## PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### WEST RIDGEWAY.

HEREAS by section 2 of the Ordinance No. 5 of 1873, it is amongst other things enacted that "promoters" shall mean any person, corporation, or company authorized by Proclamation in the Government Gazette to be issued by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, for that purpose, to construct and work tramways in any part of this Island, and any person, corporation, or company claiming under the said promoters:

And whereas John Melvill Boustead, of Colombo, and Edgar George Money, also of Colombo, carrying on business in Colombo aforesaid under the style or firm of Boustead Brothers, have entered into an agreement with the Municipal Council of the town of Colombo to construct and work tramways in the said town of Colombo, and it is expedient to declare the said John Melvill Boustead and Edgar George Money to be "promoters" for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation authorize the said John Melvill Boustead and Edgar George Money, carrying on business under the style or firm of Boustead Brothers, to construct and work tramways in the town of Colombo under and in pursuance of the terms of the said Ordinance, and We do hereby declare the said John Melvill Boustead and Edgar George Money, carrying on business as aforesaid, to be "promoters" for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-six.

#### FOR NOVEMBER, 1896. REPORTS

#### WESTERN PROVINCE.

#### COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: the recent heavy rains have done some damage to standing crops, but a fairly good harvest is expected.

Dry grain: no cultivation worth reporting.

Other products: the supply of vegetables was good and prices were moderate, but fruit was rather scarce and dear.

Prices of staple products: rice, from Rs. 3.50 to 4.50 a bushel; coccanuts, from Rs. 30 to Rs. 38 a thousand.

Rainfall: during the month there was rather more rain than was wanted.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: on the whole, a fairly good maha harvest is expected.

#### KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: the sowing of the maha harvest was over during the month throughout the district. The plants have been damaged by the recent flood. Dry grain: nil.

Other products: fruit and vegetables are scarce in the district, except in Rayigam korale, where vegetables are abundant.

Prices of staple products: imported rice, Rs. 4 to Rs. 5 a bushel; country rice, Rs. 3 to Rs. 4 50 a bushel; cocoanuts, Rs. 35 to Rs. 40 a thousand.

Rainfall: very heavy.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: it is expected that the yield of the maha harvest will be less than that

#### NEGOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: paddy plants have been damaged by the heavy rains.

Dry grain: no cultivation during the month.

Other products: fruit and vegetables were scarce.

Prices of staple products: rice, from Rs. 3 50 to Rs. 4 50 a bushel; cocoanuts, from Rs. 33 to Rs. 37 50 a thousand.

Rainfall: plentiful.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: prospect of a fairly good harvest.

#### CENTRAL PROVINCE.

#### KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy, maha: transplanting of paddy in Udunuwara, Yatinuwara, Tumpane, Harispattu, Pata Dumbara, Pata Hewaheta, and Uda Bulatgama is over; in Uda Dumbara the paddy plants are in blade, and in Udapalata in ear Crop or prospect of crop: good in Udapalata; too early to form an opinion with regard to other divisions.

Yala: nil. Dry grain, maha: hill paddy chenas in Yatinuwara, Tumpane, Harispattu, and Uda Bulatgama are about to blossom; in Udunuwara, Yatinuwara, Tumpane, and Harispattu amu in blade; in Pata Dumbara kurakkan chenas are being sown; and in Uda Dumbara they are in blade. Crop or prospect of crop: too early to form an opinion.

Yala: nil.

Rainfall: sufficient, in Udapalata excessive.

Prices: paddy, Re. 1.75 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1.50 per bushel; cocoanuts, Rs. 5 per 100.

#### MATALE DISTRICT.

Rainfall registered at Matale: 18.01 in.

Paddy: maha cultivation is still going on, except in Laggala, Matale east, where yala fields are being harvested. Some of the maha fields in plants were damaged by the heavy rains.

Dry grain: some of the kurakkan chenas are in plants, others are being sown.

Tanks in Matale north: most of the tanks are full. Health of cattle: satisfactory.

Health of people: good, a few cases of measles and chickenpox were reported from Matale north and south. Prices: rice, Rs. 4 to Rs. 5:50 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1:25 per bushel; and cocoanuts, Rs. 3 per 100.

#### NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Kotmale.—Maha cultivation has begun everywhere in the district. In some villages plants are about four months old. In others fields are weeded and transplanted. The weather is most favourable for the sown fields.

Prospects are very promising. Kurakkan chenas are being reaped with very satisfactory results. Fruits were scarce, but the supply of vegetables was satisfactory. Market prices were normal.

Uda Hewaheta.—Yala cultivation is satisfactory, and prospects seem to be promising. Kurakkan chenas are budding, and the recent rains which lasted from November 1 to 20 were satisfactory and favourable to the standing crops. The supply of vegetables and fruits was fair. Chickenpox and hoof-and-mouth disease amongst cattle prevail

in some villages.

Walapane.—Yala harvest is being gathered in some villages with fair outturns. Kurakkan chenas are doing well in consequence of the recent rains.

#### NORTHERN PROVINCE.

#### JAFFNA DISTRICT.

Weather: there was abundance of rain during the month, the only two rainless days in the Jaffna District being the 29th and 30th. The rains which fell on the 8th, 9th, 11th, 13th, 15th, 16th, 19th, 21st, 22nd, and 23rd were heavy and general, and the rainfall on other days was scanty and partial. The rainfall registered by the Public Works Department at Jaffna was 14:46 in., against 12:83 in November, 1895.

Paddy, kalapokam, 1897: the paddy is in plants from 2 to 2½ months old, except in Karachchi, where the early sowing is in ear. The plants of the late sowing were attacked by Arakkoddiyan, a species of caterpillar, in Valikamam west, Vadamaradchi east, Tenmaradchi, Punakari, and The islands. The injury done by them is not however fatal, as the caterpillars have disappeared from most places and the plants are regaining their vigour. A few fields of the late sowing in Valikamam west have also been attacked with the disease called senthal (barren shoot). Weeding and transplanting were vigorously carried on during the month. The weeding operation has been much more expensive than usual, as the weed seeds which lay dormant during the drought thickly sprang up with the fall of rain and the sowing of paddy. There is sufficient water for the present, and the prospects are in general very good.

Dry grain: kurakkan is in ear and being reaped; the outturn is reported good. Varaku and karuttachami are in plants and doing well. Mondy and putsamy, sown only in Valikamam west and The Islands, are in plants and ear. Uluntu, kollu, and payaru, sown in Valikamam north, are in tender plants. The dry grain cultivation of the islands of Delft has been greatly damaged by the caterpillars above referred to.

Prices of staple articles: paddy, between Re. 1.62 and Rs. 2 per bushel; rice, Rs. 4.37½ per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1.37½ per bushel; varaku, Re. 1.50 per bushel; tinaichchamy, Re. 1.50 per bushel; Paddy, kalapokam, 1897: the paddy is in plants from 2 to 21 months old, except in Karachchi, where the early

bushel.

#### MANNAR DISTRICT.

Rainfall: good showers of rain in Mannar island, and heavy rains in mainland. Almost all tanks spilled. Rainfall registered is 14.75 in.

State of crops: sowing of paddy continues. Those in plants doing well. Dry grains in Mannar island also doing well. Prospects in general very good.

Prices of grain: prices of grain have risen owing to no large consignments of rice coming in on account of apprehension of famine and prevalence of cholera in India, but there is no scarcity. Paddy sells at Re. 1.75 per bushel; rice sells at Rs. 4.50 per bushel; kurakkan sells at Re. 1.25 per bushel.

#### MULLAITTIVU DISTRICT.

Crops: sowing and preparations for sowing still continue. Paddy crop of fields already cultivated is in a flourishing condition.

Dry grain crop: kurakkan and varaku are in the plant stage.

Weather: good rain throughout the district. The wind blew generally from the north-east.

Health of people: fair, but there has been fever.

Health of cattle : good.

Prices of grain: paddy, Re. 1.50 per bushel; rice, Rs. 3.25 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1.25 per bushel; varaku, 75 cents per bushel; gingelly, Rs. 4 per bushel; uluntu, Rs. 3.50 per bushel; payaru, Rs. 4 per bushel; kollu, Rs. 2.50 per bushel.

#### VAVUNIYA DISTRICT,

There have been good showers of rain throughout the district during the month. Rainfall registered at Vavuniya is 11.61 in.

Vavuniya is 17:01 in.

Plonghing and sowing for the kalapokam harvest are in progress. Tanks full.

Prices: paddy, Re. 1·12 to 1·28 per bushel; rice, Rs. 3·20 to Rs. 4 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1 to Re. 1·25 per bushel; gingelly, Rs. 4 per bushel.

Fever is prevailing throughout the district.

The murrain which was raging in Kilakumulai north has spread into Melpattu south, 199 out of 208 cases are

reported to have proved fatal.

#### SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

#### GALLE DISTRICT.

Paddy, maha: heavy rain caused much damage to paddy plants, especially to newly sown lands, seed paddy in some of them having been washed away. The standing plants are looking well and promise a good harvest. Dry grain : hardly any cultivation.

Miscellaneous: jak and breadfruit are scarce; the other vegetables are in fair supply; cocoanuts. Rs. 30 per thousand nuts.

Prices of staple products: rice, Rs. 3·50 to Rs. 5·50 per bushel; paddy, Re. 1·50 per bushel: kurakkan, Rs. 3·84 per bushel; Indian corn, 75 cents per 100 cobs; mederi, Re. 1·50 per bushel; and amu, Re. 1·25 per bushel.

Rainfall: 16.92 in. Health: satisfactory Cattle: free from disease.

MATARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: good.

Dry grain: good.
Prices: paddy, Re. 1.75 per bushel; fine grain, Re. 1.68 per bushel.

#### HAMBANTOTA DISTRICT.

Paddy: ploughing and mudding for maha going on throughout the district. In West Giruwa pattu many fields are being cultivated, which have lain fallow for four years.

Rainfall : fair.

Health: fever and dysentery have prevailed to some extent. Some cases of hoof-and-mouth disease are

reported in West Giruwa pattu.

Prices: rice, Rs. 3·50 to 4·75 per bushel; paddy, Re. 1·25 to 1·75 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1·25 to Re. 1·84 per bushel; cocoanuts, Rs. 35 to 45 per 1,000; Indian corn, 50 to 62; cents per 100 cobs; sweet potatoes, Re. 1. per cwt.

#### EASTERN PROVINCE.

#### BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

Paddy: sowing of early munmari for the harvest of next year is nearly over. Weather has been very favourable for sowing. Preparations are made to commence sowing for later munmari.

Other grains: Indian corn crops on chena and private lands are in good condition; harvesting will commence

after middle of next month. Kurakkan is being sown. Price of paddy: Re. 1.25 a bushel.

Price of other grains: none sold in the market. Rainfall: 18.92 in.

Health of people: on the whole good. There are a few cases of dysentery, measles, and the usual amount of fever prevailing at this time of the year.

Health of cattle: hoof disease is on the decline.

#### TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

Rainfall: 19.04 in.

Paddy: sowing of the munmari cultivation completed. Condition of plants very satisfactory, except in some parts of the Tamblegam pattu, where cultivation has been damaged by too much rain.

Tobacco: cultivation already commenced and some of the gardens being planted.

Dry grain: none.

Manioca: cultivation in Tamblegam pattu is in a good condition.

Fishery: no fishing is carried on now owing to the setting in of the rain.

Prices of articles: paddy, Re. 1.50 per bushel; rice, Rs. 3.87 per bushel; dry grain, Re. 1.25 per bushel cassawa, 4 cents per lb.

#### NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

#### KURUNEGALA DISTRICT.

Wanni Hatpattu.—Fields are being ploughed throughout the hatpattu. Rain being abundant and tanks full prospects are good. Chenas all sown and crop young; prospects favourable. No disease among cattle. Health of people good.

Dewamedi Hatpattu.—Paddy: some earing and some being sown. Rain being sufficient prospects very good, Chena crop young; prospects favourable. Health of people good, except a few cases of measles. Health of cattle good. Murrain in one village on the decrease.

Katugampola Hatpattu.—Paddy crop young ; prospects good. Chena crop promising. Health of people good,

except in a few palatas.

Dambadeni Hatpattu.—Paddy crop young and slightly damaged owing to excessive rain; prospects otherwise good. Chenas small extent cultivated; prospects very favourable. Health of people very fair, except a few cases of measles and chickenpox in one korale. Health of cattle good.

Weudawili Hatpattu.—Paddy crop earing; a good crop anticipated. Chena crop good. Health of people and

cattle good.

Hiriyala Hatpattu.—Paddy crop young, some fields still being ploughed. Standing crop good. Chena crop young; prospects good. Health of people good, except a few cases of fever and cold. Health of cattle good.

#### PUTTALAM DISTRICT.

Paddy: in Demala hatpattu, Puttalam pattu (including Akkarai pattu south and Rajakumarawanni pattus), Akkarai pattu north, and Pomparippu pattus the crops are tender, but look healthy; in some pattus ploughing and sowing are being done; prospect middling.

Dry grain: in Demala hatpattu chenas are being sown with dry grain, and in the other pattus the crop is young. Staple products: price of rice varies from Rs. 4·25 to Rs. 4·50 per bushel; cocoanuts, Rs. 3·50 to Rs. 4 per 100. Rainfall: the weather has been unusually wet during the month, and the rainfall registered is 14.78 in. The rain has breached several tanks and damaged the main roads.

#### CHILAW DISTRICT.

Northern Division.—Fields being ploughed for bala-wi cultivation. Some of the bala-wi cultivation already

done has been damaged by flood.

Central Division.—6,381 bushels of ma-wi and ilankali have been cultivated, of which 547 bushels have been damaged by rain and floods, and a large extent of the cultivation is yet under water. The cultivation in high level fields is in very good condition and just beginning to ear. Kurakkan cultivation is reported to be 20½ bushels and doing well.

Southern Division.—Bala-wi cultivation ceased, and the rains have partly damaged the crops. 37 bushels of fine grain cultivated, and is thriving well. Tanks full and some overflowed, causing slight damages.

#### NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

#### Anuradhapura District.

Rainfall: at Anuradhapura 1402 in. There has been rain throughout the Province.

Paddy: the crops of the Sinhala and Meda pattu of Tamankaduwa District have been reaped. In other parts of the Province the fields are being either ploughed or sown, or have a growth of young paddy plants thereon.

Tanks: some of the tanks are full and have spilt. There are others which are yet half full and quarter full.

Health of cattle: cattle murrain is reported to be prevalent in some villages of Nuwaragam palata. All cases of disease are being treated according to the instructions of the Assistant Veterinary Surgeon.

Health of people: satisfactory.

#### PROVINCE OF UVA.

#### BADULLA DISTRICT.

The rains which came on a little earlier than usual this year have been very heavy and, with the exception of a short break at the end of the month, continuous. The registered rainfall in Badulla was 15-39 in. Several fields by the banks of streams have been washed away. The yala crop and chenas have been sown. The young paddy plants are doing well. The food supply is good; fruit and vegetables plentiful. The health of the people has been good except for a few cases of dysentery. Foot and mouth disease has almost disappeared.

#### PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

#### RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy: the recent floods to some extent have damaged the maha crops on the low-lying fields of the district. The crops on the other fields look well, and some are just beginning to flower. In Pussella, Kuruwiti korale, blight in some fields have appeared.

Chenas: the crops on el-wi chenas are doing well, and some are now in ear. The kurakkan chenas in the Bintenna are just being sown. In Kolonna korale chenas sown with kurakkan failed, seed not germinating, and this has necessitated the cultivators to repeat sowing a second and third time; prospects not favourable.

Cattle: no disease among cattle is reported.

Health of the people is satisfactory.

#### KÉGALLA DISTRICT.

Paddy, maha: prospects are good throughout the district, but the rainfall has been rather heavy, and some of the fields have been slightly damaged.

Dry grain: hill paddy, amu, and iringu prospects are good. Kurakkan has been harvested. The yield is in general good. In Three Korales (Walapala) chenas are being prepared for sowing kurakkan. Meneri sown in Beligal korale is growing well.

Prices: paddy, Re. 1·25 to Re. 1·50 per bushel; hill paddy, Re. 1 to Re. 1·25 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1 to Re. 1·25 per bushel; mun, Rs. 3·25 to Rs. 3·50 per bushel; amu, 75 cents to Re. 1 per bushel.

Rainfall: registered at Ambanpitiya 22·55 in. (up to 29th), Ruanwella 27·06 in.

Cattle disease: the district is free from cattle disease.

Health of people: two cases of chickenpox were reported from Paranakuru korale and a few cases of dysentery from the village Dedigama in Beligal korale. Otherwise the health of the people is in general good.
