

EIGHTY-EIGHT CONTACTS OF DIVULAPITIYA COVID-19 PATIENT TEST POSITIVE

I MFASURES TO PRE FURTHER TRANSMISSION

Eighty-eight contacts of the Divulapitiya COVID-19 patient have been tested positive for COVID-19 infection, Head of the National Operation Centre for the Prevention of COVID-19 Outbreak (NOPCO) Army Commander Lt. Gen. Shavendra Silva confirmed.

The Government Information Department confirmed that all these 88 cases

are employees of a garment factory where the Divulapitiya COVID-19 patient was employed at. Health Ministry sources said that all possible measures are being taken to prevent further transmission and in the interest of preserving national security. The health authorities are aggressively engaged in contact tracing, PCR testing and facilitating any isolation, hospitalizations and quarantine measures to be taken.

A 39-year-old woman, employed at the Minuwangoda garment factory tested positive for the COVID-19 coronavirus on Sunday (4) and is currently receiving treatment at Infectious Diseases Hospital (IDH) in Angoda. PCR test results confirmed that her 16-year-old daughter had also contracted the virus and has been admitted to the IDH on Sunday (04) TO PAGE 02



"The phrase "All departments of government "in Article 154(1) of the pre – 19th Amendment Constitution brought the Presidential Secretariat and the Prime Minister's Office under the purview of the Auditor General", a statement issued by the Prime Minister said.

He added that the Opposition has been unhesitatingly uttering every lie that comes to mind with regard to this matter because of the confidence that most people would not be familiar with these obscure provisions of the Constitution.

"All that the 20th Amendment seeks to do is to replace the changes made to the provisions relating to the Auditor General by the 19th Amendment with the provisions that existed before the 19th Amendment".

The full statement: The Opposition has been trying to propagate the idea that the Auditor General's powers would be reduced by the proposed 20th Amendment. It's seldom that the Constitutional provisions regarding the Auditor General come to the attention of the public. This has made it easier for the opposition to propagate various falsehoods in this connection.

One of the false claims being made is that the 19th Amendment set up an Audit Commission and that the 20th Amendment seeks to abolish it. What the 19th Amendment made provision for was not an Audit Commission but only an Audit Service Commission. The Audit Service Commission does not carry out any auditing functions. It handles matters like the appointment, promotion, transfer and disciplinary control of members of the State Audit Service. Usually such matters pertaining to government servants are dealt with by the Public Service Commission.

All that the creation of the Audit Service

Commission achieved was to set up yet another Commission to do the work that was being done by the Public Service Commission.

Another false claim being made

by the opposition is that the 20th

Amendment seeks to remove the Presidential Secretariat and the Office of the Prime Minister from the purview of the Auditor General. From the very inception of the 1978 Constitution, the Presidential Secretariat and the Prime Minister's Office have been under the purview of the Auditor General. The phrase "all departments of government" in Article 154(1) of the pre-19th Amendment Constitution brought the Presidential Secretariat and the Prime Minister's Office under the purview of the Auditor General. These institutions were always listed as government departments in the Government Financial Regulations. Quite apart from these two institutions, even the Office of Former Presidents

is listed as a separate government depart-

ment and all these institutions were always

audited by the Auditor General. The inclusion of the Presidential Secretariat and the Office of the Prime Minister by name in Article 154(1), by the 19th Amendment did not achieve anything new. Even though they may have not been specifically mentioned by name, from the very inception of the 1978 Constitution, the Presidential Secretariat and Prime Ministers Office had always been under the purview of the Auditor General. Even after the 20th Amendment reinstates the old article 154(1) which existed from the inception of the 1978 Constitution, in place of the so called 'changes' made by the 19th Amendment, the Presidential Secretariat and the Prime Minister's

Office will continue to remain within the purview of the Auditor General. Over the past decades, it's the Auditor General who audited the Presidential Secretariat and the Prime Minister's Office and not some private audit firm.

Another falsehood that's being propagated is that state owned companies will be removed from the purview of the Auditor General by the 20th Amendment. The audit-

ing of state corporations and state owned companies (i.e. companies in which the state owns more than 50% of the shares) comes under Article 154(2) of the Constitution. Under the provisions of Article 154(2), the minister in charge of the subject can assign the auditing of a state corporation or a state owned company to a qualified audit firm. However before doing so, he is mandatorily required to obtain the concurrence of the Finance Minister and also to consult the Auditor General. After the minister in charge of the subject assigns the auditing of a state corporation or a state owned company to an audit firm in this manner, the Auditor General can issue a written notice to that audit firm informing them that he proposes to utilize their services for the performance and discharge of the Auditor-General's duties in relation to that state corporation or state owned company, and thereupon that audit firm is mandatorily required to act under the direction and control of the Auditor-General.

The content of Article 154(2) which existed from the inception of the 1978 Constitution, was not changed by the 19th Amendment. The content of Article 154(2) will not change under the 20th Amendment either. Therefore it can be said that the content of Article 154(2) has remained the same from the inception of the 1978 Constitution and will continue to remain so in the future as well. Hence the claim that state owned companies are to be taken out of the purview of the Auditor General, is a complete falsehood.

It is also being claimed by opposition propagandists that the 19th Amendment had stipulated that the Auditor General should be a 'qualified auditor' and that when the 20th Amendment reinstates the old pre-19th Amendment Article 153(1) this qualification requirement will be dropped and hence, after the 20th Amendment is passed, even an unqualified person can be appointed as Auditor General. Constitutions are written on the assumption that those reading it will have basic common sense.

The Constitution does not state anywhere that the person appointed as Attorney General or as a Supreme Court judge has to be a qualified lawyer. But those appointed as Attorney General, Auditor General or a Supreme Court judge will always have the required educational and professional qualifications without which they cannot function in those positions.

All that the 20th Amendment seeks to do is to replace the changes made to the provisions relating to the Auditor General by the 19th Amendment with the provisions that existed before the 19th Amendment. The opposition has been unhesitatingly

uttering every lie that comes to mind with regard to this matter because of the confidence that most people would not be familiar with these obscure provisions of the Constitution. Its our duty to understand the facts of the matter and to defeat the unprincipled attempt being made by the opposition to mislead the people.

Divulapitiya suspected COVID-19 cases sent to Habaraduwa centre

Forty eight associates of the COVID-19 infected garment factory employees in Divulapitiya have been referred to Habaraduwa Quarantine Centre in Galle for respective Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) tests, Habaraduwa Medical Officer of Health (MOH) Pramoda Siriwardana said.

"The PCR tests were to be carried out yesterday. Among the persons sent for PCR tests were several close associates of the corresponding garment factory and several staff members of the hospital at which the COVID patient was treated.

The blood samples will be sent to the Karapitiya Teaching Hospital laboratory for tests," the MOH further said.

However, convening a media briefing at the Defence Ministry yesterday (05), the Defence Secretary said that certain parts of his speech had been selected and coined making it look as if he was praising Bathiudeen. "I was invited to make a speech and during my speech I did not praise Bathiudeen but I did praise the services rendered by Mrs. P.S.M. Charles (Current Northern Governor) while she was the Vavuniya AG. The only statement I made about Bathiudeen was that he was the Resettlement Minister at the time. Other than that I never said a word about him. But, I did men-

tion that Mrs. Charles had been a great source of strength to me during difficult times on behalf of the state mechanism. However, what this certain media institution has done is coin two parts of my speech, omitting parts of my speech and making it sound as if I

was praising the former minister." The Defence Secretary played the recorded speech made by him during the event and it was clear that he had only mentioned the former minister with respect to the fact that he was the former Resettlement Minister. He said that it is understandable that media institutions are not in a

position to air entire speeches made by state officials, but added that the presenter in her introduction had stated that he (the Defence Secretary) had praised the former minister (Bathiudeen) prior to

airing the edited clip. Hence, he said this was a deliberate attempt to tarnish his name and cause him and the government embarrassment.

Gunaratne added that during his entire military career he had served the country with commit-

ment and as the Defence Secretary now, his only goal is to carry out the responsibilities entrusted to him in ensuring that the people of this country could live without fear and in safety. "I have taken on that responsibility very willingly and having faced

many challenges during my military service, I will not be deterred by any threat and will certainly commit myself to serve this country."

However, the Defence Secretary said that he intends to seek legal advice regarding this distortion of his speech, with the intention of delivering a wrong message to the public and tarnishing his reputation. "If the media behaves in a decent manner, then what they should do is take the essence of a speech and air it. It is a very low down act to select a single sentence from my speech and portray it in a very misleading manner," he

The Defence Secretary also said

Instructions have been issued to carry out random PCR tests in every district in the country as well in institutes. Especially, organizations where a large number of people are employed have been asked to conduct tests. However, it does appear that the factories with large work forces have neglected this responsibility, President added.

The general public and the media are obliged to assist the initiatives to control the spread of the pandemic with a clear understanding of the current situation. President also said that a thorough investigation should be carried out into the presence of COVID infected from the community after a lapse of two

Paying tribute to the great efforts by the Police and the Public Health Officers President emphasized the importance of carrying out that programme at village

Steps have already been taken to prevent people from leaving areas where infected patients were identified. Other factories and institutions in the area will be randomly checked.

The President also pointed out the need to conduct random inspections at workplaces with the participation of the private sector.

The Supreme Court's determination over the proposed constitutional amendment bill is to be communicated to the Speaker later.

The Supreme Court fivejudge-Bench comprised Chief Justice Jayantha Jayasuriya, Justices Buwaneka Aluwihare ra de Abrew, Priyantha Jayawardena and Vijith K. Malalgoda.

In his submissions, Attorney General Dappula de Livera informed the Supreme Court that all the clauses of the bill are consistent with the constitution. The Attorney General argued that there is no necessity to approve any provision in the bill by people at a referendum.

Thirty nine petitioners including including SJB General Secretary Ranjith Madduma Bandara, MP Mayantha Dissanayake, TNA leader R. Sampanthan, SJB Youth Organization Propaganda Secretary Rasika Jayakody had filed Special Determination petitions challenging the constitutionality of

the 20th Amendment to the Constitution.

Speaking at a media conference at the Health Promotion Bureau yesterday, Chief Epidemiologist of the Epidemiology Unit, Dr. Sudath Samaraweera yesterday said that a cluster of COVID-19 coronavirus has been created at Brandix Minuwangoda garment factory, and 71 people have been identified as having been infected with

He said that although there were large COVID-19 clusters in the Welisara and Kandakadu in the past, the risk was less as they were in the camps. but in this cluster the risk of community spreading is high since the infected persons came to work from their homes on a daily basis and were more exposed to society.

He further said that the risk of the disease spreading is high since the source of the infection was not vet covered.

He said that if there is anyone who has been associated with this factory in the last few days, they should stay at home and if there is any respiratory distress or complete symptom, they should inform the health officer in their area and seek immediate hospital treatment.

He also instructed the people to stay indoors as much as possible and go out only for essential purposes. People are also advised to refrain from congregating in large crowds. The Chief Epidemiologist further said that no

decision has been taken yet to postpone the forthcoming examinations and the relevant authorities will be informed about the situation within the next few days. He further said that the further spread of the disease will depend on the day to day behaviour of the people and the public is advised to extend their support by following the proper health guidelines.



Discuss cooperation in Green projects

As a follow up to the meeting held between the Foreign Ministers of Sri Lanka and Luxembourg on January 31, 2020 in Colombo, Sri Lanka Ambassador to Belgium, the Europe an Union and Luxembourg Ambassador Grace Asirwatham met with Dr. Werner Hoyer, President of the European Investment Bank (EIB) on September 24, 2020.

The discussion centred on the ongoing EIB activities in Sri Lanka and the possibilities of developing cooperation between Sri Lanka and the EIB in the field of Green projects. xcerpts from the recent interview the Daily News conducted with Pharmaceutical Production, Supply and Regulation State Minister Prof. Channa Jayasumana.

Q - What is the current situation of local drug production?

A - Sri Lanka imports drugs worth Rs. 130 billion annually. It is about 85 percent of the total annual drug requirement of the country. At the moment, local state and private sectors produce only 15 percent of the total drug requirement of the country. The State Pharmaceuticals Manufacturing Corporation (SPMC) owns a plant in Rathmalana and there are several other pharmaceutical manufacturing factories owned by private firms. They produce drugs required for the country.

Q - What are your future plans to increase local drug production?

A - We have multiple approaches. We are planning to establish a new plant for the SPMC in Rathmalana and there will be a budget proposal for that. The project will be completed within 24 months. This new plant will produce intraocular lenses, orthopaedic implants and some new drugs which are not produced in Sri Lanka at the moment. This will increase local drug production.

At the same time, joint ventures with the private sector, including local drug manufacturers and foreign investors, will be launched. We have already completed the first round of discussions and we will call expressions of interest to invite

Several other factories have already commenced the production of drugs. Within the next couple of months, we will open several more factories in collaboration with the SPMC and other local drug manufacturers. Within three years, Sri Lanka will be able to produce 50 percent of the total drug requirement of the country. In four years, Sri Lanka will be

self-sufficient in drugs. The pharmaceutical industry is one of the major areas that will be developed under the vision and mission of the current Government. We will establish two pharmaceutical manufacturing zones in Sri Lanka and one of them, which will be export-oriented, will be set up in Hambantota, close to the harbour. The other zone will be established at Oyamaduwa in the Anuradhapura District where the Deyata Kirula exhibition was held. Our target is to export pharmaceuticals to Eastern African and South East Asian regions. Some of the major pharmaceutical companies in the world have already expressed their interest to invest in the Hambantota zone. The project will create 5,000 new jobs for Sri Lankan youths. The country will be self-sufficient in pharmaceuticals in four years.

About 96 percent of the drugs used in the private health sector are imported. It is the responsibility of medical doctors to prescribe brands of drugs manufactured in Sri Lanka. At the same time, irrational use of drugs, especially antibiotics, by people is a major issue in the country.

Q - The National Medicines Regulatory Authority (NMRA)
Act, as well as some officials, were criticized by the media during the past for

various irregularities. What is the current situation and future plans for the NMRA?

A - We can conduct an internal inquiry if there are any formal complaints. But at the moment, we have not received any formal complaint with regard to the top officials of the NMRA.

The regulation of cosmetic devices is not included in the NMRA Act of 2015. I informed the NMRA to formulate a new Cosmetic Act and the first draft of this new Act is almost ready. I have already sent this first draft to different stakeholders, including the Cosmetic Manufacturers' Association of Sri Lanka, Government Medical Officers' Association (GMOA) and several other interested parties. I will proceed after I receive their comments and observations. I hope within the first quarter of the next year (2021), we may be able to introduce new regulations for cosmetics in the country. It will be a part of the existing NMRA Act. We are planning to amend the current NMRA Act.

Earlier, there was no strict time frame to register new drugs and formulas. Following the discussions with the NMRA, we have now introduced new time frames.

- Q During the previous regime, there were media reports on low-quality drug imports, especially cancer drugs and substandard drugs produced in shanties in some foreign countries. What is the current situation?
- A It is true that low-quality cancer drugs were imported to Sri Lanka during the previous regime and there were many irregularities. We are conducting internal inquiries and a report compiled by a Presidential Commission, which inquired about those irregularities, is already available. We hope to obtain legal advice in order to proceed further. We found that certain drugs imported to Sri Lanka during the previous regime had not been analyzed properly and there were failures in laboratory procedures. We updated and enhanced the laboratory procedures with the assistance of the Sri Lanka Institute of Nano Technology (SLINTEC), Sri Lanka Standard Institute (SLSI) and the Industrial Technology Institute (ITI).

According to the NMRA Act of 2015, a quality regulation laboratory should be available in the country though no such lab has yet been established. Therefore, the essential laboratory tests which have to be performed on all imported drugs and locally-produced drugs before being dispatched to the market were not properly analyzed in the past. I solved this matter with the assistance of the SLINTEC, SLSI and ITI.

Q - What will be the actions taken against the malpractices and corruption took place in your subject area during the previous regime,

which have already been exposed with evidence by a Presidential Commission Report?

A - There is no politics involved in this issue. Every possible legal action will be taken against all culprits involved in corruption and malpractices irrespective of their current positions, past and present political affiliations and social status etc. This Government is in the view that irrespective of all factors mentioned above, they should be punished according to the legal framework of the country.

People of this country should decide the fate of corrupt politicians of the previous regime. They have been elected to Parliament through people's mandate. A famous politician lost his seat due to his alleged involvement in corruption and malpractices in the pharmaceutical industry in the past and that was proved beyond reasonable doubt. He came back to Parliament. He became the Health Minister.

This should never happen again. It is up to people's judiciary to make sure that such individuals are not elected to Parliament ever again. A person who is involved in corruption and malpractices and punished by the law after proving beyond doubt should not come to Parlia-

Q - What do you think about the possibilities available for rich, unqualified foreign MBBS degree holders to become doctors in Sri Lanka, who even do not possess four simple passes in the Advanced Level Examination?

A - All local and foreign MBBS degree holders should be qualified. It should be educational qualifications; it is not money that is considered to become an MBBS doctor. Unfortunately, the previous Health Minister, misusing some powers vested in him, influenced the Sri Lanka Medical Council (SLMC) through a third party. He controlled the quality of the medical education of Sri Lanka. Some persons appointed by him are still in those positions. They are not allowing anyone to regularize the process.

Some foreign MBBS graduates do not have at least three simple passes (3S) in the Advanced Level (Science Stream) Examination. Some of them failed in all three subjects.

Then, how come they become MBBS doctors and work in Sri Lanka? This is very unfair and also a huge challenge to free education and free health service in the country. It is a huge injustice to the people of Sri Lanka and the safety of their lives.

I extend my full support for anything that has to be done against these unqualified doctors and the process of creating them which involves money. They are dealing with humans; not with metals or something



Patali's driver granted bail

The Colombo High Court yesterday ordered the withdrawal of the warrant and granted bail to former Minister Patali Champika Ranawaka's driver Dilum Thusith Kumara over the case filed for an alleged motor accident that took place in 2016 at Rajagiriya.

When the case was taken up before High Court Judge Damith Thotawatta, accused Dilum Thusith Kumara surrendered to the court filing a motion through a lawyer.

Accordingly, the Colombo High Court judge granted bail to the accused on an additional surety.

At a previous hearing, Dilum Thusitha Kumara, the driver of former Minister Patali Champika Ranawaka, who has been named as the second

accused in the case, was issued a warrant by the Colombo High Court for failing to appear in the court.

Accordingly, the High

Court Judge ordered the Colombo Crimes Division to arrest accused Dilum Thusitha Kumara and produce him before the court for not appearing before the court.

The case will be taken up again on October 12.

The case was filed against former Minister Patali Champika, his driver Thusith Dilum Kumara and ASP Sudath Asmadala over the hit-and-run accident at Rajagiriya in 2016.

On previous occasions, indictments were served on the three accused and ordered to release each accused on a cash bail of Rs.10,000 and two sureties of Rs.500, 000. The indictment comprising 16 charges was filed against all three accused on charges of fabricating false evidence, conspiracy of fabricating evidence and submitting false reports to the Court.

The main charge is relating to conspiring and fabricating false evidence to claim that it was Dilum Thusith Kumara who was driving the vehicle which caused the accident and another charge relates to him allegedly conspiring to conceal evidence in order to protect MP Patali Champika from legal penal-

ASP Sudath Asmadala was charged with producing a false report to the Colombo Magistrate's Court in order to protect former MP Patali Champika from legal

'Viable solution needed to prevent flooding'

Jayaweera Bandara, who was born and bred in Dehiwala, Hill Street to be exact, was known to me for a very long period of time. Jayaweera Bandara became associated with my family consequent to his marriage to Chandana Jayaweera Bandara, a Lawyer by profession herself.

Jayaweera Bandara's late father was a teacher by profession and served in the staff of Royal College. I remember my late father an old Royalist referring to Senior Jayaweera Bandara as a strict disciplinarian.

I got to know that the late erudite gentleman was very free with his cane and in the event of a revelation of an act of indiscipline, and if the student concerned did not admit to the same, he would cane the entire class. Jayaweera Bandara's late sister, Indrani, was a lawver in the corporate sector and his brother- in-law, Chula, was also a lawyer practiced in the Labour courts.

Jayaweera Bandara's wife, who has been a long-term friend of my family (whom I refer to as 'Aunty Chandi') hails from Chilaw. Her late father, Samson Rajapaksean, an advocate, was a close family friend of my late maternal

Chandi's late mother Lilian Clara de Silva Rajapakse's family being connected to my late great grandmother.

Aunty Chandi has two brothers and two sisters in her family who are all professionals, two of them being Lawyers. She had met Jayaweera Bandara when he had been stationed in Chilaw as the state prosecutor from the Attorney-General's Department. Consequent to their marriage, late

uncle Jayaweera has been closely associated with my family. A past pupil of Isipathana College, Colombo, he captained the school's first cricket team. Uncle Jayaweera excelled in the game of cricket at college, being classified as an all-rounder; he was also adjudged as the best bowler. Uncle Jayaweera was also the first advocate from Isipathana Col-

Consequent to taking oaths in 1972, he joined the Attorney-General's Department. He resigned from the department prior to me joining same, and his tenure in the Attorney-General's Department could be more aptly described by his superiors and peers at the time.

I recollect Uncle Jayaweera referring to the Attorney-General's Department as, "It is a unique place where one could



carries out his duties with dedication and integrity."

I remember Uncle Javaweera was very enthusiastic when I joined Sri Lanka Law College. He took it upon himself to tutor me in the subjects of Criminal Law and Evidence. He espoused the principles of evidence and relevancy. I remember him referring to me rather disdainfully with a tinge of sarcasm when I took an extremely long time to grasp a particular point of Law. He was a very quick-tempered person, and I believe I got off rather leniently due to the long-term mutual friendship that he and Aunt Chandi had with my late dear parents.

Uncle Jayaweera was a man of few words, rather reserved; but when he takes a liking to you, he becomes your lifelong friend. On many occasions during family events, I used to discuss many subjects with him: namely Law,

and cricket. Uncle Jayaweera used to always sit in

a place where he could observe the proceedings, and he was always a very keen observer and gave each and every person who comes to the function a cursory glance from head to toe, quietly observing the happenings and proceedings going on. Uncle Jayaweera and Aunty Chandi

have two sons, Gunika and Dr. Dinushka. Dr. Dinushka is married to Sudeshika, and they have two daughters: Ovini and Vihini. Gunika, who is a lawyer by profession, has, in Uncle Jayaweera's own words, built up his legal prowess and capabilities very rapidly.

Uncle Jayaweera lived his life by the 'Dhamma', and as a dutiful husband, father, and true friend. He passed away peacefully on August 21. May he attain the Supreme Bliss of Nibbana.

According to him, the Moragahakanda scheme's water management system, which was not properly implemented by the previous ghe recently held an inspection government, would be readjusted to provide drinking and irrigation water to more people.

The price of complacency

t is too early yet to jump to the conclusion if we are, indeed, in the throes of a second wave of the Coronavirus pandemic. However now is the time to redouble all efforts to ensure the health guidelines that were put in place of the early days of the virus in this country is strictly adhered to if our worst fears are not to come to pass.

We say this because it is by pure chance that the detection of the first community spread of Covid-19 case in two moths came about when a lady supervisor of a leading garment factory in Minuwangoda tested positive after been subjected to a cursory PCR test on leaving hospital to which she was admitted for some other illness. It was later found that her daughter too had contracted the virus following which all members of the family together with some 600 factory employees were placed under quarantine. Two other employees of the same garment factory who had returned home to Punguduthivu in Jaffna too had been put under self-quarantine together with 19 other first contacts of the duo. A search is also on to identify the passengers in which the two employees travelled all the way to the north following the factory supervisor testing positive for Covid-19.

According to Army Commander Lt General Shavendra Silva who also heads the Coronavirus Special Task Force they are now in the process of tracing the source that infected the factory supervisor which certainly is a difficult task given that it was a chance detection and there is no knowing for how long she had been carrying the virus and apart from the immediate family and her charges and associates in the factory who else she had been in contact with for according to the Lt. General a large number outsiders obviously had been circulating in the areas. For all intents and purposes the carrier could be an outsider making it doubly difficult to trace the source. A curfew had been clamped in Minuwangoda, Divulapitya and Veyangoda where child was schooling as a precaution to contain the virus, assuming of course that the source was within their confines. But like the Lt. General told a private TV channel last morning they are yet to determine the source and they were awaiting the PCR tests carried out on several hundred persons who are suspected to have been in close contact with the victim. At the time of writing the reports of the PCR testing were yet to be submitted and it is thereafter that the true extent of the seriousness of the situation could be gauged.


Such a sorry state of affairs would certainly have not come to pass if the public paid heed to the repeated warnings of the health experts not to let their guard down and follow the guidelines put in place, even though the Coronavirus, on the face of it, may have left our chores, based on the fears of a real possibility of the virus making a comeback in a second wave. However, in typical Sri Lankan style, after the initial vigilance and cautionary approach it did not take long to get back to square one, once the initial threat was seen off which made one wonder, if, after all, we were really amidst a deadly pandemic that has already claimed over one million lives the world over. Face masks were gradually dispensed with and the distance rule appeared to be a thing of the past with the reopening of offices and commercial establishments. Ditto for hotels, eateries and kiosks which started serving meals indoors contrary to the guidelines that only "take aways" are permitted. Public transport too followed suit with private buses carrying their usual 'loads' although the stipulation was that passengers would be limited to only seating capacity. Besides, the law enforcement themselves were guilty of letting the public get away with flouting health guidelines after the early days of the Coronavirus. Had the checks and restrictions been enforced with the same strictness and rigidity as before the present situation could easily have been averted. One should also not lose sight of the fact that quarantine centres are not limitless and capacities could shrink fast if there is a serious outbreak of the Coronavirus in this country. At present there are 72 quarantine centres which accommodate 7,000 persons and the number could grow at any moment.

The Health Ministry should get cracking without delay in devising emergency measures with the same commitment and resourcefulness its staff displayed in fighting the first outbreak of the Coronavirus ensuring all health guidelines that were in place being strictly

No doubt, the fears encountered during first phase of Coronavirus will teach the citizens to think anew regarding the precautions to be taken to protect themselves, health-wise, particularly the health guidelines to be adhered to in their interactions with society. It also brought about a new outlook in the people and had forced them out of their set routines and behavioural patterns, hitherto taken for granted. Hopefully, this experience will hold them in good stead to meet the challenge of any second wave on the horizon.

clause 9 of the 19th Amendment Chapter VIII (Cabinet of Ministers) which dealt with executive in the 1978 Constitution was repealed and replaced with a new Chapter VIII. The executive organs of Government in the 19th Amendment comprised (1) The President, (2) Prime Minister and (3) the Cabinet. The President is regarded as a member of the Cabinet who shall be the Head of the Cabinet (Article 42(3)).

The President appoints the Prime Minister from the Members of Parliament, who in the President's opinion is most likely to command the confidence of Parliament (Article 42 (4). Any Cabinet Minister may through a notification in the Gazette delegate to any Minister not in the Cabinet, any power or duty pertaining to any subject or function assigned to such Cabinet Minister (19th Amendment, Article 44(5)). These provisions widen the scope of activity of a Cabinet Minister. It would have been better, where the Cabinet Minister makes such delegation, the Cabinet Minister had the prior concurrence of the President to prevent confusion, overlapping, conflict and maladministration that may affect the government machinery.

The repeal and the replacement of Article 61E, found also in the Seventeenth Amendment, provides that the President shall appoint Heads of the Army, the Navy and the Air Force without the approval of the Constitutional Council, but he shall require the approval of the Constitutional Council, subject to which he shall appoint the Attorney-General and the Inspector General of Police. The President's power to appoint the three heads of the Armed Forces is derived from his position as the Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces. (19th Amendment, Article 30(1)).

The President has the power by Proclamation to summon, prorogue and dissolve Parliament. (Clause 17 of the 19th Amendment). However, the President shall not proclaim the dissolution of Parliament before there has been a lapse of four years and six months from the date of first meeting of that Parliament. However, the President may proclaim an earlier dissolution whenever twothirds of the whole number of members of the Parliament, when counted, including those who had been absent; had voted in support of the resolution (19th Amendment, Article 70(1) and the Proviso)). The adverse effect of this provision has been well noted in the recent past.

Article 78 of the Constitution requires every Bill to be published in the Gazette at least 7 days prior to it being placed on the Order Paper. The 19th Amendment has increased that period to 14 days, as inadequacy of seven days was experienced on this matter. The 19th Amendment has made an important change in Chapter XIII of the 1978 Constitution which deals with Referenda. That change has been brought about by repealing the whole of paragraph (2) of Article 85. That paragraph recognized the President's power at his sole discretion, to submit to a Referendum a Bill which had been rejected by Parliament. That power has now been taken away from the President by repealing that second paragraph of Article 85. In the context of the principle of cheque and balances between the President and Parliament, the Prespeople deserves that power.

The Right of Access to Information

The 1978 Constitution in Chapter III - Fundamental

These fundamental rights cover in the main civil and political rights (Articles 10 -14), the limitations of which are also found in Article 15 of the Constitution. The long felt a new addition to our FR Chapter is the Right of Access to Information incorporated as Article 14A under the 19th amendment. This fundamental right is really a salutary addition to our FR Chapter. That Constitutional right of access to information (RTI) is provided to every citizen to obtain information held by a wide variety of public authorities that control its sources. These sources are described in the amended Article 14A of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution. It lists the following sources as:

(a) the State, a Ministry or any Government Department or any statutory body established or created by or under any law; (b) any Minister of a Minister of the Board of Ministers of a Province or any department or any statutory body established or created by a statute of a Provincial Council (c) any local authority; and (d) any other person, who is in possession of such information relating to any institution referred to in sub-paragraph (a) (b) or (c).

In terms of Article 14A (2) no restrictions shall be placed on the right declared and recognized by this Article, other than such restrictions prescribed by law as are necessary in a democratic society. Since the Supreme Court jurisdiction in this matter is provided for in that Article in the original Article 122, this original Article may be retained. ■ The original Article 92

found in the 1978 Constitution in paragraph (a) placed the requirement to achieve a minimum age of thirty years upon a person who wishes to contest, as a Presidential Candidate. While the 17th Amendment made no changes to Article 92 of the Constitution, the 18th Amendment amended that Article by the repeal of Paragraph (c) of that Article. The 19th Amendment increased that age from 30 years to thirty-five years (19th Amendment, Article 92(1)(a)). It appears that there is no rationale for this change from the age of 30 years to 35 years, other than personal views.

An important amendment to Article 91 found in the 19th Amendment is the exclusion of 'a citizen of Sri Lanka who is also a citizen of any other country' to be elected as a Member of Parliament. (Article 91(4) (viii)). Any dilution to the existing law as introduced by the 19th Amendment which bans dual citizen from being elected to Parliament need be carefully reviewed as such dilution may infringed on the constitutionally accepted principles of peoples' sovereignty, nationality and franchise.

In the final analysis, the 19th Amendment by the public experience is really a great obstacle to the proper governance of the country, to the proper national development and maintaining law and order and national security. Surprisingly, the 19th Amendment blocked the acceptance by the Executive President, being also Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of Ministerial

which needs to be corrected.

The President's powers relating to summoning and dissolution of Parliament under the 19th Amendment also created deep issues. It is undoubted that auditing and procurement processes are vital and there are laws in place to manage them. But two Commissions - The Audit Commission and The National Procurement Commission under the 19th Amendment by their conduct have not proved to be of

vital institutions. Outcomes even without politics are visible to the people. The 19th Amendment does not appear to have been drafted even to realize the true mandate received by the then government due to some element of malice ignoring the realization of the true 'good governance' principles. It failed, except a few, not only in principle but also in practice due to rivalry politics.

The 19th Amendment led to three power centres - the President, the Prime Minister and the Speaker within the government which in turn weakened governance and was detrimental to the country. This is mainly due to inherent technical issues of the 19th Amendment further worsened by the unhealthy attitudes of those exercising three power centres and application of different political ideology.

The inclusion of civil activists in the Constitutional Council also created issues and they proved themselves to be unfit at that top decision making body. Since the Constitutional Council led by the Speaker through its powers has restrained and overstepped the due executive powers of the President mandated by the people, Constitutional should be given only observational powers and failing which President can go ahead with such appointments.

Therefore it is recommended that leaving several salutary provisions of the 19th Amendment remained unchanged as stated at the beginning, the rest of the 19th Amendment be abolished by enacting a new Amendment to meet the urgent need subject to enacting a well thought Constitution as per public mandate.

ri Lanka enjoyed more-thanenough development intelligence, exerted by multitudinous expertise and contradicting politics. Yet, what was able to be succeeded by all of them represents no development independence. 19. Why? The most central issue will be food. The proposed programme will make the community pandemic-surviving and they will be able to spend the period with less frustration and mitigated mental stress.

It is high time for Sri Lanka to be initiated into the garden cultivation component of the permaculture, aimed at producing food in suburbs and villages, promoting energy efficiency and self-production. Here, the enterprise starts from one's own voluntary wish and from one's own home. It is here, more than all other sectors of permaculture, the imagination and the flair of the solutions adopted are surprising.

The selection of plant species to cultivate in outside home spaces should be based primarily on their ability to cope with the harsh conditions of the environment, such as high wind and radiance, lack of organic material and nutrients, and intermittent drought. Therefore, careful plant selection should be integrated into outside space design. There are increased a biotic stresses, such as disturbance, pollution, drought, radiation, heat and microclimate extremes. Besides, there might be a rush on vegetable seedlings in garden centers, because many more people, may want to grow their food. The spread of Covid-19 has caused panic buying at supermarkets, so many families can skip the supermarket and head to their local garden centre to grow their own and become self-sufficient. Therefore, it might be often necessary to wait on average for a week or a couple of, to get seedlings.

Advantages of agro-engineered gardening

From various sites on the web, it is possible to draw countless ideas for designing and managing a small home garden. Regardless of space and financial availability, the farmers can devise their slice of food independence. The most important thing is to start and be ready to try, without being afraid of making mistakes.

A vegetable garden in the village has many advantages. First, you will produce healthy vegetables for yourself. Then, there is the psycho-physical well-being that comprises doing a little physical activity and enjoying the satisfaction of seeing your vegetables grow. Even at the community level, a vegetable garden has its positive sides: a green spot in the cement brightens the view, purifies the air, and cools the environment because of plant transpiration. On an ecological level, an agro-engineered garden is a refuge and a shelter for many animals.

This BR Wisdom Project has been planned to implement this big season, giving priority to improve the home economy while integrating in to large-scale development programs. It will need the services of a circle of officers, comprising: (1) Grama Niladhari (2) Samurdhi Niladhari (3) Agricultural Research Procurement Assistant Office (4) Economic Officer and (5) Family Health Services Officer. The gardens must be rightly identified through rural officers at: (1) national level (2) provincial level (3) district level and (4) the regional level. The gardens will have to be well monitored chronologically under specially appointed supervising committees.

Water is the most important issue. On terraces, there are usually rain gutters. Instead of wasting rain water, which moreover is of excellent quality, as it is salt-free, a tank can be adapted for the collection of rain water. The lid, necessary to avoid water evaporation, should be perforated to facilitate the entry of the tube. Considering the heat in the summer month and the outrageous demand for water due to transpiration and evapo-transpiration, an additional reserve of water is useful and falls within the perspective of sustainability and saving of natural resources. If the water is in excess, the accumulated water will also be very useful for other cleaning purposes.

The project designer is reported to have decided to give Vegetables, fruits, spice processing plants, Osu plants, export agricultural plants, wooden plants etc. to the selected gardens under this vision and for those areas, which are suitable for more fruit. Also the focus is on domestic chicken control, goat control, mirage tanks, garden reservoirs and fish farming in garden mud ponds, and developing the domestic milk industry. It is also hoped to empower the women to find solutions to social issues by building an economic situation that can contribute to the family economy by preventing women from focusing on jobs in the Middle East. The sending of Sri Lankan mothers and sisters to Middle East, has become such a disgusting issue, it has acquired the status of a factor, which ruins the dignity of Sri Lankan women. Though, it brings foreign exchange to Sri Lanka, the practical side of it is not only tear-inviting, but also extremely painful. No government took any initiative to stop this quagmire, being incited by the greed for foreign currency.

The Prosperity Production Task Force Chairman Basil Rajapaksa emphatically stressed that the Garden Agro-Engineering Project would serve as a powerful means to protect our environs, being contaminated and destroyed by various actors. It will plant an innovative attitude in the minds of farmers, their assistants and family members to respect and love fauna and flora. The psychology would be really strong, since, it begins from one's home. The project will create the space to produce a fertile soil, which contains no artificial and harmful chemicals. Hence, having food, not poisoned by murderous chemicals, Sri Lanka is going to have a healthy nation, which can make a positive contribution to the economy.

This project also can serve as a solid foundation to bring back our ancestral self-sufficiency doctrine of trinity- Tank, Dagoba and Temple. With this enriched morality, the divided Sinhala Buddhist can unite in to one strong community, the members of which, with other Tamil and Muslim minority communities, are ever ready fight for the freedom, independence and the security of the Motherland. In order to live what is required is: food, water, home, clothes and clean air. Depositing the food security in the operation of import from other countries, will never guard Sri Lanka against food threats. The corona crisis convinced it. The construction of the tallest tower in South Asia will have no commendable impact, if the starving children are looking for food in the dustbin, kept outside with leftover food. The voters of Sri Lanka must be grateful to the Prosperity Production Presidential Task Force Chairman Basil Rajapaksa, for taking the firm decision to execute this timely project, which all his predecessors forgot or failed to implement.

Nature and Biodiversity for a Sustainable Future

"Investing in nature is investing in a sustainable future," was one of the key messages from yesterday's first-ever United Nations Summit on Biodiversity where world leaders and experts agreed on the urgency to act swiftly to preserve biodiversity globally.

percent of the world's are endangered due to overfishing, destructive practices and climate change," U.N. Secretary General António Guterres said in his opening remarks at the biodiversity summit, which was held as the 75th Session of the U.N. General Assembly wrapped up this week.

This loss doesn't come without a cost. Guterres added that according to an Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) estimate, the amount of money required for sustainability of nature is about \$300 – 400 billion, which is less than "current levels of harmful subsidies for agriculture, mining and other destructive industries"

Guterres also pointed out how this disproportionately affects poor com-

According to the Convention on



Biological Diversity, between 50 to 90 percent of the livelihoods of poor households comes from ecosystems.

"Nature offers business opportunities to poor communities, from sustainable farming to eco-tourism or subsistence fishing," Guterres said.

This year was especially crucial given the COVID-19 pandemic and the havoc it wreaked across communities around the world.

Volkan Bozkir, president of the General Assembly, pointed out the world's inability to ensure preservation of biodiversity severely impedes the ability to fight diseases — a result that is being witnessed firsthand this year. It also negatively affects food security, water supplies, and livelihoods, among other issues. "We must be pragmatic: our

healthcare systems rely upon rich biodiversity," Bozkir said. "Four billion people depend upon natural medicines for their health, and 70 percent of drugs used for cancer treatments are drawn from nature."

Chinese President Xi Jinping addressed the meeting, extending a warm welcome for next year's Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (COP 15) scheduled to take place in China.

"More than half of the world's nature," he added.

"COP15 offers an opportunity for parties to adopt new strategies for global biodiversity governance," Xi

Xi proposed a list of steps that leaders can take in order to ensure



biodiversity preservation around the

Adhere to ecological civilisation and increase the drive for building a beautiful world, given that a sound ecosystem is crucial for the prosperity of civilisation. "We need to respect nature, follow its laws, and protect it," he said. "We need to find a way for man and nature to live in harmony, balance and coordinate economic development and ecological protec-

Uphold multilateralism and build synergy for global governance on the environment. "Faced with the risks and challenges worldwide, countries share a common stake as passengers [on] the same boat, and form a community with a shared future," Xi said. "To enhance global governance on the

environment, we must firmly safeguard the U.N.-centred international system, and uphold the sanctity and authority of international rules.

Meanwhile, panelists at a "Fireside Chat" panel brought up the importance of including indigenous communities in the conversation.

Inger Andersen, executive director of the U.N. Environment Programme, said the indigenous community is "critical" to this conversation.

"Let's recall they are the owners and managers of one quarter of global land area, and one third of protected areas," Andersen said. "So safeguarding their right to their land is part of safeguarding biodiversity."

Ana Maria Hernandez Salgar, the first woman chair of the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES), also shared a similar sentiment as she reflected on what, in her experience, has led to true change.

"We have to work collectively: governments, individuals, private sector, academia, we need to address the root cause of biodiversity loss - it works, Salgar said.

Elizabeth Maruma Mrema, the appointed Executive Secretary of the Convention on Biological Diversity, also spoke on the same panel and added that it's important not to lose sight of the fact that biodiversity, on top of being a concern, is also a solution to some of the sustainable development goals (SDGs).

"We know, 14 out of the 17 SDGs depend on biodiversity, from naturebased solutions, to climate, to food, water, security, sustainable livelihood: biodiversity remains the basis for sustainable future and sustainable development," Mrema said.


Perhaps the conversation on the link between biodiversity preservation and humans was most aptly put forth by Achim Steiner of the U.N. Development Programme who moderated the panel.

At the core of the preservation efforts is how we view the issue, Steiner said.

"Biodiversity has as much to do with nature as it has to do with people, people's dependence on nature, people's inability to see the complexities of nature, people's blindness and sometimes greed and ignorance and also the planetary blindspots of our econo-

JAPAN'S INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION DAY TODAY

QUALITY INFRASTRUCTURE ECHOES SPIRIT OF COLOMBO PLAN

he Colombo Plan (The Colombo Plan for Cooperative Economic and Social Development in Asia and the Pacific) is a regional intergovernmental organization which was established in Sri Lanka in 1951 for the purpose of providing assistance, mainly through technical cooperation for the economic and social advancement of the peoples of South and Southeast Asia.

On October 6, 1954, Japan decided to join the Colombo Plan. With this decision, Japan made a fresh start as a donor country and Japan's Official Development Assistance (ODA) began. Thus, in 1987, the Government of Japan designated October 6 as International Cooperation Day. The Colombo Plan will celebrate the 70th anniversary next year.

Japan's assistance to Sri Lanka

Japan has been a close partner in Sri Lanka's social and economic development, and provided Sri Lanka with assistance equivalent to 1,445 billion Japanese Yen (approximately Rs. 2,530 billion) since 1965 as of the end of the Japanese fiscal year of 2018, in the form of grants, Yen loans and technical cooperation mainly by the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). Japan's assistance to Sri Lanka ranges from large-scale infrastructure development to community development at the grassroots level together with human resources development.

The construction of Southern Expressway, Baseline Road, Upper Kotmale Hydro Power, Sri Jayewardenepura, Anuradhapura and Jaffna hospitals and the expansion of the Colombo Port are examples of Japanese-assisted projects. In addition, the Project for Construction of New Bridge over the Kelani River and the Bandaranaike International Airport Development Project are among the ongoing projects.

The Government of Japan's assistance is based on

its Country Development Cooperation Policy for Sri Lanka, which aligns with Sri Lanka's policies and long-term development needs. Based on the principle of "promoting high quality and inclusive growth", the Government of Japan gives priority to the following three areas: "promoting quality growth," "development cooperation for inclusive growth," and "mitigating vulnerability."

(1) Promoting quality growth

In order to help Sri Lanka achieve quality growth, the Government of Japan actively supports infrastructure development in sectors such as transportation, energy, water supply and sewerage, eyeing utilization of Japan's advanced technology, both in hardware (physical) and software (institutional).

(2) Development cooperation for inclusive growth

Regional and individual disparities have been major challenges for Sri Lanka. Japan is, therefore, committed to supporting the development of industries and human resources especially in conflict-affected areas with a focus on agriculture, improvement of basic infrastructure that contributes directly to people's lives and their industrial activities, and women's economic empowerment in order to improve livelihoods of the people in these areas.

Japan is recognized as a leading donor in supporting demining operations in the conflict affected areas which is a prerequisite for the resettlement of people. Since 2002, Japan has provided US\$ 37 million (approximately Rs. 6.7 billion) for demining activities in the Northern and Eastern Provinces under its "Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP)" administered by the Embassy of Japan. The GGP scheme provides assistance also for a variety of grassroots level projects mostly through local NGOs.

(3) Mitigating Vulnerability

Sri Lanka, being an island nation like Japan, is seriously affected by monsoon and vulnerable to natural disasters such as heavy rain. It is also vulnerable in social service due to the delay in establishing its service delivery system. To prepare for measures to mitigate its vulnerability, Japan provides physical and institutional assistance to develop and strengthen the Sri Lankan Government's capacity for tackling climate change and natural disaster risk reduction

At the time of the Indian Ocean earthquake and tsunami in 2004, the Government of Japan immediately dispatched a disaster relief team to be followed by various support in both tangible and intangible ways, including rehabilitation of bridges and mental health care for the affected people.

(4) People-centered Development

One of the most remarkable features of Japan's assistance is people-centred development. Capacity building of the people in Sri Lanka through trainings or technical cooperation is a key for achieving sustainable development goals. As of Fiscal Year 2018, over 13,366 Sri Lankans were provided trainings, while 1,148 JICA Volunteers and 2,958 Japanese experts were dispatched to Sri Lanka cumulatively.

Examples include the Japanese Grant Aid for Human Resources Development Scholarship (JDS) Programme which offers public officers opportunities to study post-graduate courses in Japan in order to develop their expertise. Since its commencement in FY2010 up to FY2018, 135 officials have completed Masters Degree in Japan, and Japan started to provide two officials every year with the opportunity to study Doctoral courses in Japan from FY2018.

These initiatives enhance not only Sri Lanka's sustainable development but also the friendship between the peoples of both countries.

Bridge Construction Projects

The domestic passenger and cargo transport highly depend on road transportation in Sri Lanka and the steady and rapid economic growth boosts demand for transportation. Many major bridges on National roads across the country are over 100 years old, and the old bridges become bottlenecks in the highway sections crucial for economic activities including tourism, due to their poor conditions and insufficient width. The Project aims to construct the major bridges on the National road network, in order to ensure smooth road transportation, thereby contributing to economic development.

Quality Infrastructure Development

Developing countries face growing needs for infrastructure development. To achieve inclusive, sustainable, and resilient "quality growth," it is necessary to promote "quality infrastructure investment" for bridging the infrastructure gap, which has become a bottleneck against global economic growth. The importance of quality infrastructure investment has been confirmed in recent years by the G20, APEC, the FfD, and the 2030 agenda for sustainable development, etc.

In 2019, at the G20 Osaka Summit, G20 Countries including emerging donors endorsed the "G20 Principles for Quality Infrastructure Investment" as follows:

Principle 1: Maximizing the Positive Impact of Infrastructure to Achieve Sustainable Growth and Development (job creation, transfer of expertise, enhancing connectivity etc.)

Principle 2: Economic Efficiency in View of Life-Cycle Cost (attaining value for money etc.)

Principle 3: Environmental Considerations
Principle 4: Resilience against Natural Disaster and Other Risks

Principle 5: Social Considerations (Open access to infrastructure services safety respect nender and socially vulnerable neonle etc.)

vices, safety, respect gender and socially vulnerable people etc.) **Principle 6:** Strengthening Infrastructure Governance (Openness and

transparency of procurement, debt sustainability etc.)
Japan will continue to support quality infrastructure development for transportation/better connectivity between urban and rural areas, stable power supply, and water supply and wastewater management, among others, to respond to the growing economic activities and urbanization in Sri Lanka.

Ambassador Sugiyama Akira's Message

-From the Memory of Colombo Plan towards the Era of "Quality Infrastructure"-

It is my honour to commemorate Japan's International Cooperation Day in Colombo, the city where the initiative for a new framework of regional cooperation, capped with the name of the city, was first conceived in 1950- upon which Japan has shaped its new role in the aftermath of World War II.

Sixty-six years ago, on this day, October 6, 1954, a historic decision to join "the Colombo Plan" was made by the Cabinet of the Government of Japan. This decision has set the new course for redefining Japan's identity as a major development partner in the international community, and to mark the aspirations of this epoch, October 6 was inscribed as International Cooperation Day on the first page of the history

of Japanese Official Development Assistance (ODA). It is, thus, most befitting for us to revisit the genesis of the Colombo Plan today, to which International Cooperation Day is inseparably connected, while recalling its founding principles authored by the leading architects of the Colombo Plan, amongst whom Sri Lankan luminaries stood at the helm when the world was in search of the new order of stability and peace.

At the outset of the Colombo Plan, greater emphasis was placed on the Technical Cooperation Scheme with a view to developing human resources as the agency of consolidating the foundation of the nation building. Led by this currency of the times, the Japanese assistance to Sri Lanka, which started in 1955, also commenced with technical cooperation backed

by the rich experience and knowledge accumulated rapidly during the industrial revolution in the Meiji Era, which had also contributed to the post-war economic recovery and development in Japan.

Technical cooperation not only facilitates the transfer of technology, but also fosters the bond of friendship most naturally through the training programmes with the human touch. To date, over 13,350 Sri Lankan prospective leaders have received training opportunities under Japanese ODA programmes. One of the iconic figures to recall in this context is Deshamanya Dr. Polwattearachchige Romiel Anthonis, a world-renowned surgeon who had been trained in Japan. He is one of the first recipients of the Colombo Plan Scholarship, and who had pursued professional guidance from Prof. Nakayama Komei at Chiba University, known to be, as Dr. Anthonis described, "the greatest surgeons of the time". The legacy of Deshamanya Dr. Anthonis is a culmination of enduring strength that technical cooperation is endowed with, which features human-centred development, that elicits inspiration in our hearts unfadingly.

Over the nearly seven decades, the Japanese economic cooperation towards Sri Lanka has evolved in close consonance with the genuine development needs of the Sri Lankan people. Currently, the Government of Japan's assistance to Sri Lanka, based on the principle of "promoting high-quality and inclusive growth," gives priority to i) promoting quality growth, ii) development cooperation for inclusive growth, and iii) mitigating vulnerability. In order to achieve the first goal, that is, promoting high-quality growth of Sri Lanka, Japan has extended assistance for developing infrastructure in wide-ranging areas, including transportation, energy, water supply, waste water management, and irrigation.

In recent years, Japan launched an initiative of "Quality Infrastructure" development, which, in our view, leads to resilient, inclusive and sustainable growth of developing countries. "Quality Infrastructure" should be developed in accordance with international standards, with particular emphasis on (i) open access, (ii) transparency, (iii) economic efficiency including life-cycle cost, and (iv) financial viability of recipient countries. This concept is gaining currency in the international community. In 2016, when Japan hosted the G7 Ise-Shima Summit, the G7 leaders agreed upon the "G7 Ise-Shima Principles of Promoting Quality Infrastructure Investment." In addition, at the G20 Osaka Summit in 2019, under Japan's leadership, G20 countries including emerging donors endorsed "G20 Principles of Quality Infrastructure Investment", which includes the four priority elements I just mentioned. Japan, under this concept, will continue to engage in the development of infrastructure in Sri Lanka most diligently, with special focus on ports, airports, power supply, water supply, sewage system, and irrigation, among others, to correspond to the vision of the Government of Sri Lanka. I would like to add that "Quality Infrastructure" will contribute to enhancing "physical connectivity" in the Indo-Pacific region, leading to the peace, stability and prosperity across the region.

The spirit of Colombo Plan rests on "Planning Prosperity Together" which is characterized by building and sustaining "win-win-win" relationships between donors, recipients and stakeholders along with the vision of mutual benefit, the common good, inclusiveness as well as equality and the right of the peoples and the nations as its founding principles. It is my humble belief that the universality and timelessness of the spirit and principles must have served as one of the major reasons for the resiliency of "harmonious federation" of the Colombo Plan, despite the fact that the world has witnessed a cauldron of major changes over the last seven decades since its establishment.

As the center of gravity shifts towards the Indo-Pacific regions, where the greater majority of the member states of the Colombo Plan are the stakeholders, the growing relevance of the founding principles of the Colombo Plan merit renewed appreciation. As observed above in my historical account of International Cooperation Day, Japanese ODA is inseparably connected to the same lofty principles of the Colombo Plan -the principles that are deeply rooted in the spirit of mutual cooperation and compassion- which, with its unchallengeable humanity, will guide us a long way into the future, as it has done in the past.

BIA Development Project

WARS, SCANDALS and now COVID-19 thwarts 2020 NOBELS

SWEDEN: Wars, jailed laureates and diplomatic rows have occasionally put the brakes on the Nobel prizes through the years. This time it is the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic that has thwarted plans, and while prize announcements will go ahead this week, December festivities will be scaled back.

The traditional December 10 awards ceremony and banquet in Stockholm honouring the laureates in medicine, physics, chemistry, literature and economics has been replaced by a televised event where the winners will receive their prizes in their

The Oslo ceremony for the peace prize, held on the same day, will meanwhile go ahead on a smaller scale, and that banquet

has also been cancelled. Here are some previous occasions when

the Nobels didn't go as planned.

The committees tasked with selecting Nobel laureates in the fields of medicine, physics, chemistry, literature, peace and economics can refrain from awarding the prize. The Nobel Foundation's statutes say this is possible when no work or research is deemed worthy.

Not awarding the prize can also be an honour. In 1948, several months after the death of Mahatma Gandhi, the Nobel Peace Prize was not awarded, a homage to the Indian pacifist who never won the prize -- widely considered a historic omission. The committee at the time said "there was no suitable living can-

In total, 49 prizes have not been awarded since the first Nobels in 1901, most of them in the field of peace (16 times). The prize can also be postponed.

That was the case in 2018, when a scandal engulfed the Swedish Academy which selects the literature prize winner. The 2018 prize was awarded instead the following year, to Polish author Olga Tokarczuk.

While Sweden remained neutral during the two world wars, the Nobel committees often refrained from awarding the prizes, especially during World War II. Both moral and logistical reasons were cited, as well as the fact that the committees in Stockholm no longer had access to scientific publications.

Norway, which awards the peace prize, was meanwhile occupied by Nazi Germany from April 1940. The peace prize was not awarded between 1939 and 1945, when the 1944 prize was awarded retroactively to the Red Cross. In Stockholm, the prizes were

awarded again from 1944, though the prize ceremony in December was cancelled.

In 1924, organisers cancelled the formal prize ceremonies in Stockholm and Oslo because of a combination of ailing laureates, including Polish writer Wladyslaw Reymont, and the fact that the chemistry and peace prizes were not awarded. That was the only time the ceremonies have

been cancelled in peacetime. Meanwhile, the celebratory banquet traditionally held after the December 10 prize ceremony at Stockholm's City Hall was cancelled in 1956 to avoid inviting the Soviet ambassador because of the repression of the Hungarian Revolution. An unofficial, smaller dinner was organised instead.

Several laureates have over the years been unable to attend the Nobel ceremony for political reasons.

German journalist and pacifist Carl Von Ossietzky was detained in a Nazi concentration camp and was unable to receive his peace prize in 1936. He died two years later.

Myanmar opposition leader Aung San Suu Kyi was under house arrest when she won the peace prize in 1991 and was unable to accept her prize in person until 2012.

In 2010, Chinese dissident Liu Xiaobo was in prison when he was awarded the peace prize. His chair remained empty, where the prize was placed. He

died in 2017. In the case of Alexander Solz-

henitsyn, the Soviet writer was forced to decline his 1970 literature prize, fearing that he would not be able to return to his country should he travel to receive it. He finally accepted the award four years later.

Several laureates have declined their prizes, including two who did so of their own

French philosopher Jean-Paul Sartre turned the literature prize down in 1964, and although Russian author Boris Pasternak accepted it in 1958, Soviet authorities later forced him to decline it.

In 1973, Vietnam's peace negotiator Le Duc Tho refused to share the peace prize with US Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, arguing that the ceasefire ending the Vietnam War was not being respected.

Kissinger meanwhile refused to travel to Oslo for the prize ceremony because of the risk of protests, and was replaced by the US ambassador.

In the 1930s, three German scientists were awarded Nobels: Richard Kuhn (1938) and Adolf Butenandt (1939) in chemistry, and Gerhard Domagt (1939) in medicine.

But Hitler -- outraged over the prize to Von Ossietzky -- barred any German from accepting a Nobel, and they were forced to decline their prizes. They received their Nobels after the war. - AFP

UK: The United Kingdom passed 500,000 confirmed coronavirus infections on Sunday, official figures showed, in the latest grim milestone for the European country worst-hit by the pandemic.

Health authorities blamed a technical glitch for a sudden spike in cases announced in evening figures that had kept several thousand cases from the last week of September off the official tally.

Sunday's numbers showed 22,961 cases for the day, a rise of more than 10,000 on Saturday's figures.

Officials said the issue had now been resolved and earlier cases missed in the official count would be included in future figures.

The United Kingdom has now recorded 502,978 COVID-19 cases since the start of the pandemic, with more than 42,000 deaths. In an interview with the

Cineworld temporarily shuts cinemas on COVID-19 coronavirus impact

UK: British cinema chain Cineworld announced Monday that is temporarily shutting cinemas in Britain and the United States, as coronavirus pandemic delays major new films like the latest James Bond spy blockbuster.

The company said in a statement that it will suspend its 127 Cineworld and Picturehouse theatres in Britain from Thursday, and 536 Regal theatres in the US.



Maduro's son to join Sputnik V vaccine trial

VENEZUELA: Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro said Sunday his son will join trials of Sputnik V, the coronavirus vaccine which was met with caution when Russia announced it was the world's first to be approved.

An initial batch of the vaccine arrived in Venezuela on Friday, the government announced, and 2,000 residents will participate in the trials.

"In this clinical trial phase, my son, Nicolas Ernesto Maduro Guerra, told me of his decision to be vaccinated with the Russian vaccine, to join the trial. I think it is very good," the socialist leader said in a speech on state television network VTV.

Maduro's sister is also a volunteer for the clinical trials.

Maduro Guerra, 30, is also a politician and a member of his father's governing United Socialist Party of Venezuela (PSUV).

Named "Sputnik V" after the historic Soviet-era satellite, the vaccine was met with skepticism from the global medical communi-

Russia in August declared itself the first country to approve a coronavirus vaccine, although it is still undergoing large-scale clinical trials after promising results.

The drug is currently in Phase 3, the human testing state, and according to Moscow, more than 40,000 volunteers have been inoculated during the process

"When the entire scientific, clinical and testing phase is closed, voluntary vaccination will come... As soon as we start mass vaccination, I am going to be the first one to get it," Maduro said.

Russia has been one of Maduro's main backers in the face of international pressure led by Washington, which seeks to displace him from power because it considers his reelection to have been fraudu-

The US, as well as some 50 other countries, recognize Maduro's opponent, National Assembly speaker Juan Guaido, as Venezuela's interim president.

Guaido slammed the decision to participate in the Russian trials. saying, "They use our people as guinea pigs.'

According to official figures, as of Saturday, Venezuela has registered 77,646 cases of Covid-19 out of the entire 30 million population, and 649 deaths. These numbers are disputed by the country's opposition and international organizations such as Human Rights Watch. - AFP

France, Italy step up flood rescue efforts

FRANCE: French and Italian rescue services stepped up search efforts Sunday after floods cut off several villages in the mountainous border regions, causing widespread damage and killing at least four people.

Others remained unaccounted for on the French side of the border after storms, torrential rain and flash floods battered the area, washing away roads and houses, cutting off entire villages and triggering land-

Emergency services recovered at least four bodies Sunday on the Mediterranean coast of Liguria, Italy, ANSA

news agency and other Ital-

ian media reported. Italian and French teams were working together to try to identify them, but it was not yet clear that they were victims of the flooding or if their deaths had another cause. French rescue workers are still looking for eight people listed as missing, after people saw them swept away in the flood waters. Another 12 people are also unaccounted for.

In Breil-sur-Roya, a French village close to the Italian border, houses were buried in mud and turnedover cars were stuck in the riverbed.

A pile of vehicles on a street in Breil-sur-Roya, south-eastern France after extensive flood-

ing caused widespread damage in the Alpes-Maritimes department. - AFP

Rescue efforts were concentrated on the Roya valley where roughly 1,000 firefighters, backed by helicopters and the army, resumed their search for survivors and helped people whose homes were destroyed or

inaccessible. Storm Alex barrelled into France's west coast on Thursday, bringing powerful winds and rain across the country before moving into northern Italy.

"What we are going through is extraordinary,' said Bernard Gonzalez, prefect of the Alpes-Maritimes region, after as much centimetres (two

feet) of rain fell in 24 hours in the worst-affected areas. Italy confirmed two people died Saturday, a volunteer firefighter on a rescue operation and a man whose car was washed away.

France also announced two fatalities. The first found was a shepherd whose body was pulled from a river near the border. Firefighters later announced a man had been found dead in his car in the southeastern village of Saint-Martin-Vesubie.

France has declared the region a natural disaster

Saint-Martin-Vesubie, a village home to 1,400 north of Nice, was completely cut off by the storm.

A bedraggled group of tourists and residents gathered in the village square to be airlifted to safety, an AFPTV journalist said after reaching the site on foot.

The Presidents of Italy's Piedmont and Liguria regions signed a joint letter calling on the government to declare a state of emergency with several villages cut off.

"The situation is very serious. It is like it was in 1994," when 70 died after the Po and Tarano rivers flooded, president, Piedmont's Alberto Cirio, told La Stampa newspaper. - AFP

103-year-old woman survives COVID-19

MEXICO: A 103-year-old Mexican woman suffering from a chronic pulmonary disease has survived a bout of COVID-19, the Mexican Social Security Institute announced.

The institute (IMSS), which is part of the Mexican healthcare system, said the woman, identified only as Dona Maria, had been hospitalized for 11 days.

She had tested positive for the virus but, despite her pulmonary problems, did not have other aggravating factors such as diabetes, obesity or high blood pressure.

"That's what contributed to her treatment," the IMSS said in a statement Saturday.

The woman was admitted on September 22 to a regional hospital in Guadalajara in western Jalisco state, suffering from fever, breathing trouble and a runny nose. She did not require a ventilator.

"She was always very cheerful, lucid, talking to the doctors. Even at the end, she urged us to take care of ourselves. Her progression was very good; her symptoms have disappeared," said hospital director David Sanchez. - AFP

COVID-19 VACCINE alone won't curb spread of virus, report warns

UK: A report of Royal Society's DELVE (Data Evaluation and Learning for Viral Epidemics) Initiative suggests that there are serious challenges to developing, evaluating, manufacturing and distributing the vaccine.

A successful vaccine stimulates immune responses that negate chances of transmission of infection and reduce risk and severity of disease. It also ensures long term protection so that people do not have to be re-vaccinated frequently.

Currently, scientists have not been able to put their finger on SARS-CoV-2 infection's immune responses. They do not even know if the infection has any immune responses. Antibodies and T cells have been detected in those who have recovered from the virus, but it is not clear whether it leads to protection against reinfection, according to the report.

Over 200 SARS-CoV-2 vaccine candidates are currently in development, with a handful being in later stages of clinical trials. Some of the candidates that are in later stages of trials, such as the Oxford/Astrazeneca candidate, have used 'viral vectors' -- where a part of the SARS-CoV-2 genetic code is inserted in another harmless virus through which antibodies are generated.

Others, such as Moderna, have used an alternative design, where a viral genetic code is produced as an RNA vaccine, which also leads

to the production of viral protein billion doses could be available when it enters a cell, the report

Even as development of these candidates has been accelerated, vaccines fail at a later level of trails many times due to poor immunogenicity, it added.

Once a vaccine is available, the choice of vaccination strategies will need to be phased to match manufacturing capacity.

Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI) estimates that for 2021, a global annual capacity of between 2 to 4

without disrupting existing vaccine supplies, with much of the capacity being in India and China, the report said.

If immunity is short lived and annual vaccine boosters are needed, capacity will be needed to extend coverage whilst maintaining immunity in existing recipients, it added.

The vaccine supply chain consists of a series of transportation and storage steps.

Sourcing of raw materials used for drug product manufacturing and distribution of the finished product might be disrupted due to the pandemic itself.

Supply chain will be disrupted in case borders are closed due to lockdown, personnel become ill, countries compete for short supply or medical system is overwhelmed. For making transportation easy, manufacturers are working towards improving thermostability of prospective vaccines to reduce the need of the distribution at very low temperatures, the report said.

NASA tests new \$23 mn titanium space toilet

US: NASA's first new space potty in decades — a \$23 million titanium toilet better suited for women — is getting a not-so-dry run at the International Space Station before eventually flying to the moon.

It's packed inside a cargo ship that should have blasted off late Thursday from Wallops Island, Virginia. But the launch was halted with just two minutes remaining in the countdown.

Barely 100 pounds (45 kilograms) and just 28 inches (71 centimeters) tall, it's roughly half as big as the two Russianbuilt toilets at the space station. It's more campersize to fit into the NASA Orion capsules that will carry astronauts to the moon in a few years.

Station residents will test it out for a few months. If the shakedown goes well, the toilet will be open for regular business. With SpaceX now launching astronauts to the space station and Boeing less than a year from sending up its first crew, more toilets are needed. The new one will be in its own stall alongside the old one on the U.S. side of the outpost.

The old toilets cater more toward men. To better accommodate women, NASA tilted the seat on the new toilet and made it taller. The new shape should help astronauts position themselves better for No. 2, said Johnson Space Center's Melissa McKinley, the project manager.

"Cleaning up a mess is a big deal. We don't want any misses or escapes,"



Let's just say everything floats in weightlessness. As for No. 1, the funnels also have been redesigned. Women can use the elongated and scooped-out funnels to urinate while sitting on the commode to poop at the same time, McKinley said. Until now, it's been one or the other for

noted.

Like earlier space commodes, air suction, rather than water and gravity, removes the waste. Urine collected by the new toilet will be routed into NASA's long-standing recycling system to produce water for drinking and cooking. Titanium and other tough alloys were chosen for the new toilet to withstand all the acid in the urine pretreatment.

Going to the bathroom in space may sound simple, but "sometimes the simple things become very difficult" without gravity, said NASA astronaut Mike Hopkins, commander of the second SpaceX crew, due to launch on October. 31 from Kennedy Space Center.

While the old design isn't that hard to use, subtle design changes can make all the difference for women, noted NASA astronaut Shannon Walker, a former space station resident who's also on the next SpaceX crew.

"Trust me, I've got going to the bathroom in space down, because that is a vital, vital thing to know how to do," she told The Associated

Press earlier this week. The typical space station population will go from six to seven with the next SpaceX flight, and even more when nonprofessionals like tourists start showing up as early as next year. Astronauts normally stay six months.

The last time NASA ordered up a new toilet was in the early 1990s to accommodate two-week space shuttle missions. The agency contracted with Collins Aerospace to provide the latest model; the company also worked on the shuttle

Kim Jong Un wishes Trump a speedy recovery

SOUTH KOREA: North Korean leader Kim Jong Un sent a message to Donald Trump after the US president's diagnosis with coronavirus, wishing him a quick recovery, state media said Saturday.
"He offered his sympathy to the

president and the First Lady," the official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA) reported.

"He sincerely hoped that they would be recovered as soon as possible. He hoped they will surely overcome it. He sent warm greetings to them.'

South Korea's Yonhap news agency said it was the first time Kim had sent well wishes to a world leader who tested positive

for the novel coronavirus. Trump announced in the early hours of Friday that he had tested positive for Covid-19. Later in the day, he headed to a military hospital for further observation and

Trump and Kim held three highprofile meetings starting in June 2018, after an uptick in tensions between Washington and Pyongyang at the start of Trump's term.

But nothing concrete emerged in terms of Pyongyang's denuclearization, and talks have been officially at a standstill for months.

US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said in mid-September that talks were ongoing behind the scenes.

Trump has consistently portrayed his close relationship with Kim as one of his foreign policy achievements. - AFP








FEARS GROW FOR CIVILIANS AS KARABAKH FIGHTING RAGES

ARMENIA: Clashes between Armenian and Azerbaijani forces were raging over the disputed Nagorno-Karabakh region on Monday as fears grew for civilians after the two sides shelled major cities.

Separatist forces in Karabakh -- an ethnic Armenian enclave that broke away from Azerbaijan in the 1990s -reported firefights along the frontline with the regional capital Stepanakert under heavy artillery fire.

Azerbaijan's defence ministry said Armenian forces were shelling three of its towns, after hitting the country's second-largest city Ganja on Sunday.

Donald Trump not first US President to fall seriously ill

US: Donald Trump's shock announcement that he has coronavirus and his subsequent hospitalization has sent the US reeling. However, the 45th President is hardly the first to suffer from a major illness or even a global pandemic while in office.

From George Washington to George W. Bush, here's a roundup of the US presidency's more memorable brushes with disease and death.

The US Constitution's 25th Amendment allows Presidents to temporarily hand power to the vice president while incapacitated, a process in which one organ -- the colon -- has played a starring role.

Former president George W. Bush invoked the 25th Amendment in 2002 and again in 2007 while being sedated for routine colonoscopies, putting then-vice president Dick Cheney in charge for hours.

Although the amendment was adopted in 1967, Ronald Reagan indicated in 1985 he did not believe he officially invoked it when he left then-vice president George H.W. Bush briefly at the helm while doctors removed a cancerous polyp from the president's colon.

Reagan said the period was too "brief and temporary" for the

amendment to apply. Hoping to avoid public attention, former President Grover Cleveland covertly stowed away for surgery at sea on a friend's yacht in 1893.

With the nation on the brink of an economic depression, Cleveland aimed to keep the cancer on the roof of his mouth a secret so as not to send the nation into a financial panic. He mostly

succeeded. The tumor, five teeth and a piece of his left jawbone were reportedly removed somewhere off the coast of New York, and a rubber prosthetic was later inserted for aesthetics.

Trump is hardly the first US president to be laid low by a global pandemic, or play down the dangers only to become infected by the disease. Woodrow Wilson caught the Spanish flu in April 1919 while in France for the Paris peace talks negotiating the end to WWI.

In addition, Reagan was seriously wounded in a 1981 assassination attempt outside a Washington hotel by a deranged gunman.

In 1850, President Zachary Taylor attended a July 4 dedication for the Washington Monument. After reportedly chugging iced milk and eating a large quantity of cherries, he fell ill and died several days later. Contemporaries blamed the milk. Historians say the matter is still up in the air.

Three other presidents have also died of natural causes while in office: William Henry Harrison, Warren G. Harding and Franklin D. Roosevelt.

VATICAN CITY: Pope Francis says the coronavirus pandemic has proven that the "magic theories" of market capitalism have failed and that the world needs a new type of politics that promotes dialogue and solidarity and rejects war at all costs.

Francis on Sunday laid out his vision for a post-COVID world by uniting the core elements of his social teachings into a new encyclical, "Fratelli Tutti" (Brothers All), which was released on the feast day of his namesake, the peace-loving St. Francis of Assi-

The document draws its inspiration from the teachings of St. Francis and the pope's previous preaching on the injustices of the global economy and its destruction of the planet and pairs them with his call for greater human fraternity and solidarity to address those issues

In it, Francis rejected even the Catholic Church's own doctrine justifying war as a means of legitimate defense, saying it had been too broadly applied over the centuries and was no longer viable.

"It is very difficult nowadays to invoke the rational criteria elaborated in earlier centuries to speak of the possibility of a 'just war," Francis wrote in the most controversial new element of the encyc-



Pope Francis arrives at the St. Francis Basilica to sign a new encyclical on fraternity and solidarity in the post-COVID world, in Assisi, Italy, Saturday. The Pontiff made his first trip outside the Vatican in seven months since the virus outbreak.

Francis had started writing the encyclical, the third of his pontificate, before the coronavirus struck and upended everything from the global economy to every day life. He said the pandemic, however, had confirmed his belief that current political and economic institutions must be reformed to address the legitimate needs of the people most harmed by the pandemic.

"Aside from the differing ways that various countries responded to the crisis, their inability to work together became quite evident," Francis wrote. "Anyone

who thinks that the only lesson to be learned was the need to improve what we were already doing, or to refine existing systems and regulations, is denying reality.'

He cited the grave loss of millions of jobs as a result of the pandemic as evidence of the need for politicians to listen to popular movements, unions and marginalized groups and to craft more just social and economic policies.

"The fragility of world systems in the face of the pandemic has demonstrated that not everything can be resolved by market freedom," he wrote. "It is imperative to have a proactive economic policy directed at 'promoting an economy that favours productive diversity and business creativity' and makes it possible for jobs to be created, and not cut.'

He denounced populist politics that seek to demonize and isolate, and called for a "culture of encounter" that promotes dialogue, solidarity and a sincere effort at working for the common good. As an outgrowth of that, Fran-

cis repeated his criticism of the "perverse" global economic system, which he said consistently keeps the poor on the margins while enriching the few. Francis rejected the concept of an absolute right to property for individuals, stressing instead the "social purpose" and common good that must come from sharing Earth's resources. The title of the encyclical had sparked controversy in the Englishspeaking world, with critics noting that a straight translation of the word "fratelli" (brothers) excludes women. The Vatican has insisted that the plural form of the word "fratelli" is genderinclusive and that the document by its very nature is inclusive of

It is quite phenomenal to see a sportsman excel at School, Club and International level. Anuradha Bowala was one of them who had the rare distinction of playing for six 'A' division clubs in his rugby career, which is a record in Sri Lankan Rugby history.

Anuradha Bowala well known as 'Bo' in the rugby fraternity is the son of Punchi Bandara Bowala a retired ASP of Sri Lanka Police. He has one brother late Senaka Bowala and two sisters Kumari Dharmapala and Sub-

He started his education at Isipathana College, Colombo and carried on until high school. His elder brother Senaka was also a prominent figure in rugby at college in the 1969/1970 season before he went on to play for CH and FC and Air Force as a prop forward, was instrumental in influencing his brother Anuradha to take up rugby. Late Senaka Bowala played for Presidents XV and Defence Service team. Anuradha began his rugby career at college in 1975 playing for the college under-15 team. In 1976, he captained the college under-

es. In 1977/1978 season he was selected to play in the first XV team of the college under H.K.Sisira and M.P.F. Sallay. Two years later the college was placed third in the Asian Schools tournament in Bangkok under his leadership and he was adjudged the most outstanding player While playing as a winger in 1978 under the captaincy of late M.P.F Sallay, he scored 23 tries in a single schools rugby season which was achieved by his school mates H.K.Sisira and Hisham Abdeen. Isipathana became the runners up to S Thomas' who won 13-6 in the centenary year knockout tournament conducted by SLRFU where they beat Dharmaraja in the quarter final and went on to trounce Trinity in the semi-final by 21 points to 6, played after a lapse of 12 years. The last encounter against them was in 1966 where Isipathana lost 33-3 at Bogambara Stadium under the captaincy of Sunil Wickramasinghe. He also represented Sri Lanka Schools team against the visiting Loughborough College from London where the local squad consisted of six Isipathanians, 17 rugby team at inter school match- six Thomians and six Royalists,

His club rugby career started in 1978 as a schools boy at the age of 17 years donning CH and FC jersey. After two years he represented Havelock's in 1980 to be in the sevens champion team. In 1981 he swapped clubs and joined the Sri Lanka Air Force along with his brother Senaka Bowala. In 1982 he once again crossed over to represent CR and FC sevens champions team. He was picked as the best player at the inter-club sevens in 1982

He toured with CR and FC for the 'Milk Cup' at the Singapore sevens in 1982. He then was called for the

National team to represent Sri Lanka team at the Rugby Asiad in Japan in 1984. When he was in his peak he kept on shuffling clubs and played for Dimbula in 1984/1985 season before he joined Kandy Sports Club in the 'A' division rugby in 1984. Last year playing in the under 17 he scored 390 runs with two fifties





Nadal breezes at Roland Garros, Thiem escapes and Zverev in sickness row

PARIS, SUNDAY: Twelve-time champion Rafael Nadal breezed into his 14th Roland Garros quarter-final on Sunday as Dominic Thiem survived an epic five-setter and Alexander Zverev stunned the coronavirusaffected tournament by admitting he played despite being sick and was struggling to breathe.

On a dramatic windswept and chilly day in the French capital, teenagers Jannik Sinner and Iga Swiatek created shockwaves by reaching their maiden Grand Slam quarter-finals.

Nadal beat American qualifier Sebastian Korda 6-1, 6-1, 6-2 to stay comfortably on course for a record-equalling 20th Grand Slam crown.

It was Nadal's 97th win at the tournament against just two defeats since his title-winning debut in 2005.

"It was a good performance and I am happy with that," said Nadal who has now made his 42nd quarter-final at a major.

ner, 19 and ranked 75, who defeated Zverev 6-3, 6-3, 4-6, 6-3 to become the youngest men's Grand Slam quarter-finalist since Novak Djokovic in Paris in 2006.

In a tournament turned upside down by the coronavirus, which meant a four-month delay and with a crowd capacity of just 1,000 a day, Zverev admitted he had played despite

The German star, runner-up to Thiem at the US Open, raised questions over whether he should even have been allowed to take to the court when he revealed he had been feeling ill since his win over Marco Cecchinato in the previous round.

"I am completely sick after the match with Cecchinato in the night. I can't really breathe, as you can hear by my voice," said Zverev.

"I'm not in the best physical state. I shouldn't have played." Zverev, 23, was up to date with his tournament-mandated Covid-19 tests, the French Tennis Federation (FFT) said in a statement. His last one was on September 29.

However, the FFT added that the German "did not consult the tournament doctors before

Zverev's previous coronavirus test was negative. The result was received on September 30. "Today (Sunday) he received

a reminder for his next test, to be carried out within five days of the previous results," the FFT added.

Sinner is first player to reach the last eight on his Roland Garros debut since Nadal lifted the trophy in 2005.

'Today was very tough knowing that it's going to be a long match but in the end I'm very happy about my performance,' said Sinner.

Third seed Thiem, the runner-up to Nadal for the last two years, was given a major scare France's Hugo Gaston,

ranked at 239, who stunned 2015 champion Stan Wawrinka in five sets in the third round.

Thiem made the last eight for a fifth straight year but had to battle for a 6-4, 6-4, 5-7, 3-6, 6-3 win and will now face Argentine 12th seed Diego Schwartzman for a place in the semifinals.

"He plays drop shots from another planet," 27-year-old Thiem said of Gaston, the last Frenchman in the draw. "I was lucky to make it through.'

DUBAI, MONDAY: New Zealand quick Trent Boult returned figures of 2-28 as he overcame hot UAE weather to help holders Mumbai Indians reach top of the Indian Premier League table on Sunday.

Boult, a left-arm paceman, led a disciplined bowling attack with Australia's James Pattinson, who also took two wickets, as Mumbai outplayed Sunrisers Hyderabad by 34 runs in the afternoon match of the Twenty20 tournament.

South Africa's Quinton de Kock hit form with his 39-ball 67 to guide Mumbai to 208 for five, a total the bowlers defended by restricting Hyderabad to 174-7 at the short-boundary Sharjah cricket ground.

"We had watched a bit of cricket played on this wicket. Small ground too. Good effort by the boys. We had something to bowl to," Boult said after being named man of the match. "I am known for swing and not for slower ones with the new ball, but you just use variations

and angles." Boult got the key wickets of England batsman Jonny Bairstow for 25 and his national captain Kane Williamson, caught behind for three, to choke David Warner's Hyderabad.

Historians were reaching for the record books as the goals flowed, first at Old Trafford as United conceded six goals in a match for only the third time in the Premier League era, then at Villa Park as Liverpool surrendered seven goals for the first time since 1963.

For the first time since 1986, United have lost their opening two

The roadmap will pave the way for better understanding of the visitors who come to Sri Lanka and assist the public and private sectors in making evidence-based decisions and investments in tourism. This is the first time a thorough analysis has been undertaken to evaluate the effectiveness of the data collection efforts by SLTDA and its usage.

SLTDA identified the need for better quality data and research to improve the strategic direction of Sri Lanka's tourism sector, in line with the goals set in Sri Lanka's Tourism Strategic Plan.

"SLTDA's goal is to identify a

services and products that would make Sri Lanka a top tourism destination globally" noted Kimarli Fernando, Chairperson, Sri Lanka Tourism.

"As the primary agency for the collection, analysis and publishing of tourism related data, our goal is to use this roadmap to upgrade SLTDA's research capacities and practices to identify opportunities for new investments, promotions and policy."

CCPI based inflation dips in Sept.


Headline inflation as measured by the year-on-year (Y-o-Y) change in the Colombo Consumer Price Index (CCPI, 2013=100)1 marginally decreased to 4.0 % in September 2020 from 4.1 % in August 2020. This was driven by the statistical effect of the high base prevailed in September 2019. Food inflation (Y-o-Y) decreased to 11.5 % in September 2020 from 12.3 % in August 2020, whereas Non-food inflation (Y-o-Y) increased to 0.9 % in September 2020 from 0.8 % in August 2020.

The change in the CCPI measured on an annual average basis

also decreased to 4.7 % in September 2020 from 4.8 % in August

Monthly change of CCPI recorded at 0.7 % in September 2020. This was due to price increases observed in items of both Food and Non-food categories.

Accordingly, within the Food category prices of vegetables, coconut, fresh fruits and big onion increased in September 2020. Within the Non-food category, prices of items in Alcoholic beverages, Tobacco and Narcotic and Transport subcategories increased during the





'World's fastest human calculator'

Olympic gold medal winner pledges to eradicate math phobia in Sri Lanka

You could say Neelakantha Bhanu Prakash is to maths what Usain Bolt is to running. - BBC

t the age of 20 he's won India's first ever gold in the mental calculation world championship. He says maths is a "big mental sport" and his ultimate mission is to "eradicate maths phobia." Bhanu - as he's known - "thinks about numbers all the time" and is now the fastest human calculator in the world.


Neelakantha Bhanu Prakash a 20-year old, won GOLD medal for India at the Mind Sports Olympics (MSO), London 2020 in establishing that he is the 'fastest human calculator in the world' (This is the first time, a non-European won a Gold Medal, ever.). Neelakantha holds four World Records for being the Fastest Human Calculator in the World, breaking records which were once held by famous Scott Flansburg and Shakuntala Devi. The MSO is the most prestigious international competition for games of mental skill and mind sports held every year in London since 1997.

'The Mental Calculation World Championship 2020' had 29 competitors from 13 countries, aged up to 57 years old took part, with very high levels of ability demonstrated! After multiple rounds, in the finals Neelakantha won with a clear margin of 65 points. The judges were so surprised that they required him to perform a few extra questions to verify that this was done properly (which in fact it

At the age of 20, he stands with not only a plethora of accolades but a vision to eradicate math phobia which is a prevalent problem across the globe, establish math as an artform which can be learned and performed and has been doing his bits of work with the government to change the math-education landscape of the world.

Q: This wizardry in Maths is it all thanks to that learning or you were born with a genius streak?

In 2005, an accident rendered me bedridden for a year, with doctors speculating over whether I would have any long-term effects. However, my parents refused to believe them. They encouraged me to solve puzzles in an at-

tempt to boost my brain. And contrary to the doctor's predictions, ten years later I went on to break a World Record held by Scott Flansburg to become the World's fastest human calculator. All thanks to learning hence!

Q: What are your future plans- how do wish to go about eradicating math phobia? "Vision Math" is a global movement.

I called out for promoting the view that the global definitions of mathematical education have TO change.

Our researches across the world, say that three out of every four students across the world are math-phobic. Four out of every seven people, in the working age group, say that they would have done better had they been good at math.

Numeracy establishment, hence is the first step towards improving a country's mathematical competence. With this movement and my start-up Exploring Infinities, I wish to promote and nurture math education in students through experiential narratives to learn math as not only a subject but as a sport and an art form. My firm, Exploring Infinities is venturing out as a serious start-up with an objective - making math fun and accessible to all.

With Vision Math, I see myself touring across the world being an Indian Ambassador promoting "#visionmath" as a Global Movement to 30+ countries, driving reforms in local math educa-

tion and developing cognitive abilities through arithmetic. Doing shows across the country to inspire a generation to take up mathematics, and learn from the indigenous Indian knowledge, would be the way ahead. With this I want to Initiate and carry Global dialogues and head Training initiatives and impact every single state in the country, thus working on increasing the numeracy across the Globe.

OBJECTIVES

Q: Growing up maths scares students. It is boring. Can this be changed? Can maths be for

Math is for all. A two-year-old would go towards a bowl which has two chocolates ignoring the bowl with 1. 2>1, is an. Inherent knowledge. The reason why it does get boring and scary for a lot of people is that we start learning mathematics in an extremely different way, something which seeds math phobia. When we learn language, we start with poems, stories, morals and then go to grammar. In math, we start with the grammar instruction (metaphorically), in comparison, how many of us would love language if we were taught about "to infinitives" and "gerunds" in grade 1. I believe that learning the world around you with mathematics is the way forward and with my firm Exploring Infinities, we wish to bring that experiential learning of math into the picture.

Q: Who would you attribute your success to - any personal story?

I was inspired by multiple people here are a few - my parents - the amount of belief they had in me when it came to whatever I wanted to pursue. Srinivasa Ramanujan, for his world-famous works in mathematics which put India on the global map for mathematics. Sachin Tendulkar and the sheer brilliance, from being a child prodigy to becoming a leg-

Q: You have a philanthropic side and are now helping students during this Covid crisis with

free classes? Who influenced you in this regard? My parents both studied in Zilla Parishad Government Schools and have always stressed the fact of how there is a huge economic divide in access to quality education and hence helping students overcome math phobia has been my way of helping students. 3 out of every 4 students who study in the Government schools of India have trouble understanding basic Mathematics. And, the phobia caused by math and demotivation hence, is the number two cause for kids opting out of the rural schools in India. With a recent tie-up as the Math

Education partner with the T-SAT Network and Govt. Of Telangana, our classes, under Exploring Infinities - Project Math in Lockdown are now reaching out to lakhs of students, through Satellite TV Broadcast in Telugu, Hindi, English and other languages. I see that

this is just the beginning of #visionmath Q: Many children who are extraordinarily intelligent find it difficult to study with other average students in a class. How was your experience in this regard?

I personally don't consider myself a prodigy of any sort. And, I was doing good in a few classes, not so much in the other because I believe that intelligence isn't an intrinsic trait and has so many edges to it which we don't usually talk about.

Q: How was your victory at the Mind Sports Olympics recognized in India?

It was a humbling experience to get an official call and letter from the President of India - His Excellency Shri Ram Nath Kovind(^attaching the letter) and the Vice-President of India - Shri Venkaiah Naidu. Several Chief ministers and respective Governors of States sent in their congratulations and the entire nation celebrated the success. This was a great experience because the entire nation, for that matter, the entire world was discussing MATH - which I think is a very good sign.

Not doing well in math, is the number one demotivator for students of all age groups across countries in South Asia which lead students to leave schools, colleges and universities. Lack in numerical understanding affects not only students, but professionals, adults in turn the human capital of the country.

Numeracy (ability to do math) is as important as literacy, be it in an individual of any age. I believe that a strong tour across Sri Lanka, doing shows and inspiring kids into taking up math proving a point that math can be fun, will set things in motion.

Interacting with schools, colleges, universities, teachers, principals and other education stake holders across Sri Lanka, by carrying the ideologies of how math education has to be reformed and how a change in math education has to be brought would be a good beginning. I see myself coming down soon, to mark the beginning of eradication of math phobia in Sri Lanka, and work towards a day where every single student - loves and is good at maths! On the lines of my work in India, I see how sustainable



BTS to become multi-millionaires

Il seven members of South Korean K-pop group BTS are set to become multi-millionaires, when their label Big Hit Entertainment goes public in October.

Soaring demand for shares in Big Hit has given it a market valuation of £3.2bn (\$4.1bn), with shares priced at the top of the expected price range.

Big Hit boss Bang Si-hyuk, who owns 43 percent of the management label, will become a illionaire.

In August, he gave each BTS member 68,385 shares, worth £6.2m in total.

Currently priced at between 105,000-135,000 won (£70.03-£88.70) per share, Big Hit expects to raise about £638.3m with the sale of 7.13 million new shares when it is listed on Korea's Stock Exchange, the KOSPI, on October 15.

BTS set a new record on Monday when it took just hours for underwriters to find investors to take a stake in the firm when order books opened, with demand 1,000 times higher than the available stock.

According to CNBC, die-hard BTS fans in South Korea are hoping to buy at least one share in the management label to support their favourite members.

What is even more striking is that this is South Korea's largest IPO in three years.

It's a sign that BTS' popularity has not waned, despite the group being forced to cancel their world tour due to the coronavirus pandemic, and the risk that some of the members may soon have to do two years of compulsory military service.

"One of the top reasons for going public now is related to the company's effort to diversify its business and stream of revenue," says Damyoung Hong, who reports on K-pop news for the Korea Herald. She told me that the coronavirus pandemic has hardly affected Big Hit's success:

"Despite the cancelled tours, Big Hit managed to achieve record sales from strong digital and physical album sales, as well as BTS' paid online concert in June. Considering such growth momentum, Big Hit would have considered now as the right time to go public."

In 2019, BTS generated 97% of Big Hit's sales last year, and 88% this year.

BTS has repeatedly broken records in their seven-year history. In August, its single Dynamite became the most viewed YouTube video in 24 hours, amassing 101.1 million views in a day.

The K-pop band also became the first Korean artists to top the Billboard Hot 100 chart with that single, drawing praise from South Korea's President Moon Jae-in, who said were writing a "new chapter in K-pop history".

And an online concert held in June set another Guinness World record for the most viewed music concert live stream, with 756,000 fans joining from over 100 countries.

The group is made up of Kim Tae-buyng (known as V), lung Hossack (L-Hone), Kim Nam-

They have credited much of their success to their loyal international fan base, known as ARMY, who have helped make BTS the most tweeted-about music group from March to September this year.

"I believe the group will be in the limelight as long as they keep making good music. Even if a few of its members halt their career due to military service, the bandmates have already proven their solo prowess," Ms Hong says.

"The scale of BTS's fandom and the world-building empire tightly built around them are so powerful." she adds.

Fans are now eagerly awaiting the upcoming release of BE, BTS' second album of the year, on November 20. $\it BBC\ News$
