The provisions of section 13 of the Local Authorities Elections Ordinance, No. 53 of 1946, shall, in their application in the case of the preparation of the electoral lists for the purposes of the general election of the members of the Naranthana Village area due to be held in 1954, have effect as if there were substituted—

- (1) in paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) of that section, for the words "the first day of September", of the words "a day not later than the thirtieth day of September"; and
- (2) in sub-section (3) of that section, for the words "shall, not later than ten days before the date", of the words "shall, before the date".

No person shall, between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or Public Holiday, or between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on any Saturday other than a Public Holiday, sound any warning instrument affixed to or carried in any motor vehicle on the highway or portions of highways specified in the Schedule hereto, the terminal points of which are indicated by notices, exhibited by order of the Mayor of Galle, with the word "Silence" legibly painted thereon in the English language

2. At the intersections of the highway known as Point Pedro road with the highways known as Bankshall street, Chapel street, Vembadi road, Victoria road, Punnalai or Stanley road, Palali road, Navalar road, Ammansannithi road, Wyman road, Arasadi road, Temple road, Chetty street, Nallur Cross (road) or 2nd Mile road, Arasadi East or Chemmani South road, Chemmani (North) road, Pandarakkulam or Arasakesari road, Sattanathar Kovil road, New Sattanathar Kovil road and Adiyapatham (Thirunelveli-Kalviyankadu or Kokkuvil Station) road in Jaffna, Point Pedro road shall be deemed to be the main road.

3. At the intersections of the highway known as Kandy road with the highways known as Esplanade road, Front street, Point Pedro road or First Cross street, 2nd Cross street, 3rd Cross street, 4th Cross street, Small Bazaar road, 5th Cross street, 6th Cross street, Martyn road, Odakkarai road, Convent or Devareerkulam road, Mount Carmel road, David road, St. Patrick's road, Temple road, Guardian Press road, Columbutthurai road, Hospital road, Old Park (or Maravakulam) road, Kachcheri Nallur road, Punkankulam road, Ilanthaikulam road, Navalar road, Ananthanvadali road, Nedunkulam road and Aththikkadu road in Jaffna, Kandy road shall be deemed to be the main road.

4. At the intersections of the highway known as Palali road with the highways known as Navalar road, Ammansannithi road, Arasadi road, Palam road, Thirunelveli Sivankovil road and Nachchimarkovil road in Jaffna, Palali road shall be deemed to be the main road.

5. At the intersections of the highway known as Stanley or Manippay or Punnalai road with the highways known as Rasavinthottam road, Aththiyadi New road, Aththiyaddi road, Clock Tower North road, Kasthuriyar road, Vairavarkovil road, Sivankovil Pannai road, Sivankovil North road and Kathi S. M. M. Aboobucker road, Navalar road and Eerappilavadi road Pichchaikulam road, Pirappankulam road, Oddumadam road and Arali road, Aiyankovil street or road and Chippiththarai road in Jaffna, Stanley or Manippay or Punnalai road shall be deemed to be the main road.

6. At the intersections of the highway known as Karaitivu road with the highways known as Fort Circular road, Pannai Causeway and Sivankovil Pannai road, Hospital road, Kathi S. M. M. Aboobucker road, Navalar road and Arali road in Jaffna, Karaitivu road shall be deemed to be the main road.

7. At the intersections of the highway known as Beach road with the Fort Circular road, Esplanade road, Front street, Point Pedro road or 1st Cross street, 2nd Cross street, Reclamation West road, 3rd Cross street, 4th Cross street, Small Bazaar road, St. James road, 6th Cross street, Odakkarai road, Mount

Carmel road, David road, St. Patrick's road, Reclamation East road, Old Park (or Maravakulam) road, Punkankulam road, Swamiar road and Ananthanvadali road in Jaffna, Beach road shall be deemed to be the main road.

8. At the intersections of the highway known as Columbutthurai road with the highways known as Nedunkulam road, Ananthanvadali road, Ilanthaikulam road, Swamiar road, Punkankulam road, and Old Park (or Maravakulam) road in Jaffna, Columbutthurai road shall be deemed to be the main road.

9. At the intersections of the highway known as Navalar road with the highways known as Taffs road, Idroos Makam road, Eerappilavadi road, Kasthuriyar road, Brown street or Neeraviyadi road, Clock Tower North road, Aththiyadi road, Aththiyadi New road, Wyman road, Rasavinthottam road, Temple road, Chetty street, Nallur Cross (road) or 2nd Mile road, Kachcheri Nallur road and Canagaratnam road in Jaffna, Navalar road shall be deemed to be the main road.

10. At the intersections of the highway known as Hospital road with the highways known as Taffs road, Sivankovil Pannai road, Kasthuriyar road, Power House East road, Clock Tower South road, 2nd Cross street, 3rd Cross street, Martyn road, Devareerkulam or Convent road, Rasavinthottam road, and Temple road in Jaffna, Hospital road shall be deemed to be the main road.

11. At the intersections of the highway known as Bankshall street with the highways known as Front street, 2nd Cross street, 3rd Cross street, 4th Cross street, Small Bazaar road, St. James' East road, St. James' road, 6th Cross street, Odakkarai road, Mount Carmel road, David road and St. Patrick's road in Jaffna, Bankshall street shall be deemed to be the main road.

12. At the intersections of the highway known as Chapel street with the highways known as Front street, 2nd Cross street, 3rd Cross street, 4th Cross street, 5th Cross street and Martyn road in Jaffna, Chapel street shall be deemed to be the main road.

13. At the intersections of the highway known as Vembadi road with the highways known as Front street, 2nd Cross street, 3rd Cross street, 4th Cross street, 5th Cross street, Martyn road and Convent or Devareerkulam road in Jaffna, Vembadi road shall be deemed to be the main road.

14. At the intersections of the highway known as Taffs road with the highways known as Koddadi New road, Kathi S. M. M. Aboobucker road, Pichchaikulam road and Pirappankulam road in Jaffna, Taffs road shall be deemed to be the main road.

15. At the intersections of the highway known as Clock Tower North road with the highways known as Power House North or Grand Bazaar North road, Victoria road and Kannathiddi road in Jaffna, Clock Tower North road shall be deemed to be the main road.

Date of Examination A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter Grade I of the Local Government Electrical Foremen's Service will be held in Colombo, on October 31, 1953. The Examination will be conducted by the Local Government Service Commission

2 (1) *Salary*.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts in Grade I of the Local Government Electrical Foremen's Service

to serve local authorities (other than Village Committees) on the salary scale of Rs 840 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs 72 to Rs 1,992 per annum, with an efficiency bar before Rs 1,488 per annum. Rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance will be payable in accordance with Government rates and conditions

(ii) *Conditions of Service*—(a) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws and regulations of the local authority subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder.

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on one year's probation, and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder

(c) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in a local authority drawing a salary higher than the initial salary assigned to the post of Foremen, Grade I, may be placed on a suitable step on this salary scale

3 The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur

4 *Eligibility*—(1) Candidates must be of good character

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese¹
(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least—

- (a) the 7th Standard in English or higher examination;
- (b) either should have had at least ten years of practical experience in an electrical engineering firm or under a Chartered Electrical Engineer or under Government or Local Supply Authority, or should possess technical qualification of the Ceylon Technical College or its equivalent, and
- (c) should have a knowledge of the operation and maintenance of high tension and low tension distribution system, transformers, diesel engine plant and switchgear, testing of consumers' installations, and house service meters. Should also possess a working knowledge of the safety rules and I.E.E. Regulations for electrical equipment and buildings

Note.—Applications will also be considered from Foremen in Grade II of the Local Government Electrical Foremen's Service who have at least 10 years' practical experience in a Local Authority Electricity Scheme in any capacity and also from those who have satisfactorily completed 3 years as Foremen Grade II, irrespective of age and academic qualifications

(iv) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph 5 (iv) except that, if necessary—

(a) Service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilized service in the last war from their age

5 *Applications*—(1) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from the office of the Local Government Service Commission, Room No 29 1/5, Gaffoor Building (First Floor), Colombo, up to October 10, 1953, and forwarded by registered post to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than October 19, 1953. Any application received after that date will be rejected

(ii) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments or under local authorities, must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments or the Chairmen of Local Authorities in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so he will be regarded as disqualified.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs 4

(iv) The following documents must be attached to the form of application—

(a) a certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born not earlier than October 31, 1913, and not later than October 31, 1936.

Note—(1) Affidavits will not ordinarily be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates

(2) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth, under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap 94), will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, applications should be made to the Registrar-General or to the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office in the district in which the birth took place, under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance for the amendment of the entry in page 2 of the birth registration entry and in other cases application should be made to the District Court under section 20 for rectification of the entry in page 2.

(b) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a Member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, or generally speaking some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made

(c) The original certificates of or regarding candidate's educational qualifications

N.B.—Applications will be rejected in the absence of one or more of these documents

(v) The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, will issue admission forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time table and the rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Supervising Examiner on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination he should communicate without delay with the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, informing that he has not received the admission form and giving the following particulars:—

- (1) Name of examination
- (2) Full name
- (3) Full postal address

6 Should any of the particulars furnished by the candidates be found to be false within their knowledge they will, if appointed, be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalized.

Withdrawal and refunds

7 In no circumstances will a refund of the value of stamps be made.

Leave to Officers to attend examination

8. Heads of Departments and Chairmen of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant to officers of their Departments and of Local Bodies whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, duty leave to present themselves at the examination.

9. The subjects for the examination are as follows.—

(2) Viva Voce Test—Candidates are required to produce at the viva voce test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission to the Local Government Service Examination for Electrical Foremen, Grade I	100

10 The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the viva voce. The number to be called at the viva voce examination will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission. The viva voce examination will be held in Colombo

Medical examination

11 The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.
