

The preliminary magistrate's inquest into the death was performed by Galle Acting Magistrate Premarathna Thiranagama on Saturday at the KTH after which he ordered a postmortem. At the magisterial inquest police submitted that the woman was arrested on a tip off for allegedly trafficking heroin and on questioning she had confessed that the packet of heroin she had with her had been swallowed by her. Later as she fell sick following the arrest, police had admitted her to the hospital where she died while being treated at the Emergency Treatment Unit. Assistant Judicial Medical Officer Ruwan Nanayakkara who held the postmortem returned an open verdict. Blood samples of the deceased was sent to the Government Analyst for further examination.

Her funeral will be held today in Hikkaduwa. Meetiyagoda Police who had obtained a court order advised the deceased's family members to refrain from holding any demonstration and to take her remains to the closest cemetery for burial.

"This situation has been created due to the foreign policy pursued by this government and the previous government." Silva noted. Silva furthered,

"This is not to say that we should not deal with the rest of the world. Although a small country, we must deal with it as an independent, sovereign state. However, the country has been plunged into a serious debt crisis. So we have to borrow more or sell more resources. The debt-ridden economy pursued by previous governments and this government has made Sri Lanka a pawn of all these countries. In fact, creditors

are coming to our country. Of course, the debtor must bend the knee when the creditor arrives. When one creditor leaves, another creditor arrives. Our country is stuck in a debt crisis of over 13 trillion rupees. Due to this increase in debt, Sri Lanka was downgraded to a country with the lowest lending capacity. If another unit is reduced, we will not be able to borrow from any country." Silva also noted, "The big-

gest problem in our debt crisis is the increase in the share of foreign debt in total debt. It is not difficult to repay a loan taken from within the country as we pay in rupees.

Printing money is not a good option at all, but printing can save money. But dollars cannot be printed. More than 48% of Sri Lanka's total public debt is in dollar terms.Where is the dollar for Sri Lanka to repay these loans? The collapse of our export economy has increased by the COVID epidemic. In this situation there are only two ways to repay foreign loans. One is to sell the valuable resources of our country to foreign countries. This is what is happening now.'

Silva furthered, "Last month Sri Lanka paid off a 1 billion dollar maturing loan. We have to pay 1 billion dollars by July next year. In addition, the interest rate on the loan is about 400 million dollars a month. The annual loan interest is around 4.8 billion. We are stuck in a debt trap of USD 5 billion next year."

He visited the Tea Research Institute (TRI) in Talawakele on Saturday. During his visit, he looked into the possibility of passing the knowledge and the knowhow to the tea stakeholders to improve their productivity. He also visited the Coombs Tea Factory in Talawakele and a tea factory with modern technology set up by the TRI at the Waltrim Tea Estate. The State Minister, while taking part at a panel discussion, said that it is a

great pleasure to be at the TRI, which is the second oldest tea research institute of the world and to share knowledge with the experts and academics of the tea industry.

The State Minister said that in accordance with President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's vision, the tea industry can be well used for economic prosperity. The Government also pays a special attention to uplift the tea industry, since it has a huge potential to be developed as one of a main income generators to the "Revenue generated by the tea industry can be increased significantly by increasing the productivity and increasing the quality of the production as well. You all at the TRI have clearly analysed the issues relating to the tea industry, and it is praiseworthy that you have initiated to address and overcome those issues," the Sate Minister said.

The Minister said that the TRI should go to the grass-roots level to share the knowledge and the expertise of the tea stakeholders including state and private sector. "We wish to inform you that, during routine PCR testing at our facilities, an associate at Hirdaram-

ani Industries, Kahathaduwa tested positive for COVID-19 on October 17, 2020. Since the start of the recent COVID-19 outbreak, our dedicated factory teams have been conducting PCR testing across all facilities.

The associate is currently asymptomatic, in stable condition and following the required MOH procedures for quarantine and treatment.

As a precautionary measure, we are disinfecting the entire plant and have requested all employees working in the facility, and those in the Group who have come into contact with the individual to self-isolate, while we conduct further PCR tests. We are working with the relevant authorities to contact trace, arrange additional tests as required and determine the next steps.

Book review:

A slice of HRAVEN

Ruwanmali Samarakoon-Amunugama's book Milk, Spice & Curry Leaves: Hill Country Recipes from the Heart of Sri Lanka aims to give Sri Lankan cuisine its rightful place in

ri Lankan food, if it gets mentioned at all at restaurants, often gets lumped in with the Indian curries and rice dishes on the

Or if you want to cook Sri Lankan food at home, you won't find as many recipes as you would if you Googled some other South Asian countries.

US resident Ruwanmali Samarakoon-Amunugama wants to change that. She's here to make the case that Sri Lankan cuisine deserves to stand on its own merits, that the country's geography, history and bounties of jackfruit and coconut produce bright, clarion flavours that should be celebrated more in the United

In her first cookbook, "Milk, Spice & Curry Leaves: Hill Country Recipesfrom the Heart of Sri Lanka" (to be published tomorrow (20) by TouchWood Editions), the author pays homage to her mother's homeland, expounding on the abundance of fish around the island that inspired its seafood dishes, and fruits and veggies from the hill country of the Central Province that produce memorable vegetarian curries. The pillars of Sri Lankan cooking, said Samarakoon-Amunugama, are rice, spices and coconut. Always the coconut.

Coconut is "featured in every meal of the day, whether in the form of fresh, dried or roasted flesh, or liquid oil or milk," she writes.

When it comes to curry, it is the melding of curry leaves, onion, garlic, ginger and chillies that gives these dishes their complex, layered flavors, she said. They're classified by colours: red curry (with chillies and sometimes paprika), white curry (with coconut milk with turmeric) and its revered black curry (with

The author, who grew up in British Columbia, Canada, is a self-taught cook. She watched her mother in the kitchen, jotting down recipes to preserve the family history since her ancestors – like many Sri Lankans – never measured their spices and ingredients, she said.

Her motivation to write a cookbook came in part because she didn't see any Sri Lankan cookbooks around British Columbia. "People don't know the cuisine very well. I would see Indian and other South Asian cookbooks. Never saw Sri Lankan," she said.

Because of the coronavirus pandemic, Samarakoon-Amunugama has not checked out those new restaurants yet. We recently caught a few minutes with her over the phone. Answers have been edited for brevity and clarity.

Q: WHEN I THINK OF THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN SRI LANKAN AND INDIAN CUISINE, WHAT COMES TO MIND IS THE ROASTED CURRY POWDER THAT MAKES YOUR ISLAND'S FOOD DISTINC-TIVE FROM MANY OTHER SOUTH **ASIAN CUISINES.** A: Yes, you have

O: THERE'S ALSO A PRONOUNCED TARTNESS, ESPECIALLY IN MANY CURRIES, THAT I DON'T FIND IN OTHER SOUTH ASIA CUISINES.

A: That sour dimension is often goraka (Garcinia), a sour fruit. Goraka is often dried and brined and used whole or ground to a paste. That sourness you notice could also be a squeeze of lime at the end. Other times it is tamarind or vinegar.

O: THE COUNTRY'S COLONIAL PAST MUST HAVE HAD AN INFLUENCE?

A: The Portuguese - that can be seen in the use of chillies, tomatoes and eggplants. Also desserts and breads. And the cooking method 'tempering' - the sautéing of onions, curry leaves, mustard seeds or ground spices to release the aromatics. The Dutch have an influence with lamprais, which has been flavoured in a broth with aromatics or spices. Also sweet treats like kokis, which are deep-

O: THERE ARE TEA FARMS IN THE CENTRAL PROVINCE OF SRI LANKA. A COLONIAL INFLUENCE AS WELL?

A: Yes, the British – we have afternoon tea with small bites. Carrots, peas and potatoes might have also been popularised through the British as well.

Q: WHERE DO YOU SHOP FOR INGREDIENTS?

A: India Supermarket in Bellevue. The curry leaves are fresh. I buy banana leaves there and ash plantains. People don't like to grate their own coconut. You can buy fresh-grated coconut in the frozen aisle. Also, a lot of options for rice. I also hit the Asian Family Market, behind the India Supermarket. You can find tamarind and specialty products. For really great vegetables to use for vegetarian curry, I go to farmers markets or community farms. I found lemon grass at a community farm in Bellevue called TBUG.

O: DEVILLED PRAWNS IS ONE SRI LANKAN DISH THAT POPS UP ON MENUS AROUND THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST, WHAT'S THE BACK STORY OF THIS DISH?

A: That dish is reflective of the Chinese influence. And there is Portuguese influence because of the devilling, a method of cooking where the main ingredient is marinated with chilli sauce or crushed chillies and sautéed, often with other ingredients.

It has some sweetness from the caramelizing. It's a fun dish to make when you have company. I like to serve it with yellow rice and a refreshing salad.



Cashewnut curry

uwanmali learned to cook Sri Lankan food from her mother and grandmother. Her knowledge of South Asian foods and ingredients has been further enhanced by numerous trips to Sri Lanka and other parts of Asia. Born in Mississauga, Ontario, Ruwanmali graduated from Simon Fraser University and has lived in British Columbia, Alberta, Ottawa, and Washington

Ruwanmali's childhood memories of visits to Sri Lanka were filled with colourful trips to the market, lively, happy meals with her extended family, and long, scenic car rides from the capital of Colombo, past tea estates and farmers' stalls, into the hill country around Kandy. In Milk, Spice and Curry Leaves, Ruwan shares the rustic, tropical flavours of these Sri Lankan visits sweet pineapple and mango, bitter gourd,

toothsome cashews, spicy chili pepper, tart lime, and many more – in recipes designed with home cooks around the world in mind.

She introduces the three pillars of Sri Lankan cuisine: coconut milk, rice, and spices, and walks readers through the steps to make the two foundational Sri Lankan curry powders (roasted and

unroasted). She also goes into detail on specialty products - like goraka, pandanus leaves, tamarind, and young jackfruit. With lush food photography and styling, handdrawn illustrations, heirloom photos and

ephemera, Milk, Spice and Curry Leaves is an invitation to a way of cooking and a family of traditions from the amazing

DEVILLED PRAWNS (ISSO BADUM)

Sri Lanka, a devilled dish is most often equated with "very hot!" This may be true, but devilling is also a method of cooking in which the main ingredient (vegeable, fruit or protein) is marinated with chilli (chill sauce or ground or crushed chillies), and often sautéed with garlic and ginger. Reminiscent of Portuguese influences with a modern fusion of Asian flavours, devilled dishes often include tomatoes, capsicums and onion. I love that this dish has a bit of sweetness due to the caramelizing of ingredients at the end of cooking. Serve with rice.

MAKES: 4 servings **INGREDIENTS:**

· 250 grams pound fresh large prawns, shelled or unshelled, tails

left on, and deveined · 2 garlic cloves, finely grated, divided

- · 2-inch piece of fresh ginger, peeled and finely grated
- · 1 teaspoon fine sea salt, or to taste · 1 teaspoon chili flakes, divided
- · 1 tablespoon lime juice · 1 teaspoon chili paste
- · 2 tablespoons olive oil
- · 1 teaspoon granulated sugar
- \cdot ½ red onion, sliced · 1 tomato, cubed (optional)
- · 1 red bell pepper or banana pepper, deseeded and sliced
- · 3 green scallions, cut diagonally into long pieces 1. Place the prawns, half the garlic, ginger, salt, ½ teaspoon of
- the chili flakes, lime juice, and chili paste in a bowl. 2. Mix together, cover and let marinate in the fridge for 30 min-

3. Place the oil in a wide frying pan set over medium-high heat, and fry the remaining garlic and ½ teaspoon chili flakes to release their aroma. Add the prawns and, stirring constantly, cook for

4. Add the sugar, stirring quickly to coat the prawns. When the prawns are nicely browned, add the onion, tomato (if using) and capsicum (or banana pepper). Adjust salt. Stir to combine and let cook for another 1 or 2 minutes.

5. Finish by sprinkling the green scallions over top, give it all a quick stir, remove from the heat and serve right away.

Sri Lanka, India Navies to conduct military exercise

The Navies of India and Sri Lanka will conduct a three-day military exercise off Trincomalee beginning Monday, in a show of growing congruence in their strategic interests and operational convergence in the region, officials said.

The eighth edition of the annual SLINEX exercise will feature a series of complex drills including surface and anti-air weapon firings and cross deck flying operations to further fine-tune the "high degree" of inter-operability between the two Navies, they said.

The Indian Navy will deploy anti-submarine warfare corvettes INS Kamorta and INS Kiltan as well as a sizeable number of advanced light helicopters, Chetak helicopter and Dornier maritime patrol aircraft in the exercise, the officials said.

The Sri Lanka Navy will be represented by offshore patrol vessel Sayura and training ship Gajabahu. The previous edition of

SLINEX was conducted off Visakhapatnam in September 2019. "SLINEX series of exer-

cise exemplifies the deep engagement between

India and Sri Lanka. They have strengthened mutual cooperation in the maritime domain," an Indian Navy Spokesperson said.

"Interaction between the two Navies has also grown significantly in recent years, in consonance with India's policy of 'Neighbourhood First' and the Prime Minister's vision of Security and Growth for all in the Region (SAGAR)," he

The Indian Navy has participated in a number of joint maritime exercises in the last few weeks including a three-day drill

with Japanese Navy from September 26-28.

Turkish envoy in Sri Lanka wants Armenia to reach agreement with Azerbaijan

Turkey has urged the international community to put pressure on Armenia to resume sincere, substantive and result oriented negotiations in good faith with Azerbaijan.

Ambassador of Turkey in Colombo R. Demet ekercio lu was speaking to the Daily News on Sunday reacting to some articles stemming from a number of foreign news agencies published recently in the Sri Lankan media on the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict.

"I would like to enlighten the Sri Lankan public opinion on some truths about the ongoing conflict between Azerbaijan and Armenia, as well as Turkey's position on the issue," she said, pointing out that Turkey strongly condemns the Armenian attacks, which have caused civilian casualties, resulting in a clear violation of the international law. Armenia's provocations have now reached to a level that directly targets international and regional peace and stability. With these attacks, Armenia once again proves that it is the biggest obstacle to peace and stability in the region.

Turkey wants to see a negotiated settlement of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict based on Azerbaijan's territorial integrity in accordance with the international law and the UN Security Council Resolutions and OSCE decisions to ensure enduring

peace and stability in the region. However, she said, Armenia has by many means demonstrated that it does not want a peaceful, she said, negotiated settlement to the conflict.

Armenia wants to preserve the status quo and consolidate its occupation. That is why Armenia has done everything to sabotage the negotiations under the auspices of the Minsk Group.

"Turkey fully supports Azerbaijan with unwavering solidarity in this process. Our support for Azerbaijan is not only based on our special bonds, but also stems from the reality that Azerbaijan stands on the right side of the international law."

The envoy said the Armenian allegations regarding Turkish involvement in the field and the fighters from outside are baseless and irrational.

It is no secret that Turkey sells armaments to Azerbaijan like other countries such as Russia and Israel. Armenian Armed Forces are equipped with effective weapons as well.

"Turkey gives and will continue to give strong political and moral support to Azerbaijan. However, Turkey is not a party to this conflict and also not present on the battleground. Armenian disinformation campaign has no other goal than diverting attention away from its illegal occupation and portray Armenia as the victim.

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

Cautious optimism

he lockdown regimens have become so chaotic in the UK and some other countries in Europe that the people are genuinely confused what the rules are in those places. Two families are not allowed in the same space in the UK in the latest lockdown regulation, and in France, curfews have been imposed after

There was much disagreement in the UK also over the so-called circuit-breaker lockdowns that were mooted. All this comes amidst news that the WHO has now deemed lockdowns as a less than effective means of curtailing the pandemic.

The kind of chaos that is prevalent in European countries must be due to a variety of factors, and it is no reason for us in Sri Lanka to be smug.

But citizens are probably collectively thankful that this nation has by and large had a far more cohesive and coordinated response to the crisis than Europe, even as the so-called Minuwangoda cluster is now being brought under control.

The response here has been firm but has left no room for guessing as to who is in charge and whether those in charge are in fact in control. That type of singlemindedness is important when people look for leadership in the midst of the type of uncertainty that has been the norm since the Covid-19 outbreak began.

The election results in New Zealand have also reaffirmed the fact that people in most parts of the world appreciate this type of decisive leadership that doesn't vacillate in the face of challenges. Jacinda Arden, the Premier of a developed nation that is a liberal democracy, managed the Covid-19 crisis rather differently from leaders of most other Western liberal democra-

While others seemed to be indecisive in how restrictions should be balanced with the fundamental Western liberal inclination towards freedom of movement and freedom of assembly, Arden took the early lead in being firm about the restrictions. But once she had done the first part right, she didn't have to contemplate the hard decisions faced by say, Boris Johnson in the UK who didn't seem to control the situation effectively at the beginning, leaving him facing enormously daunting challenges in the current latter phase, in the face of which he seems rather bewildered.

The Sri Lankan example so far has been parallel to Arden's early alert response which made the subsequent challenges far easier to handle, even though such situations were complex and daunting in themselves. Some may notice that the election results in both countries are not similar by coincidence - there is a reason that there were landslide wins in both Sri Lanka and New Zealand for the incumbents, and there is no reason to labour the point by alluding to the paral-

Though some may argue that Sri Lanka - or for that matter New Zealand - are not out of the woods yet, both countries can afford reasonably to plan the economy and the Covid-19 response itself, in the long term. Some would argue that this would be premature in this country with the Minuwangoda cluster still being active. This is not a pandemic in which active clusters or suddenly emergent clusters can be wished away. But despite all the desperate attempts in certain quarters to paint a picture of major disruption and chaos, that is not the case.

The latest cluster has not got out of hand, and it is hoped that it will not. It is reasonable to think it will not - because the contact-tracing response and the regulatory framework that is now in place by Gazette notification, are both going very much according to plan.

The people are also past the early phase of psychological panic at the mere mention of a new Covid patient. Though there is still a great deal of anxiety among commuters and daily workers getting about their lives - there is no palpable panic, and that is in marked contrast to the very first response to the breakout of the pandemic in this country earlier this year.

This improvement in the collective psyche of the populace is a source of strength to the authorities, and vice

The most important factor is the continuing focus on the economy, which is not the reality in some countries which let the situation spiral beyond their control.

The people have been immensely resourceful, and that has been seen in the food industry for instance, where there is variety of responses amidst the various types of challenges that face those who are in the business. Small-time food vendors have discovered extremely innovative methods of making themselves viable, while adhering to the new demands for social distanc-

Overall, there have been no unjust demands for business as usual and that can be put down to cultural factors. This can be contrasted to the youth raves in the UK for instance - where partygoers have sometimes flooded the streets and clashed with the police. New Zealand has not had that type of unruliness either,

and it seems fair to say that when there is a collective notion that things are under control, even the youth sense the fact that it's better for them to cooperate. Where things are out of control, for better or for worse, even the young people seem to be asking the question, 'what's the point?'






Results of the Presidential Election 2019

UN survives a world turned upside down

THALIF DEEN

s the United Nations (UN) plans to commemorate its annual UN Day and 75th anniversary, come October 24, 2020, Secretary-General Antonio Guterres is presiding over a world body which has remained locked down since last March because of the spreading coronavirus pan-

"In a world turned upside down, this General Assembly Hall is among the strangest sights of all," said Guterres last month, describing the venue of the UN's highest policy-making body.

At its 75th anniversary last month, the UN resembled a ghost town, with not a single world leader in sight. But an overwhelming majority did address the UN remotely via video conferencing, for the first time in the history of the 193-member organization.

Still, the United States (USA) was notoriously missing in action (MIA).

"It was like staging Hamlet without the Prince of Denmark," remarked one delegate, using a Shakespearean metaphor.

The US, which is tradition given pride of place as host country to the UN, was not represented either by the President, the Secretary of State or the Permanent Representative to the UN (in that pecking order).

The designated speaker for the commemorative meeting was a deputy US Permanent Representative – way down the political hierarchy.

Tricontinental Institute for Social Research, told IPS the United States stands almost alone in its disdain for the UN and for the goals of the UN Charter of 1945.

Disrespect to the UN at the 75th anniversary meeting comes alongside US withdrawal or pledges to withdraw from UNESCO, UNICEF, UNRWA, and the WHO.

Keep in mind, he said, that the US Government has sanctioned senior members of the International Criminal Court (ICC), while US unilateral sanctions against counthe UN and its affiliated agencies in New York, are working from home

Speaking of the 75th anniversary meeting, Barbara Adams, Chair of the Board of Global Policy Forum and former Chief of Strategic Partnerships and Communications for the UN Development Fund for Women (UNIFEM), told *IPS*: "Yet again people around the world were witnesses to the enormous gap between the well-articulated diagnosis of where we are and what needs to be done not only in the

tries such as Cuba, Iran, and Venezuela are a violation of international

There is no surprise that no senior official came for the anniversary meeting; in fact, it is to be expected, he added.

The United Nations remains one of the most important institutions committed to international peace and development, declared Prashad, author of over 30 books, including Washington Bullets, Red Star Over the Third World, The Darker Nations: A People's History of the Third World and The Poorer Nations: A Possible History of the Global South.

Meanwhile, as the lock down continued, the overwhelming majority of over 3,000 staffers at

face of COVID-19 but also of preexisting inequalities, vulnerabilities and multi-dimensional violence."

Could it be, she asked, that the UN has been "captured" as the President of Equatorial Guinea lamented: "We cannot accept either that after so many years, the Charter of the UN continues to preserve the primacy of the major powers who trample on the legitimate aspirations of the weak so that they can enjoy the advantages of the UN system."

Joseph Chamie, a former director of the UN Population Division, and currently an independent consulting demographer, told IPS: "In my opinion I did not hear any significant or noteworthy contributions from world leaders who addressed

the meeting. Their statements were not informative, insightful or inspiring. In brief, their remarks were disappointing and unmemorable," he pointed out. Chamie said that the lofty goals, ideals and accomplishments of the United Nations should have been highlighted and stressed.

During the past 75 years, he argued, the United Nations has accomplished much and contributed greatly to many critical areas, including peace, security, human rights, health, education, women's equality and development.

"In the next 75 years, the United Nations must promote and expand its essential work for a world population now approaching nearly eight billion, four times its size when the United Nations was established."

While many challenges remain, including the current pandemic, this is an opportune time for world leaders to support and strengthen the United Nations and work together on effectively addressing the critical issues of today and tomorrow, said Chamie.

"The spirit, leadership and vision of 1945 can be rekindled and the United Nations revitalized for its indispensable role in the 21st century," he declared.

The final declaration, which was adopted by the 193 member nations, singled out the UN as the only global organization with the power to bring countries together and give "hope to so many people for a better world and...deliver the future we want."

"No other global organization gives hope to so many people for a better world and can deliver the future we want. The urgency for all countries to come together, to fulfill the promise of the nations united, has rarely been greater," the declaration said.

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres

Mandeep S. Tiwana, Chief Programmes Officer at CIVICUS, a global civil society alliance, told IPS statements by world leaders at the meeting to commemorate the 75th anniversary were mostly along expected lines reflecting their governments' political priorities, and in some cases, their personal predilections.

Notably, there was significant support for international cooperation through multilateralism. The continuing relevance of the key principles of the UN Charter was affirmed even as their realization remains a work in progress, he said.

In a sign of the times, Tiwana pointed out, the United States despite being the host country and as the country whose leaders and visionaries played a key role in establishment of the UN chose to downgrade its representation at the high-level meeting.

The country's statement was delivered by its deputy permanent representative to the UN whereas other countries were represented by their presidents, prime ministers or foreign ministers

Tiwana said "one thing we'd like to see as an outcome from 75-year celebrations is the creation of an office of a Civil Society Envoy to champion peoples and civil society's organisations' participation in the affairs of the UN"

Such an office could help in enabling (i) more consistent civil society participation across UN forums, agencies and departments, (ii) more inclusive convenings by the UN of various kinds of civil society actors, and (iii) better outreach by the UN to civil society across the globe.

"You'll probably agree that the call has enhanced significance in light of the 75-year celebrations of the UN Charter and its commitment to 'We the Peoples'. Coalitions such as UN 2020 and Together First with whom we're closely associated are pushing for such an office.

As Adams, of the Global Policy Forum, pointed out the Prime Minister of Barbados Mia Amor Mottley, expounded in detail the failure 75 years later to move forward to close the gap between disaster and recovery:

"Surely reconstruction of the COVID shattered economies of our countries is a priority now. Unless we forget financing was found in the form of a Marshall Plan for the rebuilding of Europe and financial space was given to war-indebted Britain for over 50 years through bilateral loans and lines of credit at exceedingly low interest rates".

"It is not beyond the international community's capacity to develop mechanisms to ring-fence and differentiate COVID related debt and to treat to it with the far-sighted realism that was shown then to the British debt.

"In the absence of such an approach, my friends, it is clear that the debt to GDP ratio of our region and many small island states will be unsustainable and there will be no fiscal room to build the resilience that we need as we stand on the front line of the climate crisis." (IPS)



There's a 'SOME MOTHER'S **CHILD'** we rarely notice



ave you tried to see people as children? It's not a hard exercise, really. When one has lived long enough to have seen people of different ages, from infant to extremely elderly, one can look at a child and imagine what that child would look like decades from now. The reverse is also possible. We can try to draw out the child that an old person was many decades before.

That's one way of looking at it. There's another. Consider the following note on

My mother taught me to always look at people as children. "Some mother's child," she would say, repeatedly. Often, she would add something else: "That mother wanted the best for them."

As in, that mother did not wish for their child to grow up to be awful, mean-spirited, a liar, thief, pauper, abandoned, lonely, addicted, and so forth. That mother wanted their child to be treated well, to be loved, to be respected, to

be cherished.

If you've passed the school gates within which some child was sitting for an examination, you might notice anxious parents hovering outside. They worry. They pray, some of them at least. They hope for the best. They utter

words of encouragement as their children walk in. They bless them. When they come out, they try to read the eyes of their children. They try to get a sense of whether the children are thrilled or distraught or feel something between these extremes. It is second nature for a parent to quickly wear the face appropriate to the feelings apparent on a child's face. They may get it wrong, of course. Sometimes even if they get it right, a child might not appreciate the instinctive

response of a parent. One thing is clear. Most parents wish nothing less than the best for their children. We all know this. A few minutes of reflections on one's parents, even if we are displeased with them for whatever reason at the particular moment, is all it takes to realize that we are not appreciative enough.

We all know that they played and still play (as the case may be) an important role in our lives. However, we don't advertise the fact. Well, we might acknowledge, but that is rare, apart from such sentiments expressed on three-wheelers. Naturally, we see the person before us. We think of the individual who writes, talks or does something else. We think of a person who was reticent when boldness was required, bullish when reticence was called for. We notice a lot of things about people. We don't notice the mother that was or is a part of the person's life.

'Some mother's child' is not something that comes easily to mind.

What if we did think 'mother'? It's not easy to get past an 'awful, mean-spirited, lying, thieving no-good' person, especially if he or she is in your face. It's hard to see the person as a child. However if we made a habit of preambling 'some mother's child,' before analysis and judgement, the engagement, even if it wasn't genial, would at least not be caustic to the point of corro-

It's something we can do. It's something we can repeat to one and all, especially our children. It's not hard.

"He or she is some mother's child. That mother wanted the best for him or her." So very easy.

The particular child of the particular mother who shared the sentiments mentioned at the beginning had this also to say: "Every time I look at someone I see their mother behind them, hoping against hope. And wherever there is a mother, I see a child. It's a good enough circle for me. Blessed, in fact."

End of the party: Paris empties under curfew

PARIS SUNDAY: Shortly before the clock struck 9 pm on Saturday, restaurant shutters in Paris came down and people dashed home to beat a strict new curfew to battle the coronavirus out-

Police patrolled streets which would ordinarily be bustling with party-goers to enforce the new anti-mingling measure as the country notched up a record of more than 32,000 positive Covid-19 tests in 24 hours, with 1,868 people in intensive care.

Densely-populated Paris has been an infection hotspot, with bars already shuttered since October 6 although restaurants and other establishments that serve food were allowed to stay open.

Alcohol sales are prohibited from 10 pm and face masks are compulsory in public both indoors and outside.

But there has been concern over people, especially youngsters, flouting face coverings and social distancing rules to gather in groups on restaurant terraces and in other public places.

This prompted the government to announce a 9 pm to 6 am curfew for Paris and a dozen other French cities - some 20

million inhabitants in all -- and impose a limit of six on home gatherings blamed for a large proportion of new infections. The curfew will remain in place for at least four weeks.

At 10 pm on Saturday, the streets of the City of Light were eerily empty apart from a

few stragglers risking a 135-euro (\$158) fine unless they can provide a certificate to show they have good reason to be out and about.

"I'm coming back from the hospital Curie where my daughter is being operated on. They gave me this proof," one man tells a group of police officers, presenting a piece of paper.

"That's fine, good evening sir," one replied as he handed back the docu-

Food delivery employees zigzagged the streets on bikes or scooters, bringing meals to now home-bound diners in a city where it is common to sit down to a meal after 9 pm.

A handful of municipal buses circulated without impediment down unusually car-free lanes, though mostly empty themselves. Metros and trains also continue operating to ferry people who have no choice but to break the curfew, whether for work or medical reasons.

Paris has not known a curfew since 1961, which was limited at the time to Muslims amid unrest over the Algerian war of independence from France.

China beefs up laws to handle epidemics, protect whistleblowers



BEIJING SUNDAY: China has passed a new law to improve its handling of disease outbreaks -- including protecting whistleblowers - following a cascade of criticism over its coronavirus response and accusations of an early cover-up.

The new biosecurity law, approved by lawmakers on Saturday, flags the right to report "acts that endanger biosecurity" and calls for risk prevention systems, ranging from active monitoring to emergency plans.

It takes effect from April 15 next year. "Any work unit or individual has the right to report acts that endanger biosecurity," the regulation said.

"When a report is required according to the law, no work unit or individual shall conceal (it)... or hinder others from making a report," it added on infectious diseases and epidemics.

China's approval of the law comes in the

face of Western criticism on the coronavirus, over accusations that it covered up the initial outbreak and silenced early whistle-

But China has been trying to reshape this narrative, with authorities seeking instead to model the country as a van-

guard in the pandemic fight.
Although doctor Li Wenliang who alerted colleagues to the new coronavirus in late December was at first reprimanded, a national outpouring of grief and anger over his death prompted Beijing to redirect criticism to local officials and subsequently paint him as a hero.

President Xi Jinping in February raised the need to speed up establishing the biosecurity law, urging for reforms of mechanisms to prevent major outbreaks.

Under the new law, those who conceal information, omit making reports or prevent others from reporting infectious diseases could be given warnings or suspended. The new law also calls for systems including to regularly monitor biosafety risks, and to trace the origins of

Disease prevention agencies are also to help predict the occurrence and prevalence of emerging diseases.

Based on these predictions, authorities should announce warnings and adopt prevention measures. (AFP)

11 soldiers dead, 11 missing in Vietnam

after second big landslide in days

HANOI SUNDAY: Eleven soldiers are dead and a frantic search is under way for 11 others after a huge landslide hit central Vietnam on Sunday, as the country battles its worst flooding in years. Heavy rain has pound-

ed the region for more than a week and at least 64 people have been killed in floods and landslides, according to Vietnam's disaster management authority, with concerns mounting that waters could rise further.

Rocks rained down on the barracks of a military station in Quang Tri province, with 22 soldiers believed to have been buried underneath thick mud, an official govern-

Lieutenant General Phan Van Giang, the army's chief of general staff, warned there could be further landslides in the area and said rescuers needed to find a safer way to access the site.

Eleven bodies have been recovered so far, the government said.

It comes just days after 13 members of a rescue team were found dead after a failed attempt to save workers from a hydropower plant engulfed by a landslide.

The bodies of two employees at the plant have been found but 15 are still missing.

Armenia, Azerbaijan trade accusations of breaking new truce

STEPANAKERT SUNDAY: Armenia and Azerbaijan accused each other of violating a new ceasefire over Nagorno-Karabakh on Sunday, as they tried for the second time in a week to bring a halt to fierce fighting over the disputed region.

The ex-Soviet neighbours agreed to a new truce from midnight on Sunday, as international mediators push for a stop to three weeks of heavy clashes over Nagorno-Karabakh, an ethnic Armenian region that broke from Azerbaijan's control in the

A previous ceasefire agreed a week ago fell apart amid mutual accusations and continued fighting that has left hundreds dead and forced tens of thousands from their homes. The new ceasefire deal was

announced after one of the deadliest attacks on civilians so far on Saturday, when a missile strike hit a resi-



dential area of Azerbaijan's second city Ganja, killing 13 people including small children.

The two sides have described the agreement as a "humanitarian truce" to allow for the exchange of prisoners and bodies.

But Armenia's defence ministry said Azerbaijani forces had violated the new ceasefire only minutes after it took effect, firing artillery shells and rockets in the early hours of Sun-

Its foreign ministry said Azerbaijan had also launched an attack in a southern area of the Karabakh frontline "demonstrating to the international community its treacherous nature, which we have been dealing with for decades".

Azerbaijan's defence ministry said Armenian forces had "grossly violated another agreement", accusing them of firing artillery and mortar shells in various directions and of launching early morning attacks along the front-

Exporters' outlook for business and economy improves

USAID, CCC COVID-19 impact survey

Sri Lankan exporters are more positive in their outlook with the expectation for a moderate growth for the export business and the economy over the next 12 months as the country rebounds from the impact of COVID-19.

This was revealed in the latest Business Survey on Trade and Labour Market Impacts of COVID - 19 on Sri Lankan Exporters designed and conducted by the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce (CCC) Economic Intelligence Unit (EIU) and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) supported Partnership for Accelerating Results in Trade, National Expenditure and Revenue (PARTNER) project.


The survey was conducted over three weeks, starting from August 13, 2020, and covered 39 export segments. In addition to the improvement in outlook in the current survey, it was noted that business operations are heading back to pre-COVID-19 levels. 53% of the firms have gone back to normal working operations while 64% of the firms reported that they are at over 60% of their operational capacity. However, about 38% of firms reported that they are in partial operation.

The optimism related to finding new market opportunities has fallen from 63% in the last survey to 49% in the current survey. The decline in opportuimpact of COVID-19 on Sri Lankan nities would indicate that some of the

The recovery outlook is supported by the survey insights related to employment and training budgets. Over 70% of the survey respondents are now able to pay basic salary with standard allowances for all executive and non-executive grade employees, which is a substantial improvement from the 40% response recorded in May. 47% of firms are now expecting their training budgets to remain unchanged relative to 2019.

Firms had a few specific requests for the Government that could support business recovery and ensure sustainable growth of exports. These were related to tax relief, market access support, robust communication strategy exporters. 
Perceived outlook for export business.

Head of the Presidential Task Force for Economic Revival and Poverty Alleviation, Basil Rajapaksa, recently attended an observation tour of the Watawala Dairy Farm in Lonach Estate, Ginigathena.

The state-of-the-art dairy farm by Watawala Dairy Limited (WDL), a 100% subsidiary of Sri Lanka's leading diversified agribusiness company Watawala Plantations, manages a herd of 1, 600 dairy cattle with an ultramodern milking parlour which can produce over 6 million litres of fresh milk annually (17,000 litres of fresh milk per day).

Some of the key initiatives towards ensuring sustainability include flaring of methane gas trapped from the waste management system to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, production of biogas from cattle waste to support energy needs, distribution of milk to schools, upgrading the water distribution schemes for villages around the farm and infrastructure development.







wo weeks ago I walked into the bookshops at Gamini Hall. Truly, as most book lovers know when it comes to discovering amazing books at the price of a fancy loaf of bread at a high-end bakery, 'There is no place like Gamini Hall,' and there I found Emile Zola's Germinal'. It looked brand new even though the name of the original owner was still on the front fly-leaf. Browsing some more I came across other gems, in fine condition. FitzGerald's 'Rubaiyat', Daphne du Maurier's 'I Will Never be Young Again,' and 'The History of English Literature'. They were all available for a ridiculously low price. It was too good a chance to



towards me echoing one word - 'traitor.' The time was six thirty in the evening, I dropped my backpack with my new companions on the floor and lay my head on top of another friend I had brought home several months ago, a friend who now sits on my desk, brooding and lonely. My breathing grew deep and fast as if I was trying to ward off a panic attack. I could see only their silhouette but I knew they were there - judging me, accusing me, waiting for me.

I dreaded to turn on the light and acknowledge an immense sense of failure, the misery of the opportunities missed, like the email reply I never received from Ta-Nehisi Coates. I felt like Edmond Dantes imprisoned on the grim island fortress off Marseille, I was Gabriel Oak the morning he lost all his sheep. And all because of a pile of books books who are breaking my heart, stalking me like ghosts - books I have yet to read.

I wonder if a mischievous fairy casts a spell on me each time I walk into a bookstore, determined not to buy, just to look but end up leaving with at least a small pile of books in my bag. Or more likely, this is a habit inherited from my father who has no scruples when it comes to spending money on books, old or new, covering subjects as vast as the ancient silk-route or as fascinating as the future imagined by Issac Asimov.

If you are reading this, there is no doubt you are all too familiar with those heart-stopping moments when your eyes fall on an attractive cover, when the brief summary on the fly-leaf mesmerizes you and the feel and the smell turn your knees to jelly. Realizing your will-power is not strong enough to resist them, you bring them home.

But alas, in the cold, unforgiving light of your cluttered study, you realize you really don't have the time right now to get to know them from cover to cover. So away they go, to join the pile of books on the desk, under the chairs, on to the bookshelf already groaning with the weight of previous booty, onto the bed in the visitor's room, until they stack so high, the cat glares at you because the gecko who lives on top of the pile is too far for her to hunt down. And sadly, some end up in cardboard boxes stowed under the bed. Out of sight, but never out of mind.

There is an easy way out, of course. We could conjure a dozen excuses about the busy lives we lead that gives scarce time to read all the books stacked sky high around us, or if you are a writer like me, we dare not read too many books lest we end up adopting the style and phrases of all the authors we have read. But to be honest, if we cut down on all the time we spend on Facebook or gazing out the window and talking with the leaves of the mango tree, or listening to Maroon 5 singing 'Memories', over and over, or watching 'The Sound of Music' even when we have decided Captain Von Trapp is a blockhead when it comes to

women, we would have ended up reading at least half the books around us. And yet...

There's one consolation. Umberto Eco, they say, suffered from the same addiction. According to Nassim Nicholas Taheb in his book The Black Swan: The Impact of the Highly Improbable, Eco, like most of us, owned more books than he could ever read, but unlike you or I he owned 30,000 books. His intention was not to hoard books or even to buy them with full intentions to read their pages, but instead to spark curiosity and in turn motivation. Taleb expands the idea by writing:"A private library is not an ego boosting appendage but a research tool. Read books are far less valuable than unread ones. The library should contain as much of what you do not know as your financial means, mortgage rates and the currently tight realestate market allows you to put there. You will accumulate more knowledge and more books as you grow older, and the growing number of unread

books an anti-library." And even as the books I had to read nagged me no end, a childhood friend in that magic way childhood friends can read your mind sent me an email with just one word written on it along with an explanation. "If you thought you were the only one who keeps buying new books without first reading those at home, you will be relieved to know this habit is so common it even has a name. The Japanese call it tsundoku — a word used to describe the act of piling up books without reading them."

And that one word brought the sun back into my book clogged world. Now I know I don't have to be guilty about buying more books when I already have so many waiting for me at home because it is


good to possess an 'ambitious curiosity.' To paraphrase the thoughts of a fellow tsundoku addict: It is good to take bets on books at the limits of your comfort zone. That willingness to buy books signals to yourself there are new worlds other creators make, and for the price of a meal you can purchase the opportunity to discover them. You should not penalize yourself for trying. If you never read any of the books you own that might be a problem, but merely not reading some of them is entirely sensible. After all, the clothes we buy mostly sit unworn. The egg-beaters and waffle-irons in our kitchens are hardly ever used.

A word of caution, though. Don't always stick to brand new books with glossy covers. Pay more attention to the inside of the book. When you see a book that would cost you a thousand rupees or more, contemplate how you could buy five used books for that money-after all, what really matters is the content and not the looks.

Meanwhile, let's not be too hard on ourselves. For all we know, someday we might find the time and the will power to read all those books.

Until then, let's congratulate ourselves for being black belts in tsundoku.

Majeed as a young boy started his school career at Methodist Mission School, Pottuvil. Thereafter joined the Muslim Boys school and the Central College in Pottuvil respectively. He was a brilliant student and in 1952 he got through the grade five scholarship exam from Muslim Boys School, Pottuvil. He was admitted to St.Michael's College, Batticaloa in 1953 for further studies . There he launched his sporting career that coincided with education. He was a livewire in College Athletics and Soccer teams under Rev. Father Weber.

Monitoring his progress his family decided to transfer him to a school in Colombo and finally enrolled him in Zahira College, Colombo in 1958.

With a much bigger set of students and better facilities at Zahira, he enjoyed his career brimming with confidence. Ultimately he became the cynosure of all eyes at College beginning with athletics, where he established several records.

In1959, he was chosen to don the College soccer jersey, in that invincible soccer team captained by late Kumarasamy, where they ended up as undisputed school champions.



Stunning Clarke leads All Blacks to emphatic win over Wallabies

enjoyed a storming first Test start as an aggressive All Blacks downed Australia 27-7 with a rollicking second half in Auckland on Sunday to answer their critics after last week's draw.

After the dramatic, 16-16 Bledisloe Cup series opener, the All Blacks led 10-7 at half-time and scored three quick tries after the restart as they piled on 17 unanswered points in the second period.

Bruising wing Clarke, who had the crowd on the edge of their seats every time he touched the ball, skittled defenders and evoked memories of Jonah Lomu as the All Blacks played with a renewed physical presence and

It was the seventh time in the past 13 years that the three-

AUCKLAND: Wing Caleb Clarke started the annual Bledisloe Cup series with a loss or a draw and immediately bounced back.

> "It was tough, but we're so damn happy," said All Blacks captain Sam Cane. "There was a lot of pressure this week for a relatively new squad in a lot of ways and I'm really proud of the way we stuck to our plan.

"We worked really, really hard and in the end we managed to break them." The four-tries-toone victory extended the All Blacks' impressive record at Eden Park, where they have not lost in 44 Tests since 1994 and where Australia have not won since 1986.

They now need to win only one of the two remaining games in the Bledisloe Cup series, which will be played in Australia as part of the upcoming Tri-

Unawan hits first IPL ton to keep Delhi top of the table

DUBAI SUNDAY: Shikhar Dhawan hit his first Indian Premier League century on Saturday as Delhi Capitals beat Chennai Super Kings to go back top of the table.

South African veteran AB de Villiers produced another blistering batting display meanwhile to take Royal Challengers Bangalore to victory over Rajasthan Royals and keep them in the playoff race.

India opener Dhawan batted through the Delhi innings as they chased Chennai's 179-4 in which Faf du Plessis made 58 and Ambati Rayudu an unbeaten 45.

Dhawan made 101 off 57 balls with 14 fours and one six but his partners Shreyas Iyer (23) and Marcus Stoinis (24) hit the boundaries that kept Delhi in the hunt. The surprise IPL contenders needed 15 off the last over and it was spin bowler Axar Patel who blasted three sixes to secure the win with a ball to spare.

"It feels very special," said the 34-year-old.

"At the start of the season also I was hitting the ball well but I wasn't converting those 20s into 50s. Once you do that, you take that confidence into the next game.'

Delhi now lead reigning champions Mumbai Indians by two points while M.S. Dhoni's three-time winners Chennai have only three wins from nine games and are slumbering in sixth place in the eight team league. Mumbai play King's XI Punjab on Sunday.

In the opening game of the day, De Villiers hit an unbeaten 55 off 22 balls taking Bangalore from the verge of defeat - needing 35 off 12 balls -- to a stunning seven wicket victory that kept Virat Kohli's side in fourth place and the final playoff spot.

The 36-year-old's latest power hitting left both sides in awe. He hit three straight sixes off the penultimate over by Jaydev Unadkat and overtook the target 177-6 with another six off Jofra Archer with two balls to spare. Bangalore made 179 for three with Kohli also making 43.

"I said to a few of the Rajasthan boys, I know you lost but sometimes it doesn't matter which side you're on, you can only go wow," said de Villiers' South African teammate Chris Morris.

India coach Ravi Shastri said this week that de Villiers should come out of his international retirement. After a 55 off 24 balls in a win over Mumbai and a devastating 73 off 33 balls against Kolkata, de Villiers now has the IPL's best strike rate and only Sanju Samson is up with his 19 sixes.

De Villiers said he was always "very nervous" going into such a run chase. "I try to hide it. I get very stressed. I'm proud of my performances. Want to perform for my team, have an impact to win games."

Bangalore coach Simon Katich called de Villiers a "freak" but knows he will need more sixes from the South African if the team are to win their first IPL title. AFP

New record for Jepchirchir but Cheptegei misses out at world half-marathons

between New Zealand and Australia in Auckland on October 18, 2020.

chirchir lowered her own world record for an all-women's half marathon at the world championships in Gdynia on Saturday but serial record-breaker Joshua Cheptegei missed out on a medal in the men's race.

The 27-year-old Jepchirchir, who also won world half marathon gold in 2016, produced a final sprint to take the women's title in 1hr 5min 16sec.

That bettered the previous best set by Jepchirchir herself in Prague on September 5 of 1hr 5min 34sec.

"It's unbelievable," said Jepchirchir.

"My goal was to win this race. I did not expect that I would beat the world record, but I realised that it could happen when we passed 20km.

"It was a little bit windy, but the course was good for me." She came home just two seconds clear of Germany's Melat Yisak Kejeta, who smashed the European women-only record to take silver in 1hr 5min 18secs, with Ethiopia's Yalemzerf Yehualaw a further second behind.

On a cold and windy morning, a group of favourites broke away early during the four-lap race but after the 15km mark. AFP

LOS ANGELES: Unbeaten Teofimo Lopez upset Vasiliy Lomachenko by a unanimous decision on Saturday to become the undisputed world lightweight champion in Las Vegas.

Lopez defended his 135pound IBF lightweight title and seized the WBC, WBO and WBA belts from Ukraine's Lomachenko who suffered his first loss in six years.

"I am ready to take over the world," said Lopez, who won by scores of 119-109, 117-111 and 116-112.

Lopez, 16-0 with 12 knock-

outs, became the lightweight king in a fight that appeared to be closer than the lopsided judges' scorecards indicated at the MGM Grand Hotel and

In the biggest fight of his career, Lopez, of the US, dominated the first half before Lomachenko came storming back in the later rounds to set the stage for a thrilling final round.

At 23, Lopez is the youngest fighter to become a four belt undisputed champion. He did it in an empty MGM arena where spectators were banned

because of the coronavirus pandemic.

Lopez received a nasty cut over the right eye from an accidental head butt in the final round but was able to contin-



Sri Lankan equities reversed last week's losses as buying interest in mid-cap stocks pushed the benchmark index back into positive territory this week despite the rising number of COVID-19 cases and the IMF estimating that Sri Lanka's economy could contract by 4.7% this year. Consequently, the Bourse ended the week on a positive note as the ASPI increased by 147.07 points (or 2.54%) to close at 5,945.79 points, while the S&P SL20 Index increased by 21.93 points (or 0.93%) to close at 2,370.43 points.

EXPO was the largest contributor to this week's index gain as the ongoing rally in the stock led to a gain of 28.1% W-o-W. Meanwhile, buying interest in DIPD and its parent, HAYL, also collectively contributed 20.1% to the index gain this week. 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




