2. Tenders should be made only upon forms attached. Tenderers may quote for any or all the items in the said schedule. Tenderers shall indicate clearly the item or items for which they are quoting.

3. Tenders should be in duplicate, and each copy should be signed by the tenderer and placed in a separate envelope. The envelope containing the original of the tender should be marked "Original" and the other marked "Duplicate" and both must be sealed. Both these sealed envelopes must be placed in one cover together with one copy of the conditions of tender (being these conditions) duly signed by the tenderer, which must be clearly marked "Tender for Cotton

Yarn", and should reach the Chairman of the Tender Board, Ministry of Home Affairs, P. O. Box 552, Colombo, Ceylon, not later than 2.30 p.m. on Friday, April 30, 1954.

4. If the copy of the conditions of tender is not signed and returned with each tender the tender will be considered incomplete and will be rejected.

6. These documents must be sent in triplicate.

7. All quotations shall be in Ceylon currency or sterling or in the currency of the country of supply and the tendered rates shall be entered in the tender forms in figures and repeated in words against the appropriate items in the said schedule. If there is any discrepancy between the words and figures or any error in the proper completion of the form in this respect such imperfect tender will be rejected. All alterations and erasures in the tender form must be initialled by the tenderer, else the tender will be rejected.

8. The Tender Board reserves the right to reject any or all tenders and/or to accept any item or part of any item. The tenderers should be prepared to supply any items of the tender at the rates quoted in the tender form against such item.

9. Notice of acceptance of tenders will be sent by registered post to the successful tenderer addressed to the address given by him in the tender form as soon as possible after the closing date of tenders. The successful tenderer may be required to enter into an agreement and bond for the due execution of the tender.

10. All tenders shall hold good for acceptance for a minimum period of 30 days from the closing date of tenders.

12. Should the accepted tenderer at any time find that he will be unable to deliver the full quantity of yarn or any portion of it within the period named, he shall at once give notice accordingly to the Commissioner of Cottage Industries who will in his discretion either grant

an extension of time to complete the supplies or determine the contract on thirty days' written notice without prejudice to the Commissioner's rights under the contract for partial failure of the supplies.

13. The purchase price of any yarn accepted by the Commissioner of Cottage Industries after the last day prescribed for delivery thereof shall be subject to a deduction as damages of five per cent. and such deduction shall be regarded as a reasonable pre-estimate of actual damage which the Government will and may sustain by reason of the default of the successful tenderer to complete delivery within the specified time, and shall for all purposes be deemed to be and regarded as liquidated damages and not as a penalty.

14. If the successful tenderer fails to supply the yarn as herein provided, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Cottage Industries in his discretion to purchase in the open market at whatever price he may deem fit and reasonable such quantity of yarn as the successful tenderer has failed to supply. If the yarn so purchased cost more than the tendered price, such excess cost and all expenses incurred on such purchase shall be payable by the successful tenderer on demand.

15. (a) If subsequent to the issue of the notice of the determination of the supplies from the successful tenderer and within the period of thirty days covered by such notice the successful tenderer shall deliver to the Commissioner of Cottage Industries the entire quantity of yarn then remaining undelivered or any part of such quantity it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Cottage Industries for good cause shown or otherwise to him appearing to accept such quantity of yarn or any part thereof; and in the event of the Commissioner of Cottage Industries accepting a part only of the quantity of yarn so remaining undelivered, such acceptance shall in no way be deemed to be or construed as a waiver of the written notice herebefore referred to which said notice shall despite such acceptance be deemed to be for all purposes valid and effectual with a view to enabling the Commissioner of Cottage Industries lawfully to purchase in the open market such quantity of yarn as shall yet remain undelivered at the expiration of the period of thirty days covered by the said notice.

(b) If any dispute shall arise between the parties it shall, in the first instance, be referred to arbitration of two persons in Ceylon, each party being entitled to nominate one arbitrator. The said arbitrators shall forthwith on reference to them take all reasonable steps for making a speedy award. The arbitrators shall nominate in advance and before entering upon their award an umpire to whom they shall refer their dispute in the event of the arbitrators not being able to agree upon their award. If the arbitrators are unanimous in their award, their decision shall be final; but in case the arbitrators are not unanimous in their final award the dispute shall be referred to the umpire for his decision. If either party in difference shall neglect to

appoint an arbitrator for a space of 30 days, after notice in writing to do so shall have been given by the other party or shall appoint an arbitrator who shall refuse to act, then the other party shall apply to the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury for the appointment of an arbitrator to act on behalf of the party failing to appoint and the arbitrator so appointed may proceed and act as if he had been appointed by the party failing to appoint. The cost of the arbitration proceedings should be paid by each party hereto in such proportions as the arbitrators or umpire, as the case may be, shall determine.

16. The stamp duty on the agreement and bond (if any) with the successful tenderer is payable by the successful tenderer.

17. (a) The successful tenderer shall indemnify the Crown against any claim, by or in respect of any of his employees under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Cap. 117) or any statutory amendments or modifications thereof.

expense, remove the rejected yarn. Pending removal the yarn shall remain and be at the risk of the successful tenderer who shall, in addition be liable to refund to the Commissioner of Cottage Industries the cost of handling and other charges incurred, and the charges so incurred, when certified under the hand of the Commissioner of Cottage Industries shall be deemed final and conclusive.

(b) Each lot must be certified after inspection by a testing authority approved by the Commissioner of Cottage Industries and such certificate should accompany shipping documents against each such lot. The fees of such authority shall be payable by the tenderer.

22. The Government shall have the right to nominate any Agent (including the Crown Agents in London) to supervise the manufacture of the yarn, to take samples during and after manufacture, to check upon qualities and quantities, and generally to appear in a representative capacity either directly or through sub-agencies for the purposes of the supplies and the successful tenderer shall give all facilities to such Agents or Sub-Agents to carry out such duties.

23. Quotations must be based on the length, weight, and size of the grey yarn used and not of the final product. Percentage loss or gain on the grey weight in the final product should be quoted in invoices for comparison purposes. The counts specified are rated in the grey, and not in the final product. The final count, however, should be specified in invoices for comparison purposes.

24. It should be noted that quotations are invited by weight purely for the sake of convenience and the actual measure for which payment is being made is the measure of length. The count of the yarn may be specified in any accepted system, but actual length in English yards per English pound must also be quoted. The recognized unit is the "standard pound" that is—each pound shall be regarded as equivalent to 840 English yards multiplied by the number representing the count.

25. The prices quoted should be for the nett weight of the yarn, exclusive of the weight of any holders, containers, packing material, &c., nor for any separate inland handling, licensing, excise, transport, documentation, export dues, &c., up to the state of delivery in the ship's slings in Colombo Harbour. All such charges should be included in the price quoted per nett pound of yarn and no variation in the other charges shall be a liability of the Government of Ceylon whether due to *force majeure* or other causes. Notwithstanding the existence of any trade custom, the weight of wrappers, battens or other materials used in packing shall not be included in the weight for payment.

26. Yarn if hanked shall be in units of 840 yards per hank and if wrapped shall be in units of one or five or ten standard English pounds unless otherwise expressly specified, packed in bales or boxes of 200 or 400 pounds nett contents with all necessary and suitable packing material which should be expressly specified but not separately charged for. If any accessories are used for winding, wrapping, or packing, the tare weight shall be stamped or indelibly marked on each accessory.

27. Containers of metal of proper gauge, suitable for re-use as water tanks, or oil tanks, may be used for packing instead of normal baling or casing, and if metal containers are used, a

separate charge may be made therefor. Such charge should be separately itemised in the tender.

28. The cotton used shall be of the best commercially available bush varieties, and at least 75 per cent. of the cotton shall be of the range of staple lengths appropriate to the particular count. No other fibre of any kind shall be admixed with the cotton nor shall cotton be used which is known or suspected to contain more than 15 per cent. of fibres of shorter staple than the range of staple lengths appropriate to the count or admixed with any other fibre. No tree cotton or cotton known to have been from immature or diseased bolls or older than two years shall be used.

29. SIZING—(a) The amount of size per 100 pounds of Grey Yarn must be mentioned.

(b) Sizing of yarn, when required in the case of gassed or bleached or dyed yarn shall be done only at the last possible stage after all the other operations are complete. Preferably sizing should be done on single thread before winding wherever practicable and not in hanks. Sizing after reeling on cones or bobbins is strictly prohibited. The use of weighting materials or mere fillers or loading materials (other than mineral waxes and oils) which confer no strength or colour, shall be avoided. Sufficient non-volatile antiseptics shall be used to preserve the sized yarn in damp hot tropical climates for at least one year. The size used shall not make the yarn tender in any way even after storage for one year. The size shall remain hard, strong, and non-adhesive at all temperatures up to 100°F. and/or a relative humidity of 90 per cent., but the size shall not be waterproof. No acids (except boric and salicylic acids) or zinc chloride or other hydrolysable chemical shall be included in the size composition.

30. DYEING: Unless otherwise specified or permitted, only top quality vat dyes, fast to light, washing and rubbing shall be used. In the case of red colours and shades, azoic dyes may be specified as an alternative. Unless otherwise specified all dyes will be presumed to be vat dyes. The dye shall be applied by repeated dips instead of at one time. Dye shall not be applied until scouring is complete.

31. The dye numbers quoted are from the latest colour charts of Messrs. Imperial Chemical Industries of England. Any other colour charts may be followed provided—

- (a) Such different colour charts are approved in advance of the tender.
- (b) Four copies of the colour charts and yarn samples are sent to the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Home Affairs, for approval well in time and the dyes used are specified therein.
- (c) The dyes used and the dyed yarns produced are in no way inferior to the prescribed colours in brightness, tone, depth, fastness, and other characteristics.
- (d) The dyes conform to standard tests in the country of manufacture as of first class quality.

32. The monthly requirements for the period July to December, 1954, are set out in the schedule following.
