- (b) 11 a.m.—6 oz. of bread or a suitable substitute of the same value approved by the Port Health Officer, Kayts, with two vegetable curries,
- (c) 2 p.m.—A cup of plain tea or coffee,

(d) 5 p.m.—6 oz. of bread or a suitable substitute of the same value approved by the Port Health Officer, Kayts, with 2 vegetable curries.

- (11) Patients (illicit immigrants)—8 oz. bread with $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. coffee with 2 oz. of sugar, or 2 oz. malted milk, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. coffee with 2 oz. of sugar or 2 oz. arrow root, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. coffee with 2 oz. sugar, or 2 oz. barley with 2 oz. of sugar, as prescribed by the Port Health Officer, Kayts

2 Tenders in duplicate marked on the top left-hand corner of the envelope "Tender-for the supply of cooked provisions, Kayts", should be sent under registered cover. Tenderers should quote separately for the 7 a.m., 11 a.m., 2 p.m., 5 p.m. meals and one rate for patients' diet. All tenders should be on forms obtainable from the Director, Quarantine Department, Colombo. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. - (ii) A recommendation from the District Revenue Officer or the Village Headmen that the tenderer is capable of carrying out the contract and has experience in similar catering services and worth in property or in cash or both not less than Rs 10,000
4. The tender deposit of Rs 25 will be refunded to all tenderers after a contract has been entered into with the successful tenderer. If the successful tenderer fails to enter into a contract with the Director, Quarantine Department, Colombo, within two weeks of the receipt of information that his tender has been selected the deposit of Rs 25 will be forfeited

QUOTATIONS FOR WASHING SOILED LINEN, QUARANTINE OFFICE, COLOMBO
