PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. West Ridgeway, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 7 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, as occasion may require, to establish by Proclamation in the Government Gazette a Police Force for the effectual protection of person and property within such towns as to them shall appear to require the same:

And whereas by the 13th section of the said Ordinance it is further enacted that the Proclamation establishing a Police Force in any town shall also specify and define the limits of such town, and it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time, as occasion may require by Proclamation to alter or vary such limits:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 8th day of March, 1886, a Police Force was established at Nuwara Eliya under the provisions of, and for the purpose of, the said Ordinance, and the limits of the said town were specified and defined in and by the said Proclamation.

And whereas by the 8th section of the Ordinance No. 27 of 1890, intituled "An Ordinance relating to Local Boards," it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, exempt the inhabitants of any town from payment

of the Police tax, and order the withdrawal of the whole or any part of the Police Force therein; and may, with the like advice, revoke such exemption and order of withdrawal; and that after such

revocation the liability of the inhabitants to pay the Police tax shall be revived:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of January, 1891, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the said section of the said Ordinance did order the withdrawal of the Police Force from Nuwara Eliya as from and after the 1st day of January, 1891:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke such exemption of the inhabitants of the town of Nuwara Eliya from payment of the Police tax, and the said order of withdrawal of the Police Force

from Nuwara Eliya:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the power in Us vested by the 8th section of the Ordinance aforesaid, do by this Our Proclamation revoke the said order of withdrawal of the Police Force from Nuwara Eliya and declare that the liability of the inhabitants of the said town of Nuwara Eliya to pay the Police tax shall be revived as from and after the 1st day of January, 1897.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-second day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-six.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir Joseph West Ridgeway, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 85 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, intituled "An Ordinance for the General Regulation of Customs in the Island of Ceylon," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation appoint any place to be a haven, creek, port, or warehousing port in this Colony, and declare the limits thereof, or annul the limits of any port, haven, or creek already appointed, or to be hereafter appointed, and declare the same to be no longer a port, warehousing port, haven or creek; and that all ports, warehousing ports, havens, and creeks, and the respective limits thereof, appointed and existing as such at the time of the passing of the said Ordinance, should continue to be such ports, havens, and creeks until annulled or altered as aforesaid:

continue to be such ports, havens, and creeks until annulled or altered as aforesaid:

And whereas the town of Dodanduwa, in the Southern Province, is a port duly appointed within certain specified limits, and was existing as such at the time of the passing of the said

Ordinance:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to annul the limits of the said port and declare the same

to be no longer a port for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Prolamation annul the limits of the said port of Dodanduwa aforesaid, and declare the same, as from and after the first day of January, 1897, to be no longer a port for the purposes of the said Ordinance.
