- (11) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the first schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale prices per 80 measures and 112 measures nett, respectively, above which paddy shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas montioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the same schedule.
- (iii) fix the prices specified in column 2 of tho second schedule hereto to be the maximum retail prices per measure above which paddy shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the same schedule.
- (IV) direct that for the purpose of this order-
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchasor shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.

  - (a) the date of sale ,(b) the quantity of paddy sold ;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold, and
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, i.e., whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail

    - (b) the quantity of rice sold;
    - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold; and
  - (d) the nature of transaction, i.e., whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail
