Denying allegations against the Government, Minister Rajapaksa pointed out that the release of former Minister Rishad Bathiudeen's brother Riyaj from Police detention probing the Easter Sunday terror attacks does not mean that the suspect is vindicated from all charges. The Minister pointed out that the same suspect would be taken into custody, if new evidence linked to him surfaces.

Responding to a question raised by Samagi Jana Balavegaya Badulla District MP Chaminda Wijesiri, the minister said that Riyaj had been taken into custody on April 14, this year on suspicion of the latter's connections with Insaf Ahmed, the terrorist who committed suicide at the Cinnamon Grand Hotel in Colombo during the Easter Sunday terror attacks.

"As per the call records, there were 17 calls made by the suspect to the terrorist. The suspect had been detained under the provisions of the Prevention of Terrorism Act for three days for questioning and thereafter obtained the permission of courts twice for three months each. Speaking at the weekly Cabinet media briefing, Minister Rambukwella further said that unlike the initial wave of COVID-19, the government at present has a well-equipped range of facilities and resources that need to handle the outbreak.

"The Government will draw further decisions with regard to the new COVID-19 cluster based on the results of the PCR tests due over the next 48-hours," he said.

"Around 2000 PCR tests have been conducted within the last 24-hours in areas identified as potential places for the spread of the virus. The results of these tests will be used to determine the source of the source of exposure and infection by the Supervisor of the Apparel factory in Minuwangoda," he said. Responding to a question by a journalist with regard to the health guidelines being disregarded during the recently held Colombo book fair, the Cabinet Spokesman said many organizations including the public have become complacent with the guidelines, causing loopholes and a reappearance of the virus. Minister Rambukwella stressed that the Government must address such loopholes and relaxing of guidelines, adding that if the public do not support the Government in this regard, then the Government alone cannot prevent the spread of the virus. The Cabinet Spokesman urged the general public to strictly adhere to the guidelines issued by the Health Ministry and to help the Government in combating the COVID-19 outbreak.

Responding to another question by a journalist with regard to the Grade 5 scholarship examination scheduled for this Sunday (11) and GCE Advanced Level examination set to commence from Monday (12), the Minister said that all necessary measures have already been taken to conduct the two examinations. But nearly 2000 PCR tests were conducted on those connected to the COVID-19 cluster identified in Minuwangoda and the government is awaiting the results of those tests. So depending on the results of these PCR tests the Education Ministry will take the final decision on the A/L and scholarship examinations.

The former President told the Commission on Monday that he received the support of Parliament and the Government only for the first six months of his tenure.

However, Wickremesinghe said it was him, who intervened to get Sirisena the necessary support of the other parties.

Wickremesinghe said Sirisena was fielded as the Common Presidential Candidate in 2015 following the refusal by former President Chandrika Bandaranaike Kumaratunga and others in the United National Party to contest that election.

There was an objection from various parties such as Late Most Ven. Maduluwawe Sobhitha Thera for Sirisena holding the Chair of the SLFP as the President, the former Prime Minister said and also added that Sirisena was never able to get more votes in matters such as passing bills.

Testifying further, Wickremesinghe said the Oluvil Declaration of 2003 and the establishment of the South Eastern University was helpful to set the Muslim community apart from the Tamil people and also to get intelligence information to defeat the Liberation of Tamil Tigers' Eelam (LTTE). He said although it was made public in 2003, this declaration had been in discussion even before.

Responding to a question raised by SLPP - MP Mohamad Musammil, State Minister of Money & Capital Market and State Enterprise Reforms Ajith Nivard Cabraal said that between the period from 2015 to 2019 a total of 2,102,262,948 kilos of plastic had been imported to the country at a cost of Rs 549,991,640,147/= from 47 countries.

MP Musammil said that plastic products are a threat to the environment and they take around 400 years to decompose. "Discarded sachets and polythene packaging poses a huge threat to the environment," he said. Hence, he asked the Minister if the government intends to introduce a substitute for plastic products at a time local industries have come forward with alternative solutions.

Minister Cabraal said that he welcomed the opinion of the MP and promised that he would take up the matter with his ministry officials to bring about an environmentally friendly solution.

Asked whether the government would consider the re-imposition of the cess on plastic imports, the Minister said that too would be taken into consideration at his next meeting with his officials at the ministry.

In addition, a uniformed man is seen standing next to him, dressed in a camouflage kit similar to that worn by members of the Indian Army. In fact, only the LTTE terrorists wore such uniforms. Therefore, I urge you not to make false allegations against the military," said Fonseka. In addition, responding to the statement made by Selvarajah Gajendran in Parliament yesterday, MP Sudharshana Denipitiya requested that the statement referring to the Sri Lanka military as child murderers be taken off the Hansard. This observation was made by Co-Cabinet Spokesman Mass Media Minister Keheliya Rambukwella at the weekly Cabinet media briefing held yesterday at the Government Information Department.

Minister Rambukwella further said that the cabinet approval was granted in August this year for drafting the Appropriation Bill of the financial year 2020.

Accordingly, the total recurrent expenditure for the financial year 2020 is estimated as Rs. 2692 billion and the capital expenditure is estimated as Rs. 1846 billion.

Those estimated provisions include the provisions allocated by the two Vote on Accounts previously passed by Parliament, provisions for Estimated Expenditure for the Year 2020 approved by the President in terms of the Article 150(3) of the Constitution and provisions for the accounting of Rs. 211 billion spent for the year 2019 but has not been accounted.

Accordingly, the Attorney General's approval has been received for the Appropriation Bill drafted by the legal draftsman for the Fiscal Year 2020.

Meanwhile, the Cabinet of Ministers approved the proposal presented by the Prime Minister in his capacity as the Minister of Finance to publish the appropriation bill for the year 2021 in the parliament and then table it in the Parliament for approval.

The drafting of the Appropriation Bill for the Fiscal Year 2021 was approved by the Cabinet in September this year and accordingly the total recurrent expenditure for the financial year 2020 is estimated as Rs. 2.690 billion and the capital expenditure is estimated as Rs. 2,216 billion.

The Attorney General's approval has been received for the Appropriation Bill drafted by the legal draftsman.

Addressing the weekly Cabinet media briefing held yesterday at the Government Information Department, Minister Rambukwella said that the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance of No.19 of 1934 would be amended to take measures to escalate the amount of compensation eligible to be paid to the employees during an accident, under the theme of 'A Workmen Culture for the Country' declared in the 'Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour' National Policy

Framework. Accordingly, the Legal Draftsman has drafted a bill to amend the applicable provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance for increasing the amount of compensation paid to the employees who encounter accidents and experience damages whereas it has been observed that the said bill should be further amended due to the following reasons.

1.Increase of the fine of Rs. 1,000 that can be imposed in terms of the provisions prevailing to the date at the instances in which an employer does not furnish compensation statement to the Commissioner of Compensation in regard to a particular accident caused to an employee in terms of section 42 of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance. 2. Amendment of the sched-

ule 4 of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance that

emphasize of the compensation amounts to suit the current circumstances as follows: i. The minimum monthly

salary applicable for the payment of compensation from rupees 0 to rupees 2,500/- prevailing at present to be increased from rupees 0 to rupees 10,000/-.

ii. Amendment of the maximum monthly salary applicable for compensation existing from rupees 20,001/- to be increased from rupees 100,000/-

iii. The death compensation from rupees 181,665/- to 550,000/- paid at present to be increased from rupees 1,140,000/- to rupees 2,000,000/-.

iv. The compensation paid at a complete discrepancy from rupees 196083.80 to 550,000/paid at present (based on the salary) to be increased from rupees 1,200,000/- to rupees 2,000,000/-.

v. The temporary compensation from rupees 1,320/- to 5,500/- paid at present to be increased from rupees 5,000/to rupees 47,500/- (depending on the bi - monthly salary).

3. Assigning the compensation recovery process of confiscating the property to the Fiscal / Registrar attached to the office of the Commissioner of Compensation in order to accelerate the compensation process.

4. Introduction of a new labour compensation insurance scheme.

# **PCol probing Easter Sunday attacks** Ranil opposed ban on 'Niqab' due to political concerns - Sirisena

#### LAHIRU FERNANDO

Former Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe opposed to a suggestion made by then Army Commander at a National Security Council (NSC) meeting in 2016 to ban the 'Niqab' dress worn by the Muslim women and it was due to political concerns, former President Maithripala Sirisena told the Presidential Commission of Investigation (PCoI) probing the Easter Sunday attacks on Monday.

"Wickremesinghe stressed that there will be a tense situation in the country if such a decision is implemented," Sirisena said.

"By that time, it was a coalition government. The government had

"Things became worse when I appointed a PCoI into the Bond scam," former President Sirisena said.

Sirisena further added that politicians do not have the ability to address the mistrust between various ethnic and religious groups.

Therefore, special institutions with able manpower need to be established to address these issues," he added.



The National Child Protection Authority (NCPA) has received 6,063 complaints in the first nine months of this year about child abuse. Of the complaints, only 3,900 have been investigated, Education Minister Prof. G.L. Peiris said in Parliament yesterday.

Professor Peiris said that of the investigated cases, only 303 were prosecuted.

"I am not at all satisfied with the number of cases that have been fully investigated. We will take steps to increase the efficiency of the investigations." the Minister said.

The Minister was replying to a question by Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP) National List MP Dr. Harini Amarasuriya dur-



ing the oral question round. Minister Prof. Peiris said that of such child-victims, the number of those who are continually engaged in their studies (formal and/or informal) as before as a percentage is as low as 9 per cent. "This is absolutely unsatisfactory. We will take immediate steps to rectify this matter," Prof. Peiris said.

Professor Peiris said that steps have been taken to establish nine units in each Province to derive video evidence of child abuse cases. "Special training will be provided to police officers to handle child abuse cases. Preliminary reports of every child abuse case will be sent to the NCP within 24 hours. Nine magistrate courts will be set up in the nine Provinces to hear child abuse cases," the Minister said.

Of the abused child victims, 5,667 children are living with their family members. About 396 such victims have been taken by their families and placed either with their trusted relatives or child development centers.

Professor Peiris said that 774 of the victims are receiving psychosocial assistance by properly trained personnel.

The Minister said that the Government will open nine centres to accept infants abandoned by their parents for various difficulties.

Dr. Amarasuriya asked if the Government is genuinely interested in solving these child abuse cases as even a separate ministry was not set up for child affairs. Minister Prof. Peiris said, "For a long time, there were several ministries overlooking this section. No solutions have been given. The Government will take swift measures to address the issues.'

# student jailed for 10 years

A killer driver has wept as he was sentenced to a decade behind bars over the death of a Sri Lankan student, who told her parents she would be safe in Australia. Shane Cochrane, 38, wiped away tears as he learned he would have to serve at least eight years in jail after hitting Nisali Perera with his car in August last year.

killed," she said. Court documents reveal that the lights on Wellington Road had been red for 12 seconds and Ms Perera, who was using the pedestrian crossing, was just 2 metres from safety when she was struck.

Cochrane fled the scene and then abandoned the car, which was later found near an abandoned church.

ment Ms Perera's mother, Kamal, told the court that she felt guilty for her daughter's death.

"When  $\mathbf{she}$ gained entrance to the university of Monash, in Australia, we were in two minds [on] whether to let her go from our care and protection," she said.

"[The] irony of the situation is that Nisali had a strong belief that Australia was a very safe country and she could walk on the road at any time of the day.

She had to end her life in the same country of which she had immense faith."

The court heard Cochrane, a father-of-one, started using drugs when he was 16 and had appeared in court on 30 occasions for charges like careless driving, unlicensed driving, speeding, dangerous driving and drug use.

In 2013, Cochrane left the scene of a crash while driv-

ing an unregistered car. In 2018, and under the influence of the drug GHB, he stopped in the middle of a highway.

Also in the same year, and having already lost his license, he led police on a chase, reaching an estimated 200 kilometres per hour.

Cochrane has already spent 355 days behind bars, meaning he could be eligible for parole in about seven years.

He has been disqualified from getting a licence for five years.

# 'Yahapalana' Govt. made false allegations - Avant-Garde Chairman

Avant-Garde Chairman Nissanka Yapa Senadhipathi yesterday told the Colombo High Court that the Ministers of the 'Yahapalana' Government had made such false allegations to imprison President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and himself.

He made this statement from the dock over the case filed against him and seven others over the High profile Avant Garde floating armory case.

The case was taken up before the Colombo High Court Trial-at-Bar Bench comprising High Court Judges Dhammika Ganepola (President), Adithya Patabendi and Manjula Thilakarathne.

The case will be taken up for further trial today (07).

Previously, the Attorney General has amended the indictment filed against Avant Garde Chairman Nissanka Yapa Senadhipathi and seven others over the High profile Avant Garde floating armory case. According to the previous indictment, the Attorney General submitted that the accused have committed punishable offences under Sections 22(1) and 22(3) of the FireArms Ordinance and section 113B, 102, 189 and 190 of the Penal Code for illegally operating merchant vessel ship MV Avant Garde carrying a stock of firearms and explosives including 816 unlicensed automatic firearms and 202,935 rounds of ammunition on the high seas off Galle.

The Attorney General maintained that there is sufficient evidence to prove that the all accused had committed punishable offences under the Firearms Ordinance and Explosives Ordinance on or around October 6, 2015. The Attorney General further maintained that three accused - Saman Dissanayake, P.D. Premachandra and Nissanka Senadhipathi - could be charged for fabricating false evidence under Section 189 and 190 of the Penal Code.



# Indian scientists invent one-hour COVID test

India's drug authority last month approved a paper-strip test for Covid-19 that shows results in less than an hour, the head of the government institute that invented the test told CNN on Monday.

The test, called FELUDA—an acronym for FNCAS9 Editor-Limited Uniform Detection Assay—was named after a popular Indian fictional detective. It intends to "address the urgent need for accurate mass testing," according to a statement from TATA Sons, which manufactured the test.

The kit could be manufactured for selftesting in the future, according to Agarwal, but the prototype being developed currently is only intended for testing in labs.

The FELUDA test follows a similar rapid test kit developed in the US this spring. Both tests use a gene-editing technology called CRISPR to detect the virus in a patient's RNA. The US Food and Drug Administration approved the emergency use of the SHERLOCK test kit in May, developed by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

The test received approval for commercial launch by the Drugs Controller General of India, the country's drug authority, on September 19. It had a 96% sensitivity and 98% specificity for detecting the novel coronavirus, meeting the Indian Council of Medical Research's (ICMR) quality benchmark, according to a statement from the Ministry of Science and Technology. Lessons from Minuwangoda

with the continuing surge in the number of Covid-19 cases in curfew slapped Minuwangoda where a factory supervisor was first found to have been carrying the virus and the detection of cases outside the 'danger zone' it is clear that the country is in the throes of a much feared second wave of the Coronavirus pandemic that will need all the efforts and resources the State could muster to bring under control. This is going by the experience of countries which rolled back their lockdowns and opened up only to see the pandemic revisiting them with greater intensity.

- According to Chief Epidemiologist of the Academy of the Epidemic Disease Unit Dr. Sudath Samaraweera, the Covid-19 cluster in the Minuwangoda area is the most difficult one to be tackled since the point of origin of its first infection is untraceable. He told a news conference that this cluster was more dangerous than the other clusters since the Health officials had not yet ascertained as to how the female factory worker had first contracted the virus.
- These fears cannot be unfounded since the female supervisor's infection came to be detected by pure chance when she was subjected to a casual PCR test for a fever while being hospitalized. Prior to that she could well have circulated freely visiting friends and relatives, doing shopping and travelling in public transport. Who she infected in the process apart from her charges in the Government factory, is anybody's guess.

Hence the authorities will have to throw their dragnet far and wide. But the problem lies in deciding from where to begin. At the time of writing Health officials are yet to receive even the remotest of clues as to the original source of the infection and it is going to be a Herculean task, as Dr. Samaraweera opined, to obtain a cue in this connection. This may force the authorities to go for the hard option of enforcing yet another lockdown, until the original carrier is traced.

Even then it will be a case of continuing the hunt to trace those who had been in contact with the original carrier which is going to make the exercise that much harder. Of course, going for lockdown would be the last option of the Government given what this could mean to the economy and livelihoods, going by the experience of a few months ago. The Government is also not in position to dole out handouts as it did earlier due to the unstable state of the economy still reeling from the initial outbreak of the virus.

#### JUSTICE TO VICTIMS

The Easter Sunday carnage on April 21, 2019, which took the lives of over 250 innocent people and injured more than 500 people including foreigners, children and women in a series of suicide bombings in churches and hotels, will haunt the conscience of this nation for many more years to come.

The information that came to light in the immediate aftermath of the attacks, that there had been pre-warnings, not just once but multiple times, but in a massive blunder the public had been kept in the dark and the security establishment failed to avert the tragedy, shook the nation and also sounded the death knell for the previous administration. The testimonies elicited from former IGP Pujith Jayasundara and former Defence Secretary Hemasiri Fernando at the Presidential Commission of Inquiry (PCoI) to probe into the Easter Sunday terrorist attacks sent shockwaves across the political spectrum during the last couple of weeks, leading up to the appearance of former President Maithripala Sirisena at the Commission. Some of the revelations which came up during cross examinations of the two key officials, who were caught in the eye of the storm following the attacks, made the audience sit up and take notice. The five-member Commission appointed in September last year is determined to leave no stone unturned to find the truth behind the Easter Sunday attacks. Nobody who was following news of Commission proceedings could have missed seeing how those findings have ruffled a few feathers of political bigwigs who held authority at that time.

#### CARDINAL'S REMARKS

Archbishop of Colombo His Eminence Malcolm Cardinal Ranjith, who had commended the efforts of the PCoI, however made a hard-sitting statement last week over the CID's sudden change of tracks that led to the release of Riyaj Bathiudeen, brother of All Ceylon Makkal Congress (ACMC) Leader MP Rishad Bathiudeen. The Cardinal went on to question whether it was a political manoeuvre.

Playing a voice cut of the Police Spokesman at a press conference, the Cardinal questioned how the same Spokesman, who said that there was enough evidence to prove direct links between Riyaj and terrorist outfits five months ago, can now claim otherwise. Hours after this statement, heads rolled at the Criminal Investigations Department (CID). Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Nuwan Wedasinghe, who was in charge of the CID, was transferred as Western Province (North) acting DIG, and DIG S.P. Ranasinghe took the reins of the CID.

Simultaneously, a clarification came from no less a person than President Gotabaya Rajapaksa. In a Facebook post on Sunday, he said, "Ensuring national security is the first and foremost responsibility of my Government. I am not prepared to hand over the power of arresting or arbitrarily releasing people or politicians, as happened in the past. I will also take actions to rectify any omissions or mistakes made by the relevant authorities or officials. I emphasize that our Government has not entered into any political deal with MP Rishad Bathiudeen. I assure my citizens that I will not forsake the trust that they have placed in me and I will most certainly continue to work towards strengthening that trust".

- But with hundreds, nay, thousands of lives at stake extreme measures will have to be deployed in a situation where the virus could well run out of control as in many other countries.
- In the meantime, loud calls are going out for the public to strictly adhere to the health guidelines put in place during the first outbreak of the pandemic, with President Gotabaya Rajapaksa issuing a special gazette to legally deal with those flouting the rules. Army Commander Lt. General Shavendra Silva, who also heads the National Operations Centre for the Prevention of Covid-19 said the decision on any lockdown would be taken only after a careful monitoring of the situation and denied reports circulating on social media of an all island curfew that was to be declared yesterday.
- Cabinet Spokesman Minister Keheliya Rambukwella said that any decision about an island-wide curfew would entirely depend on the opinion of the medical experts and how the present situation will pan out. The Government, understandably, is cautious about enforcing a total lockdown given the hardships faced by the people the last time, but with nearly 500 cases reported from among the Minuwangoda factory workers as of noon yesterday, the Gampaha District could well be the starting point of a lockdown.
- The second wave, if that indeed is the case, could not have come at a worse time when economic activity was getting off the ground in earnest with also plans to reopen the airport to tourists from Covid-19 free countries were being made, as the country, for all intents and purposes appeared to have seen the back of the Coronavirus. But, as was proved in Minuwangoda, all it needed was just one careless carrier to set back the whole process.
- So it will back to the "New Normal", once again, with offices, businesses and commercial establishments going into reverse gear and limiting their staff and also settling for half salaries and wages, weddings and functions limited to only a handful of guests, cinemas, bars, restaurants putting up shutters, gyms and spas once again closing their doors schools closed with sporting activity brought to a standstill and possibly even Christmas and New Year celebrations curtailed - all due to the callous disregard and indiscipline of a few.

#### IN SEARCH OF THE TRUTH

Instances of a lukewarm attitude to matters of national security, inefficient communication, lack of coordination in the defence apparatus and among political authorities and the glaring leadership gap were laid bare during the investigations.

Former IGP Jayasundara, in an explosive revelation before the PCoI on September 24, said Easter Sunday suicide bomber Abdul Latif Jameel Mohammed had met with an intelligence agent just 45 minutes before he blew himself up at the Dehiwala Tropical Inn lodge. Mohammed first went to Taj Samudra Hotel, but his attempt had been aborted due to a malfunction of the detonator.

The former IGP urged the Commission to follow this piece of information and inquire in what capacity the intelligence officer met the suicide bomber. Earlier last month, Sri Lanka Muslim Congress (SLMC) Leader Rauff Hakeem, in another observation, told the Commission that a mastermind of the attacks hired National Thawheed Jammath and its leader Zahran Hashim as pawns to destabilize the country and the ISIS banner was used as a front. Asked to reveal the identity of the group which he suspects as the mastermind, Hakeem said he would do so in camera.

The proceedings of the PCoI culminated this week with former President Maithripala Sirisena and former Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe, the two leaders at the helm of the Government at the time of the brutal attacks, were summoned to testify. The PCoI

#### SUPREME COURT VERDICT

In another important development, the Supreme Court five-judge-bench headed by Chief Justice Javantha Javasuriya concluded the hearing of petitions challenging 20A on Monday after four days of sittings.

After carefully considering arguments for and against the draft Constitutional Amendment, the Supreme Court is expected to send its determination to the President and Parliament before October 13.

The Government will review 20A in line with the Court order and it intends to put it forth for Parliamentary debate in early November, before the presentation of its maiden Budget.

A series of amendments the Government intends to make to the 20A Bill in the Third Reading was presented to the Court by the Attorney General last week. Under the proposed amendments, the President will only be able to dissolve Parliament two and a half years after Parliament first meets. Under the earlier gazetted version of the Bill it was one year.

The Offices of the Secretaries to the President and the Prime Minister will be brought back under the scope of the Auditor General, and a provision has been added to say that the Auditor General should be a "qualified auditor". Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa in a recent statement noted that these institutions have always been and will always be subject to audits.

However, dissenting views on 20A have not yet died down within the Government, and MP Dr. Wijeyadasa Rajapakshe and the National Freedom Party (NFF) led by Minister Wimal Weerawansa sent two letters to the President and the Prime Minister over the weekend informing of their objections to certain provisions of the 20A.

Opposition parties have already expressed their disapproval of the draft Bill and have stepped up their campaign against it. At the same time, there was also speculation that several Opposition MPs were willing to support the Government for the passage of 20A in Parliament. Moves are also underway to formulate a new Constitution.

"Politics makes strange bedfellows" is a saying that has been proven time and again in our political context, and going by the current developments it could yet be proven in the coming weeks.

# **THE OPPOSITION OWNS BATHIUDEEN AND CAN'T STICK** HIM TO THE GOVERNMENT

he Opposition has wanted to stick former Minister Rishard Bathiudeen to the government with super glue, but that effort became spectacularly unstuck last week.

So, a series of tragi-comedies does not a movement make. He acts as if his Sinhala Buddhist nationalism is something he can put on and take off like some safari suit top. When it suits him, he is a Sinhala nationalist. When it is nightfall, he transforms into the Shakespeare quoting ham actor. It's unintended burlesque, and in serious politics, it just won't do.



Words: their sources, half-way houses and journeys



ive years ago, some Sri Lankan writ-ers attending the SAARC Literary Festival in Bengalaru, India, discussed contemporary novelists writing in Sinhala. Saumya Sandaruwan Liyanage, a past winner of the State Literary Award for Poetry (Sinhala) asked, tonguein-cheek, 'Masimbula saha thava kawda (who else, apart from Masimbula)?' Everyone laughed.

Mahinda Prasad Masiumbula was, in everyone's mind, 'established' as the Sinhala voice in the longer narrative genre. This was thanks to his maiden novel 'Senkottan.' Since then he has published two novels, 'Manikkaavata' and 'Apoyyaava, the latter described by the author as a novel for young people ('yovun nava kathaava').

Now whether other novelists are indeed a notch below Masimbula can be debated and disputed. Other novels and novelists have been honoured with numerous awards since his 'Senkottan.' This is not the place for that discussion. Neither is this a book review. This is about one passage in the book.

'Apoyyaava,' just like 'Senkottan' and 'Manikkavata, 'is hard to translate. The word is derived from the exclamation, 'apoi!' which is an expression of concern or even disbelief bordering on alarm. It's one of many Sinhala worlds whose English equivalent would be 'oh dear,' 'goodness me,' 'good grief,' or OMG. 'Apoyyaava,' then, would refer to the feeling proceeded by whatever it is that prompted 'apoi'.

Anyway, here's the passage (in translation):

'Well, boy, you don't have to wrack your mind as


Sajith Premadsa by contrast wants to dream of that era, but steal Mahinda Rajapaksa's nationalist clothes and run away with them.

if trying to knot the earth and sky for this. You'll find the word. The words we need invariably surface from somewhere.'

That was a grandmother's sharp advice to a young boy working on a crossword puzzle. Of course, the word he was looking for did arrive, as did others which enabled the pair to complete the puzzle.

Words. Who made them? Where do they live? How do they travel and when? How many of us have struggled to find the right word? How often do we find it at the right time? What is the formula to call forth the right word at the right time and have it arrive as well? And is what is true for 'word,' true for other things too which require calling forth and prompt arrival?

The *kiriamma* in the story obviously believes in some intrinsic ability for a right word among millions to stand up and walk over to whoever who needs it and at the right time too. Perhaps she believes in a large scheme where this holds true for other things too. Love, for example. Revolution too. A maturation of objective preconditions, a theorist of such things might call it. Maybe that's a plausible explanation, but such theories take away the magic and denies wonderment to those awaiting the whatever.

Good things come to those who are patient. We've heard that. Maybe they do, but not all those who await good times get to experience them. If all wishes could come true, sooner or later, the world would be a happier place. Karma might explain why this is not the case. It might also explain why words (or other things for that matter) can and do arrive as promised by the boy's grandmother.

You can't hurry love. This too we've heard. Happens when it has to happen. This too. Auspicious times, then? The configuration of planets, constellation and location? God's will? To each his or her believes, we could say, and leave it at that.

Words. They don't come easy always. Sometimes, at least to some people, they do. Maybe it's karmic force, merit acquired in lifetimes, this and those that came before. Masimbula, one senses, writes easily. It is as though he's waited long enough, not just for a single word but a thesaurus. He can therefore call them forth at will or rather, he just needs to sit with pen in hand and paper before him or fingertips ready at a keyboard, as the case may be, and stories write themselves on their own.

That's word and writing. Life, can also be read as a narrative made of words made of the things that people do and do not, say and don't say, are 'words.'

Since the novel is about a 'prahelikaava,' literally 'riddle' but in this case a crossword puzzle, let me end this with a hint — 'down' or 'across' in the riddle of life, your pick. 'Apoyyaava' satisfied the conditions of length and compatibility with other words/letters whose paths it crossed or intersected with respectively. It wasn't the word that the puzzle-maker expected. It titled a lovely story, however. As worthy of celebration as 'getting it right' as per established norm.

Up Close and Personal

**Completion of 50 years as a Parliamentarian**

hen the sixteenth Parliament was convened recently, it also marked the 50th anniversary of the oldest and longestserving Parliamentarian, the only one to reach that rare double milestone. (Only two other politicians have achieved this milestone in recent times - Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa and Athauda Seneviratne).

Vasudeva Nanayakkara was elected to Parliament at the 1970 Parliamentary Election, representing Kiriella, at age of just 31, as a candidate of the Lanka Sama Samaja Party (LSSP) led by Dr. N.M. Perera. Serving as the Leader of the Democratic Left Front (DLF) and having contested the Ratnapura District under the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP), he was sworn in as the Water Supply Minister on August 20, 2020 in Kandy.

During over half a century as a pre-eminent politician in the nation, Vasudeva has served as a Parliamentarian, a cabinet minister, and a presidential candidate. During his long tenure as a Parliamentarian, he has distinguished himself for his integrity and honesty, no mean achievement for a Sri Lankan politician. It is a matter of regret, though, that he will also be remembered for an indecorous gaffe directed at the then Prime Minister when according to press reports the Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe attempted to prevent Nanayakkara from raising a Point of Order.

As a Parliamentarian, he has been an uncompromising champion of the rights of the minorities. He has been beaten, jailed, and forced underground for his political activism. His activism, compassion, and fearless honesty have won the hearts of the working class and minority commu-

family was the primary benefactor in Galle for the UNP. His father was a wealthy businessman running one of the most successful wholesale and transport business in the South. His fleet of lorries transported much of the goods back and forth from Colombo to the Southern cities. The lorries had painted on them the name of the business as 'Vasudeva & Co', named after the owner's eldest son. His father also owned tea estates and was an ardent supporter of the UNP. So, coming into Richmond, it was natural for Vasu to be a UNP supporter.

At the 1952 General Election, riding a wave of sympathy in the wake of the death of the first Prime Minister of the Nation D.S. Senanayake, the UNP, led by his son Dudley Senanayake, won the elections. In the ensuing celebrations, Vasu led the UNP group in the school, demonstrating around the school grounds. He was donned in green from head to foot with a green shirt, cap, and flag in hand, carried on the shoulders of friends as their leader. Having been an admirer of socialism for a while, a group of us from Galle schools formed an informal socialist group in our senior years. Once a month we invited leading Trotskyite leaders as speakers, and one Sunday I had invited Tissa Vitharana, at the time a senior medical student at the Medical College who happened to be the nephew of the leader of the LSSP, Dr. N.M. Perera, to address our group. He motored down from Colombo in his

Vespa scooter and gave a brilliant lecture to about 15 of us, including a couple of friends that we had invited to the lecture.

so furious with Vasu for initiating the strike that he nearly disowned his son.

Watching these developments on the sidelines was the now Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa, who was in the junior boarding at Richmond College. Richmond indeed was the house of Rajapaksas. His father, D.A. and his uncle D.M. and his cousins George and Lakshman and his brother Chamal, were all Cabinet Ministers who were educated at Richmond and played in the college cricket team. Following his father's death in 1967, Mahinda Rajapaksa took over as the SLFP candidate for the Beliatta constituency and was elected to Parliament in 1970 as the youngest Member

of Parliament at just 24, the same year that Vasu was first elected to Parliament. Thus, the Prime Minister is also completing his fiftieth year as a Parliamentarian this year. Despite his father's admonitions, Vasu remained a socialist, immensely distraught of the social

injustices he observed

that compelled him to

during the last 30 years. The police imprisoned Vasu for a year for allegedly conspiring to overthrow the government during the failed youth uprising of 1971 led by Rohana Wijeweera. Once out of jail, Vasu spearheaded the movement to nationalize Sri Lanka's large tea, rubber, and coconut plantations, which are remnants of the colonial economy.

In 1977 when the LSSP was expelled from the United Front Government of Sirimavo Bandaranaike, the LSSP leadership expelled Vasu, then the leader of the LSSP Youth League, along with his idealist colleagues from the party, blaming their agitation for speedy reforms for the privileges lost from no longer being in the coalition Government and its Cabinet. Vasu went on to form the Nava Sama Samaja Party (NSSP) with a non-communal socialist agenda.

Vasu stands firm in his belief that each ethnic group should have the right to maintain its identity and determine its fate. In 1983, the Sri Lankan government, in a calculated attempt at shutting down all opposition to its policies, banned Vasu's party and a few other leftist groups, falsely accusing them of fomenting racial riots. The Leftist groups found themselves without the option to defend their rights under the Emergency Rules, and Vasu was constantly on the run during his two-year hide-and-seek with the law. He was masquerading dressed as a Middle Eastern sheik when he openly visited the legendary attorney President's Counsel D.S. Wijesinghe, at his residence at the Thimbirigasyaya junction where I was visiting, as I always did, during my trips to Colombo. Vasu was confident he was not detectable in the form he was in and dared even to speak to Policemen seeking information. In the highly emotionally charged battlefield of ethnic politics of the time, many of his colleagues paid

the price with their lives. Vasu feels lucky to survive the terror-filled late '80s when paramilitary death squads and the extreme nationalist insurgents reigned; neither group respected the middle ground that Vasu and his colleagues were espousing.

Vasu had always been the maverick in the LSSP and ready to criticize the government and even the party, whenever he felt either was deviating from its stated mission. In 1994, the LSSP joined the People's Alliance (PA), the front led by the SLFP. Vasu had by then returned to the LSSP from the NSSP following a disagreement with his protégé Dr. Wickramabahu Karunaratne who now leads the NSSP. However, in 1999 Vasu, the LSSP Member of Parliament elected from Ratnapura, was once again expelled after publicly criticizing the PA Government.

After his expulsion, Vasu floated the Democratic Left Front (DLF). The LSSP gradually lost strength. The Congress of Samasamaja Youth Leagues that Vasu led had been disbanded. At the 2010 elections, both the LSSP and the DLF contested under the United People's Freedom Alliance (UPFA). Once again, Vasu won elections as an MP from the Ratnapura District and was appointed as National Languages and Social Integration Minister after the 2015 elections.

Many consider that Vasu's finest hour came when he placed a wreath on the front table of the then Prime Minister Sirimavo Bandaranaike in 1976 during the No-Confidence Motion which was tabled by J.R. Jayewardene, as the Leader of the Opposition at the time. When the Sergeant-at-Arms approached to take Vasu to Parliamentary custody, leaders on the Left and the Right, N.M. Perera, Colvin R. De Siva and J.R. himself formed a ring around Vasu so that Sergeant-at-arms could not approach Vasu.

It was as 10-year-old kids that we met as students at Richmond College, Galle in 1949, and ever since then, we have been close friends though most of our lives, though we lived oceans apart, in different continents

Richmond was a politically active place creating an awareness and an interest among the students in the politics of then Ceylon through debates and discussions, particularly in the hostel environs.

Vasu at the time was a firebrand UNP supporter, mainly because his

Freedom Party (SLFP) led by S.W.R.D. Bandaranaike, Vasu was a true red-blooded socialist who was even more conversant with socialist philosophy and its demagoguery than the rest of us in the group.

Vasu became such a fervent supporter of socialism that while still at Richmond, he organized a strike among his father's tea estate workers. His father promptly sacked the leader and got the workers back to the estate. The leader wanted to get his job back and sheepishly went and spilled the beans. His father was

bandon his promising law career and devote his time and energy seeking comprehensive and lasting remedies for the social ills plaguing Sri Lanka.

Vasu joined the Lanka Sama Samaja Party (LSSP) as a student in 1958. When he was first elected to Parliament at the 1970 Parliamentary Election, representing Kiriella for the LSSP, he was the youngest of the recognized stalwarts in the LSSP, led by several political legends of the time. Vasu was at the forefront of the trade union struggles. The LSSP peaked in political strength in the 1970s but has declined gradually

was once again elected to represent Ratnapura. Having been sworn in as a Minister in the current Cabinet and addressing his supporters, Vasu lamented that he has so far failed to find a way to close the gap between the rich and the poor that he had sought all his life and that he may have to bid farewell to life before he finds one. But after a half a century as a politician, he remains sincere to his cause and untainted by any allegation of corruption. That is quite an achievement for a Sri Lankan politician. That may also be his ultimate legacy.

# **Action Needed to Protect Wild Species and Natural Habitats**

he UN Summit on Biodiversity was meant to galvanize commitments to stop the impending biodiversity crisis, and to underscore the need for effective actions in a new Global Biodiversity Framework. Few could predict that it would take place in the middle of a deadly global pandemic – which in all likelihood was brought about by human activities that exploit wild animals and nature.

While COVID-19 has shined a spotlight on the increasing risk of infectious diseases from animals, the same human activities that are causing these risks are also causing the decline of wild species of animals.

First is the direct use of wild species, which includes the use of meat from wild animals as a source of food or income, use of animal parts for other commercial products, recreational hunting, and traditional healing practices.

Second is the destruction of natural habitat and the encroachment of activities that bring humans and their livestock in close proximity to wild species, increasing the risk of spillovers of pathogens to humans.

The 2019 IPBES global assessment on biodiversity catapulted the loss of species onto the front pages of newspa-



pers around the world. It found that we are losing wild species of plants and animals at an unprecedented rate, and that as many as a million species could go extinct in the near term.

A recent study published in the journal Science found that North America has lost three billion birds in the last 50 years alone. And an initial review this year of the status of species protected by the Convention on Migratory Species (CMS) found that the majority of those species are in decline.

Wild animals unquestionably provide an important source of protein for some poor communities and indigenous populations in various parts of the world. But any use of wild species of animals needs to be sustainable. And the current use and trade of wild animals goes far beyond food security for vulnerable communities. Recent growth in domestic use and international trade is largely commercial. There has also been growth in demand for some types of wild meat in urban areas, with such meat viewed as a luxury product.

Addressing food security and poverty alleviation are among the highest priorities of the UN Sustainable Development Goals. Achieving these goals will be ever more challenging as we add roughly two billion people to the global population in just the next 30 years and reach over 11 billion by the end of this century. Currently, humans and livestock account for approximately 96 percent of the biomass of all mammals, with wild animals making up only four percent. Reliance on the consumptive use of wild animals is simply not a feasible or sustainable solution for long-term food security and poverty alleviation.

Unfortunately, the pressures on wild animals and their habitats are expected to grow exponentially over the coming decades, with millions of kilometres of planned new roads, massive increases in energy infrastructure, unprecedented human population growth, urban expansion, food insecurity and climate change

The thirteenth Conference of the Parties of CMS adopted numerous resolutions and decisions aimed at addressing the threats to migratory species and actions to enhance their conservation needs. COP13 also adopted the Gandhinagar Declaration, highlighting the CMS priorities for the post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework, and calling for it to include:

1) a commitment to maintaining and restoring ecological connectivity;

2) provisions to effectively address the conservation needs of endangered species and species with an unfavourable conservation status, including goals and targets to halt species declines;

**3)** provisions encouraging parties to include in their NBSAPs appropriate reference to other biodiversity-related conventions to which they are also Parties, in order to increase more coherent implementation across the various global agreements;

4) recognition of the role of the various biodiversity-related conventions as well as other relevant MEAs, for effective implementation, monitoring, and review of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework; and

5) provisions to promote international cooperation and connectivity for the implementation of the new Global Biodiversity Framework.

The UN Summit on Biodiversity provides an opportunity to commit to actions needed to protect wild species and natural habitats as a central element of reversing the global trends of biodiversity loss. COVID-19 just provides one more reason to do so.



# WHO estimates 10% of global population infected with COVID-19

#### SWITZERLAND:

Roughly one in 10 people across the globe may have already been infected with the novel coronavirus. The estimate from the World Health Organization (WHO) comes as it predicts that "a difficult period" lies ahead.


The World Health Organization (WHO) said Monday its "best estimates" suggest one in 10 people worldwide may have been infected by the coronavirus.

The figure represents more than 20 times the number of confirmed cases, which currently stands at more than 35 million.

"Our current best estimates tell us about 10% of the global population may have been infected by this virus," said Mike Ryan, the head of emergency operations at the WHO.

"It varies depending on country, it varies from urban to rural, it varies depending on groups. But what it does mean is that the vast majority of the world remains at risk,

Ryan continued. "We are now heading into a difficult period. The



continues to disease spread." Ryan made the comments as he addressed the WHO's 34-member executive board focusing on COVID-19.

He told the board that outbreaks were surging in parts of southeast Asia and that infections were on the

rise in parts of Europe and the eastern Mediterranean region. Cases surging, nearing spring peak. The global death toll

from COVID-19 could reach 2 million before a vaccine is readily available, and could be even higher without strenuous efforts

to prevent the spread of the novel virus, the World Health Organization (WHO) has said.

"Unless we do it [take concerted action] ... [2 million deaths] is not only imaginable but sadly very likely," Mike Ryan, head of the UN agency's emergen-

cies program, said in a briefing.

This figure would see the world's death toll doubling from the current 1 million confirmed fatalities from COVID-19 since the virus first emerged in China in late December. - DEUTSCHEWELLE



# Public investment key to **COVID-19 recovery - IMF**

**US:** Public investment should play a "central role" in the recovery of both emerging and advanced economies from the coronavirus downturn, the IMF said Monday ahead of its fall meetings.

Stepping up such spending with interest rates low globally could "create millions of jobs directly in the short term and millions more indirectly over a longer period," officials with the International Monetary Fund wrote in a blog post. Assuming investments are of "high quality," the Washington-based crisis lender said increasing public investment by one percent of GDP could raise private investment by 10 percent, employment by 1.2 percent, GDP by 2.7 percent along with overall confidence in the recovery. The coronavirus pandemic has caused a sharp economic downturn glob-



# **'POLITICAL WILL' NEEDED TO END COVID-19 OUTBREAKS, SAY NOBEL LAUREATES**

US: Technological advancements and international cooperation have accelerated scientific understanding of COVID-19 but it will take political will to end virus outbreaks, the new Nobel laureates in medicine said Monday.

Americans Charles Rice of The Rockefeller University and Harvey Alter of the National Institutes of Health were honoured along with Briton Michael Houghton for the discovery of the Hepatitis C virus. In separate press conferences, the laureates noted how long it had taken them to achieve their results. "It is a long story, kind of a 50 years saga," said 85-year-old Alter who began his research in the 1960s. But they added how technological improvements now meant quicker results. "There is a big difference between the 1970s and '80s and now. The technology is



# **Europe confronts SECOND VIRUS WAVE**

**FRANCE:** Paris bars and cafes will shut for two weeks as the city and its region were placed on maximum alert Monday, with Europe facing a second wave of the coronavirus pandemic.

France reported nearly 17,000 new coronavirus cases on Saturday alone, the highest daily number since the country began widespread testing.

The shuttering of bars and cafes - seen by many as the essence of Parisian life -- were "braking measures because the epidemic is moving too fast," Paris police chief Didier Lallemant told journalists, adding that restaurants will remain open provided they respect new safety measures.

These will include making sanitising hand gel available at all dining tables, limiting patrons to six a table with at least a metre (3.3 feet) between seats, and allowing patrons to remove their masks only for eating.

Also on Monday, the president

of the European Commission Ursula von der Leyen said she would self-isolate for a day after learning she had met someone infected with COVID-19 last week.

Von der Leyen, who turns 62 this week, is not the first senior EU official to be quarantined in recent weeks. Last month the president of the European Council, Charles Michel, was forced to postpone a European leaders' summit for a week after a security guard in his team tested positive.

Europe, which has recorded 235,553 deaths, is approaching a caseload of six million out of the more than 35.2 million cases officially diagnosed across the world.

The virus has at least killed 1,037,971 people worldwide according to the latest AFP tally based on official sources.

Britain remains the worst-hit European country, passing its latest milestone of

500,000 confirmed coronavirus infections on Sunday.

Neighbouring Ireland for its part is mulling a nationwide lockdown after a surge of new cases.

The National Public Health Emergency Team recommended that the entire country reprise the highest level of COVID-19 restrictions imposed during the original lockdown in March.

Russia recorded 10,888 new cases on Sunday – close to a peak reached in May – but stopped short of reimposing a new lockdown.

Spain has decided partial lockdowns for two more cities, Leon and Palencia, after residents of Madrid and nine nearby towns were barred from leaving city limits for any reason other than work, school or medical and legal appointments.

A survey conducted between June and August revealed severe disruptions to mental health services in 93 countries, the WHO said ahead of a large fundraising push.

"This is a forgotten aspect of COVID-19," WHO mental health director Devora Kestel told a virtual media briefing. - AFP





# **TRUMP RETURNS TO** WHITE HOUSE - REMOVES **MASK IMMEDIATELY** WORLD NEWS Tells Americans: "Don't be afraid of COVID"

**<u>US:</u>** US President Donald Trump checked out of hospital on Monday after four days of emergency treatment for COVID-19, pulling off his mask the moment he reached the White House and vowing to quickly get back on the campaign trail.

Shortly beforehand, Trump had tweeted that Americans, who have lost nearly 210,000 people to the virus, have nothing to fear.

A series of made-for-TV moments allowed Trump to squeeze the maximum from his medical discharge, starting by exiting alone from the large gold-colored front doors of the Walter Reed military hospital just outside Washington.

Live on television, he then walked in a mask to a limousine, giving the thumb's up, before boarding the nearby Marine One helicopter for the quick flight to the White House -- which he left on Friday after falling ill.

Landing, he walked up the steps onto the South Portico's stately balcony and demonstratively removed his mask, saluting the departing Marine One.

With less than a month until November 3 election day, polls show Trump behind Democrat Joe Biden and left scrambling even harder by his hospitalization

to catch up. The return to the White

House was minutely stage managed to show he is physically fit, while a series of striking tweets demonstrated Trump's coming angle of political attack -- that he personally beat Covid and will now lead the country to its own comeback.

"Will be back on the Campaign Trail soon!!!" he said in one tweet.

"Don't be afraid of COVID," he said in another, claiming to be feeling rejuvenated after his illness. - AFP

UK: British Prime Minister Boris Johnson will seek to banish the coronavirus gloom with a vision of a prosperous future fuelled by floating windmills when he addressed his Conservative party's annual conference on Tuesday.

In a speech closing the four-day digital event, he will highlight an election pledge to quadruple the power generated by offshore wind from 10 to 40 gigawatts this decade, saying it would support 60,000 new jobs.





Hemantha Yatawara is no stranger to that category who was a robust player who engaged in several sports while reaching the pinnacle in the game of rugby.

Hemantha Yatawara popularly known as 'Yatta' in the sporting circles hails from a family of six brothers and a sister. His father B.D.Yatawara was a former Sri Rahulian while mother Leela Dissanayake studied at Poramadulla Central Hanguranketha. Both his parents have stood as a pillar of strength in supporting him and Saman the elder and Udaya the younger brother throughout their sporting career from the childhood days, even though they were not from a sporting background. They were especially very supportive by feeding them with hygienic food which was required to engage in sporting events, which ultimately became a morale booster for them to compete in sports.

# Djokovic keeps French **Open title bid on track**



**PARIS, MONDAY:** Novak Djokovic defeated Karen Khachanov in straight sets to make the French Open quarter-finals for the 11th consecutive year on Monday while Sofia Kenin escaped trouble to also clinch a spot in the last eight.

Top seed and 2016 champion Djokovic won 6-4, 6-3, 6-3 against Russian 15th seed Khachanov to draw level with Rafael Nadal on a record 14 quarter-final appearances in Paris.

Djokovic faced his toughest assignment so far but Khachanov was unable to derail his bid to become the first man in half a century to win all four Grand Slam titles twice.

The Serb hit 44 winners and has yet to drop a set in the tournament, losing only 25 games in four rounds. He improved his record in 2020 to 35 wins against just one loss.



"It was a very even match, perhaps more difficult than the result showed," said Djokovic, who is chasing an 18th Grand Slam title.

He admitted to suffering an "awkward moment of deja vu"

after unintentionally hitting a ball which smashed into the head of a line judge while trying to return serve. The incident came just weeks

after Djokovic was defaulted at the US Open in New York for

The world number one will face Pablo Carreno Busta, the man who benefited from Djokovic's US Open disqualification, for a spot in the last four after the Spaniard swept German qualifier Daniel Altmaier aside in three sets. Stefanos Tsitsipas overcame an eye problem to become the first Greek man to reach the last eight of the French Open with a 6-3, 7-6 (11/9), 6-2 win over Grigor Dimitrov.

The 22-year-old will now take on Andrey Rublev in a repeat of the recent Hamburg final which was won by the Russian.

Fifth seed Tsitsipas has won 12 successive sets at the tournament having been two sets down to Jaume Munar in the opening round. Rublev, the 13th seed, also advanced to the quarter-finals for the first time after battling past Marton Fucsovics of Hungary 6-7 (4/7), 7-5, 6-4, 7-6 (7/3). AFP

"We expect asset quality to deteriorate significantly as economic conditions remain weak, while profitability will take a hit from rising credit costs and declining margins," Eugene Tarzimanov, a Moody's Vice President and Senior Credit Officer said.

# Tourist arrivals dip to 1.9 mn in 2019

Tourist arrivals to Sri Lanka in the year of 2019 dipped to 1.9 million from 2.3 million in 2018.

This represents a fall of 18 percent. 1.5 million tourists arrived on the basis of pleasure, while 70,000 traveled on the basis of business, and 251,000 travelled for other purposes.

These figures were made public in the Tourism Ministry Annual Performance Report and Accounts submitted to Parliament recently.

The room occupancy rate dipped from 70% to 57% levels in 2019. The sector is directly estimated to employ 173,592 people and to generate 225,273 positions of indirect employment.

# **ComBank receives USD 50 mn Equity from IFC**

The Commercial Bank of Ceylon has announced the completion of all formalities relating to the private placement of shares with the International Finance Corporation (IFC) and the receipt of US\$ 50 million (Rs 9.215 billion) from the latter for 115,197,186 ordinary voting shares in the bank.

This is the first foreign equity placement by Commercial Bank, the first post-pandemic equity placement by the IFC and is one of the largest foreign investments into Sri Lanka since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Bank said.

The investment collectively makes the IFC, the IFC Financial Institutions Growth Fund LP (FIG Fund) and the IFC Emerging Asia Fund LP (EA Fund) the largest shareholder of the Commercial Bank of Ceylon and further strengthens the Bank's shareholder composition by increasing its foreign shareholding up to 30%, enhancing credibility and confi

Fund receiving 40,319,015 each. "This investment by the IFC in Sri Lanka via the Commercial Bank of Ceylon is an extremely impactful vote of confidence in Sri Lanka," the Bank's Managing Director S. Renganathan said. "This investment represents many benefits to the Bank as well as to the country, especially at a time like the present, when economies and markets are reeling from the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

We are delighted to have the IFC, the IFC FIG Fund and the IFC EA Fund as key institutional investors in the Bank, as it will further strengthen investor confidence while raising funds to support the Bank's future growth."

Significantly, the IFC equity placement was done at a premium price of Rs 80 per share, 20% more than the Weighted Average Price of Rs 66.78 for the 30 days preceding29th June 2020, the date of the Board resolution on the pridends and an equal share in the distribution of surplus assets on liquidation.

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

# **Two different** divine art forms

aratha Natyam and yoga are two different divine art forms that originated in the Indian soil. Both of them are deeply rooted in Santayana Dharma which was often referred to in Hinduism in the olden days. Bharatha Natyam derives its theoretical foundation from Natya Sastra which is considered as the fifth Veda of Hinduism. Natya Sastra consisted of 36 chapters and contains 6.000 verses.

Baratha Natyam and yoga help individuals for spiritual uplift and salvation. In the recent past, many researchers have been done to identify the union between these two ancient art forms. Bharatha Natyam is often referred to as artistic yoga. Yoga generally means the union of the soul with Almighty. Bharatha Natyam is a divine fine art that coordinates the human body, mind and emotions.

#### **SPIRITUAL WELLBEING**

While Bharatha Natyam grew in the gurukula tradition yoga developed in ashrams in India. Both art forms promote physical, mental, and spiritual wellbeing. Bharatha Natyam is based on Natya Sastra which was derived from the four Veda, viz., Rig, Yasoor, Sama and Atharvana.

According to Yoga Sudra Patanjali, there are eight components commonly identified as 'astanga' or eight limbs. The eight limbs of yoga are known as Yama which reveals abstinence or avoiding activities for self-pleasures or bodily pleasures. The second factor is Niyama or observance.

The third factor in yoga is Asana, or body positions. The fourth factor is Pranayama or breathing control. The fifth aspect in yoga is Pratyahara or withdrawal of senses. It could be described as withdrawal of attachment. The sixth factor in yoga emphasizes Dharans or the power of concentration. The seventh factor of the yoga component is Dhyana or promotion of meditation. The eighth component is Samadi.

Both these art forms benefit the mental, physical and emotional stability of the practitioners. They treat the nervous system and promote physical health. But yoga particularly promotes meditation. If we practise these two art forms in



mudras are strongly linked with one another.

In Bharatha Natyam, mudras are called Hasthas or mudras, and singlehand mudras are called Asamutha Hasthas, and double hand mudras are called Samutha Hasthas. Yet the total number of mudras differ from text to text

The mudras used for Abinaya are called Nirthiya hasthas, or Nirthiya mudras. In this category, all the single







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# **VISIONS THAT WIDEN CREATIVE HORIZONS**

#### **PROFESSOR SUNANDA** MAHENDRA

It is recorded that as the 19070 Nobel Prize winner in literature, the great writer Alexander Solzhenitsyn was unable to leave Russia to deliver the customary Nobel lecture in Stockholm. But he had the opportunity to submit his text written in the Russian language that came to be translated into English by a scholar named FD Reeve. The bilingual text came in the form

of a booklet running about 70 pages.

The English-reading world had the chance of reading what Solzhenitsyn wanted to express his creative process as well as his interpretation of art and creativity as he sees it from seven broad dimensions. The bilingual text initially came to be printed in 1972. Then there onwards it had gone to five impressions by 1974. As the necessity for more and more translations are needed as a guiding principle that was laid down on the International Translations Day that fell on September 30, this lecture of Solzhenitsyn comes as a genuine document that fulfils the intention.

In the first instance, he lays down the background to all forms of creativity in the following lines:

"As the savage, who in bewilderment has picked up a strange sea-leaving, a thing a thing hidden in the sand or an incomprehensible something fallen out of the sky-something intricately curved, something shimmering dully, sometimes shining in a bright ray of light, turns it this way and that, turns it looking for a way to use it, for some ordinary use to which he can put it, without suspecting an extraordinary one."

This metaphorical reference is then extended to the human expansion of knowledge that emerges via creative nuances. Solzhenitsyn sees creativity as a common compulsory act that embraces sensitivity as well as interpretative power of knowledge.

As you go on reading the text slowly considering each sentence, you will feel that the creativity in the human being has surpassed the narrow barriers of expression, giving vent to broader perspectives. They include the areas of speech mannerisms, visual means and the written sentences that envelop creativity in multi-faceted ways. The thinker cum creator in award-winner enables us to fathom his knowledge on the creativity linked to the orient as well as the occident. He takes the three concepts of Truth that are explained as Satyam in Orient, Happiness explained as Shivam and Beauty explained in Sundaram. These three are a global creative phenomenon accepted in the past. But they are considered universal realities. As Solzhenitsyn explains his view that the task of the artiste is to sense more keenly than others the harmony of the world, the beauty and the outrage of what man has done to it, and poignantly to let people know. He adds that in failure as well as in the lower depths – in poverty, in illness, in person - the consciousness of a stable harmony will never leave him. The Nobel text enables a reader to take up rereading what Solzhenitsyn has written in his language as followed by English translations. They include creative works such as One Day in the Life of Ivan Denisovish (1967), The First Circle (1968) and the Cancer Ward (1968). With the exception of the Cancer Ward, most of his creative works are translated into oriental languages. This includes Sinhala s well. Dr W A Abeysinghe has translated First Circle recently. The text underlines the fact that the work of art contains its verification and identity in itself. This is a factor that has been grossly undermined. The artificial pedagogical and pseudo modernism may at times tend to undermine the better qualities of good creative work. Such things have taken place in certain literary judgments over the years. The text underlines the three factors of truth, happiness and beauty as the Trinity belonging to the entire world. He also reminds his colleague FyadorDostoevesky who said that Beauty will saveth the world. He adds that it is not a slip of the tongue but a prophecy. It is perhaps Dostoevsky had been his guiding guru in the creativity, for he says that he had the gift of seeing much a man wondrously filled with light. With all these factors he raised a question: Could not art and literature help the modern world? In his text, he confesses that over the years he had not had the opportunity of learning to answer the question raised by himself. Bt he wants to know whether there could be a wider frame of discussing the same as a global response. The reader feels the pulse of Solzhenitsyn in varied forms. His vision in various forms; he confesses that his experience has paved the way to his creations.
