IRRIGATION DEPARTMENT

Construction of a Composite Sewerage Scheme, Ratmalana, W. P.

THE Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Lands and Land Development, P. O. Box 500, Secretariat, Colombo, will receive tenders for the construction of a composite sewerage scheme, Ratmalana, W. P.

2 Only contractors who are registered in the Public Works Department, Irrigation Department or Public Health Department, for works costing Rs. 100,000 and over are eligible to tender. Firms of repute and sound financial standing desirous of tendering for the work but are not at present registered as contractors in any of the above departments should get themselves registered as contractors in any of the said Government departments before applying for tender forms for the work.

3. Those tenderers who have contracts already in hand under Government should obtain certificate of satisfactory progress therein from the respective Engineers in charge and submit same on application for tender forms.

4. Tenders are to be made on forms obtainable from the office of the Irrigation Engineer, Colombo Sub-Division, Kolonnawa, Colombo 9. Intending tenderers must deposit a sum of rupees three

hundred (Rs. 300) per tender at any Kachcheri or the office of the officer issuing tender forms and produce the receipt for same before the required tender forms can be issued. No tender will be considered which is not made on the recognized form or which does not wholly comply with these conditions. Tender forms will be issued up to 12 noon, Friday, November 27, 1953.

5 The tendered rates must be entered in ink in words as well as in figures and any alterations made in the quotations should bear the initials of the tenderer. The total amount of the tender should also be given in words as well as in figures. If the amount given in words differs from the amount given in figures, or if no amount is stated in words, such tender will be rejected. The tenderer should give his full address on the tender.

6 Tenders should be submitted in duplicate, signed and dated, in sealed covers, addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Lands and Land Development, P. O. Box 500, Secretariat, Colombo 1. Tenders may either be sent by post under registered cover or be deposited in the tender box provided for the purpose at the office of the Chairman, Tender Board, so as to reach him not later than midday on Tuesday, December 1, 1953. Envelopes should be marked "Tenders for Composite Sewerage Scheme, Ratmalana" on the top left-hand corner.

7. Tenders should be firm and subject to no variation for fluctuation in prices and/or in Customs Duty.

8. A notice in writing from the head of the department or his authorized representative, accepting the tendered rates, will be sent to the successful tenderer who will then be required to furnish 5 per cent. of the accepted tender as security in cash or by bank guarantee for the satisfactory completion of the work, within 14 days of the issue of such notice, and to enter into an agreement with the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury. The tender deposits will be refunded after the agreement has been signed.

9. If the successful tenderer fails to furnish the required security and/or enter into the agreement with the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury on the basis of his accepted tender as required by the previous clause, his tender deposit will be forfeited and his name included in the list of defaulting contractors.

10. The work should be commenced within thirty days of notice of acceptance and completed to the satisfaction of the Irrigation Engineer, Colombo Sub-division, on or before the date specified, the monthly output being equal to not less than twenty-five per cent. Default will entail immediate determination of the contract.

11. The contract should not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Chairman, Tender Board, or his authorized representative; nor should a power of attorney be issued to a person on the list of Crown defaulting contractors for performance of the contract.

12. The Government reserves to itself the right to reject, without question, any or all tenders and to accept any portion of any tender.

13. No agreement or arrangement regarding this contract should be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors either individually or jointly with any other person whose name is on such list, or with a person to whom the Chairman, Tender Board, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects.

14. Access to plans will be allowed by the Irrigation Engineer, Colombo Sub-division, to all tenderers during office hours at any date up to the closing date. The department will not accept liability for errors in tenders due to inadequate description of services on the tender schedule of quantities. Intending tenderers should satisfy themselves as to what is required by inspection of the site and plans and by questioning the Irrigation Engineer, Colombo Sub-division, who will give any further information required during office hours.

15. It should be noted that, in all cases where security deposit is obtained in terms of paragraph 8, the agreements are liable to a stamp duty based on the amount of security; and therefore the successful tenderer should produce stamps of the appropriate value when summoned for the purpose of signing the agreement. The amount of security and the value of the stamps necessary will be intimated to the successful tenderer at the time the notice specified under paragraph 8 is sent to him.

16. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for. The employment of only Ceylonese labour will be made a condition of the contract, and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided however that in exceptional circumstances the Director of Irrigation may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry

of Lands and Land Development. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence is forbidden.

The term Ceylonese shall mean and include—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; or
- (b) A British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (c) A British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (b).

The term 'labour' shall mean both skilled and unskilled labour

17. The contractor shall, whenever required to do so by the Commissioner of Labour, supply him with full particulars of the categories of workers employed by the contractor under the contract for this work.

18. The contractor will be required to supply his own tools, plant and equipment necessary for the satisfactory execution of the work. All necessary materials required for the satisfactory execution and completion of the work, unless otherwise stated on the specification, shall be supplied by the contractor.

19. The contractor shall indemnify the Government against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934, or any statutory modification thereof. Any such claim which may be paid by the Government shall be deducted from and out of any sum or sums of money that shall be due or become due to the contractor under the terms of the agreement.

20. All notice to be served upon the contractor shall be deemed to have been duly served if given to him personally or to his agent (including, in the case of a company, the agent or secretary of such company) or sent through the post addressed to his house/office, which place the contractor selects for the purpose. Should the contractor change his office/house, he shall forthwith by writing notify to the Engineer the fact of such change; and, until such notification is communicated to the Engineer, the posting of such letters, notices or other documents, to the address provided in the agreement shall for all purposes be deemed to be and constitute sufficient delivery of the same.

21. Any person employed by the contractor on the works, who in the opinion of the Engineer is incompetent or who shall act in an improper manner or is objected to by the Engineer, shall be dismissed from the works by the contractor at the request of the Engineer, and such person shall not be again employed upon the works without the written permission of the Engineer.

22. The contractor will comply with all sanitary and health regulations for the time being in force and applicable to the site of the works

23. The Laws of the Dominion of Ceylon shall apply to the contract

24. The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any damages from the Government by reason of not being awarded work up to the extent specified in the contract, or at all in the event of any reduction in or the cessation of the work being deemed necessary by the Engineer.

25. The Engineer will be entitled to retain an amount equal to ten per cent. of the value of work executed monthly until the amount so retained aggregates a sum equal to 5 per cent. of the amount of tender

The amount so retained shall be held by Government as security for the completion of the works

until the whole of the works have been completed in accordance with the contract and to the satisfaction of the Engineer, and until the Engineer has issued a completion certificate in respect of the whole works, whereupon one moiety of the amount retained shall be paid to the contractor and the other moiety thereof shall be held until the issue of the final certificate, whereupon the said moiety shall be paid to the contractor.

Tender for the Supply of Double Cadjans

SEALED tenders, marked "Tender for the supply of Double Cadjans" on the top left-hand corner of the envelope, will be received by the General Manager, Animal Husbandry Farms, Peradeniya, up to 12 noon on Saturday, November 14, 1953, for the supply of 15,000 double cadjans to the Cattle Farms, Ridiyagama.

2 The rates quoted should be for 1,000 double cadjans delivered at the Cattle Farm, Ridiyagama.

3. The size of the double cadjans should not be less than 5 feet in length and 14 inches in breadth

4. Applications for tender forms should be accompanied by a receipt for a deposit of Rs. 25 made at the Treasury or at the nearest Kachcheri. Tender forms will be issued up to 12 noon on Saturday, November 7, 1953.

5. The successful tenderer will be required to deposit 5 per cent. of the total value of the contract and to also enter into an agreement for the due and faithful performance of his contract. He will further be required to supply the double cadjans within three weeks of notice in writing given by the General Manager, Animal Husbandry Farms, Peradeniya.

6. Tenders from those whose names appear in the list of defaulting contractors will not be entertained.

7. The undersigned reserves to himself the right, without question, to reject any or all tenders, or accept any part of a tender.

8. The General Manager, Animal Husbandry Farms, Peradeniya, reserves the right to order the successful tenderer to supply a bigger quantity or a smaller quantity of double cadjans than what is stipulated in the tender notice.

TENDERS FOR THE TRANSPORT OF FOODSTUFFS, 1953-54

TENDERS are hereby invited for the following services for the financial year October 1, 1953, to September 30, 1954

Sealed tenders will be received up to November 24, 1953, by the Deputy Food Controller, Polonnaruwa, for the following services required at the Polonnaruwa Supply Station:—

Food Control

(1) Unloading from the railway wagons; loading into carts or lorries; transporting to, unloading, and stacking at Supply Station, Polonnaruwa.

(2) Loading into carts or lorries at the Supply Station, Polonnaruwa; transporting to, and unloading into the railway wagons at the Railway Station; and stacking into railway wagons

Guaranteed Price Scheme

(1) Loading into carts or lorries at the Minneriya Agricultural Produce and Sales Society Mills, Hingurakgoda; transporting to, and unloading at, the Supply Station, Polonnaruwa.

(2) Measuring, re-bagging and stacking at Supply Stations.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover and should be addressed to the Deputy Food Controller, Polonnaruwa.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box at the Polonnaruwa Kachcheri or be sent through the post under registered cover.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tenders for transport of foodstuffs" in the left-hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Deputy Food Controller, Polonnaruwa, not later than midday on Tuesday, November 24, 1953.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Polonnaruwa Kachcheri, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the prescribed form.

6. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

7. A deposit of Rs. 50 will be required to be made at the Polonnaruwa Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract on the acceptance of the tender, or fail to furnish the required security within ten days of his receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. Notice of the acceptance of the tender will be deemed to

have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer. All other deposits will be returned upon the signing of the contract.

8. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become sureties for the fulfilment of the contract.

9. Tenderers should state the number of licensed vehicles they already possess, with the distinctive numbers in the case of lorries.

10. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of each contract. The amount of security required should be given in cash as shown against each of the items in the tender form. The right to vary the security deposit, whenever necessary, is reserved. All other necessary information on this matter can be obtained upon application at this office.

11. No tender will be considered unless, in respect of it, all the conditions laid down above have been strictly fulfilled.

12. No tender will be entertained from persons whose names appear in the list of defaulting contractors.

13. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of the tender.

14. No contract may be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Deputy Food Controller, Polonnaruwa. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

15. No tenderer will be allowed to withdraw his tender. If he does so, his tender deposit is liable to be forfeited and his name submitted to the Tender Board to be included in the list of defaulting contractors.

16. The Deputy Food Controller, Polonnaruwa, will, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any persons specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

17. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for will be a condition of the contract; failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. However, in exceptional circumstances, the Deputy Food Controller, Polonnaruwa, may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Food. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers, without such approval and concurrence in writing, is forbidden. The term Ceylonese shall mean—

- (a) a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; or
- (b) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (c) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within the category (b).

18. A tenderer who has not previously held a Government contract, when applying for the tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and the permanent address, stating in which

district or districts he owns landed property or has other valid interests. The extent of the landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given.

A tenderer, who has carried out Government contracts with the department but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tender, should state in which division or districts he had held similar contracts.

A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with any other department should specify the name of the department for which, and the district in which, the service was rendered.

19. The successful tenderer will be responsible for ascertaining the dates and times of arrival of wagons at the railway station and their release within such time as may from time to time be indicated by the Railway. It will also be his responsibility to find out from the Storekeeper of the Supply Station the volume of work that has to be carried out each day. Failure to comply with these requirements will render him liable to pay demurrage charges and other penalties for the delay. The decision of the Deputy Food Controller, Polonnaruwa, on this question will be final.

The successful tenderer should employ his own escorts for the transport of foodstuffs and be prepared to work on Sundays and Public Holidays if so required.

20. The Government will not be bound to provide regularity of work under this contract and will not be liable to make any payment by way of compensation to the contractor if work is not available for him.

21. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance.

22. Supply Station, which has a number of stores attached to it, will include all stores in the charge of the Storekeeper. The location of the stores under each supply station could be ascertained from this office.

23. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Deputy Food Controller, Polonnaruwa, acting for and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

24. Any other particulars can be had from the Deputy Food Controller's office, Polonnaruwa, during the usual office hours on any working day.

Conditions of Tender

SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF OILED COIR ROPE

THE Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Transport and Works, P. O. Box 547, Colombo, will receive tenders up to 2.30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 11, 1953, for the supply and delivery of oiled coir rope as per bill of quantities attached hereto.

2. All tenders should hold good for acceptance for a minimum period of sixty (60) days from the date of closing of tenders.

3. (i) Tenders should be priced as indicated in the bill of quantities and should include all charges for delivery at the HARBOUR WORKS STORE.

(ii) The rates quoted in the tender as well as the total amount of the tender should be entered in words as well as in figures. Where the amount given in figures differs from the amount in words or no amount is stated in words, the tender is liable for rejection. All alterations and erasures in tender forms must be initialled by the tenderer.

4. The tenders are to be submitted on prescribed forms which will be supplied up to 12 noon on Tuesday, November 10, 1953, upon application at the office of the Colombo Port Commission, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the prescribed form.

5. All tenders should be submitted in duplicate together with a copy of the "Conditions of Tender" duly signed by the tenderer, under one sealed envelope. The envelope should be marked "Tender for the Supply of Oiled Coir Rope, Colombo Port Commission" on the top left-hand corner of the envelope and should reach the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Transport and Works, P. O. Box 547, Colombo, not later than 2.30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 11, 1953. If a copy of the "Conditions of Tender" is not signed and returned along with the tender, the tender will be considered incomplete and will be rejected.

6. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Ministry of Transport and Works, or be sent through the post under registered cover to be received before the specified time.

7. Tender forms will be issued on production of a receipt issued by the Shroff, Colombo Port Commission, for Rs. 100. The tender deposit of Rs. 100 will be refunded to bona fide tenderers after the selection of the successful tenderer and on his entering into a contract. The tender deposit will be forfeited to the Crown if—

- (a) the withdrawal of a tender already sent is not made before the closing date of tender, or
- (b) the tender documents are not returned before the closing date of the tender in the case of anyone who does not wish to tender after obtaining the tender forms, or
- (c) any person declines or fails to enter into the contract or bond or fail to furnish approved security within ten days of his receiving notice in writing from the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, his tender deposit will be forfeited and the tenderer will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer in the tender form.

8. Before tender forms are issued to tenderers they must, if called upon to do so, satisfy the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, as to their financial ability to carry out the supply. The Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, may refuse to issue tender forms if an applicant is unable to comply with this requirement.

9. No tender forms will be issued to any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors either individually or jointly with any other person, nor to any person objected to by the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, for good and sufficient reasons.

10. The Tender Board reserves to itself the right of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender. Tenderers should be prepared to accept and execute a portion of any item in the bill of quantities at the rates quoted against such item.

11. The successful tenderer will be notified by registered letter that his offer has been accepted, as soon as possible after closing date of tenders. A tenderer who is unable to offer the oiled coir rope ex stock should be prepared to enter into a contract with the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission/the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office under the Government of Ceylon. The contract will be strictly in accordance with the decision of the Tender Board and within the time limit mentioned in the tender, unless an extension has been given in writing by the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission.

12. All expenses incurred in the preparation of the contract will be borne by the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission. The successful tenderer will be bound under the Stamp Ordinance (Cap. 189) to affix stamps of sufficient value to the contract when entering into a contract.

13. As security for the due fulfilment of the contract the successful tenderer will be required either to deposit with the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, a sum equal to 5 per cent. of the contract amount in cash, which said amount he should undertake to mortgage, assign, and set over to the Crown after the tender is accepted, or to furnish a bank guarantee for the like amount.

14. The contract when entered into shall not be assigned or sublet without the consent in writing of the Port Commissioner and Chairman. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a Power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

15. If at any time between the acceptance of the tender and the completion of the supply of the said oiled coir rope the contractor shall become bankrupt or have receiving order made against him or shall present his petition in bankruptcy, then the Government may terminate the contract and forfeit the security deposit.

16. Tenderers should forward at their own expense free samples (not returnable) of three fathoms of each of the various sizes of oiled coir rope given in the bill of quantities, with the name of the tenderer written thereon, to the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, at the Harbour Works Stores, Kochchikade, before November 21, 1953.

17. On completion of supply of oiled coir rope by the successful tenderer, the rope shall be tested on Colombo Port Commission testing machine.

18. The tenderer shall pay the cost of each test of the samples at rates shown in the Booklet of Charges in force at the Port of Colombo.

19. The Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, or his authorized representative shall be entitled to inspect the ropes at any time during manufacture.

20. Even after an order is placed on a tenderer, on the sample furnished by him proving to be satisfactory, the ropes themselves are liable to rejection without cost if they prove to be not in conformity with the sample piece and or with the bill of quantities, and the tenderer will be required to replace such rejected material with material equal to the sample and/or specification free of charge within the period specified by the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, of such rejection.

21. Tenderers shall give, against each item on the tender form, the earliest date, after intimation of acceptance of tender, on which delivery can be effected ex works.

22. Should the tenderer fail to supply and deliver the oiled coir rope demanded of him within the specified period or should he fail to replace any rejected quantity with a like quantity of approved quality within a period allowed by the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, he becomes liable to pay liquidated damages, as stipulated by the Port Commissioner and Chairman, for each day he is in default, until the supply is completed.

23. Should there be any contingency not provided for in this tender and should the contractor and the Port Commissioner and Chairman, Colombo Port Commission, fail to come to a mutual agreement in any other manner, the matter shall be referred to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Transport and Works, for decision. The Permanent Secretary shall thereupon decide the said matter.

24. The tenderer shall indemnify the Government against any workmen's compensation claims.

25. The Government has the right to object to the employment by the tenderer of any undesirable labour.

26. The tenderer will employ Ceylonese labour in carrying out this contract.

"Ceylonese labour" for this purpose is defined as—

- (a) a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration, or
- (b) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon, or
- (c) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (b).

27. No tender will be considered unless all conditions of tender laid down above have been fulfilled.

OILED COIR ROPE—BILL OF QUANTITIES

SPECIAL EXAMINATION FOR ABSORPTION OF MONTHLY-PAID TEMPORARY CLERKS IN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS INTO THE HIGHER GRADE OF THE QUASI-CLERICAL SERVICE

1 *Date of Examination.*—A special examination open to temporary clerks on monthly pay in Government employ for absorption into the Higher Grade of the Quasi-Clerical Service will be held in Colombo, Galle, Kandy, Jaffna, and Batticaloa, by the Commissioner of Examinations on December 26, 1953.

Any centre for which a sufficient number of candidates do not enter may be cancelled.

2 *Salary.*—Successful candidates will be appointed to the Higher Grade of the Quasi-Clerical Service. The salary scale of this Service is Rs. 840—72—Rs. 1,920 per annum. A candidate whose salary as temporary clerk falls within the range of salary scale for the Higher Grade of the Quasi-Clerical Service will be placed on that same point of salary in the Quasi-Clerical Service (Higher Grade) scale. A candidate whose salary on the date of appointment to the Higher Grade of the Quasi-Clerical Service exceeds the maximum of the scale for that Service will be permitted to retain that salary as a fixed salary personal to him for as long as he remains within that Service.

3 *Conditions of Service.*—(i) The posts are non-pensionable and appointments will be only on a Provident Fund basis. Successful candidates will
