 - (b) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon, or
 - (c) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (b)
12. The Government reserves the right to object to the employment by the tenderer of any workmen whose employment is considered not desirable or to object to the employment of any workmen.

Cross Members.—To be of 2" x 6" well seasoned halmilla fitted to the lorry by $\frac{1}{2}$ " bolts with washers to the nuts.

Uprights.—To be of 2" x 2" well seasoned halmilla.

Should any person decline or fail to enter into the necessary contract and bond, or fail to furnish the approved security within ten days of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown and his name will be blacklisted. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to or left at the address given by the tenderer. All other deposits will be returned when the contract is signed.

6. The successful tenderer will be required to deposit a sum of rupees five-thousand (Rs. 5,000) in cash as security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

and shall render the contract liable to cancellation and the successful tenderer's security will be forfeited and his name included in the list of defaulting contractors

11. The penalties for which the successful tenderer will render himself liable under the contract to be entered into by him will be—

- (i) A sum of Rs. 200 for each and every failure to do or render efficiently any of the services which are required of him or omission to comply with the lawful directions of the Director of Food Supplies.
- (ii) A sum of Rs. 200 for failure to supply the required number of labourers.
- (iii) The value at wholesale price of goods lost or damaged in the course of transport by carts supplied by the successful tenderer.
- (iv) Demurrage charges incurred by reason of his failure to load or unload promptly any Railway wagon.

12. The successful tenderer shall indemnify the Government against any claim by or in respect of any employee of his under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance or any statutory modification thereof.

13. All notices and orders to be served upon the successful tenderer shall be deemed to have been duly served if given to him personally or sent by post, addressed to the place elected by him for the purpose.

14. It shall also be competent for the Director of Food Supplies for reasons which appear to him sufficient to give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the successful tenderer of any person specified in such notice and no such person shall be employed or continue to be employed.

15. The laws of (the Dominion of) Ceylon are applicable as far as practicable.

16. The Government is not bound to provide regular work for the labourers under the Agreement to be entered into with the successful tenderer and will not be liable to make any payment by way of compensation or otherwise to the successful tenderer or to his labourers or carters provided by him if work is not available for them.

17. The stamp duty on the agreement and/or bond to be signed by the successful tenderer should be paid by him.

18. No tender will be considered unless, in respect of it, all the conditions above laid down have been strictly complied with. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, to reject any tender or all tenders. Any tender accepted will be for the performance of the entirety of the labour services provided for in the tender form. No tender will be entertained from persons whose names appear in the list of defaulting contractors.

19. The contract may not be assigned or sub-let wholly or in part without the authority of the Tender Board, Ministry of Agriculture and Food. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorizing him to carry out the contract on the contractor's behalf.

21. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury or the Director of Food Supplies acting for and on behalf of the Crown and the designation of such

officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and the successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

22. Only persons who are in a position to command a sufficient labour force should tender.

From August 3, 1953, every ration book holder will be entitled to receive on his coupon, in addition to the legal ration at the subsidized price, ¾ measure of rice at the unsubsidized price of 16 cents per measure more than the subsidized price. The rate of ¾ measure per week per coupon will apply to all coupons, whether Worker, Ordinary, Child or Infant. The coupon holder need not take this extra rice.

2. Authorized retail dealers and Co-operative Stores will be expected to have extra rice from August 3, 1953, to meet any demand from their ration book holders and should apply immediately, i.e., during the week beginning July 27, 1953, to their wholesale dealers or Co-operative Unions to obtain their requirements of this rice from the Kachcheri during the week beginning July 27, 1953.

3. Authorized wholesale dealers and Co-operative Unions will apply accordingly to the Kachcheri when they make their usual application for rationed rice during the week beginning July 27, 1953.

4. Prices: Wholesale dealers will charge retail dealers for this rice at the rate of Rs. 12.85 per 80 measure bag and Rs. 18 per 112 measure bag more than what they charge for subsidized (i.e., rationed) rice. If the prices mentioned herein are exceeded or if the rice is not available to the consumer, the wholesale dealers and authorized distributors concerned will be severely dealt with.

5. This issue will continue weekly until further notice.

6. All dealers should keep registers showing separately their stock of rationed rice and of this extra rice. All dealers are expected to furnish weekly their balances of each kind to the Deputy Food Controller of the area: the authorized distributor through the wholesale dealer and the wholesale dealer direct.

7. Any variety of rice issued by the Deputy Food Controller for issue in the ration, must be issued only in the ration and cannot be diverted to the extra ration issue.

8. From August 3, 1953, imported rice can be sold by authorized distributors, Co-operative Stores and other authorized dealers only in the ration or as the extra issue, authorized herein, on the coupon. No other sales of imported rice will be allowed.
