to reach the Marketing Commissioner, Tripoli Warehouse, Maradana, Colombo, before the closing date of tender, viz, 2 p.m. on Wednesday, July 22, 1953.

7. All quotations should hold good for acceptance for a minimum period of 30 days from the date of closing of quotations.

8. Quotations should be signed. All alterations and erasures in the quotation should be initialed by the person quoting. The amount quoted should be expressed in figures and words. Where the amount given in figures differs from the amount given in words or no amount is stated in words, the quotation is liable to rejection.

9. The quotations should be exclusive of customs duty but inclusive of cost of transport and delivery at Tripoli Warehouse, Maradana. Arrangements will be made to have the consignments cleared free of customs duty through the Superintendent of Government Stores. TENDERS will be received by the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Agriculture and Food, up to 12 noon on Friday, July 24, 1953, for labour services for handling (loading, unloading, weighing, measuring, &c.) of local agricultural produce such as Maize, Kurakkan, Gingelly, Tamarind, Paddy, Mustard, Red Onions, Rice, &c., and gunnies at the Emergency Stores (Guaranteed Price Scheme), Polonnaruwa. 3. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Labour Services at Emergency Stores (Guaranteed Price Scheme), Polonnaruwa" in the left-hand top corner of the envelope and be made upon forms obtainable at the office of the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Kachcheri, Polonnaruwa, on or before 12 noon on Tuesday, July 21, 1953, on payment of the deposit referred to in paragraph 6 below. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form.

4. Tenderers must quote for each and every service provided for in the form of tender. Separate rates for day and night work should be quoted.

5. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

6. A deposit of Rupees fifty (Rs 50) must be made with the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Polonnaruwa, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish the approved security within ten days of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to

the Crown. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at the address given by the tenderer. All deposits will be returned when the contract is signed.

7. If a person to whom a tender form has been issued fails for no satisfactory reason to submit his tender within the prescribed time his tender deposit will be liable to be forfeited.

8. The successful tenderer will be required to deposit a sum of Rupees one thousand (Rs. 1,000) as security for the fulfilment of the contract.

9. The successful tenderer shall employ Ceylonese labour only in carrying out the work tendered for. Any failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation: Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Polonnaruwa, may with the consent of the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Agriculture and Food, permit the employment of non-Ceylonese labour. The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include:—

- (a) a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration;
- (b) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (c) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (b).

10. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions herein laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

11. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders. Portions of tenders will not be accepted. Any tender accepted will be for the performance of the entirety of the labour services provided for in the tender form.

12. No tender will be entertained from persons whose names appear in the list of Defaulting Contractors.

13. No contract may be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board of the Ministry of Agriculture and Food. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by the contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

14. The Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Polonnaruwa, may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objections to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

15. The contractor shall indemnify the Government against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance.

16. A tenderer when applying for a tender form should furnish the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Polonnaruwa, with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address and stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property with its exact location and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given. If any contract is held or was held in any Government Department, particulars of the contract/s and the name/s of the Department/s should also be furnished.

17. Only persons who are in a position to command a sufficient labour force should tender. Tenderers should state the number of labourers in the labour force they command.

18. The Government does not guarantee any specific quantity of work. Tenderers should not expect work to be provided regularly and should

be prepared to perform the labour services provided for in the form of tender as and when required. The Government will not be liable to make any payment by way of compensation or otherwise to the successful tenderer or to the labourers provided by him if work is not available for them.

19. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Polonnaruwa, acting for and on behalf of the Crown and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under Government.

20. The draft agreement and bond to be entered into by the successful tenderer will be available at the office of the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Polonnaruwa, for inspection by applicants for tender forms.

21. The laws of the Dominion of Ceylon are applicable as far as practicable

22. The stamp duty on the Agreement/and/or Bond to be signed by the successful tenderer should be paid by him.

### INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES FOR AIRCRAFT APPRENTICESHIP PRIOR TO RECRUITMENT AS AIRCRAFTMEN IN THE CEYLON AIR FORCE

SIX vacancies are now offered for Aircraft Apprenticeship prior to recruitment in the rank of Aircraftmen in the Ceylon Air Force.

2. The vacancies offered for Apprenticeship will be in one of the following trades:—

Airframe Fitters  
Engine Fitters (Servicing)  
Instrument Fitter  
Electrical Fitter  
Radio Fitter  
Armament Fitter

3. The applicant for Apprenticeship will be required to fulfil the conditions set out in paragraph 5 below. A preliminary selection will be made from the applications received from those who fulfil these conditions, and final selection will be made after the interview of those selected candidates.

4 The following are the rules which will apply and the procedure which will be adopted in respect of the candidates who are selected for the existing vacancies:—

(a) An Aircraft Apprentice, on joining the Ceylon Air Force, will be attested covering the period of his apprenticeship and twelve years regular service from the age of 18, i.e., from the date of joining until he reaches the age of 30. Ex-Apprentice Airmen may be selected for re-engagement from the age of 30 with a view to qualifying for pension.

On attaining the minimum age of entry for men's service, which is at present 17½ years, the apprentice will become entitled to a recruit's rate of pay of 7s. per diem whilst in the United Kingdom.

No cost of living allowance is payable.

(d) All expenses such as pocket money, maintenance during compulsory leave periods between terms at the Schools of Technical Training, the cost of civilian clothes which may be worn when off duty, &c., will be the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the apprentice. Such expenses would be about Rs. 1,200 per annum for the period during which the apprentice is away from Ceylon. However, the apprentice will be entitled to 3s. 6d per diem as ration allowance during compulsory leave periods, i.e., periods of non-attachment to a Mess.

(e) (i) In the event of an apprentice voluntarily terminating his apprenticeship during his course at the School of Technical Training in the United Kingdom, the parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred up to that time by the Ceylon Government on account of such apprenticeship. Such apprentice will also be required to return to Ceylon at his own expense.

(ii) If at any time during his course an apprentice is reported upon by the authorities at the Schools of Technical Training as being unsuitable for reasons of misconduct, or due to causes within his own control, his parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred on his account by the Ceylon Government.

### FOOD CONTROL

#### Notice to Authorized Dealers (Wholesale & Retail)

THE price of rice to consumers will be increased by 45 cents per measure from July 20, 1953. An increased weekly rice ration will also be simultaneously issued as follows:—

Worker coupon	.. .	2	measures
Ordinary	..	1½	..
Child	..	1	..
Infant	..	¾	..

2. The increased ration at the increased price will be issued to Wholesale Dealers during the week beginning July 13, 1953, and wholesale dealers should therefore be prepared to pay the increased amount that will be necessary, which may amount to as much as four times what they paid before.

3. Wholesale Dealers are also notified that they will have to pay next week to the Deputy Food Controller at the rate of 45 cents per measure on the balance stock of rice in hand after making their issues to the retail dealers for the 28th week, as this balance stock would have been obtained at the previous lower price.

4. Wholesale Dealers are further notified that they should obtain payment from their retail dealers at the rate of 45 cents per measure on all balances of rationed rice in the hands of each such retail dealer after close of business on July 19, 1953. The amounts so recovered by the wholesale dealers should be paid to the Deputy Food Controller when they make their applications for rationed rice that week.

5. Authorized Distributors, i.e., retail dealers in the rationing scheme, will please make payment to their wholesale dealers as indicated in para 4 above. All issues of rationed rice received by them from wholesale dealers on and after July 20, 1953, will also have to be paid for at the new increased price.

6. Authorized Distributors should take special care to see that all balances of rationed rice in their hands at the ends of the 28th and 29th rationing weeks are duly notified to their wholesale dealers.

7. Wholesale Dealers should take special care to see that all balances of rationed rice in their hands and in the hands of the authorized distributors (i.e., retail dealers) attached to them are duly notified to the Deputy Food Controller when applying for rationed rice during the 28th and 29th rationing weeks.
