The rules made under section 3 of the Public Performances Ordinance (Chapter 134), and published in *Gazette* No. 7,004 of April 4, 1919, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 9,724 of June 27, 1947, are hereby amended in so far as they relate to the area within the administrative limits of the Matara Urban Council, by the substitution, for rule A3 thereof, of the following new rule:—

“A3. (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2), an applicant for a licence for the use of any building or erection for public performances shall, before such licence is issued to him pay to the Chairman a fee calculated at the following rates:—

BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS

1. The schedule required to be furnished under rule 211 of the rules made by the Executive Committee of Local Administration and published in *Gazette* No. 9,609 of October 4, 1946, shall not be furnished.

2. The annual tax imposed by the Council in respect of vehicles and animals under sections 175 and 176 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the thirty-first day of March in every year at the office of the Council.

3. (1) The Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which the annual tax has been paid, a metal plate with such of the distinguishing letters for vehicles specified in the schedule hereto, as are appropriate to that vehicle and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles.

(2) When any plate issued under paragraph (1) becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner of the plate shall, on returning it to the Chairman and on making a payment of twenty-five cents, be entitled to receive a fresh plate.

(3) The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate issued under paragraph (1) has been lost or stolen issue to the owner of that plate a fresh plate on the application of that owner and on payment by him of fifty cents.

4. (1) The person having possession, custody or control of any vehicle in respect of which a plate has been issued under by-law 3 shall cause that plate to be affixed to a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

(2) Every person who contravenes the provisions of paragraph (1) of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

5. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any person authorised in writing by him, to stop any vehicle for the purpose of inspecting the metal plate required by by-law 4 (1) to be affixed thereon; every driver of a vehicle shall, on being requested to do so, stop the vehicle and permit and assist such inspection.

6. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council;
 “Council” means the Sarmanturai Town Council;
 and

“Ordinance” means the Town Councils Ordinance, No. 3 of 1946.

7. The by-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals made by the Sarmanturai Town Council and published in *Gazette* No. 9,928 of December 10, 1948, are hereby rescinded.

Four Posts of Draughtsmen, Municipal Engineer's Department, Municipal Council, Colombo

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Local Government Service Commission for the above posts.

2. Each post carries a salary of Rs. 1,320 per annum, rising by 19 annual increments of Rs. 120 and 4 of Rs. 180 to Rs. 4,320 per annum, with an Efficiency Bar before Rs. 2,640 per annum. A rent allowance in accordance with Government rates and conditions, a temporary cost of living allowance and a special living allowance at Government rates will be paid. The selected candidates may be placed at suitable steps in the scale according to qualifications and experience.

3. The posts are permanent and pensionable. The selected candidates will be eligible for the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension benefits. Pension rights of officers holding pensionable appointments will be conserved if they are released under section 21 of the Minutes on Pensions.

4. *Qualifications.*—Applicants must be Ceylonese* and should have either—

- completed the three-year (evening) Engineering Course at the Ceylon Technical College, and have had 4 years' regular apprenticeship in an Engineering Firm, or with a Chartered Surveyor or Architect; or
- obtained a pass before 1947, in a Building Construction II Course at the Ceylon Technical College and completed 2 years' apprenticeship in an Engineering Establishment or a Government Department or a Local Authority; or
- obtained the Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College in Draughtsmanship and completed 2 years' apprenticeship in an Engineering Establishment or a Government Department or a Local Authority subsequent to the completion of the Technical College Course; or
- obtained the Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College for Junior Technical Officers and completed one year's regular apprenticeship as a draughtsman or apprentice draughtsman subsequent to the completion of the Course; or
- completed 5 years' service as a Draughtsman in a Local Authority.

5. Applications will also be considered from those who possess only the certificates referred to at (c) and (d) above but have not completed the full period of apprenticeship. If such candidates are recruited, they will be placed on the following steps in the salary scale for apprentices (viz., Rs. 840—72—Rs. 1,272) :—

- (i) Those who possess only the Certificate in Draughtsmanship: First year Rs. 1,200 per annum; second year Rs. 1,272 per annum;
- (ii) Those who possess the Certificates referred to at (c) above and have completed one year's apprenticeship and those who possess only the Certificate referred to at (d): Rs. 1,272 per annum.

On confirmation, those referred to at (i) and (ii) above will be placed on the initial of the scale for Draughtsmen.

6. Applications from those in a Local Body or in a Government Department should be forwarded through the Mayor or Chairman of the Local Authority or the Head of the Department in which they are serving.

7. The selected candidates will be on one year's probation and will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder.

8. The selected candidates may be required to furnish security either in cash or by fidelity guarantee bond through a guarantee association approved by the Commission.

9. The candidates selected will be debarred from undertaking any private work and may be required to reside within the City of Colombo.

10. Applications should be made substantially in the form appended and should reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, on or before February 27, 1953.
