THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE

Order under Section 5

- (e) Curing or manufacture of rubber.
- (f) Manufacture of soap
- (g) Keeping of a tannery.
- (h) Curing of arecanuts.
- (i) Boiling of blood or offal.
- (j) Storing of hides
- (k) Storing of bones.
- (l) Icing of fish.
- (m) Curing of planks.
- (n) Smoking or manufacture of rubber sheets or crepe.
- (o) Storing of artificial manure or materials used for the preparation of artificial manure in quantity over three bags.
- (p) Curing or drying of tobacco.
- (q) Keeping of a toddy collecting station
- (r) Manufacture of beedies.

(2) The following trades shall be deemed to be dangerous trades:—

- (a) Manufacture of aerated waters.
- (b) Manufacture of copra.
- (c) Quarrying for cabook, gravel, or metal.
- (d) Storing of copra
- (e) Storing of straw
- (f) Manufacture of desiccated coconut
- (g) Curing or storing of plumbago
- (h) Digging for coral stones by opening a pit.
- (i) Manufacture of coconut oil by machinery.
- (j) Burning or storing of lime.
- (k) Manufacture or storing of fibre.
- (l) Storing of cotton wool.
- (m) Manufacture of matches
- (n) Keeping of a kerosene oil depot.
- (o) Keeping of an establishment to manufacture jewellery.
- (p) Keeping of a forge

(3) The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive and dangerous trades:—

- (a) Keeping of a factory to manufacture tea.
- (b) Keeping of a rice mill.
- (c) Storing of timber."

8. The selected candidate will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No 43 of 1945, and the regulations made thereunder.

9. The selected candidate may be required to furnish security either in cash or by fidelity guarantee bond through a guarantee association approved by the Commission.
