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



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PCol probing Easter Sunday attacks

Nearly 10,000 people were aware of foreign intelligence information of a possible terror attack - Former SIS Head

Nearly 10,000 people in the country were aware of the foreign intelligence information of a possible terror attack, within a period of one week after the State Intelligence Service (SIS) received such information, former SIS Director, SDIG Nilantha Jayawardena told the Presidential Commission of Inquiry (PCoI) probing the Easter Sunday attacks yesterday.

He was responding to a question by Shamil Perera, PC who appeared on behalf of Archbishop of Colombo Malcom Cardinal Ranjith during the cross-

attention of the Presidential Commission and Jayawardena was asked if he made such a revelation with responsibil-

Jayawardena replied "Yes" and added that he was making that statement based on former IGP Pujith Jayasundara's testimony before the Commission.

According to Jayasundara, he had passed the said intelligence to four ranges at the Western Province Police Division, which includes nearly 8,000 Police officers in addition to the Ministerial Security Division (MSD) which provided security to 225 MPs.

"By the day before the attack, Embassies in the country were also aware about the foreign intelligence," the former SIS Head said.

Meanwhile, the witness said that foreign intelligence agencies were also aware of the National Thowheed Jamath and mastermind Zharan Hashim only due to the briefings provided by the SIS to them. He emphasized that the value given to information coming from foreign countries is not given to the locally produced information.

During his cross-examination of the witness, the former IGP's legal representative Anura Meddagoda, PC asked Jayawardena if the April 4 information was not verified, was it not his responsibility to develop it as a reliable one? "It is everyone's responsibility", the

When the PC suggested that Jayawardena as the SIS Director had neglected his duties by not developing the raw information into intelligence information, the witness refuted that

Head further added that the Presidential Commission probing the attack would decide as to who was responsible for the attack.

"I know what I have done. Also I will not point a finger at anyone. This Commission and the judicial procedures will decide whether I'm going to jail or not."

There was an attitudinal change in the system regarding how to react to information in the aftermath of the Easter Sunday terror attacks and accordingly this can be considered as a turning point," he also said.

He said that when a suspect is evading arrest, they usually don't use mobile phones etc. as they are aware that with modern technology they could be traced. Therefore, those absconding from the Police tend not to leave any trace of their whereabouts. Hence, it is commendable that despite these obstacles the CID had managed to arrest him within a very short time

Meanwhile, seven persons who aided and abetted Bathiudeen to evade arrest were also arrested, according to DIG Rohana.

Addressing a media briefing yesterday, DIG Ajith Rohana said the suspects arrested by the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) were produced before the Fort Magistrate's Court yesterday evening

He said that two among the seven arrestees had been arrested on October 17 in the Wellampitiya area. Upon interrogation, it was revealed that Bathiudeen had stayed at a house in Kohuwala, Kalubowila, prior to being moved to a house in Dehiwala on October 15.

Among those arrested for helping Bathiudeen to evade arrest is a lady doctor, her husband, a foreign employment agent who escorted the MP from the first house to the second, and the owner of the Dehiwala house where the Parliamentarian was arrested at.



The Police Spokesman noted that the vehicle used to escort the Parliamentarian has also been taken into the custody of the CID.

Bathiudeen has been accused of violating Article 82(1) of Presidential Elections Act, No. 15 of 1981 by misappropriating public funds amounting to around Rs. 9.5 million when he was the Minister of Industry and Commerce.

The former Minister was accused of misusing 222 buses belonging to the Sri Lanka Transport Board (SLTB) to transport IDPs from Puttalam to polling stations in Silavathurai, Mannar during the 2019 Presidential Election.

Attorney General (AG) Dappula de Livera issued orders to the police last week to obtain a warrant for Bathiudeen's arrest.

Bathiudeen had later filed a writ petition seeking an order to prevent his arrest.

However, the Magistrate ruled that the Police can proceed to arrest the suspects without a warrant.

The Attorney General directed the Police to arrest the three suspects in keeping with the law.

Six police teams were deployed for the arrest of the Parliamentarian.

Further investigations are being carried out by the Criminal Investigations Department.

Prof. Amarathunga said that presently the universities are continuing teaching and learning through online methods and so far, it has shown a positive outcome.

Moreover, he said that options like open book assessments and moving on to analytical questions can be regarded as solutions. "In that case, the UGC

will have to provide circular instructions to universities regarding the preparation of papers. We will need moderators to act in this kind of situation," he added. He also added that none

of the student unions have opposed online teaching methods and a positive contribution should be made by both learners and teachers. "We should be solution-

oriented to face any kind of a situation as we are unaware of the behaviour of the COVID-19 virus," he said.

"Students must have proper access methods such as laptops or desktop computers as smartphones are not enough for an online evaluation. So, there is a barrier in this aspect. We are concerned about every minor detail regarding this," he said.

When questioned

regarding underprivileged students in universities, he said that details of those students must be gathered and proper solutions must be brought forward. "We cannot penalize those students; we should equally consider their rights as well" he said. "During the last lockdown

we introduced the online method for universities, but this time without prior announcement, every university started online teaching. Most of the universities are conducting lectures and some universities are undergoing the study leave period and the rest are on vacations. Only 15-20 percent are facing this exam issue. A practical solution will be reached very soon," he added.

He further said that the UGC is very much concerned regarding online evaluation methods and a proper method will be soon be put forward.

The second drug made locally under the 'New Drugs for a New Country' programme to produce 50 percent of Sri Lanka's total drugs requirement locally was launched yesterday by the State Pharmaceuticals manufacturing Corporation

In line with the National Policy Framework 'Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour', the SPMC running under the purview of the State Minister of Production, Supply and Regulation of Pharmaceuticals yesterday launched its second product Clopidogrel USP 75 mg to market and its first set of drugs was handed over to Dr. Saroj Jayasinghe, Professor of Medicine, Faculty of Medicine, University of

Clopidogrel is a drug, which is widely used among patients with heart disease, peripheral artery disease, and stroke. The government spends Rs.317 million annually for the importation of Clopidogrel, while the private sector spends Rs.400 million. The SPMC is hoping to provide this drug to the Medical Supplies Division at a cost of Rs.2.10.

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he 37th commemoration ceremony of the late Lands and Agriculture Minister Hector Kobbekaduwa was held on September 18 at the Hector Kobbekaduwa Agrarian Research and Training Institute (HARTI). Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa, Trade Minister Dr. Bandula Gunawardane, State Ministers Shasheendra Rajapaksa and Anuradha Jayaratne, Secretaries of Ministries, including Secretary to the Agriculture Ministry Major General (Retired) Sumedha Perera, family members of Hector Kobbekaduwa, heads of state institutions, scholars and staff of the HARTI participated.

Director General of the President's Media Unit and renowned media veteran Mohan Samaranayake delivered the Hector Kobbekaduwa commemoration lecture on the topic 'how the late Minister Kobbekaduwa's agriculture and land policies could be the foundation for the implementation of the Government's development agenda *Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour*.' The salient points and highlights of the lecture can be summarized as follows:

Two challenges are faced in conducting the lecture on the above topic. Firstly, Minister Hector Kobbekaduwa's economic, political and agricultural policies, and actions are not widely accepted in the framework of the ideology of the present society. Some could interpret it as an outdated philosophy. However, after World War II, there was a great deal of discussion about how society should be governed. Based on these ideas, the Austrian economist Karl Polanyi wrote an excellent book named 'The Great Transformation'. Polanyi stated that if the market is allowed to control the society, that society would be devastated. However, this ideology, which was accepted by almost everyone in the society at that time, was later suppressed and the philosophies of neoliberal economic models embraced the society, allowing market forces to control the society.

Unfortunately, the COVID-19 crisis has hit almost entire world. It re-emerges the idea which was in existence in the 1940s, that society should control the market though it has not yet sunk deep. It can be identified as the other challenge. UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres made a note on Twitter on July 18, 2020, at the height of the Corona crisis – "COVID-19 has exposed the lie that the market can guarantee health for all in the society and it also refuted the myth that social work is useless."

Highlights from Hector Kobbekaduwa commemoration lecture

His vision, a link to Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour

During the COVID-19 crisis, Sri Lankan doctors, and healthcare and political leaders worked together and managed to bring the situation under control. Despite the criticism, all those officials were quick to resolve the crisis, avoiding a major catastrophe. However, market philosophies teach us something different. UN Secretary-General Guterres also made a note of another point. That is, COVID-19 denies the fact that we live in a world free of racism. In the end, he declares that we all are in the same sea, but some in super luxury yachts while others float on the wreckage.

Kobbekaduwa's political vision

It is necessary to examine how realistic and people-friendly the policies pursued by Kobbekaduwa during his political career in the fields of land, agriculture and crop cultivation etc. The receipt of membership in the Kandy Socialist Front led by Minister T.B. Ilangaratne in 1947 was the starting point of Kobbekaduwa's socialist thinking. Some socialist groups whose slogan was 'destruction to imperialism and socialism for the people' in the 1960s and '70s are now claiming that there are no labour pains for socialism at present.

His philosophy was based on

socialism. It means that a man can live happily and contentedly, building a good and just society. The primary purpose of human life is to be happy. It was even preached by the Buddha. Western thinkers also endorse it. The American Declaration of Independence, adopted on July 4, 1776, in the U.S. State of Philadelphia, is an excellent document. The second paragraph of it states that the creator of man has granted him several rights that one cannot take from him; It cannot be stolen by anyone else. They are the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness, and so on. But to achieve those goals, humans need to obtain enough nutritious food. You should have the opportunity to take medicine when you are sick. There must also be an opportunity to live under a free regime. Likewise, there must be a social security system that allows anyone to live without depending on others in the latter part of life. It is to such a social level that we define a just society.

The movement for a just society emerged in 2015, and the main issue in the world, they said, was the abolition of the Executive Presidency. But 'do people receive enough food there? Do farmers have enough water for cultivation? Do you receive fertilizer? Do they have facilities to sell their produce? How to get rid of malnutrition that is among them?' were not the subjects of a just society. Prior to the last General Election, President Gotabaya Rajapaksa toured the country and listened to the needs of people on every occa-



sion. People asked for deeds for land, fertilizer, schools for children, teachers for schools, hospitals for villages, doctors and so on. Accordingly, the President established State Ministries representing key thematic areas where people need support. It is clear that what is conceived there is an extension of Hector Kobbekaduwa's land and agricultural policy.

Throughout our history, land ownership, crop production, productivity, harvesting, product distribution, and farmer nutrition have been the central factors in building a just society. Fights between the people of the tribal society and various conflicts in the colonial empire were based on land. During the Russian Revolution of 1917, people organized demonstrations in Russia and proclaimed, 'Power to the Soviet Union, land to the people'. The Soviet Revolution failed, but those revolutionary demands could not be extinct. Land is such a central factor.

Today, global land grabbing takes place in another form. There are more land grabs in the African Continent and Latin America than in our country. Kobbekaduwa was aware of the need for land ownership. Sirimavo Bandaranaike appointed him as the Lands and Agriculture Minister in 1970 and he worked with foresight and deep thinking. We are making great use of the results of his vision even today.

The Prime Minister of the Government that came to power in December 2001 stated that paddy lands should be reclaimed and gherkins should be cultivated. He stated that they could be exported to Europe. Also, the Agriculture Minister of the Yahapalana Government stated in 2015 that the country's paddy production is beyond what we required and therefore we need to divert to cash crops. In order to reduce the paddy production in the country, the land extent used for paddy was allotted for other crops. If those policies were successful, what would happen to the people of this country at the time of the food crisis due to COVID-19 menace?

The agricultural development journey initiated by S.W.R.D. Bandaranaike in 1956 was further extended by Kobbekaduwa in 1970. He can be identified as the founder of a specific land and agrarian policy and the political leader who had the courage to implement it.

Land is an integral element of human life. Land has become a major factor in every development project that has been sustained. The basis of the capitalist mode of production is the alienation of people from the land. That is why Britain passed the Barren Land Act in Sri Lanka and launched it in this country. This fact was central to Kobbekaduwa's land, agricultural, and food policies. We are still extensively reaping the benefits of his policies. Land should belong to those who cultivate in the land. That is why in a play by Bertolt Brecht, it says "farmers must win the land and the village". Land ownership should belong to the people of this country and not to foreigners. These lands should be cultivated according to a proper methodology. There should be an institutional system in supporting agrarian activities. For example, HARTI is supposed to perform that task. Over time, this institute has been conducting vital researches on food production, crops, minor export crops, and spices, etc. in our country, rendering a great service to the nation. These institutional mechanisms must be strengthened for the sake of agricultural development in the country. Minister Kobbekaduwa realized that service as an urgent need and hence the Agrarian Services Department was established. The governments headed by D.S. Senanayake, S.W.R.D. Bandaranaike, Sirimavo Bandaranaike, and the vision of the then Agriculture and Lands Minister Hector Kobbekaduwa contributed to the progress of agricultural development in the 20th century.

Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour

The policy framework Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour states that the local economy is an essential factor in human existence based on food security. The Buddha also once preached that all living beings

depend on food. At the United Nations Conference of Heads of States in 1977, food was recognized as a basic human right. Accordingly, the establishment of an indigenous economy that guarantees food security and an agricultural sector that strengthens the local economy have been identified as key elements in the Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour. The fifth section of the policy framework which is on the peoplecentred economy, outlines the prosperity through food security. It demonstrates the agricultural development policies to be implemented by the present Government. Based on these facts, one Minister and three other State Ministers for Agriculture have been appointed. Accordingly, the President is implementing a three-pronged programme by including every small sub-sector of agricul-

It is important to look at how the developed countries of the world reached supremacy. The mode we are taught is to open the economy, to allow foreign capital to allow plunder. But the developed countries did not reach the development in the same way. Ha-Joon Chang, a professor at the Cambridge University, in his book 'Kicking away the Ladder -Rewriting Development Strategy in Historical Perspective', explains that they became rich in the way they told us to reject. Accordingly, the United States is number one in economy as well as military power in the world. If the President and the governing body of that state decide, there is a possibility that the civilization on this earth will be reduced to rubble within months.

How did those countries reach that place? In the 19th century, there was a debate in the United States about the model to be followed. At that time, Britain was in a strong position. This statement was made by Abraham Lincoln, the President who ruled the USA for six years from 1862. "I don't know much about taxes. But, I know something else. If we buy goods from abroad, we receive the goods. Money goes abroad. If we make goods in this country, the goods are ours. Money is also ours."

This is the approach and how the developed nations have moved towards development.

Former U.S. President Ronald Reagan told the world about free trade. During his reign, he strictly adhered to the protectionist policies of American history. While not publicly accepting or rejecting that vision, the Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour attempts to identify the potential of our country and take advantage of it to build a strong local economy and a path marked by food security. The programmes for that objective are being implemented. Therefore, names of food crops are included in the subject name of state ministries, and ministers have been appointed for each subject. The unwavering support of people is needed to achieve this vision.

Kobbekaduwa's land and agricultural policies may have been influenced by the cruel injustices perpetrated by the British imperialists on the people of hill country where he was born. The Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour learns specifically from the mistakes of the post-colonial era.

The plunder of their land is an extremely cruel and inhumane injustice during the colonial legacy. It created a pressure in the local society. Even today, it has not been completely abolished. Therefore, the Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour is based on the principles, food and nutrition for the people. Accordingly, it is clear from all these facts that there is an inseparable link between the vision of Hector Kobbekaduwa and the policy framework Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour. While preserving the great nexus between these two policy approaches, we wish the effort to make our country a great success.

These applications were for a total of Rs. 177,954 million and registered under three Phases of the Saubhagya COVID-19 Renaissance Facility.

So far, the Licensed Banks have released loans amounting to Rs. 133,192million among 45,582 affected businesses island-wide (See Table 1

Both Phase II and III of the Loan Scheme were introduced with effect from July 1, 2020.

The intention of these schemes was to provide a total of Rs.150 billion as working capital loans at interest rate of 4 per cent per annum.

Chrisantha de Silva

A versatile cricketer

Chirsantha de Silva was the live-wire of Moratuwa Cricket in the 1980s; a lot of us benefited from his leadership, generosity, and hard work. In those days, the Moratuwa Stadium was used by the Moratuwa Sports Club. Club cricketers practiced on well-prepared center wickets during weekdays and, on weekends, we played cricket in front of thousands of fans.

The club membership fee was minimum those days and the clubhouse bar and canteen didn't generate much profits. It was Chrisantha de Silva who poured in money for almost everything and provided the much-needed leadership to the Moratuwa SC.

During that period, the town of Moratuwa produced so many talented cricketers to the country. We had so many highly talented cricketers from Prince of Wales (POW), St. Sebastian's College, and MoratuVidyalaya playing for Moratuwa SC and other clubs in Colombo. I remember the SSC strike blower back then was POW fast bowler Sripal Silva, while Roger Wijesuriya was the best young left arm spinner

the Moratuwa Stadium in the 1980s. That match was a reflection of having so many talented cricketers at Moratuwa at the time.

One of my closest Jayantha Perera, who coached POW, used to tell me a lot of stories about Chrisantha and his immense contribution to Moratuwa cricket. Chrisantha de Silva spent millions of rupees on cricket and cricketers, expecting nothing in return. In the 1980s and 1990s,

Moratuwa produced many top cricketers and was also home to so many famous singers and musical bands.

We had the most furniture shops in the country and some of the highest quality bakeries. I think Moratuwa had the most number of liquor outlets in the country as well, at the time. Our beautifully maintained cricket ground hosted one-day internationals over a period of 10 years, as well as four test matches, thanks to the hard work of Chrisantha de Silva. Australian great Alan Border scored his last test century at the Moratuwa Stadium in 1992 and, in 1993, Jonty Rhodes defied Muralitharan to score an unbeaten101 to keep the series alive on the final day of the test match.

I met Chrisantha at the Sri Lanka Cricket Headquarters two years ago, after 25 long years. We chatted for over an hour about the good old days, his family, and the Moratuwa SC. I thanked him for his immense contribution to Cricket at the Moratuwa SC. He financially


supported so many talented cricketers and noncricketers to be good citizens. He fought so hard to get recognition for the sportsmen and sports women of Moratuwa.

Chrisantha was proud of his three daughters, and he loved his wife a lot. He was a loving and caring husband and a father to his wife and daughters. He was very happy that I obtained an engineering degree and had many questions about my tertiary education. Chrisantha de Silva donated a lot to charity, year after year. It was never easy to manage emotional and volatile people of Moratuwa those days, but Chrisantha successfully managed the volatile Moratuwa SC for a long period.

On October 24, last year, we lost a selfless philanthropist who was instrumental in promoting cricket at Moratuwa. Chrisantha de Silva is no more, but his contributions to Moratuwa cricket and society will live in our hearts forever. MAHENDRA DISSANAYAKE.

The Brandix dilemma

he Coronavirus, apart from its immediate threat to the community as a whole, has also thrown up a dangerous spin off in this country, with victims of the pandemic being demonized and coming in for rough treatment.

In these spaces, the other day, we commented as to why some of those who were in contact with the Brandix cluster were reluctant to submit themselves for the quarantine procedure, the reason being fears entertained of being shunned by society even though these may take on subtle forms.

Now though this hostility seems to have taken on an overt form with reports that employees of Brandix at all levels being at the receiving end of a severe social backlash ever since the detection of the first Coronavirus victim from their Minuwangoda garment factory on October 3.

A senior management figure of Brandix in a newspaper interview claimed that even buses transporting their employees to other factories were being stoned and Brandix teams were being blocked from entering villages when they went to offer relief to their employees in their homes. Buses and three wheelers too were refusing to take Brandix employees from other locations. He said their employees were going through "hell" the way society was treating them, for no fault of theirs.

This is a dangerous trend which could snowball if prompt action is not taken by the authorities to remedy the situation. Brandix employs a vast army of workers from all parts of the country in its factory complexes and their safety should be guaranteed. What is more, this will also stymie efforts of the authorities in getting contacts of the Brandix cluster from voluntarily submitting themselves for quaran-

No such individual will stick his/her neck out if he/she is going to be at the receiving end of angry mobs who will not confine their attacks on the victims alone but also the family members and those who associated with them.

This state of affairs, if allowed to continue, will also bring to naught all efforts that are being taken to trace the origins of this wave of the infection. There is no knowing to what degree those contacts refusing to submit themselves for quarantine, due to fear of being ostracized by society, will spread the contagion. From the rising number of cases from all corners of the country with each passing day the pandemic certainly has taken on a runaway form. According to GMOA Assistant Secretary Dr. Naveen De Soysa there is a higher risk of COVID-19 being spread owing to the emergence of Corona clusters from among the society while Army Commander Lt. General Shavendra Silva opined that this week will be crucial since COVID-19 patients were reported from different parts of the country.

On Saturday alone 121 cases of COVID-19 positive cases were reported of which as many as 115 persons were close contacts of the Minuwangoda cluster. These apparently are those who were ferreted out by the Intelligence operatives now combing the country looking for the multi-tiered contacts of the Minuwangoda cluster. What of the others who had slipped through the dragnet? Will they be willing to submit themselves for quarantine after being informed of the hostile reception awaiting Brandix employees? The authorities owe it to afford protection to all Brandix employees beyond just a law and order perspective given that it is these employees who bring in the much needed foreign exchange to the country by their sweat and toil working under trying conditions.


The authorities should also not lose time in ascertaining how the virus sprung up after a near three month hiatus following the first outbreak. Doing so will go a long way in allaying suspicions now being centred on the entire Brandix family which now stands accused as the purveyors of the virus to the country.

The predicament affecting Brandix as a premier garment exporter no doubt will have its impact on the economy. It certainly will be some time before the Company will be able to emerge with a clean bill of health, literally speaking. If indeed it transpired that the original source of the virus was the Brandix factory employee, the Company certainly will have some explaining to do. This is amidst accusations that a group of Brandix workers who visited the company from India had failed to get themselves guarantined - an accusation that the Company continues to

Even so the public wrath directed at the Brandix employees as a whole should not be used as a convenient tool by business rivals of the giant garment exporter to undermine its operations whatsoever. This fishing in troubled waters has been a common trait of vested interests even in the past. The economic situation is such that any disruption in the export sector for whatever reasons is bound to affect the country in a negative way. The importance of economic stability at a time of a crisis of this magnitude cannot be overemphasized.

The return of geopolitics in Indo-Pacific

he term *Indopazifischer* Raum (Indo-Pacific Space) coined by German geopolitical thinker Karl Haushofer in 1920, is perhaps the first academic statement on the Indo-Pacific. Haushofer observed the marine space interlinking the two-great civilisations in Asia, India and China, although separated by land by the geography of Tibet. Japan in the Indo-Pacific was identified by Haushofer, who contrived the German-Japan axis during World War II, with their similar interest to defeat Britain and the US from the Pacific theatre. The contemporary revival of the term has gained prevalence in geopolitical discourse after former Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe employed the terminology in his speech to the Indian Parliament in

German Foreign Minister Heiko Maas explains: "It is already foreseeable today that, more than anywhere else, the shape of tomorrow's international order will be decided in the Indo-Pacific. Germany should not be an observer and thus play an active role, a rules-based order should be the ethos of the German foreign policy on Indo-Pacific."

For the first time, the German government has released a 70-page strategic policy guideline for the Indo-Pacif-While Germany is not an Indo-Pacific nation, many European states are joining the Indo-Pacific axis for enormous trade potential in Asia, a departure from the Atlantic axis. Thus, the EU perceives China as a *systemic* rival promoting alternative models of governance.

Today, the Quad (India, Japan, US, and Australia) is being institutionalised and possibly broad-based to include more partners with a special focus on upholding the rules-based order for a free and open Indo-Pacific. As stated by US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo at the recent Quad meeting in Japan: "The ministers who gathered in Tokyo all came to understand shared threat and the opportunity for us to work together not just diplomatically, but on the economic front to

partner to fight back against Beijing." It is a fact that China's investments and presence in the Indian Ocean have increased, and there is no economic and financial match for Beijing in the present day. China's involvement in island states has grown considerably, and Sri Lanka is a clear example in this regard having received a large number of loans from China. Secretary Pompeo will visit Sri Lanka towards the end of the month and is certain to align Sri Lanka with the rules-based order of the Indo-Pacific along with India, directly targeting Chinese predatory infrastructure projects.

Henry Kissinger warns that if the present US-China tension continues, 'we will slide into a situation similar to World War I." The US administration has accused China of spreading Covid-19, economic espionage from Huawei to TikTok, China's assertiveness in the South China Sea and its opaque loans to many nations. Sri Lanka has been cited multiple times with regard to Chinese opaque loans lacking transpar-

US Ambassador in Sri Lanka, Alaina B. Teplitz, rebuked that "Sri Lanka should engage with China. It should do so in ways that protect its sovereignty and generate real prosperity for everyone, not just elites. It's not about choosing between countries, it's about transparency and charting a path that truly benefits all Sri Lankans." The Ambassador's warning is pretty straightforward. Sri Lanka counting on China has fewer fallback options. There is too much of a China-centric

dependency which limits the Sri Lankan government to look at alternatives. While successive governments have proceeded to borrow and lease national assets, sovereignty will inevitably be threatened.

The Chinese embassy in Colombo reacted in its 'Wolf Warrior' style to the Ambassador's comments. "The US has no power or obligation to lecture on China-Sri Lanka relations. Such naked hegemony, supremacy and power politics will neither be tolerated by the Chinese nor be accepted by the Sri Lankans." Sovereignty spectrum will be threatened in weak nations or failed states. The US with its liberal hegemonic mission, legitimising intervention or China's debt-trap diplomacy is directed more towards weak nations. A few weeks earlier, Moody's Investors Service had downgraded the sovereign rating of Sri Lanka to Caa1, or 'very high credit risk,' equal to the rating of Iraq, Mali, Angola, and Congo, from the earlier B2 rating. There is a brewing economic crisis amidst the Covid-19 induced global economic meltdown with Sri Lanka expected to face a heavy debt repayment schedule in the coming years.

Balanced foreign policy

Absence and disengagement of the US from the regional security architecture will not only embolden a new form of security threat, it could enable a departure from a *rules-based order* in the international system, threatening the very basis of international affairs. How does Sri Lanka, sandwiched by the Indo-Pacific strategy and China's BRI, carve out a balanced foreign poli-

In a recent interview, the Foreign Secretary of Sri Lanka, Admiral Prof. Jayanath Colombage stated: "The President has said no more loans - our external debt to GDP is as high as 86%, if we earn \$100 we have to pay \$86." Further explaining, "we will not allow others to play football in our field, at least we should become a member of the team."

Considering recent developments, it seems that Sri Lanka has joined the Chinese team due to the large volume of financial assistance and depend-

ence, borrowing a further US\$500 million on a 10-year concessionary loan. Another multi-million-dollar grant was made after the recent high-powered Chinese delegation's visit. Whilst accepting Chinese grants, the US MCC grant was heavily politicized and frozen. This position will make Sri Lanka's usual foreign policy hedging or external balancing which is to carry out the mix of a contradictory policy of closeness with China and the US at the same time fragile.

Two high-powered Chinese delegations headed by Yang Jiechi and Wang Yi travelled in two directions this month. The visits include South Asia, Middle East, North Africa, the Balkans and four East Asian countries. Senior diplomat Yang's delegation were to visit three maritime nations — Sri Lanka, UAE, Algeria and one landlocked nation, Serbia. These nations play a substantial role in China's BRI. With the largest share of 56 percent of Chinese investments in the region directed to Serbia, it sits at the crossroads of Central and South Eastern Europe. Algeria has become China's fifth-largest trade partner in Africa with close to US\$ 10 billion. UAE is a key strategic partner in the BRI linking China with Asian and European markets with a bilateral trade (non oil) of US\$ 50 billion.

In South Asia, Sri Lanka with its geographically unique position in the Indian Ocean and with a strong BRI partnership established during the presidency of Mahinda Rajapaksa has once again become a key player. Yang Jiechi's visit was the first high powered Chinese visit to South Asia after the pandemic and Sri Lanka was the first destination. The Rajapaksa regime has ensured Beijing of continuity of its support towards BRI and has further invited Chinese investment and funding to upstart its ailing economy.

Infrastructure projects

With Gotabaya Rajapaksa's victory followed by his brother Mahinda Rajapaksa's Parliamentary victory, China has swiftly revived its past Rajapaksa 1.0 (2005-2015) diplomatic relationship. This was visible with the large amount of financial assistance provided and reassurance to support Chinese infrastructure projects during the Rajapaksa 2.0 regime. Yang Jiechi's visit will further bolster the Sino-Lanka relationship as the Chinese diplomat assured Beijing's continuous support from funding to supporting at international forums including the UNHRC.

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's development policy framework, Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour, was thus appreciated. "We will support not from words but by action," said Jiechi. President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has further welcomed Chinese assistance to develop Sri Lankan villages just like China has brought prosperity to many economically deprived Chinese villages. The successful Chinese visit amplifies President Rajapaksa's foreign policy direction tilting towards China amidst his pledge to carve an equidistant foreign policy. While equidistant is merely rhetoric to an ailing economy, external geopolitics continue to threaten the region as Indian scholar Srikanth Kondapalli correctly assess by highlighting that 'a large-scale encirclement design by Beijing, which is actively roping in Nepal and Sri Lanka, besides provoking Pakistan to open a second front against India.'

Unfortunately, the Sri Lankan foreign policy apparatus has not assessed this external factor and the new phenomenon of China in South Asia. This is accurately noted by Ambassador Shivshankar Menon, the Chinese willingness to be involved directly or indirectly in internal politics of South Asian countries, referring to the clear expression of preference of one candidate in Sri Lankan elections.

For a regional security architecture to function there should be a cooperative security concept to anchor. What you see are exclusive alliances built to counter Beijing's assertiveness. India, Sri Lanka's neighbour and a main Quad partner with multiple defence cooperation agreements with the US, extending further towards Basic Exchange and Cooperation Agreement (BECA) to share geospatial defence intelligence, will see the emerging patterns in Sri Lanka with China unfa-

Missing the bigger picture, an increasingly expired scholarly tradition of non-aligned or neutral foreign policy takes comfort and simplifies the rhetoric, ignoring the actual geopolitical vectors dragging it towards instability. The heavily indebted Sri Lanka is at a conundrum, unwittingly falling into the trap and stands to miss many opportunities if left out of the rulesbased order.

Wearing a mask is not difficult if a person is not running or doing any other heavy physical exercise.

The other issue is with the three-wheelers. The three wheel drivers are doing everything just to protect themselves from the police and not from the COVID-19. They always wear the mask to cover their chin and not the nose and mouth. They use a piece of polythene to cover the space between the driver and the passenger. But their only intention is to protect themselves from the police and not protecting themselves or their customers (passengers) from COVID-19. They removed this small thin torn piece of polythene just few weeks after the police stopped checking it and now they have placed it again just as it was in the past, a tiny torn piece of polythene and not an adequate piece of good polythene that does not have holes on it. Health guidelines

There is another pathetic situation. Some young men and women try to show how brave they are by not following health guidelines issued to the people by the health authorities in order to protect the people from COVID-19. This is a common sight at offices and some institutions. They laugh at other colleagues who wear face masks and keep the minimum social distance of one metre. Some come close without a mask. Some heads of the departments keep a blind eye to such incidents. Sometimes we cannot imagine this idiotic behaviour of individuals who are educated and work at private or state institutions.

Some are coming close to others and touch them because they think that they do not have COVID-19 and believe that there is no way of contracting it. Sometimes they come, touch, hug and chat with elderly and sick. Some such individuals do it because they think that they have to do it to please others and otherwise the others will think that not doing such things means being proud. Sometimes the individuals who undergo home quarantine do this putting the lives of others at risk.

There is another very pathetic and dangerous behaviour of the public which put the entire country in danger. That is not following the home quarantine period of 14 days properly and mixing with the society before ending their home quarantine period thinking that they are not COVID-19 positive and no way of becoming COVID-19 positive after the initial 14 day quarantine period.

It is impossible for the police and health officials such as Public Health Inspectors (PHIs) to stand in front of the house for 24 X 7 which are under quarantine. If anyone is expecting that, he/she is simply has a mental disorder. There is no way of guarding all quarantined homes in the country for 24 hours. It is the responsibility of the people to follow health guidelines and all the instructions given to them by the health authorities and law enforcement officers. There are times when you cannot find soap and water. What you can do is using a standard hand sanitizer available at any supermarket or other shops. Many developing countries are already on the brink of debt crises which is further exacerbated by a broken international tax system that allows wealthy corporations and individuals to pay little to no taxes, she pointed out.

Governments need to urgently agree on systemic solutions such as debt cancellations, a binding and multilateral UN framework for debt crisis resolution that addresses unsustainable and illegitimate debt and a UN tax convention to fix loopholes in the international tax system, argued Rangaprasad.

Professor Kunal Sen, Director of UN University World Institute for Development Economics Research (UNU-WIDER), told IPS the pandemic is going to push millions of households into poverty, all around

the developing world. "The UN can play an important role in mobilizing resources for financing the efforts of the member states to counter the effects of the pandemic on the poor and vulnerable in their own countries", said Dr. Sen, also a professor of development economics at the Global Development Institute, Uni-

The projected rise in poverty has also undermined one of the UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) which had targeted the eradication of extreme poverty and hunger by 2030.

versity of Manchester.

According to the World Bank, "extreme poverty" is defined as living on less than US\$ 1.90 a day. The projected increase in poverty would be the first since 1998.

Before the pandemic struck, the extreme poverty rate was expected to drop to 7.9% in 2020. But now it is likely to affect between 9.1% and 9.4% of the world's population this year, according to the Bank's biennial 'Poverty and Shared Prosperity

Report'. "The pandemic and global recession may cause over 1.4% of the world's population to fall into extreme poverty," said World Bank Group president David Malpass.

He said that to reverse this "serious setback", countries would need to prepare for a different economy post-Covid, by allowing capital, labour, skills and innovation to move into new businesses and sectors.

Malpass said World Bank support would be available to developing countries "as they work toward a sustainable and inclusive recovery", with grants and low-interest loans worth \$160 billion to help more than 100 poorer countries tackle the crisis.

COVID-19 impact

Ben Phillips, author of How to Fight Inequality, told IPS the concentration of wealth amongst a handful of oligarchs, and the spread of impoverishment to hundreds of millions more people, are not the disconnected coincidences that the super-rich claim, but are two sides of the same bad penny.

He said COVID-19 has not created obscene inequality, but it has supercharged it. In this systemic crisis, the healing impact of philanthropy will be no greater than a sticking plaster on a gaping wound.

As the Pope, the UN Secretary-General, the President of Ireland and the Prime Minister of New Zealand have all pointed out, there is only one non-disastrous way out of this, and that is a rebalancing of economies to serve ordinary people, he noted.

"That is absolutely doable - indeed,


we've done it before - but markets cannot self-correct, and elites never bestow a fair economy from on high. Only pressure from ordinary people can win an economy that is humane and safe," declared Phillips.

Dereje Alemayehu, Executive Coordinator, Global Alliance for Tax Justice, told IPS inequality is rising in every country; so also, is the income of billionaires. These are causally linked.

Furthermore, he said, the prevailing international financial architecture denies developing countries their right to tax their share in global profit of multinationals. To adequately address inequality, national governments should introduce progress and redistributive tax systems.

"Developing countries should also reclaim their taxing rights on global profit. For this, a UN led intergovernmental process, in which member states participate on an equal footing, should be established to pave the way for the reform of international tax rules and standards," said Alemayehu, who is also Senior Advisor - Economic Policy at Tax Justice Network

FRANCE: European nations have ratcheted up restrictions on daily life to tackle soaring infections, with a 44 percent increase in cases this week.

Nighttime curfews on millions came into force in France this weekend and Switzerland required all its citizens to wear masks in indoor public places.

But Israel has managed to flatten its outbreak through draconian measures including a ban on travelling more than a kilometre from home. In Australia, Melbourne has managed to control its upsurge in cases and officials were able to allow the city's five million inhabitants to leave their homes for more than two hours a day for the first time in three months. In Europe however, the increase in cases is reaching alarming levels.

Early release for murderer who helped foil London attack

Steven Gallant was on day release at an event for reformed prisoners at the Fishmonger's Hall in London in November 2019 when terror convict Usman Khan went on a knife rampage, killing two people and wounding

Gallant and other members of the public were

hailed as heroes for preventing even greater loss of life by tackling Khan with a five-foot (1.5metre) narwhal tusk and a fire extinguisher before police shot him dead.

The two killed in the London attack -- Saskia Jones, 23, and Jack Merritt. 25 - were working on a meeting on prisoner rehabilitation that Khan attended. Gallant had also met Merritt through the programme.

Gallant was jailed for a minimum of 17 years in 2005 for the murder of a fireman outside a pub.

"We choose hope over fear, we choose unity over division, science over fiction and yes, we choose truth over lies," he told them. Biden and Trump are working to rouse their political bases and appeal to the seemingly small number of undecided voters in an election that could revolve on voter turnout.

One key opportunity comes this week with the candidates' final nationally televised debate, on Thursday evening in Nashville, Tennessee. The final debate will be face-to-face.

On Sunday, Trump again raised a disputed allegation that

messages on a laptop computer belonging to Biden's son Hunter implicated the former vice president in corrupt links to Ukraine, calling it a "proven fact". This, he tweeted, made it "impossible" for Biden to "ever assume the office of the President!"

Trump, Biden campaign turns increasingly vicious

Biden's campaign has repeatedly rejected the allegations, angrily dismissed by the candidate as a "smear campaign."

With the President trailing in polls, some analysts say he should focus on America's economic prospects, which Trump considers his strong point.

Nearly 220,000 Americans

The details were less clean-cut.

Former Secretary of State Clinton had received nearly three million more votes than her Republican rival.

But, by narrowly winning key battleground states, Trump surpassed the 270 Electoral College votes necessary to win the White House.

With just five weeks until the 2020 election featuring Trump and Democrat Joe Biden, the rules of this enigmatic -- some argue outmoded -- system are coming back into focus.

The 538 members of the US Electoral College gather in their state's respective capitals every four years after the Presidential election to designate the winner. A Presidential candidate must obtain an absolute majority of the college vote - or 270 of the 538 - to win. The system originated with the US

Constitution in 1787, establishing the rules for indirect, single-round presidential elections. The country's Founding

Fathers saw the system as a compromise between direct presidential elections with universal suffrage, and an election by members of Congress -- an approach rejected as insufficiently democratic.

Since then, hundreds of amendments have been proposed to Congress in efforts to modify or abolish the Electoral College, but none has succeeded.

Debate was rekindled with Trump's victory. If 2020's race is a nail-biter, then the Electoral College will surely return to the spotlight. Most are local elected officials or party leaders, but their names do not appear on ballots, and their identities are

mostly unknown to voters. Each state has as many electors as it has members in the House of Representatives (a number dependent on the state's population) and in the Senate (two in every state, regardless of size).

California, for example, has 55 electors; Texas has



38; and sparsely populated Alaska, Delaware, Vermont and Wyoming have only three each.

The Constitution leaves

it to states to decide how their electors' votes should be cast. In every state but (Nebraska Maine), the candidate winning the majority of popular votes theoretically wins all that state's electors. In November 2016,

Trump won 306 electoral

votes. Indignant, millions

of Americans had signed a petition calling on Republican electors to block him. The effort was mostly in vain, as only two electors, in Texas, defected, ultimately giving him 304

votes.

Republicans denounced the move as a desperate attempt by activists refusing to accept defeat. The extraordinary 2016 situation of losing the popular vote but winning the election was not

unprecedented. Five presidents in all have risen to the office this way.

John Quincy Adams was the first, in 1824, against Andrew Jackson. More recently, the 2000 election resulted in an epic Florida entanglement between George W. Bush and Democrat Al Gore.

Gore had ultimately won nearly 500,000 more votes nationwide, but when Florida was awarded to Bush, it pushed the Repubtotal to 271 - and victory. Nothing in the Constitu-

lican's Electoral College

tion obliges electors to vote in one way or another. If some states require them to respect the popular vote, and they do not, such so-called "faithless electors" were subjected to a simple fine. But in July 2020, the US Supreme Court ruled that states could impose punishments on such disloyal voters by establishing laws mandating electors to cast their votes according to the popular vote in that state. Between 1796 and 2016,

some 180 electors cast votes contrary to the presidential or vice presidential candidate who won their state. But faithless electors have never determined a US election outcome.

Electors will gather in their states on December 14 and cast votes for president and vice president.

Why this date? US law states they "meet and cast their vote on the first Monday after the second Wednesday in December.'

On January 6, 2021, Congress will certify the winner, who gets sworn in on January 20. - AFP

Sri Lankan agri-businesses needs to look for opportunities to add value to their businesses through value chain gaps.

It is also essential to conduct value chain analysis, cut back on shortages, prepare product plans, and work with others in the chain to add value to the customer. Speaking at a webinar organised by Sri Lanka Export Development Board under the theme, 'Value Chain Development and Business Opportunities in

Agriculture sector In Sri Lanka,' Rohana Gamage, Project Director in Agriculture Sector Modernization Project under the Ministry of Plantation said that the value chain is a process in which a company adds value to its raw materials to produce products and eventually sell those products to consumers.

'Agribusiness is an industry that is engaged in the producing, manufacturing and distributing of farm equipment and supplies, and the processing, storage, and distribution of farm commodities and the supply



chain represents all the steps required to get the product to the

He said the value chain gives companies a competitive advantage

in the industry, while the supply chain leads to overall customer satisfaction.

"The value chain in agriculture identifies a set of factors and activities that bring a basic agricultural product from production in the field to final consumption. This is where at each stage value is added to the product. A value chain can be a vertical linking or a network between various independent business organizations and can involve processing, packaging, storage, transport and distribution.'

He said however the terms value chain and supply chain are often used interchangeably.

Moreover he added that outdated land tenure system, low level of irrigation development, limited adoption of research finding and technologies, high cost of farm inputs, poor access to credit and markets, inefficient fertilizer procurement and distribution and inadequate storage facilities are some of the main issues that hamper the growth of the industry to a great extent in Sri Lanka.

PMI indices for Manufacturing, Services activities expand in Sept.

Manufacturing activities expanded at a higher rate in September

2020, compared to August 2020. This expansion in manufacturing PMI was mainly attributable to the increase in Production and New Orders, especially in manufacturing of food & beverages and textiles and wearing apparel sectors. Some respondents in the manufacturing of food & beverages and textiles & wearing apparel sectors highlighted that their factories operated at full capacity receiving more new orders with the normalisation of business activities. Further, the Employment sub-index increased in line with these developments.

Further, Stock of Purchases subindex increased at a slower pace in September. The Suppliers' Delivery Time sub-index continued to lengthen at a higher pace, due issues in logistics such as shortage of direct shipping services.

Some respondents highlighted that the restrictions imposed on importation of some categories of goods continued to affect the smooth functioning of manufacturing activities. The sub-index of overall expectations for manufacturing activities for the next three months declined significantly due to the prevailing situation of spreading of COVID-19 virus in the country, particularly centering

to some manufacturing zones. Meanwhile the global manufacturing PMI recorded a value of 52.3 in September2020 with an increase of 0.5 index points from August2020.

Services sector continued to expand for the fourth consecutive month with PMI recording 54.3 in September 2020 compared to the previous month. This was underpinned by the expansions observed in New Businesses, Business Activities and Expectations for Activity compared to August 2020 indicating a further recovery of services

sector activities. New Businesses, particularly in financial services and insurance sub-sectors, improved in September 2020 with the gradual normalisa-

tion in economic activities. Business Activities also expanded in September 2020, yet at a slower pace. Financial services sub-sector was the main contributor to this expansion with increased financial facilities provided to support the businesses, which were negatively affected by the pandem-


Further, respondents in cargo handling services cited that they were able to handle more transshipment in September 2020.

Moreover, business activities related to insurance and professional services sub-sectors also expanded during the month. Employment sub-index almost reached 50-threshold level in September 2020 after a continuous decline in employment for seven months.

Meanwhile, Expectations on future Business Activities increased further in September 2020, with the positive sentiments prevailed on the recovery of economy in the second half of the year.

Meanwhile Global services PMI declined to 51.6 in September 2020 from a seven-month high of 52.0 in August 2020.

Women-owned businesses more likely to borrow from family, friends To deal with COVID-19 impacts



Eight out of 10 small and medium businesses (SMEs) in Sri Lanka struggled to continue operations and meet financial obligations due to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, according to a new report.

The report, Gendered Impacts of COVID-19 on Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises, by Women in Work, a partnership between IFC, a member of the World Bank Group, and the Australian government, shows women owned businesses were least likely to have taken a loan from a financial institution and significantly more likely to borrow from family and friends to meet their financial obligations during COVID-19.

Presenting a snapshot of the impacts of the pandemic, the report is based on surveys of SME clients of four financial institutions and from the distribution network of one fast moving consumer goods company. It shows almost three quarters of SMEs surveyed experienced decreased sales. Nearly two thirds of the SMEs saw their sales drop by more than 25% on their pre-COVID monthly average.

"Overall, our research shows little difference between the impacts on businesses whether they were owned by men, women or jointly owned," said Amena Arif, IFC Country Manager for Sri Lanka and Maldives. "But it was clear women were less likely to access loans from formal banks to support their businesses and more likely to take a more traditional route, borrowing

from family and friends. They were also much less likely to use digital business

Around one million SMEs-25 percent of which are women-owned—account for about 45 percent of total employment in Sri Lanka. This study finds that companies in the manufacturing and construction sectors are the hardest hit, followed by the services sector.

Eighty percent of SMEs experienced difficulties meeting operating expenses and had some shortfall in debt repayment or ability to meet financial obligations due to COVID-19. Moreover, over three-quarters of SMEs reported difficulties accessing their usual financial services.

In response, the IFC-DFAT report offers recommendations, including increased access to working capital solutions and other loans for women-owned small and medium enterprises (WSMEs), better access to business-related training, and greater support to help small businesses shift to digital business channels.

"We hope the report's recommendations will be a useful input into creating a more resilient Sri Lankan economy in which women-owned businesses make a greater contribution," said David Holly, Australian High Commissioner for Sri Lanka.

The findings are based on a survey completed by 413 SMEs from across the country between June 22 and July 22, 2020.



input and experience in a way that benefits the student, keeping in mind that their experiences can be of value to these boys when



One of the prominent schools in , Kandy is Trinity College. It has a distinguished history in unearthing several personalities, who reached the pinnacle not only in the field of education but also in sports, who glittered like gems, especially in rugby and cricket and hit the top. Mohan Sahayam was one of them who brought great honour to the school and country handling the oval shaped ball.

Mohan Sahayam's father was G.A.Y.Sahayam a leading Maths teacher in that era who served for a long time at Trinity College later retired as Vice Principal. Elsie was his mother who was a housewife. He was born to a family of five with three boys and two girls. His elder brother, Baskaran who is in his 90's is the oldest living hockey Lion from Trinity, while Mano is his youngest brother. His eldest sister Lali is in Chennai, India while the youngest Sunitha is living in

Mohan was in the golden age of Trinity College Rugby, Cricket and Athletics, where he excelled in all three sports and had the privilege of leading the rugger team in 1964. He was famously known for his dummies most of the time, he sold these dummies like he was selling 'Kadala. which were called Sahayam Specials' He would smile whilst dummying and on a few occasions he sold dummies even to spectators. He can be rated as one of the best fly halves the country has ever produced in rugby.

He was a close follower of Nimal Maralanda, one of the sporting greats from his own school, who subsequently motivated him to engage in sports. The influence of his under -17 coach Hilary Abeyratne, who taught the basic fundamentals in rugby followed by his first coach Percy Madugalle also a former Trinitian, whom he rates as his mentor in Rugby, had played a pivotal role in grooming him as a top Rugby player.

He launched his illustrious rugby career by playing for Trinity College in 1962 under Noel Brohier as skipper where

Royal won the first leg of the 'Bradby Shield' at Longden Place 5-0 while Trinity went on to win the second leg 9-0 at Bogambara. In 1963, he played under Ananda Piyasena where the first leg in Kandy ended in a six-all draw while winning the second leg 5-3.

In 1964, Mohan led the Trinity side and some of the players in his team were Gotabaya Dissanayake, B.D.G. Piyasena, J.T. Labrooy, M.T.M. Zarook, George Carson, C.S. Jayasinghe, N.V. Perera, Sam Canagasabai, Ifthikar Hamid, Gavin Rodie, Dathusena Senanayake.

That year Royal was led by Keith. Paul and the team were made of K.S.D.S. Vidanage, Brian. Lieversz, I.R. Thuriratnam, D.W. Goonawardene, Nizam. Jaimon, R.T. de Soysa, S. Jayadeva, A.L. Dissanayake, L.K.L. Hettiarachchi, L.R. Perera, L. de Chickera, G. Tillekarathne, S.N.L. Wadugodapitiya, U.P. Wickramasinghe. There was hardly a game in which he

did not score. Even his rival captain in

coach, Mahesh Rodrigo, "We will win, but Mohan Sahayam will score." In that year, the first leg was played at Longden Place which Royal won 3-0 with the second leg was played at Nittawela which also Royal won 14-6 to clinch the Bradby Shield.

Mohan won his rugby colours in 1962 along with R.G. Geddes, L. Karunatilake, A.R.P. Kehelpanala, B.D.A. Piyasena and the 'Lion' was awarded to Mohan in 1963.

He played cricket in 1963, under the captaincy of Sunil Perera. That year, he played three games including the "big match" where he scored 21 and 3 respectively. Then in 1964, he played a full season under M.T.M. Zarook and his teammates were S. Galgama, Eardley Wadugodapitiya, Harindra Dunuwille, Anil Ratwatte, Hemendra Ranaweera, David Ondatjie, Brian Munaweera, Glen Vanlangenberg, I.R. Hamid, A.H. Jayawaradene, Γ. Disanayake, G. Rodie.

He was a hard-hitting left hand batsman and in 1964 when Trinity were struggling at 99 for 6 against St. Josephs' at Asgiriya, he made a swashbuckling 51 runs that enabled them to recover as Trinity went on to post 190 runs. The Josephians in reply were skittled out for 146 and

Trinity in their second essay declared at 169 for 7 setting a target of 213 runs. Mohan used his long handle to score 33 and the Josephians were bundled out for 161 runs giving Trinity a 52 run win. At the end of the season, he was awarded his cricketing colours along with R.B.J. Munaweera, D.C. Ondatje, Hemendra Ranaweera, Anil Ratwatte and Glen Vanlangenberg.

In athletics Mohan was in the 400 metres relay team with Gotabaya Dissanayake, M. S. Jayasinghe and Sarath Weerasinghe. He won the 'A..H.R. Joseph' Challenge Cup for all round excellence in sports in 1964 and in the same year he was appointed as school Prefect

Soon after school he joined CR and FC where he played for a long spell leading them in 1969 while Kandy Sports Club was led by Denzil Kobbekaduwa, entered

the Bradby of 1964, Keith Paul told his the cup final hoping to shatter the 14 year hoodoo against CR. He also played for Colombo Clubs and Sri Lanka as a top fly half, which was his favourite position. In the final when the final whistle was blown by Referee Cmdr. Darley Ingelton the scoreboard read 12-6 in favour of the Longden Place Club.

The 1969 Clifford Cup winning CR side comprised Hadji Omar, 'Bumpy' Jayasekara, Dushantha Samarasekera, Junie Cader, Kamal Ratnapala, Indrajith Coomaraswamy, Ajit Abeyratne, Tony de Sylva, Tony Srimanne and Mohan Sahayam (Capt), Ronnie Schokman, Hasitha Kannangara, Reggie Bartholomeusz, Hamzi Hameed, Iqbal Jumar.

The Kandy Sports Club team was Y.C. Chang, Mohan Balasuriya, G. Stevens, Rohan Abeysundara, Dr. D. Makuloluwa, Jadi Dissanayake, Deeplal de Zoysa, Gamini Udugama, Denzil Kobbekaduwa (Capt) and Jayantissa Ratwatte, Lakshman Samarawijaya, Chang Faa Ching, George Jayasena, Fredrick Prins, Shafie Jainudeen.

He received the 'Clifford Cup' from then president of the union Dr. K.B. Sangakkara. Mohan was a fine thinker of the game and made rugby a favourite sport. When he played for Sri Lanka in 1965 his colleagues were Sari de Sylva, Tony Sirimanne, Eric Roles, John Burrows, Chris Bean. Since Sri Lanka had limited invitations for foreign tournaments, he played for Sri Lanka in the All India Tournament, several times and against the visiting England teams with distinction before he injured his collarbone at practices with CR in the 1970 season having played under Hadji Omar which ruined his career forcing him to retire as a player, and took upto refereeing He became a leading A division referee officiating even the cup final between Havelocks and Navy in 1976 He served as the secretary of the Referees Society under Malcolm Wright before he left for Australia to settle down. At present he is living in Brisbane and his wife is Penny while daughter Tishara is a retail industry holder.

Wallabies slammed for 'avalanche of mistakes'

SYDNEY, SUNDAY: The Wallabies buried themselves in an "avalanche of mistakes", Australian media commentators lamented Monday after their team again failed to snap a decades-long hoodoo at New Zealand's Eden Park.

Australia's inability to win at the Auckland stadium stretched to a 34th year after being outplayed by a rampaging All Blacks 27-7 on Sunday.

They were punished for a poor defensive performance, guilty of too many handling errors, conceding a raft of turnovers and missing a whopping 40 tackles to New Zealand's 23.

"The Wallabies buried themselves in an avalanche of their own mistakes," said the Sydney Morning Herald.

"The attitude was there but the execution was badly awry at Eden Park... It was hard to keep count of the errors but three second-half mistakes in close succession were damaging."

They included Marika Koroibete failing to get the ball down in the corner, Brandon Paenga-Amosa's double movement that cost them a try and Jordan Petaia's carelessness that allowed Sam Cane to cross for five points.

"Pressure caused some of the mistakes, but (coach) Dave Rennie will demand more of his players upon their return to Australia. It wasn't good enough," the newspaper added.

The Australian broadsheet equally unforgiving, headlining: "New team, same old Eden Park story."

"Australia may have had a relatively new side, but in the end it was an old and tiresome story as the Wallabies fell off tackles, struggled to make their hits and allowed the All Blacks to build that ferocious, familiar momentum," it said.

Fox Sports noted that "the Wallabies cannot be their own worst enemy. The All Blacks are a tough enough opponent already".

The win put New Zealand in the driving seat after two Bledisloe Cup games, with 16-16 thriller.

There are two more to come over the coming weeks in Australia as part of the Rugby Championship, which also includes Argentina but not world champions South Africa who pulled out due to lack of preparation.

While the critics piled in, Sydney's Daily Telegraph took a more optimistic line, saying the Wallabies "are showing the beginning of something".

"The All Blacks were unstoppable, imposing, breathtakingly brutal in their execution of counter-attack and turnover raids," it wrote. "Australia is not capable of this level of rugby -- yet. They could be, judging by

the signs. "They have lifted their level of skill significantly; the running lines are sharper, their set-piece is slightly more reliable. And they show more fortitude.'

DUBAI, SUNDAY: Kings XI Punjab beat holders Mumbai Indians as the Indian Premier League witnessed a second super over for the first time after skipper KL Rahul's heroics on Rahul smashed 77 off 51 deliver-

ies as Punjab equalled Mumbai's score of 176 in the second match of the day after the opening game also Kolkata Knight Riders edged out

Sunrisers Hyderabad in Abu Dhabi with New Zealand quick Lockie Ferguson making an impact in his first IPL outing this season.

Punjab and Mumbai remained level after the first super over with paceman Mohammed Shami keeping down Rohit Sharma-led Mumbai to five runs.

Chris Gayle and Mayank Agarwal then combined to get their team's 12-tun target after Mumbai managed 11 for one in the second super over of the match and the third of the day.

"It was a dream come true to play the IPL and to have exciting games like this is amazing. This kind of a match will go down in history," Agarwal, who hit the winning runs, said after the tense win.

"Having an opportunity to learn from the game's greats is quite incredible. KL is a wonderful player and the kind of performance he's put forth as a captain so consistently is incredible."

The International Cricket Council changed the super over rules in limited-overs matches after England beat New Zealand on boundary count in the final of last year's 50-over World Cup.

England was awarded the cup as they scored more boundaries during their innings despite New Zealand matching their score at the end of 50 overs and in the super over at Lord's.

Punjab have improved to sixth in the eight-team table and are level with four teams on six points with three wins and six losses from nine

Mumbai (Indians); today we were competitive." It was disappointment for Warner who came into bat at number four instead of his usual opening position

and went quicker to 5,000 runs than Royal Challengers Bangalore skipper Virat Kohli who reached the mark in 157 IPL innings. The left-hand batsman became

the first overseas player and fourth overall to join the 5,000run IPL club. Kohli leads the batting chart with 5,759 runs in 186 matches. AFP
