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readiness to supply the quantities ordered by the Department. The Commissioner for Development of Marketing is not committed to order any of the said items up to the extent stated herein or at all from the selected contractor who shall have no claim of any sort against the Government on this ground.

Where the amount given in figures differs from the amount in words, or no amount is stated in words, the tender is liable to rejection.

18 Government reserves the right to object to the employment by the tenderer of any workmen whose employment is considered not desirable or to object to the employment of any workmen.
