BY-LAWS**REGISTRATION OF MORTGAGES**

1. It shall be lawful for every mortgagee of any immovable property situated within the administrative limits of the Council, or for any of the heirs or the legal representative of any deceased mortgagee, to cause any such mortgage to be registered at the office of the Council

2 Every person desiring to have a mortgage so registered shall forward or cause to be forwarded to the Chairman a statement setting out—

- (1) the name and address of the mortgagee or of any heir or legal representative of the mortgagee, if he is deceased;
- (2) the name and address of the mortgagor; and
- (3) a description of the property or such particulars as may be necessary for identifying it

3 On receipt of such statement and on payment by the applicant of a registration fee, which is hereby fixed at two rupees, the Chairman shall cause the names and addresses and necessary particulars to be entered in the register kept for that purpose in the office of the Council

4 Such register shall be open for inspection at all times during the office hours of the Council, and a fee of 25 cents shall be paid by any person who desires to make such inspection

5 In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least fourteen days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person or persons whose names and addresses have been so registered, a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected

6 If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure

7 In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council; and

“Council” means the Jaala Urban Council

- (f) Storing copra
- (g) Storing straw.
- (h) Manufacturing desiccated coconut
- (i) Curing or storing plumbago
- (j) Manufacturing coconut oil by machinery.
- (k) Burning or storing lime
- (l) Manufacturing or storing fibre.
- (m) Storing cotton wool
- (n) Manufacturing matches.
- (o) Keeping a smithy where oxy-welding is carried on
- (p) Keeping a timber depot.

- (a) Dyeing fibre.
- (b) Burning bricks or tiles
- (c) Charging batteries

- (a) Storing cured or dry fish

By-laws relating to the Tax on Vehicles and Animals

SECTION 47

1 (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Ordinance, every person who has in his possession or custody or control any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars, substantially in the Form A specified in the Schedule hereto, which may be obtained from the office of the Committee.

(2) The schedule shall be filled up and sent to the Chairman on or before December 31, 1953, in respect of the year 1954, by the person liable to pay the tax under section 47 of the Ordinance, and no such Schedule shall be required from such

person in respect of any subsequent year during which such person is in possession or custody or control of such vehicle or animal.

2. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall, without further notice, be liable—

- (a) for the year 1954, in respect of the vehicles and animals specified in the schedule, to pay the tax on or before the thirty-first day of March, of that year; and
- (b) for every subsequent year in respect of such vehicles and animals specified in that schedule as remain in his possession, custody or control for more than thirty days in such subsequent year, to pay the tax on or before the thirty-first day of March of that year.

3. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, which is liable to the tax under the Ordinance, or any person who has not furnished any schedule for the first time acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires, commences to keep or use any such vehicle or animal, send a written notice to the Chairman stating the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use and further furnish a written statement of particulars, substantially in the Form A set out in the Schedule hereto

4. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the written statement referred to in by-law 3 shall be liable to pay the tax, in respect of the year in which such statement is furnished and in respect of every subsequent year, for the vehicles and animals specified in the statement which are in his possession, custody or control, within such time as may be notified to him in that behalf by the Chairman.

5. (1) Every person, who, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written statement referred to in by-law 3, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance, from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered or referred to in such schedule or statement, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption, specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

(2) Every person, who, after having furnished the Schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written statement referred to in by-law 3 ceases to possess, keep or use any vehicle or animal, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman that he has ceased to possess, keep or use such vehicle or animal.

6. On payment of the tax by any person, the Chairman shall issue to that person in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in Form B in the Schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of fifty cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner thereof a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by such owner of sixty cents.

7 The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of the vehicle

8 It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or any officer authorised by him in writing, to stop and detain any vehicle proceeding on any road or path, for the purpose of inspecting the metal plate required by by-law 7 to be affixed on such vehicle; and the driver or the person in charge of such vehicle shall, on being requested by the Chairman or such officer, stop the vehicle and permit the Chairman or such officer to inspect such plate

9. The by-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals framed by certain Village Committees in the Hambantota District and published in Gazette No. 9,276 of June 2, 1944, as amended by any subsequent by-laws are hereby repealed, in so far as they apply to the Tissa village area.

INTERPRETATION

10. In these by-laws—

- “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Village Committee of the Tissa village area;
- “Committee” means the Village Committee of the Tissa village area;
- “Ordinance” means the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198).
