

" Expanded Concrete ".

Abstract.—This invention relates to expanded constructional cements and plasters.

According to this invention the formation of a set, expanded constructional cement or plaster with the aid of aluminium powder and preferably also aqueous mild alkali is effected in the presence of a small amount of a water soluable lower aliphatic alcohol, suitably methanol or ethanol. The conditions for obtaining the best results are discussed.

Abstract.—This invention is an improvement in or modification of the invention claimed in U. K. Patent Application No. 4,237/45.

According to the present invention, the upper surface of the bottom wall of the valve casing is formed as a flat surface for direct contact with the lower face of the disc valve and the bottom wall is provided with spaced inlet orifices which are closed by the disc valve when the latter is seated.

" Improvements in or relating to roof coverings ".

Abstract.-This invention relates to roof coverings.

The roof covering according to this invention, consists of plates which can be hung one in the other, are stiffened by hollow beads and transverse folds and by flanges and which can be fastened on wooden roof frames by folded clasps or on metal roof frames by means of tightening screws.

Parachute Mechanism ".

Abstract.—This invention relates to parachute mechanisms:

Its object is the provision of improved means for reducing the impulse force on the article or person carried by the parachute and the parachute itself. A member of ductile metal connecting the parachute to the article increases in length so that the major part of the kinetic energy of the article which is absorbed is taken up by the inelastic strain energy of the ductile metal as the separation between the article and the parachute increases. One form of apparatus according to the invention is described.
