REGULATIONS

1. Where two or more roads or streets intersect, if yellow markings fifty-four inches in length and nine inches in width are painted on the upper surface of the pavement of any such road or street at regular intervals, commencing at the point of intersection, the driver of a vehicle shall not halt or park that vehicle on that side of such road or street on which the markings are painted within a distance of seventy-five feet from the point of intersection of such roads or streets:

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this regulation shall not apply to any vehicle halted or parked for the purpose of loading or unloading goods—

- (a) between 6 p.m. and 8 a.m. on any road or street situated within the area described in the Schedule hereto; or
- (b) between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. on any road or street situated within any area other than the area described in the Schedule hereto.

2. Where a traffic sign indicating an omnibus stopping place has been erected on any road or street, the driver of a vehicle shall not halt or park that vehicle on that side of the road or street on which the sign has been erected for a distance of thirty feet on either side of that sign.

NOTIFICATION

IT is hereby notified that the following resolution under section 230 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947, passed by the Municipal Council of Kandy at its meeting held on December 13, 1952, has been sanctioned by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947:—

“By virtue of the powers conferred by section 230 (1) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947, this Council hereby—

- (a) makes and assesses for the year 1953, a rate of twenty-seven and a half per centum on the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the administrative limits of this Council;

- (c) declares for the purposes of section 17 of the Colombo Municipal Council Waterworks Ordinance (Chapter 161) that a proportion of the said rate equal to eight per centum of the annual value is assessed in respect of the water supply provided by the Council.”

BY-LAWS

1. No person shall hawk, keep or expose for sale, otherwise than in a case or receptacle so constructed of permanent material as to prevent the contamination of its contents by dust or flies, any cooked food, pastry, confectionery, sweetmeat, sherbet, sweet drink, preserved fruit or fruit peeled, skinned, cut or otherwise prepared for immediate consumption. Such case or receptacle shall always be maintained in a clean condition, and shall not be left open except for the purpose of placing articles therein or cleaning it.

2. (1) It shall be lawful for the Sanitary Inspector or any other officer appointed for the purpose by the Commissioner to inspect any meat, poultry, fish whether fresh, salted or iced, game flesh, vegetables, fruit, cooked food, pastry, confectionery, sweetmeat, sherbet, sweet drink or other article of food or drink kept or exposed for sale, and if it appears to him that such article of food or drink is unwholesome or unfit for human consumption, to seize and convey such article to the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) If the Medical Officer of Health certifies that any article of food or drink seized under paragraph (1) is unwholesome or unfit for human consumption, such article may be destroyed without payment of compensation to the person from whose possession it was seized.

3. Any person who contravenes by-law 1 shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred and fifty rupees and in the case of a continuing offence, to an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or after written notice from the Commissioner of such contravention.
