than two years' satisfactory service will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age, provided they possess the educational qualifications prescribed in paragraph 4 (iii) (a), (b) or (c) above.

6. *Applications.*—(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from the office of the Local Government Service Commission, Room No. 29 1/5, Gaffoor Building (First Floor), Colombo, up to January 13, 1953, and forwarded by registered post to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than January 20, 1953. Any applications received after that date will be rejected.

(ii) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments or under Local Authorities, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments or the Chairman of the Local Authorities in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 5.

(iv) The following documents must be attached to the form of application :—

- (a) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born not earlier than April 11, 1928, and not later than April 11, 1936.

*Note.*—(1) Affidavits will not ordinarily be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(2) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94), will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. ### Examination for Electrical Superintendents, Grade IV

DATE of Examination—

A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter Grade IV of the Local Government Electrical Superintendents' Service will be held in Colombo, on January 24, 1953. The examination will be conducted by the Local Government Service Commission.

2. (i) *Salary*.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts in Grade IV of the Local Government Electrical Superintendents' Service to serve Local Authorities on the salary scale Rs. 1,272 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 2,424 per annum, with an efficiency bar before Rs. 1,848 per annum. Rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance will be payable in accordance with Government rates and conditions. No special temporary allowance is payable.

(ii) *Conditions of Service*.—(a) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws and regulations of the Local Authority, subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder and other conditions as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

The posts are permanent and pensionable. The appointed candidates will be eligible to contribute to the L. G. S. W. and O. P. Fund.

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years' probation, and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in a Local Authority drawing a salary higher than the initial salary assigned to the post of Electrical Superintendent, Grade IV, may be placed on a suitable step on this salary scale.

3. The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

4. *Eligibility*.—(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese\*.

(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least—

- (a) the Junior School Certificate (English) or higher examination; and

- (c) should possess the Ceylon Technical College Final Certificate in Electrical Engineering, together with 1 year's practical experience in a local electrical scheme.

A knowledge of office administration and ability to control labour are essential.

(d) Applications from persons with 5 years' service and holding permanent posts in a Town Lighting Scheme of a Local Authority having the necessary technical knowledge and experience will be considered irrespective of age and general educational qualifications, if forwarded through the Mayor/Chairman of the Local Authority.

(iv) Other candidates must be within the age limits laid down in para. 5 (iv) except that, if necessary, military service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilized service in the last war from their age.

### Qualifying Examination for Promotion from Grade II to Grade I of the Local Government Service

A qualifying Examination for promotion to Grade I of the Local Government Clerical Service will be held in Colombo, on Saturday, February 7, 1953.

The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. *Salary and conditions of Service.*—(a) Successful candidates will be appointed, as vacancies occur, to Grade I of the Local Government Clerical Service on the scale Rs. 1,440 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,480 per annum. In this scale, an efficiency bar operates before Rs. 3,000 per annum, rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance will be payable in accordance with Government rates and conditions.

(b) All successful candidates will be appointed subject to confirmation after one year. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Applications.*—(a) Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, on forms which may be obtained from the office of the Commission up to January 13, 1953.

(b) Applications must be sent to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than January 20, 1953. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

6. Mayors and Chairmen of the Local Authorities are requested kindly to grant to officers serving in their Councils or Committees, whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, duty leave to present themselves at the examination.

7. *Subjects.*—The subjects for the examination are as follows:—

- (i) Local Authority accounts (one and a half hour paper) . . . . . 100 marks.

(The paper will consist of questions in Municipal, Urban and Town Councils' Accounts, tots, &c., and will be designed to test accuracy in handling figures and a knowledge of simple fundamental rules of accounts as applicable to the above local bodies.)

- (ii) Local Government Ordinances and any by-laws and regulations made thereunder, the organization of Local Authority Office Systems (two hour paper) . . . . . 200 marks.

The paper will be designed to test an Officer's knowledge of the local Government Ordinances, amending legislation, the by-laws and regulations framed thereunder and his usefulness and competence in Local Authority office organization and procedure. He may be required to

make a precis of an actual series of official letters, to submit or correct a draft letter prepared in terms of an order, to show a knowledge of index system, filing, &c., and to have the ability to express himself clearly on paper.

- (iii) Sinhalese or Tamil (one-hour paper) 100 marks.

A working knowledge of the selected language will be expected. The Question paper will include exercises on—

- (a) Comprehension of simple prose passages;  
(b) Descriptions, letter-writing, dialogues, &c.  
(c) Translation of (1) easy sentences into Sinhalese/Tamil; (2) a simple passage into English.  
(d) Vocabulary.

This paper will be regarded as a qualifying test only and every candidate will be required to obtain a minimum of 30 per cent. of the marks allotted for the paper. The marks obtained in this paper will not, however, be taken into consideration when selecting officers for promotion.

- (iv.) Viva Voce Test . . . . . 150 marks.

8. The examination will be held in two parts. The written examination will be held first and on the results of it, candidates will be selected to attend the viva voce test, which too will be held in Colombo. The number to be called for this test will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission. In all written papers, marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.
