Hospital Clerical Service Examination

A competitive examination for male candidates, wishing to enter the Hospital Clerical Service, will be held in Colombo, on September 26, 1953.

2. *Salary.*—(i) Successful candidates will be appointed to Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service on the salary of Rs 912 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 42 to Rs. 1,668 per annum. In this scale an efficiency bar operates before Rs. 1,206 per annum. Rent allowance and temporary cost of living allowance and special living allowance are payable in accordance with Government Regulations.

(ii) Successful candidates, with previous continuous service as temporary clerks in the Department of Health Services and the Quarantine Department, will be granted incremental credit as if they had been on the salary scales obtaining from time to time for Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service from the date of commencement of their temporary employment, provided that such incremental credit does not result in their being paid a salary higher than that received by them in their temporary office immediately prior to appointment to Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service.

3. *Conditions of Service.*—(i) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be in accordance with Government Regulations.

(ii) The posts are temporary and non-pensionable. The appointment is terminable on one month's notice on either side. The selected candidate will be appointed on trial for a period of two years. Candidates will be required to pass an examination in the following, before promotion over the efficiency bar—

- (a) Sinhalese and Tamil (conversation and interpretation);
- (b) Rules, regulations and procedure relating to hospital accounts and administration.

(iii) Successful candidates will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure Departmental Orders, or any other orders or regulations which may be issued from time to time by Government.

(iv) Successful candidates will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year of the date of appointment and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed.

4. Successful candidates will be given appointments as vacancies occur.

5. *Eligibility.*—(i) Candidates must be of good character.

- (ii) an ordinary pass in English Language at the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level—English Medium) Examination;
- (iii) a pass in the J. S. C. (English) Examination held by the Education Department or by a school approved by it; or
- (c) the Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or
- (d) one of the following examinations:—

(i) Cambridge Junior	} together with one of the following	(i) Higher Commercial Certificate (either section) London Chamber of Commerce
(ii) J. S. C. (English) Education Department		(ii) Commercial Certificate (either section) London Chamber of Commerce
(iii) J. S. C. (English) School approved by the Education Department		(iii) Commercial Certificate (either section) Ceylon Chamber of Commerce

Note.—True copies of certificates of educational qualifications should be attached to the application form.

(iv) Candidates must be between 17 and 25 years of age on September 1, 1953.

6. *Eligibility, Special Conditions, for ex-personnel of the Civil Defence Services.*—In computing age for the purpose of the age limit prescribed in paragraph 5 (iv), persons who have been full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions or Civil Defence Services (excluding those who were dismissed or had left those services of their own accord) for any length of time during the period September 3, 1939, to August 15, 1945, inclusive, will be allowed to deduct the period of their continuous full-time service with those Services since September 3, 1939, from their ages. They should also have passed at least one of the following:—

- (1) Cambridge Junior;
- (2) J. S. C. (English) Education Department;
- (3) J. S. C. (English) school approved by the Education Department;
- (4) Higher Commercial Certificate (either section) London Chamber of Commerce;
- (5) Commerce Certificate (either section) London Chamber of Commerce;
- (6) Commercial Certificate (either section) Ceylon Chamber of Commerce.

Note.—(1) True copies (NOT ORIGINALS) of certificates of educational qualifications should be attached to the application.

(2) Civil Defence Service will be held to include only those services, the members of which were enrolled under the Defence Regulations.

7. (1) Temporary clerks, both in the Department of Health Services and the Quarantine Department, also will be eligible to sit for the examination irrespective of educational qualifications, provided they—

- (i) are not more than 45 years of age on September 1, 1953;
- (ii) have completed one year's continuous satisfactory service in the Department of Health Services or the Quarantine Department; and
- (iii) are recommended by their superior officers as efficient, of good character, and fully capable of performing the duties of a hospital clerk in Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service.

(b) Copies of certificates in proof of (i), (ii) and (iii) above should be attached to application.

(c) A period of "break" not exceeding fifteen days will be condoned, if such break was due to retrenchment.

*For the purpose of this examination, a Ceylonese is—

- (a) a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; and
- (b) a person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration, and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a prima facie entitlement to such citizenship.

(2) Minor employees and Hospital Overseers of the Department of Health will be eligible to sit for the examination provided they—

- (i) possess the Junior School Certificate (in English) or higher qualifications,
- (ii) are not more than 45 years of age on September 1, 1953;
- (iii) have completed two years continuous satisfactory service in the Department of Health on September 1, 1953;
- (iv) are recommended by their superior officers as efficient, of good character, and fully capable of performing the duties of a hospital clerk in Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service.

8 (1) Applications should be substantially in the form specified below, and should be sent by registered post to reach the Office of the Director of Health Services, P. O. Box No 500, Secretariat, Colombo 1, on or before August 4, 1953.

(ii) Applications will be rejected if they—

- (1) are received after the closing date specified in (i) above, and
- (2) do not conform in any respect with the requirements of this notification

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 10.

The viva voce examination may, however, be dispensed with in the event of the number of candidates qualifying for it falling short of the number of vacancies. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified

15. *Medical Examination*—The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

16. *Security*—The successful candidates will be required to furnish security in the sum of Rs 1,000 in such manner as may be prescribed.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT—UNESCO 1953 FELLOWSHIP ON TEACHING ABOUT THE UNITED NATIONS

THE United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation offers the above Fellowship to a national of Ceylon to carry out a six months' course of study related to "Teaching about the United Nations".

Applications substantially in the form specified below should be addressed to the Director of Education (Branch M), Education Office, W. A. A. F. Camp, Galle Face, Colombo, and should reach him on or before July 27, 1953.

2. *An applicant for this Fellowship must be.—*

- (a) A Ceylonese i.e., (1) a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; (2) a person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration, and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a prima facie entitlement to such citizenship.
- (b) An officer of the Education Department in the District Inspectors' Grade or a higher grade; or a Principal of a Government or Assisted Training College.
- (c) Not more than 50 years of age on July 27, 1953.

3. The country or countries of study will depend on a study of the qualifications of the candidate by experts of the UNESCO Secretariat who will work out details of a suitable study programme and make an assignment.

4. The maintenance allowance payable to the Fellow abroad will be according to rates fixed by the United Nations and its Specialized Agencies for all Fellowships. These vary in relation to the cost of living in the various countries or study and range from \$ 130 to \$ 300 per month. An allowance of \$ 50 will be paid for the purchase of necessary books. Incidental expenses such as tuition fees and travel within the country or countries of study will also be met. The UNESCO Organisation will pay the cost of passage from Ceylon and back but no separation allowance towards family maintenance will be paid.

5. *Agreement and Security.*—The selected candidate will have—

- (a) to enter into agreements with the Government of Ceylon undertaking among other things to follow the prescribed course and to complete satisfactorily the course of studies and to serve the Ceylon Government, if so required, for a reasonable period (to be decided by Government) after completion of his course of study;
- (b) to enter into bonds with two approved sureties each up to the full value of the award, undertaking to return the full amount advanced by the UNESCO and/or the Ceylon Government in the event of his failure to comply with the terms and conditions in the agreement.

6. The selected candidate will be required to pass a medical examination by a Medical Board as to his physical fitness to undergo the course of training. The fees for this examination will have to be paid by the candidate.

7. A person who desires to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempting to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

8. Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview in Colombo at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid.

9. Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to withdrawal of the award if discovered after the selection.

10. Applications or any other qualifications relating to these awards must be addressed to the Director of Education and not personally to any officer in that department.

FOOD CONTROL

Notice to Estates and Wholesale Dealers

ALL estates to which rationed rice is issued without the production of ration books, i.e. all Estates referred to in Part II Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1952, are hereby required under the aforesaid Regulations to declare their balance stocks of rationed rice (and paddy) as at close of business on July 19, 1953, to their wholesale dealer for transmission to the Deputy Food Controller.

2. On this balance stock, which has been purchased at the previous reduced subsidised price, each estate should pay to the wholesale dealer at the rate of 45 cents per measure of rice. All issues of rationed rice received on and after July 20, 1953, will have to be paid for at the new increased price of rice, which is 45 cents per measure more than the old price. Issues to estate residents by estates on and after July 20, 1953, will be made at the new increased price.

3. Wholesale dealers are hereby notified to recover the difference in price as indicated in para. 2 above on the balances of rationed rice with the estates attached to them, which amounts should be paid by them to the Deputy Food Controller, in the same week (29th week of rationing), when making application for their next issue of rationed rice. The application should be accompanied by the estate declarations of balances in hand.
