WHEREAS by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 28 of 1871, entitled "An Ordinance to provide for the Registration of Domestic Servants," it is enacted that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in such towns or districts of the Island, and from such date or dates, as may from time to time be prescribed by the Governor, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette:

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

HEREAS by section 7 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, as occasion may require, to establish by Proclamation in the Government Gazette a Police Force for the effectual protection of person and property within such towns as to them shall appear to require the same:

And whereas by the 13th section of the said Ordinance it is further enacted that the Proclamation establishing a Police Force in any town shall also specify and define the limits of such town, and it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time, as occasion may require, by Proclamation to alter or vary such limits:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 8th day of March, 1886, a Police Force was established by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, at Nuwara Eliya under the provisions of section 7 of the said Police Ordinance, 1865, and the limits of the said town were specified and defined

in and by the said Proclamation:

And whereas by the 8th section of the Ordinance No. 27 of 1890, intituled "An Ordinance relating to Local Boards," it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, exempt the inhabitants of any town from payment of the Police tax, and order the withdrawal of the whole or any part of the Police Force therein; and may, with the like advice, revoke such exemption and order of withdrawal; and that after such revocation the liability of the inhabitants to pay the Police tax shall be revived:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of January, 1891, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the said section of the said Ordinance, did order the withdrawal of the Police Force from Nuwara Eliya as from and after the

1st day of January, 1891;

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 22nd day of December, 1896, such exemption of the inhabitants of the town of Nuwara Eliya from payment of the Police tax, and the said order of withdrawal of the Police Force from Nuwara Eliya have been revoked, and the liability of the

inhabitants of the town of Nuwara Eliya to pay the Police tax has been thereby revived:

And whereas by section 34 of the said "Police Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that, for the purposes of creating a fund from which the expenses of the Police Force payable by each town not created a Municipality are to be defrayed, a tax shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 20th down of Inne 20th down of Spetterland and the 21st day of Police force the 30th day of June, 30th day of September, and on the 31st day of December in every year for the quarter ending on the said days respectively on all houses and buildings of every description and on all lands and tenements whatsoever within every such town, to an amount equal to such percentage on the bona fide annual value of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements as the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint, except in cases where such amount shall fall below the sum of 25 cents per quarter, in all which excepted cases 25 cents per quarter shall be assessed and payable: Provided that such tax shall not in the aggregate exceed the sum necessary for the maintenance of the Force in such town except as aforesaid, and which sum it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time to determine and appoint: Provided further that buildings appropriated to religious worship and such as are placed in charge of military sentries shall be exempted from the payment of such tax.

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that for the purposes aforesaid the tax payable on all houses and buildings of every description, and on all lands and tenements whatsoever in the town of Nuwara Eliva aforesaid, within the limits specified in the schedule to the Proclamation dated the Eighth day of March, 1886, aforesaid shall, save in such excepted cases as aforesaid and in the case of such buildings which are exempted from the payment of such tax as aforesaid from and after the 1st day of January, 1897, be at the rate of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per centum on the boná fide annual value of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements aforesaid.

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of August, 1888, a Police Force was under the provisions of the said Ordinance established in the town of Hatton, in the Central Province, and the limits of the said town were for the purposes of the said Ordinance specified and defined in the schedule thereto:

And whereas it is expedient to alter such limits and to re-define and specify the limits of the said town of Hatton for the purposes aforesaid:

And whereas it is further enacted that where any rules for the enforcement of such ancient customs are in force the Government Agent may call a public meeting of the proprietors for the purpose of adding to, amending, or repealing such rules or any of them, and that all such alterations and all alterations by way of addition, amendment, or repeal shall be transmitted to the Governor for approval or disallowance, and shall, if approved, be published in the Government Gazette and in the district in such manner as to the Government Agent shall seem expedient, and shall thereupon become binding upon all proprietors within the said district, and shall be as legal, valid, and effectual as if the same had been inserted in the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal rule 19 of the rules published by Proclamation dated the 9th day of August, 1882, in the Government Gazette dated the 11th day of August, 1882, and that the additional rules appearing in the schedule hereto which have been transmitted by the Government Agent of the Southern Province and approved by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall be brought into operation in the District of Magampattu in the Hambantota District:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by virtue of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid repeal the said rule 19 of the rules published by Proclamation dated the 9th day of August, 1882, in the Government Gazette dated the 11th day of August, 1882, and proclaim that the said additional rules relating to the cultivation of paddy lands in the District of Magampattu of the Hambantota District, Southern Province, appearing in the schedule hereto, have been approved by Us, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

2. Tenders should be submitted in duplicate, the original being forwarded to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and the duplicate direct to the Hon. the Auditor-General, both being required to be forwarded at the same

The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals, or to the Medical Officer in charge of the respective hospitals, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form. Each tender should be for pro-

visioning one hospital only.

4. Every tenderer will be required to make a deposit (on applying for forms) of half the amount of security for hospital where Rs. 400 or under are required, and Rs. 200 for hospital where security over Rs. 400 is required; and should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned after the contract has been signed. The deposit must be made

at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and the deposit receipt must be produced to the officer issuing the form as his authority for making the issue. In stations where there are no kachcheries the deposit must be made to the Medical Officer in charge of the hospital.

5. Provisions should be of the best quality, approvable

by the Medical Officer of the hospital.

6. When required, samples must be deposited.
7. The successful tenderers will be required to give cash security as given opposite the name of each station, and to sign the bond given in the tender for the due fulfilment of each contract within a fortnight from date of notification of acceptance of the tenders. The amount denocited for tender tenders will form the tenders. deposited for tender forms will form part of the cash security. It is left to the option of the successful tenderer to substitute at any time thereafter for cash deposited by him approved title deeds and to enter into a fresh security bond at his expense.

8. In case any person makes any alterations in his tender before forwarding it, such alteration should invariably bear his initials; otherwise the tender will be

treated as informal and rejected.

9. Any further information can be obtained on application to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals.

10. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.
