#### BY-LAW

The by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 8,806 of October 31, 1941, are hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) in by-law 4, by the substitution for the words "in the form set out", of the words "in Form A set out";
- (2) in by-law 10, by the substitution in paragraph (i), for "after 10 P.M.", of "after 7 P.M.";

(3) in by-law 15—

(a) in paragraph (2) by the substitution for the words "private market or other premises", of the words "private market";

(b) by the substitution in item (d) of paragraph (4), for the words "Bandarawela Sunday Market", of the words "Bandarawela Fair"; and

(c) by the insertion immediately after paragraph (4) of the following proviso:—

"Provided, however, that the provisions of paragraph (1) of this by-law shall not apply to the sale of fish conducted in vans by the Department of Fisheries or to the sale conducted in vans of the meat of any animal reared in any Government Farm."

(4) by the substitution for by-law 16, of the following new by-law:—

"16. (1) The Bandarawela Fair shall be held on such days and on such premises as the Council may fix by resolution passed in that behalf from time to time.

(2) No person shall expose for sale or sell at the Bandarawela Fair any eggs, poultry, jaggery, fruits, vegetables, cereals, yams or other garden or chena produce grown in the Bandarawela District—

(a) unless he is the holder of a permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman or an officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, and

(b) except between the hours of 4 a.m. and 6 p.m.

(3) (a) No person shall sell any dried or salted fish or meat within the premises of the Bandarawela Fair unless he is the holder of a permit issued by the Chairman or by an officer authorised in that behalf by the Chairman.

(b) No person shall expose for sale or sell within the Bandarawela Fair any fish or meat:

Provided, however, that the provisions of item (b) of this paragraph shall not apply to the sale of fish conducted in vans by the Department of Fisheries or to the sale conducted in vans of the meat of any animal reared in any Government Farm.

(4) Every permit issued under paragraph (2) or paragraph (3) (a) shall be in Form B set out in the Schedule hereto and shall be subject to the conditions stated therein.

(5) The fee payable in respect of every permit referred to in paragraph (4) shall be calculated at the rate of five cents for each square foot.

(6) No person shall re-sell within the premises of the Bandarawela Fair any article purchased at that Fair.

(7) Within the premises of the Bandarawela Fair, no person shall between the hours of 4 a.m. and 6 p.m.—

(a) read or offer to read the palm or tell the fortune of any person visiting the Fair; or

(b) advertise, sell or expose for sale medicine or drugs of any kind whatsoever; or

(c) beg for alms from persons attending the Fair; or

(d) teach any religion or make public speeches or collect subscriptions from persons attending the Fair.

(8) All disputes between vendors or between vendors and the public shall be settled by any officer of the Council on duty within the premises of the Fair.

(9) Order within the premises of the Fair shall be maintained by any officer of the Council on duty within the premises of the Fair.

(10) No person attending the Fair shall refuse or fail to comply with the lawful orders or directions given by any officer of the Council in settlement of any dispute or for the maintenance of order.”;

(5) in the proviso to by-law 17, by the substitution, for the words “or of game,” of the words “or of game, or the meat of any animal reared in any Government Farm.”; and

(6) in the Schedule to those by-laws—

(a) by the insertion therein between the words “Schedule” and “Market Licence” of the words “Form A”;

(b) by the addition of the following new form:—

“FORM B.

*Fair Permit*

The bearer \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_ is hereby permitted to sell articles at the Bandarawela Fair at such stall or space as may be allotted to him by the market-keeper or an officer authorised by the

Chairman in that behalf. This permit is subject to the conditions stated therein.

#### Conditions

1. This permit is not transferable.
2. Not more than two persons shall occupy the space allotted for the use of the holder of the permit.
3. This permit shall be produced for inspection by the Chairman or any officer of the Council authorised by the Chairman or by any police officer on duty at the Fair.
4. No holder of a permit shall refuse to sell by retail any article which he has brought for sale.
5. Every holder of a permit who sells any article by weight or measure shall on demand made by the Chairman or an officer authorised by him, or any police officer on duty at the Fair produce for inspection the weighing or measuring instruments he uses.
6. This permit shall be cancelled for the breach of any of the conditions stated herein.
7. The Chairman may refuse to issue a permit to any person who has at any time contravened the provisions of by-law 16 or of any of the conditions stated therein.”

#### BY-LAWS

##### DWELLING COMPOUNDS

1. The occupier, or if there is no occupier the owner, of any house within the urban area shall keep the land pertaining to such house in a clean and sanitary condition and free of undergrowth and rubbish.

##### THE CLEANING OF HOUSES

2. Whenever any house appears to be in an insanitary condition or in such a state of disrepair as to be prejudicial to the health of the inmates or of the neighbours, the Chairman shall cause a notice in writing to be served upon the owner of the house specifying what action the owner should take within a time set out in the notice.

3. (1) Every owner of a house served with a notice under by-law 2 shall comply with the requirements of such notice within the specified time.

(2) In the event of failure or refusal to comply with the requirements of a notice under by-law 2, the owner shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding two hundred and fifty rupees and in the case of continuing contravention with an additional fine of twenty-five rupees for every day during which the contravention is continued after conviction thereof by a court of competent jurisdiction, or after service of a written

notice from the Chairman, or other officer authorised in that behalf by the Chairman, directing attention to such contravention.

4. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Badulla Urban Council; and

“urban area” means the area within the administrative limits of the Council.

(2) The following trades shall be deemed to be dangerous trades:—

- (a) Manufacturing aerated waters.
- (b) Manufacturing copra.
- (c) Any trade in which machinery driven by oil or other fuel or steam or electricity is used.
- (d) Extracting oil by apparatus.
- (e) Quarrying for cabook, gravel or metal.
- (f) Storing copra.
- (g) Storing straw.
- (h) Manufacturing desiccated coconut.
- (i) Curing or storing plumbago.
- (j) Digging for coral stones by opening a pit.
- (k) Manufacturing coconut oil by machinery.
- (l) Burning or storing lime.
- (m) Manufacturing or storing fibre.
- (n) Storing cotton wool.
- (o) Manufacturing matches.

(3) The following trades shall be deemed to be dangerous and offensive trades:—

- (a) Dyeing fibre.
- (b) Burning bricks or tiles.

**KRAALS FOR SOAKING COCONUT HUSKS**

2. No person shall erect or maintain any kraal for soaking coconut husks in any public lake, river, lagoon, or estuary except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

3. No licence shall be issued in respect of a kraal that obstructs any ferry, estuary or irrigation work.

4. Every licence issued under by-law 2 shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

#### By-laws

#### OFFENSIVE AND DANGEROUS TRADES

1. (1) The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive trades :—

- (a) Manufacture of soap.
- (b) Koda manufacture.
- (c) Curing and drying of tobacco.
- (d) Cigar manufacture.

(2) The following trades shall be deemed to be dangerous trades :—

- (a) Manufacture or storing of copra.
- (b) Extracting of oil by apparatus.
- (c) Manufacture of desiccated coconut.
- (d) Sawing of timber or wood by the use of water, steam or other mechanical power.
- (e) Manufacture of aerated water.
- (f) Storing of straw.
- (g) Manufacture of matches.
- (h) Quarrying of cabook, gravel or metal.
- (i) Oxy-welding.
- (j) Keeping a timber depot.
- (k) Keeping a kerosene oil depot.
- (l) Any trade in which machinery driven by oil or other fuel or steam or electricity is used.

(3) The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive and dangerous trades :—

- (a) Burning of bricks or tiles.
- (b) Charging of batteries.
- (c) Burning, storing, curing or rending of lime.

2. (1) No person shall carry on any offensive or dangerous trade unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence shall, unless it is earlier cancelled under by-law 11, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

3. No person shall be entitled to a licence to carry on any dangerous or offensive trade unless—

- (1) the place at which that trade is to be carried on is approved by the Medical Officer of Health ; and
- (2) the building or buildings, if any, to be used for the purposes of that trade are in conformity with the following requirements :—
  - (a) The building must be in good repair, well ventilated, well lighted and provided with adequate drainage and latrine accommodation ;
  - (b) The roof of such building must be made of some permanent material and the floor must be cemented ;
  - (c) The eaves of such building must be not less than six feet from the ground ;
  - (d) Every room in such building must be provided with windows capable of being opened and the area of such windows when opened shall be less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space ;
  - (e) The walls of every room in such building must be not less than seven feet in height and must be built of brick, stone or cabook ;
  - (f) The internal surface of such walls to a height of at least four feet from the

floor must be plastered in cement and the rest of the floor must be lime plastered and limewashed ;

(g) The woodwork of such building must be oil-painted or limewashed.

4. (1) If at any time during the period for which a licence has been issued in respect of any offensive or dangerous trade, any building used for the purposes of that trade ceases to conform to the provisions of by-law 3, the Chairman may on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, cause a notice to be served on the licensee requiring him to do before a date to be specified in the notice all things necessary to make such building conform to such provisions.

(2) No holder of a licence to carry on an offensive or dangerous trade on whom a notice is served under paragraph (1) of this by-law shall fail to comply with the requirements of such notice within the time specified therein.

5. Any notice under by-law 4 shall be deemed to have been served on the holder of a licence to carry on any dangerous or offensive trade if it is affixed to the premises at which the holder of a licence carries on such trade or it is left with any person employed in such premises by the holder of the licence.

6. The holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall cause—

- (a) the floor of every building used for the purposes of such trade to be swept and cleaned daily ;
- (b) the walls of every such building to be limewashed at least once in every twelve months ;
- (c) all apparatus, implements and vessels used in such trade to be kept clean ;
- (d) all refuse, sweepings, scrapings and waste and by-products which are not to be subjected to further trade processes to be removed daily in covered receptacles from the premises in which such trade is carried on.

7. No holder of a licence to carry on an offensive or dangerous trade shall pollute or contaminate any well or tank or any river, stream, canal, channel, lake or other inland water.

8. No holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall carry on such trade in any manner likely to cause a nuisance to or to be injurious to the health or comfort of persons in the neighbourhood.

9. Every holder of a licence to carry on an offensive or dangerous trade shall cause any offensive vapours or gases which are emitted in the course of carrying such trade—

- (a) to be discharged into the external air in such a manner and such a height as to admit of their diffusion without injurious or offensive effects ; or
- (b) to be passed directly through a fire or into a condensing apparatus.

10. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Inspector or an officer of the Committee authorised in writing by the Chairman at all reasonable times to enter upon and inspect any premises at which an offensive or dangerous trade is carried on and the licensee or the person in charge thereof shall permit such inspection to be made.

11. It shall be lawful for the Rural Courts in addition to any other punishment that it may impose to cancel the licence of a licensee convicted twice or oftener of a breach of any of these by-laws relating to offensive and dangerous trades and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the cancellation.

## UNWHOLESOME FOOD AND DRINK

12. No person shall keep or expose for sale any article of food or drink which is unwholesome or unfit for human consumption.

13. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Inspector or any person authorised by the Chairman in writing to seize any article of food or drink kept or exposed for sale if such article appears to be unwholesome or unfit for human consumption.

14. Where any officer or person other than the Medical Officer of Health seizes any article of food or drink under by-law 13, he shall place a sample of the seized article in a receptacle, and shall, after sealing the receptacle in the presence of the person from whose possession the article was seized, produce the sample with the least possible delay before the Medical Officer of Health or any other Government Medical Officer.

15. Where any article of food or drink is seized under by-law 13, the person seizing such article shall, upon demand of a sealed sample from the person from whose possession such article was seized, place a sample of the seized article in a receptacle, and shall, after sealing the receptacle in the presence of the person from whose possession the article was seized give the sample to that person.

16. If the Medical Officer of Health who seized an article of food or drink under by-law 13, or the Medical Officer of Health before whom any article of food or drink is produced under by-law 14, certifies such article to be unwholesome and unfit for human consumption, the Chairman shall cause such article to be destroyed or to be disposed of as to, prevent its being exposed for sale or used for human consumption.

17. No person shall sell or expose for sale the flesh of any animal that has died of natural causes or of any disease or of drowning, or has been killed by a wild beast or by the bite of a snake or of a rabid dog.

## KRAALS FOR SOAKING COCONUT HUSKS

18. No person shall keep or maintain any kraal in any public lake, river, lagoon or estuary within the village area, unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

19. Every licence issued under by-law 18, shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

## INTERPRETATION

20. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee; and

“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Uddiyankulama village area in the Anuradhapura District.

## BY-LAWS

## CONSTRUCTION OF BUILDINGS

1. (1) No person shall erect within any part of the village area any new building, boundary wall or gateway within a distance of—

- (a) fifteen feet from the centre of any village cart road;
- (b) fifteen feet from the centre of any village path which has been notified by the Committee as a path which in course of time is to be converted into a village cart road; or
- (c) seven feet from the centre of any village path other than a path referred to in paragraph (b).

(2) No person shall erect any building, boundary wall or gateway along any cart road or path referred to in paragraph (1) without giving at least thirty days' previous notice thereof in writing to the Chairman.

## OVERHANGING TREES

2. (1) Whenever any tree, or the branch, fruit or any other part of such tree is causing or is likely to cause injury or is in such condition as is likely to endanger any passer-by along any public thoroughfare, the Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner or occupier of the land upon which such tree stands require such owner or occupier to cut down and remove or tie up and make secure, such tree or the branch, fruit or other part of such tree, as the case may be, within such time as may be specified in the notice.

(2) No person shall fail to comply with the requirements of a notice served under paragraph (1) of this by-law.

## ABATEMENT OF NUISANCES

3. Where any building or wall, or anything affixed thereon is in such condition as is likely to cause injury or otherwise endanger any passer-by on a public road, the Chairman may give notice in writing to the owner or occupier requiring him—

- (a) in any case of urgency, to cause within twenty-four hours after the service of the notice a proper board or fence to be put up for the protection of any passer-by; and
- (b) in every case, within three days after the service to cause such building or wall or anything affixed thereon to be secured or repaired.

4. (1) Every owner or occupier, served with any notice under by-law 3, shall comply with the requirements of such notice within the time specified therein

(2) In any case of failure or refusal to comply with the requirements of the notice served under by-law 3, the Chairman may authorise any specified person to do the work which ought to have been done and the expenses thereby incurred may be recovered from such owner or occupier as a debt due to the Committee.

5. (1) Whenever any house or building appears to be in an insanitary condition or in such a state of disrepair as to be prejudicial to the health of the inmates or of the neighbours, the Chairman may cause a notice in writing to be served upon the owner or occupier of the house or building requiring him to comply with the requirements of such notice within the time specified therein.

(2) Every owner or occupier served with a notice under paragraph (1) shall comply with the requirements of such notice within the specified time, and in the event of failure or refusal to comply with the requirements of such notice, the Chairman may cause the work to be done and the expenses thereby incurred may be recovered as a debt due to the Committee.

6. Every owner or occupier of any house within the village area shall cause his house to be white-washed at least once a year and at any other time specified by notice in writing by the Chairman, if by reason of any outbreak of any epidemic disease such steps appear to the Committee to be necessary.

7. No person shall dispose of the water of coconuts split for other than domestic purposes within a distance of one hundred yards of any public road or path or public place or any dwelling house.

8. No person shall keep or halt any cart on any public road or path except in the event of a breakdown, or longer than is reasonably necessary for the purpose of loading goods into or unloading goods from such cart.

9. No person shall wantonly deposit the carcase of any dead animal on any land or premises belonging to any other person.

10. No person shall place or bury any charmed plate, leaf, or paper or a charm in any other form, on the land of any other person.

11. No person shall—

- (a) draw any caricature or indecent picture or write any insulting expression on any building or any public place or do any other act by which any member of the public is likely to be insulted or public decency outraged; or
- (b) ease himself on his own land, or on another's land or on any public road or path, or in any place other than a place specially provided for such purpose, in such a way as to offend other people's feelings of decency; or
- (c) throw rubbish or noisome matter or any un-serviceable article, or any other thing on land belonging to any other person or on any public road or public place or path; or
- (d) pelt stones or throw filth at the house of any other person; or
- (e) expose any mat, cloth, or other article on or on the side of any public road, path, thoroughfare or public place in such a manner as to terrify animals or cause annoyance to the public; or
- (f) allow children of tender years to play or stray about on any public path, or thoroughfare or public place or to commit a nuisance thereon.

#### SALE OF PROVISIONS

12. No person shall keep any shop or place (other than a market) for the sale of meat, poultry, fish, fruit, vegetables or other perishable articles of food; except on a licence duly obtained on that behalf from the Chairman. Every such licence shall, unless earlier cancelled by by-law 19, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

13. The owner or seller of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables or other perishable articles of food in any shop or place (other than a market) shall keep the meat, poultry, and fish apart from the vegetables and the poultry in baskets so made that the birds may not suffer unnecessary discomfort.

14. The Chairman or any other person duly authorised by him in writing may inspect any shop, or place (other than a market) used for the sale of meat, poultry, fish, fruit, vegetables or other perishable articles of food for human consumption.

15. (1) No meat shall be transported from any slaughter-house to any shop or place where the meat is sold except in a box or vehicle which satisfies the following conditions:—

- (a) Where a box is used, the box must have the inside lined with zinc or other impermeable material and be fitted with a lid; or

(b) where a vehicle is used, the vehicle must be provided with—

- (1) a roof to protect the meat from sun or rain or from contamination by flies or dust;
- (2) a covering at each open end to screen the meat from public view; and
- (3) a compartment the inside of which is lined with zinc or other impermeable material, for storing the meat.

(2) Where any meat is transported in contravention of paragraph (1), the person liable for such contravention shall be the person on whose behalf or at whose directions the meat was so transported.

#### STRAY CATTLE

16. (1) All cattle, sheep and goats straying on any public road or path within the village area shall, on seizure be placed in the pound established by the Committee for the purpose.

(2) The charges payable before the removal of any animal so impounded shall be calculated at the following rates:—

For occupation, 50 cents per head for a day or part of a day.

For food (if supplied), 25 cents per head for a day or a part of a day.

#### CONSTRUCTION OF LATRINES

17. (1) Whenever the Committee defines an area within which the owner or lessee of any premises used for human habitation shall be required to construct and maintain a latrine, the Chairman may by notice in writing served on such owner or lessee, direct such owner or lessee to construct a latrine of such type and size, and in such a position on the premises and with such connecting drains as may have been determined by the Committee, and specify all such requirements in the notice.

(2) Every owner or lessee of premises on whom a notice is served under paragraph (1) shall within thirty days of the service of any such notice construct a latrine conforming in all respects to the requirements specified in such notice.

18. No person shall construct or maintain a pit latrine within a radius of one hundred feet from any well except with the permission of the Chairman.

#### CANCELLATION OF LICENCES

19. It shall be lawful for the Rural Court, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of a breach of any of the by-laws in connection with which the licence was issued and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the cancellation.

#### REPEALS

20. The by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 5,958 of December 4, 1903, and referred to therein as "Rules", are hereby amended, in so far as they relate to this village area, by the rescission of by-laws 67 to 70.

#### INTERPRETATION

21. In these by-laws—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee;

"Committee" means the Village Committee of the village area; and

"village area" means the Weragoda village area in the Galle District.
