2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover and should be addressed to Deputy Food Controller, Vavuniya.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the Tender Box in the Vavuniya Kachcheri or be sent through the post under registered cover.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tenders for transport and handling of foodstuffs &c, 1953/54" in the left-hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Deputy Food Controller, Kachcheri, Vavuniya, not later than midday on Tuesday, August 11, 1953.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Kachcheri, Vavuniya and no tender will be considered unless it is on the prescribed form.

6. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

8 Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons whose addresses must be given engaging to become sureties for the fulfilment of the contract.

10 Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of security required should be given in cash. The right to vary the security deposit whenever necessary, is reserved. All other necessary information on this matter can be obtained upon application at this office.

11. No tender will be considered unless, in respect of it, all the conditions laid down above have been strictly fulfilled.

12. No tender will be entertained from the persons whose names appear in the list of defaulting contractors.

13. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

14. No contract may be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Food. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

15. No tenderer will be allowed to withdraw his tender. If he does so, his tender deposit is liable to be forfeited and his name submitted to the Tender Board to be included in the list of defaulting contractors.

16 The Deputy Food Controller, Vavuniya, will, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

17. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for will be a condition of the contract; failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition, will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. However, in exceptional circumstances, the Deputy Food Controller, Vavuniya, may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Food. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval and concurrence in writing is forbidden. The term Ceylonese shall mean—

- (a) a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; or
- (b) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (c) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (b).

18. A tenderer who has not previously held a Government contract, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or has other valid interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given.

A tenderer, who has carried out Government contracts with the Department but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tender, should state in which division or district or divisions or districts he had held similar contracts.

A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with any other department should specify the name of the department for which, and the district in which, the service was rendered.

19. The successful tenderer will be responsible for ascertaining the date and times of arrival of waggons at the Railway Station and their release within such time as may from time to time be indicated by the Railway. It will also be his responsibility to find out from the Storekeeper of the Supply Station the volume of work that has to be carried out each day. Failure to comply with these requirements will render him liable to pay demurrage charges and other penalties for the delay. The decision of the Deputy Food Controller, Vavuniya, on this question will be final.

The successful tenderer should employ his own escorts for the transport of foodstuffs and be prepared to work on Sundays and public holidays, if so required.

20. The Government will not be bound to provide regularity of work under this contract and will not be liable to make any payment by way of compensation to the contractor if work is not available for him.

21. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance.

22. Each supply station, which has a number of stores attached to it, will include all stores in the charge of the Storekeeper. The location of the stores under each supply station could be ascertained from this office

23. The work is to be undertaken on an agreement to be entered into by the contractor with the Deputy Food Controller, Vavuniya, acting for and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon. The agreement must bear a stamp to the value of Rs 5 to be supplied by the contractor. The successful tenderer will be required to deposit a sum of Rs. 500 as security before the commencement of the contract.

Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to
