#### KADUGANNAWA URBAN COUNCIL

#### RULES

1. An occupation fee at the rates set out in the schedule hereto shall be paid by every person using or occupying any part of the resthouse. Provided that children under twelve years of age shall be charged only half the aforesaid rates and that no fee shall be charged in respect of the following:—

- an infant in arms;
- a servant who is in attendance on a visitor at the resthouse and sleeps within the resthouse;
- the chauffeur of any car garaged in the resthouse premises, if he sleeps in the car or in the garage.

2. (1) Every visitor shall on his admission to the resthouse legibly write his correct name and address in the resthouse visitors' book.

(2) No visitor shall be entitled to use the resthouse or to be supplied with refreshments until he has carried out the requirements of the preceding paragraph.

3. (1) No person shall occupy any part of the resthouse for more than three consecutive days without the special permission in writing of the Chairman.

(2) Every occupier of the resthouse who has not obtained the permission referred to in paragraph (1) of this rule shall on the expiration of three days immediately leave the resthouse.

4. No charges other than those payable to the Urban Council shall be entered in the resthouse book by a visitor.

5. Resthouse fees and charges shall be paid in cash on demand. In default of such payment, the resthouse keeper shall be entitled to refuse further supplies.

6. (1) No room shall be reserved for any visitor prior to his arrival unless it is engaged at least one day in advance.

(2) When a room is reserved in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this rule, it shall be paid for, even if the person engaging it does not occupy it.

(3) Until the arrival of the person or persons for whom the room is reserved, the room shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it.

7. The resthouse keeper shall not be bound to comply with any telegram requesting meals to be prepared unless the name and the address of the sender are set out in the telegram.

8. No bed, sofa, or couch in the resthouse shall be used for the purpose of sleeping unless a sheet is spread thereon.

9. The value of all articles damaged or broken by any visitor or his servant shall be paid by the visitor in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

10. (1) Any complaint which a visitor may have to make about the resthouse or the resthouse keeper shall be noted in the complaint book.

(2) It shall be the duty of the resthouse keeper to produce the complaint book when called upon to do so.

(3) No remark or complaint shall be written on the book in which resthouse charges are entered.

11. (1) No public lunch, dinner or garden party or any other reception shall be held in the resthouse except with the written permission of the Chairman.

(2) Where the Chairman allows the use of the whole or a part of the resthouse for any of the purposes specified in the preceding paragraph of this rule there shall be paid to the Council—

(a) Where the number of persons attending does not exceed twenty-four, a fee in lieu of occupation charges, of Rs. 10 for the first six hours and Re. 1 for every hour or part of an hour in excess of six hours.

(b) Where the number of persons attending exceeds twenty-four occupation charges at the rates specified in the schedule hereto.

12. Persons in actual occupation of the resthouse shall have a prior claim to the use of any garage or stable attached to the resthouse over persons not in occupation of the resthouse.

13. The owner or a hirer of a vehicle garaged in the resthouse or parked anywhere within the resthouse premises, shall, notwithstanding that he himself has not occupied the resthouse pay the personal

occupation fees for the period during which the vehicle is garaged or parked, in addition to the fee for parking the vehicle or for the use of the garage.

14. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Urban Council to prohibit the use of the resthouse by any visitor who is convicted of any breach of any of these rules.

15. A breach of any of these rules shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

16. In these rules—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council.  
“Council” means the Kadugannawa Urban Council.

“Resthouse” includes the land attached to the resthouse and any building thereon.

17. The rules relating to the Kadugannawa Resthouse published in *Gazette* No. 9,591 of August 16, 1946, are hereby rescinded.

#### BY-LAWS

1. Within the limits of the town of Anuradhapura, no person shall affix or cause to be affixed in any place any poster, placard, handbill, notice or advertisement capable of being seen from any thoroughfare situated within those limits unless—

- such place has been approved by the Special Commissioner as a place suitable for that purpose; and
- he has obtained a permit in that behalf from the Special Commissioner on payment of a fee calculated at the rates specified in the Schedule hereto:

Provided, however, that this by-law shall not apply to the affixing or exhibition of any poster, placard, handbill, notice or advertisement—

- (a) on any place of business for the purposes of that business;
- (b) on any other premises for the purpose of advertising the fact that such premises or any articles kept or situated on such premises are to let or for sale.

2. Every contravention of by-law 1 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees and in the case of a continuing contravention with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the contravention is continued after a conviction thereof by a court of competent jurisdiction or after service of a written notice from the Special Commissioner directing attention to such contravention.

3 In these by-laws the expression "Special Commissioner" means the Special Commissioner appointed under section 196 (5) of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, to administer the affairs of the town of Anuradhapura.

## BY-LAW

The by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 9,843 of March 18, 1948, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended as follows:—

- (1) by the substitution, in by-law 1 in the definition of "Offensive or Dangerous Trade" for the words "keeping a foundry" of the following:—  
"keeping a foundry, keeping an establishment for grinding chilly powder by machinery, keeping an establishment for repairing motor vehicles, keeping an establishment for repairing bicycles.";
- (2) by the re-numbering of by-law 241 as by-law 258; and
- (3) by the insertion, immediately after by-law 240, of the following new by-laws:—

## "TIMBER DEPOTS."

241. No person shall be entitled to a licence to keep a timber depot unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) such premises must not be less than fifty yards distant from the nearest dwelling house and must not be structurally connected to it;
- (b) the site must be approved by the Chairman;
- (c) in the case of a timber depot which is to be surrounded by walls, or to be erected on pillars of concrete, brick, cabook, or iron or on wooden posts, the average height of such depot must be not less than ten feet and the height must be not less than seven feet in any place; and
- (d) the roof must be constructed of durable materials.

242. Every licensee of a timber depot shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with his name and the words "LICENSED TIMBER DEPOT", legibly painted in English.

243. Every licensee of a timber depot shall maintain on the licensed premises such number of buckets of sand or fire extinguishers, or both, as may be specified by the Chairman, for the purpose of dealing with an outbreak of fire.

244. (1) In the case of any timber depot which is surrounded by walls—

- (a) no timber shall be stocked to a height within three feet of any wall plate of the building; and
- (b) the roof shall not be ceiled and no lifts or any similar structures made under the roof.

(2) In the case of any timber depot which is not surrounded by walls, no timber shall be stacked or stored in such depot except on a platform approved by the Chairman.

245. The provisions of paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of by-law 241 shall not apply to timber depots which are in existence on the date on which these by-laws relating to timber depots come into force

#### HOUSING AND PENNING OF CATTLE

246. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any person duly authorised by him in writing, at all reasonable times, to enter and inspect any cattle shed, stable or enclosure for sheep or goats or pig-sty.

247. The owner or lessee of any cattle shed, stable, enclosure for sheep or goats or pig-sty, shall take all necessary steps to ensure—

- (1) that such shed, stable, enclosure or sty is kept at all times in a sanitary condition; and
- (2) that dung or other refuse is removed daily from the premises and is so disposed of that no nuisance is caused thereby.

#### STRAY CATTLE

248. (1) All cattle, sheep and goats straying on any public road or path within the administrative limits of the Council shall on seizure, be placed in the pound established by the Council for the purpose.

(2) The charge payable before the removal of any animal so impounded shall be calculated at the following rates:—

For occupation—50 cents per head for a day or a part of a day.

For food (if supplied)—25 cents per head for a day or a part of a day.

#### LAUNDRIES

249. No person shall keep a laundry unless he is the holder of a permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

250. Every permit issued under by-law 249 shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

251. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer of the Council generally or specially authorised in writing thereto by the Chairman, at all reasonable times to enter upon and inspect any laundry and to inspect any furniture, equipment, vehicle or utensil, which is or appears to be used for the purpose of the laundry.

252. No person shall be entitled to a permit to keep a laundry unless the premises used for the purpose are in conformity with the following conditions:—

(1) The premises must be in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted and every room must be provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open must be not less than one-fifth of the superficial floor space.

(2) The walls of every room in every part must be not less than seven feet in height, with the inside thereof lime-plastered and lime-washed.

(3) A separate room must be provided for the storage of soiled-linen and the floor of such room must be cemented throughout.

(4) The premises must have a sufficient supply of water for all purposes of the laundry unless the soiled-linen is washed in a tank which is approved for that purpose or in a river approved by the Council.

(5) Where a pipe-borne water-supply is available and is used by the laundryman, adequate drainage of waste water must be provided for.

(6) The laundry must be provided with sufficient latrine accommodation being not less than one latrine for every ten persons employed therein

253. Every person who keeps a laundry shall cause the inside of the soiled-linen room to be limewashed four times a year in the months of March, June, September and December.

254. Every person who keeps a laundry shall cause every part of the laundry, its surroundings, drains, furniture, utensils and the equipment used for the purposes of the laundry to be kept clean and in good repair

255. No person who keeps a laundry shall allow any person who is suffering or who to his knowledge has been recently suffering from any infectious, contagious or cutaneous disease or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease to enter the laundry or take part in the work thereof or in the transport of any articles thereto or therefrom, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed

256. No person who keeps a laundry take or receive or permit to be taken or received soiled-linen from a house where there is, or there has recently been a case of infectious or contagious disease, unless the clothes have been disinfected in the manner directed by the Medical Officer of Health or the Chairman.

257. Every person who keeps a laundry shall, on the occurrence of any infectious or contagious disease in his premises—

- (1) forthwith cease to carry on the business of the laundry;
- (2) notify the Chairman of the occurrence of the disease;
- (3) retain all clothes in the laundry until the written permission of the Chairman is obtained for the return of the clothes; and
- (4) not resume the business of the laundry until the premises have been declared by the Chairman to be free from infection.

(2) No person who keeps a laundry shall keep washed-linen in any room used as a sleeping room."
