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

The 20th Amendment was introduced to remove the 19th Amendment which caused anarchy in the country and was rejected by the people, Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa said.

Participating in the Second Reading debate of the 20th Amendment to the Constitution in Parliament yesterday,

the Prime Minister said the mandate given to Parliament was to strengthen the President and therefore the 20th Amendment was brought in to strengthen national security and defeat the 19th Amendment which destabilized the

The Prime Minister said that the Government was not preparing to continue with the existing Constitution by introducing the 20th Amendment and expressed confidence that a new Constitution would be brought soon to build the nation fulfilling the long awaited aspirations of the people.

"No other Constitution has been criticized as much as this Constitution. Dr. N.M. Perera, Dr. Colvin R. de Silva and Sarath Muththettuwegama were opposed to this Constitution. However, we have no choice but to maintain this Constitution. Although the SLFP opposes

this Constitution, four Presidents affiliated to the SLFP had governed under it. Despite the then United National Party leader, J.R.Jayewardene introducing this Constitution to prevent the SLFP from coming to power, the Sri Lanka Freedom Party has ruled the country for the longest time by producing the highest number of Presidents. 

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

Environment Minister Mahinda Amaraweera said a Cabinet Paper would be submitted to make it mandatory for all public and private sector institutions to join in this programme.

The Ministry has designed special containers to collect discarded carbon pens and toothbrush-

The Environment Minister will present the first container to President Gotabaya Rajapaksa on Monday (26).

Minister Amaraweera observed that the discarded carbon pens and toothbrushes have resulted in enormous environmental damage. The Ministry has prepared a programme to reduce this environmental risk.

Amaraweera said approximately 80 kilogrammes of empty ballpoint pen tubes used by school students are released to the environment daily. Accordingly, it was revealed that around 29,000 kilogrammes of empty ballpoint pens are dumped into the environment by the school system per year. However, no survey has been conducted on the total amount of carbon pens released daily by the public and private institutions and other sectors.

The programme initially targets children. Accordingly, a special container has been introduced for every school to dispose of empty pens and toothbrushes. This container can hold 2,000 pens and 500 toothbrushes. 'Wex Industries Plastics Company' has agreed to purchase the container once it is filled.

The inaugural ceremony of this programme will be held at Dickwella Vijitha Central College.

But, we have not been able to change this Constitution. It was difficult to change such a Constitution because one party could not get a two thirds majority in this Parliament," the Prime Minis-

ter said. "But for the first time in history we have disproved the theory that we can never win a twothirds majority under this electoral system. The people of this country wanted to build a Government that would safeguard the sovereignty of the people without succumbing to foreign pressures and prevent the country from breaking up into factions. That is why the people have been compelled to give us a 2/3 majority even under this system of proportional representation. We are preparing to bring this 20th Amendment not to continue this Constitution but to fulfill the long awaited aspirations of the people for a new Constitution that would build making involved."

The Prime Minister said that when a Constitution is amended it is normal for various debates to arise in Parliament. "However, certain amendments in history have been made with great pressure on the Members of Parliament. But, we are not bringing this 20th Amendment to Parliament though political deals or snatching votes by excerpting influence on anyone. That is why at this moment when the 20th Amendment is being brought, there is room for debate. On the other hand, I would like to ask if the same could be said about the 19th Amendment? At that time the Maha Sangha or anyone were not allowed to protest. Therefore, we can be happy about the manner in which the 20th Amendment is being debated respecting the democratic rights of the people without any underhand deal

The Prime Ministere noted that the 19th Amendment was solely aimed at taking revenge from the Rajapaksa family and to target the civic rights of the Rajapaksas'. But said, unfortunately, it only resulted in jeopardising the national securi-

ty and unity of the coun-"The previous government rejoiced and gloated that they had clipped the wings of the president, not realising that they had cut off the neck of the country's national security and national unity. Three years after the 19th Amendment pruned the powers of the president, they were able to witness the repercussions for their actions. The head of intelligence revealed to the Easter Commission that at least 10,000 officials were aware that such an attack would happen but could do nothing to prevent the attack. It is shameful when we hear these and as a result of the actions of the govern-



ment so many lives were lost," he said.

In addition the Prime Minister noted that the president did not even have the power to remove the IGP even after such a tragedy or even to transfer unproductive police officers. Only the Police Commission can do this. But it is a mystery as to who the Police Commission is answerable to. "The state intelligence

and other intelligence services were very strong during our time. But after the introduction of the 19th Amendment, the CID was used to hunt down Opposition politicians. The training that those officers received had been disrupted. The Police Commission will not interservices. As a result, the efficiency of services such as the CID intelligence deteriorated. Now the CID could not even apprehend Rishad Bathiudeen. Rishard's younger brother who was allegedly linked to terrorists had been released on bail by the Police and there was nothing that could have been done.' Prime Minister Raja-



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






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

All Sri Lankans must practice DReAM to control COVID-19 transmission

The Ministry of Health, WHO Sri Lanka, the Itukama Project, and the Government Medical Officers Association (GMOA) launched and are currently running the 'Towards a New Normal' campaign to reinforce the importance of practicing public health behaviour to control COVID-19. The campaign focuses on crucial prevention measures, captured in the acronym DReAM.

D - Distancing - maintain a physical distance of at least 1 metre from others; avoid public gatherings, crowded places, close-contact settings, and confined and enclosed spaces;

Re – Respiratory etiquette – cough/sneeze into your elbow; stay at home and contact a doctor (and/ or 1999 or 1390) if you have a fever, cough, and/or sore throat

A – Aseptic techniques – wash your hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use a hand sanitizer with at least 70% alcohol; avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth; regularly disinfect frequently touched surfac-

M – Mask – wear a face

mask, ensuring you put on, take off, and store your mask properly; clean your

mask regularly, and make sure it covers both your nose and mouth at all times. The cam-

paign consists of two arms: 'Wagakiyamu' (Be responsible), which focuses on the obligations of organisations/enterprises, and "Meteren Jeewithe' which focuses on the duties of the general public. The campaign uses symbols that can be used universally as a reminder of DReAM. The overall goal is to create

20A will restore people's sovereignty which 19A stole: *Weerasekera*

The 20th Amendment would restore the sovereignty of the people, which was put in jeopardy by the 19th Amendment, Local Government and Provincial Council Minister Rear Admiral (Rtd.) Sarath Weerasekera said.

Participating in the second round stage debate on the 20th Amendment Bill in Parliament yesterday, Weerasekera said that as per constitutional provisions, sovereignty in this country is in the people and is unchallengeable.

Sovereignty includes the powers of government, fundamental rights, and the franchise. Within the powers of the government comes the executive power of the people. That executive power of the people is exercised through the President.

The 19th Amendment reduced the powers of the executive and thereby diminished people's sovereignty. The 20th Amendment would rectify this and restore people's sovereignty by unshackling the executive," the minister said.

"The 19th Amendment weakened the executive power. For example, 6.9 million people voted for President Gotabaya Rajapaksa. Now, nearly one year has passed, but he still could not appoint an IGP he thinks fit for the job because of the 19th Amendment," he added.

Minister Weerasekera said, "Before the 19th Amendment, appointments to key positions such as the Chief Justice, Attorney-General, and IGP were made by the President. The 19th
Amendment vested that
power on a constitutional
council comprising nine
persons. Of those nine
votes, seven were in the
hands of persons appointed by the Prime Minister
and the Opposition Leader. That means two MPs
elected form two districts
exercising executive powers of an entire popula-

"What happened in practice? The Opposition Leader was R. Sampanthan, an LTTE proxy. The Prime Minister was Ranil Wickremesinghe, and we all know his attitude. It was those two who made all the important appointments. In other words, Sampanthan from the Trincomalee District and Wickremesinghe form the Colombo District exer-

cised the sovereign powers of the entire nation. Is it justifiable?" he added.

"The constitutional council had three civil society members who were not responsible for the Parliament or the people. They were representatives of NGOs. Is it justifiable?" he asked.

He said that as the one and only who had opposed the 19th Amendment to



the Constitution in Parliament, he was happy to see that the day has come to replace it with the 20th Amendment.

19A's primary purpose was transfer of Presidential powers to PM: Sabry

The primary purpose of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution was to transfer certain Presidential powers to the Prime Minister so that Ranil Wickremesinghe could enjoy these powers, Justice Minister Ali Sabry.

Moving the 20th Amendment Bill for the second reading stage debate, the minister said that the Good Governance regime did not bring about the 19th Amendment for the good of the people. "They amendment it so that Ranil Wickremesinghe to get some of the powers of the presidency for his own benefit."

Through the 17th Amendment, they tried to empower the Prime Minister. Then through the 18th Amendment, that power was transferred back to the President. Then by the 19th Amendment, again they tried to transfer the powers of the President back to the Prime Minister. If you take the constitutions, the 1978 Constitution is the most potent," the minister said



Minister Sabry said that the executive president under the 20th Amendment would not enjoy more powers than the powers vested on that post by the 1978 Second Republican Constitution. "When we compare the constitutions of this country, the 1978 Constitution had the presidency with highest concentration of powers. Subsequent amendments had reduced some of those powers and the 19th Amendment did the worst. The 20th Amendment would restore those powers of the presidency. Our attempt is to enable the President to exercise people's power once again," the minister added.

"The 19th Amendment not only rendered the post of President impotent, but also disabled national security. Take for example of Easter Sunday carnage, which is being investigated by several commissions. Now there is none to be held responsible. Various parties and individuals go before those commissions and try to place the blame on others. No one is taking responsibility," Sabry said.

"It is clear that we cannot move forward in this manner. We have to do away the 19th Amendment for the sake of people. Former presidents J.R. Jayawardene, R. Premadasa, D.B. Wijetunga, and Chandrika Kumartunga ruled the country under the provisions of the 1978 constitution. Are they dictators? The 20th Amendment would not give any more powers to presidency than the presidential powers in the 1978 Constitution," he added.

Good Governance Government's

The so-called "independent" commissions established by the 19th Amendment to the Constitution were not "independent" but "stubborn" in nature, Minister Vasudeva Nanayakkara said yesterday.

"They were not independent commissions, but stubborn ones that employed persons who are not answerable to Parliament and the people. Recently, then Chairman of the Bribery Commission gave evidence as to how the political influence played a role in handling these so-called independent commissions," Nanayakkara added.

Minister Nanayakkara also said that the grave of Good Governance Government is marked with two memories: the Easter Sunday carnage and the Central Bank Bond Scam.

Nanayakkara made these observations joining the debate on the 20th Amendment to the Constitution

in Parliament, yesterday.

which is of our own. We started this quest in 1972 and are discovering our own future—our own new Constitutions."

"First of all, we need to understand what a Constitution is. A constitution is a reflection of the existing balance of forces at any given time. We have it and therefore, it becomes negated one moment and then rises again. Then it is challenged once again by mass forces. That is how it happens," he said.

happens," he said.

"History does not have linear growth; there is no demarcation such as rulers and people. There are only people and representatives of the people. Any other ruler is someone who gets appointed without the consensus of the people. In our government, we do not have rulers, we have

representatives of the people. That is what we call 'Representative Democracy'. We do agree that it is not the best version of democracy. The best democracy is direct democracy; the best democracy was in the Soviet Council," he added.

"Back then, we also supported the 19th Amendment. People like myself and N.M. Perera believed that the executive presidency should be done away with. We believed that reducing the power of the President and balancing it with the Prime Minister was a good thing," Nanayakkara added.

He also criticised the idea of 'de-politicisation', which was a popular terminology used by the previous government. "When we agreed to establish the Constitutional Council. former Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe attempted to include a number of people into the Council hiding behind this term. Why should we appoint people who do not answer to the people in such positions? I was against this move. Then the CC was established, amending the move," he

UNP calls on Parliamentarians to vote against 20A

The United National Party, issuing a press release yesterday, called on Members of Parliament to refrain from voting for the 20th Amendment to the Constitution.

"We as a party have continually expressed concern that such an amendment would endanger our heritage enshrined in the Constitution, which is the sovereign right of the people of Sri Lanka. The independence of the judiciary, an independent Election Commission which

protects the public's franchise, and the necessity to have a competent and independent Auditor-General, are all part of our country's Constitu-

"The UNP opposes the decision by the government to permit dual citizens to enter Parliament. The question that arises in such a situation is where would the loyalty of those citizens lie, with their country of birth or their adopted country?" the statement read

The passing of this amendment will allow for a precedent to be set which will threaten the inherent rights of the country, including ensuring Buddhism the foremost place in the country while affording equal rights and protection to other religions, the release added.

20A debate should not be a political battleground: *Dullas*

The debate on the 20th Amendment should not turn into a political battleground but a platform that discusses about drafting a new, comprehensive, and scientific Constitution, Minister of Power Dullas Alahaperuma said yesterday in Parliament.

Minister Alabaparay

Minister Alahapperuma said, "The 1978 Constitution is extremely impractical and unscientific. Therefore, it underwent a series of amendments. Apart from a couple, the most number of amendments were made by the same UNP Government that passed this Constitution. Some of these amendments are controversial. The 12th Amendment was one such amendment. There was a government MP, one Abeyratne Pilapitiya. A communist party leader Sarath Muththettugama got elected to parliament from the seat Pilapitiya was competing in. So what did the then government do? They



came up with 12th Amendment.

"This amendment increased the number of seats in the House from 225 to 226. It was not activated of course, but the amendment was done and House approved the proposal. From 1978 to 1987, there were 13 amendments done to the Constitution. It shows how shortsighted and personal they were when initially drafting this Constitution," he added.

Minister Alahapperuma said, "Within 42 years, this Constitution has undergone 20 amendments. With a random calculation, this means an amendment has been done for every one-and-a-

half years from the passing of the Constitution. Isn't this document like a letter written by a child? The American Constitution, which is over 233 years old, has only had 27 amendments; the Australian Constitution, which is 119 years old, has only 9 amendments; the Korean Constitution is 72 years old and has only 9 amendments; and the Japanese Constitution. which is also 72 years old, has no amendments. All these countries have had only one constitution

each, so far." "The problem lies with the drafting of the first Constitution. Now, at the debate on the 20th Amendment to the Constitution, it has turned into a battle between two political ideologies—this is not what should happen. The 19th Amendment is history; the 20th Amendment is our present. What we should discuss is of a new Constitution which is practical and scientific," he added.

19A weakened state mechanism: Dinesh

The state mechanism was weakened following the enactment of the 19th Amendment, Leader of the House Dinesh Gunawardena said. Joining the debate of the second reading of the 20th Amendment to the Constitution, he noted that this situation was made evident by the statements made by former President Maithripala Sirisena.

Gunawardena referred

to a statement made by

Sirisena that while he held the office of the presidency, he was unable to govern the country due to these limitations imposed

by the 19th Amendment.

He accused the former government of failing to bring about a constitutional amendment that guaranteed democracy for all Sri Lankans and ensured national security.

Therefore, the Leader of the House assured that the 20th Amendment would



correct the mistakes of the 19th Amendment.

Rishad allowed to attend Parliament after completing quarantine: *Sudarshini*



SJB Vanni District MP Rishad Bathiudeen, who is currently in remand custody, will be allowed to attend Parliament only after completing 14 days at a quarantine centre, keeping with the procedure adopted to keep prisons COVID-19 free, State Minister of Prison Reforms and Prisoners' Rehabilitation Sudarshini Fernandopulle said yesterday.

State Minister Fernandopulle said there are over 30,000 remand prisoners at present, and that strict health regulations are followed at all

prisons to avoid prisoners from contracting the virus. According to Fernandopulle, prison visits are temporarily suspended and no outside food is allowed within the premises.

Fernandopulle made

these observations in answer to a query raised by Chief Opposition Whip Lakshman Kiriella, as to why arrangements have not been made to allow Bathuideen to attend Parliamentary sessions.

Speaker Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena said that necessary health procedures have to be followed before the detained MP is allowed to attend sittings.

When Opposition MPs queried as to how SLPP MP Premalal Jayasekera who was in prison serving a death sentence was allowed to attend sittings, Jayasekera said that he had been moved out of the prison and kept in quarantine for two weeks before being allowed to attend Parliament sittings.

20A would help government rule with an iron fist: Vigneswaran

The government is hurriedly bringing in the 20th Amendment to strengthen the hands of the rulers to govern with an iron fist and block the democratic corridors still available to the minorities, especially the Tamil-speaking population, MP C.V. Vigneswaran alleged.

Joining the debate on the 20th Amendment in Parliament yesterday, he said, "It is unfortunate that every party that has come into power in this island has been generally legislating to further the self-interest of that party, and its members and supporters, forgetting their duty towards the people and the country as a whole. Those who aspire to become a Lee Kuan Yew shed their party predilections if they are to progress."

He pointed out that
Lee Kuan Yew did not

pursue a Chinese Buddhist path, but loved every Singaporean whatever hue he or she was. "Branding the minority as terrorists might bring the vote of the majority, but would not help to take the country forward. There would certainly be a geopolitical and international reac-

tion," he said.

it is in furtherance of
their attitude in self-

interest that those in power today are bringing in this 20th Amendment to cloth a single individual with enormous powers.

This would strike the death knell to democracy and human rights in this country, he added.

He noted that it is funny that those in Sri Lanka want to denigrate democracy and desecrate decent dimensions in a democratic way of life.

UNP has lost its presence in Parliament: *Cabraal*

The United National Party, which brought in the 19th Amendment to the Constitution, has lost its presence in Parliament, State Minister Ajith Nivard Cabraal said yesterday.

State Minister of Money and Capital Market and State Enterprise Reforms Ajith Nivard Cabral made this observation delivering the concluding speech of the first day of the debate on the 20th Amendment to the Constitution.

Minister Cabraal said, "When the Good Governance Government brought the 19th Amendment to Parliament, they spoke as if it would solve all the socioeconomic problems in the country. Then it was implemented, and we saw its repercussions. The country was dragged into a serious situation due to this amendment. Economy of the country and the liv-

ing conditions of the people dwindled.

"Today, the very political party which brought in the 19th Amendment to the Constitution has only one seat in the House. Even that seat, they cannot decide on whom to send."

Minister Cabraal added, "If we follow the same methodology followed by the Good Governance Government, we, too, will go down the same road. We don't want that. That

is why we immediately opted for an amendment to the Constitution and did away with all the shortcomings of the 19th Amendment. Later on, we shall bring about a new Constitution.

"The 20th Amendment to the Constitution will create a solid political situation to create a strong economy. I hope some of the Opposition MPs would vote for this bill," he added.

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

Both prosecution and respondent parties have already concluded testifying evidence in connection with

this contempt of court case. All judges of the Supreme Court had earlier determined to proceed with contempt of court charges against the former Deputy Minister after perusing the transcript of the video footage pertaining to the alleged derogatory statement.

Ven. Magalkande Sudantha Thera and R. Sunil Perera, a retired Air Force Officer had made complaints to the Supreme Court seeking a contempt of court action against the then Depnayake for allegedly making insulting remarks on the reputation of the judiciary and lawyers, at a press conference held on August 21 last year.

He made this observation joining the Second Stage debate on the 20th Amendment to the Constitution Bill.

High-risk prisoners to Boossa High Security Prison - Commissioner General of Prisons

MAHINDA P. LIYANAGE Galle Central Special Correspondent

Commissioner General of Prisons H.M.T.N Upuldeniya said they will carry out a prompt classification of prisoners islandwide and the convicts who are graded as highrisk criminals will be detained at Boossa.

He made these observations following an inspection tour at the upgraded Boossa High Security Prison on Sunday. He unveiled the new name board of the prison and opened the newly-built bachelors' quarters at the premises. Any misdeed or transgression that would be a threat to the society will not be permitted to occur within prisons in the future, the Commissioner General of Prisons said.

"With the objective of assuring a secured country, Boossa Prison was upgraded as a High-Security Prison to detain high-risk convicts. The upgrading of the prison was initiated following a decision taken jointly by Defence Secretary Maj. Gen. (Retd) Kamal Gunaratne and the chiefs of the State Intelligence Service. They decided to keep back high-risk prisoners separated from other prisoners. We hope to take all



any threat that would be caused by these high-risk inmates. It is our obligation to stop any social threat or intimidation from these notorious jailbirds," Upuldeniya said.

Commenting on the Prison Department's response to the COVID-19 outbreak, he stated that since the beginning of the pandemic eruption, they maintained a special scheme with regard to the new prisoners referred from the judiciary.

"We did not directly admit them to our prisons. Before they are sent to the respective jails, they are subjected to a compulsory 14-day quarantine process and subsequent PCR tests. In addition, we carry out random PCR tests within our prisons.

We have currently stopped public visits to the high security prisons.

prisoners to talk to their families once a week for three minutes," he said. "Our prisons officials are collectively and cooperatively

Instead, we have facilitated the

shoulder their responsibilities to uphold the high security status of prisons. They work dedicatedly to end all misdeeds and duplicitous actions that were reported some time ago within the prisons. "We are specifically con-

cerned over the hostel issue of the prison officials. State Minister Sudarshani Fernandopulle is planning out a scheme to provide our officers with a special incentive for their devoted and proficient services," he revealed.

"At present illegal use of mobile phones inside prisons has been significantly discouraged. We are planning a new scheme for the rehabilitation of drug addicts among the prisoners. We are constantly maintaining links with the police and intelligence agents to obtain information on various illegal activities carried out in prisons. If we find any prison official is connected with such unlawful performances we shall strictly deal with such dishonest officials," he said.

A welcome assurance

he assurance given by Health Minister Pavithra Wanniarachchi that Parliament would soon be told how the second wave of the Coronavirus originated in this country, would go a long way in clearing all doubts and misgivings while also helping in great measure the current efforts at containing the contagion.

The Minister answering an Oral Question by Opposition Leader Sajith Premadasa in Parliament on Tuesday said the findings of the ongoing investigations to trace how the first Brandix garment factory employee contracted the Coronavirus would be tabled in Parliament. While admitting that 48 Brandix representatives from India had visited the Minuwangoda factory, the minister insisted that they were all Sri Lankans and were put through the mandatory 14 day quarantine procedure and also another 14 day isolation period, thereafter.

The findings of the investigation would certainly reveal if the current spread of the Coronavirus to all corners of the country had its origins in the Brandix cluster as per the assertions of Army Commander Shavendra Silva or if the pandemic had already entered the community via another source, in which case the country is already in the throes of the much feared social spread as speculated by many.

The signs that such a phenomenon is already upon us are evident going by the reach made by the pandemic to places and areas that appear far removed from the Minuwangoda cluster.

Also more areas continue to be brought under curfews with every passing day which is a fair indication that the virus has assumed a runaway form that a single cluster, although admittedly large, could alone not have been responsible for. The sooner the investigations are concluded the faster could the authorities move on to the next stage in devising emergency measures to tackle the wider spread of the pandemic.

Ominously, the virus also is showing signs of a rapid spread in the heart of the City, with the Fort Police, no less, having to temporarily shut down after an Inspector at the Station tested positive. Although work resumed by afternoon yesterday it showed how vulnerable Colombo could be to the virus, which could result in another paralysis of business and commercial activity and the economy by exten-

This is perhaps why the authorities have decided not to go for a lockdown in the Fort and the Pettah at least for the moment while the Health authorities are closely monitoring the situation.

Should the worst happen, the authorities will have no option but to effect a lockdown, given the teeming denizens that flood the city each day. True, the Epidemiology Unit doctors note that the present situation in the country has still not reached a community transmission level since all the patients detected so far had their sources and even second/third tier contacts identified. However the GMOA has a different view, maintaining that a community transmission of COVID-19 may have begun and has called on the authorities to impose at least zonal lockdowns in the high risk areas.


The Security Forces and health workers are working round the clock to combat the rapid spread of the virus but their success will largely depend on the cooperation they receive from the general public. But from all accounts, this cooperation is not readily forthcoming. Despite the issuance of the gazette, the other day, to legally prosecute those flouting the health guidelines, it is business as usual in most

Despite the deterrent of a Rs.10,000 fine or a six month prison term for violators even the curfews are observed in the breach. According to Police Spokesman and Attorney-at-Law DIG Ajith Rohana 128 curfew violators were taken into custody in a single day in the areas under lockdown in Gampaha bringing the total number to 530 since the imposition of the curfew. Yet he goes onto say the intention of the Police is not arrest anyone but to shield the society from the Coronavirus. There is no doubt that it is this soft stance that has encouraged the public to act with impunity. Over 20,000 curfew violators were arrested during the first outbreak. Needless to say, they would all have been released with a warning and nothing more. We are seeing the consequences of Police leniency once again today when the virus has assumed a more virulent form.

It is time that the Police took a firm decision to deal with the violators of health guidelines in terms of the said gazette notification. Contact tracing and quarantining too should be carried out with firmness despite the complaints doing the rounds on social and mainstream media about certain aspects of it. The virus is now assuming dangerous proportions to leave anything to chance. Combatting the spectre will need the undivided attention, commitment and dedication of all the stakeholders including, most importantly, the public.

20A highlight of a decisive week

he Government is preparing to enact the 20th Amendment in to law this week, even as it battles a growing Covid-19 cluster that threatens the economy and the Opposition protests that the Parliamentary debate on the legislative changes should be postponed because of the pandemic.

At the time of writing, the Supreme Court verdict on the 20th Amendment has been tabled in Parliament. The much-awaited verdict, which could have stalled the Amendment, states the several Articles in the Bill are inconsistent with the Constitution but this is not likely to hinder its passage.

The Court has ruled that Articles 3, 5, 14, and 22 of the Bill, as they stand, are not in accordance with the Article 3 of the Constitution which is to be read with the Article 4 of the Constitution. To approve the Amendment in its present form, it would require approval at a referendum, the Court has ruled.

However, the Supreme Court has concluded that the non-compliance of Articles 3 and 14 can be removed in accordance with the proposed committee stage amendments and the non-compliance of Article 5 may be removed by making amendments as provided in the decision of the Supreme Court.

Committee Stage of the debate

It is likely that the Government will now introduce amendments at the Committee Stage of the debate, enabling the passage of the 20th Amendment. This would still require the votes of 150 Members of Parliament to give the Government the two-thirds majority that is required to enact the Amendment.

The Government, headed by President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and led by Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa in Parliament campaigned seeking a mandate to repeal the 19th Amendment at both the General Election in August this year and at the Presidential Election held in November last

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa recorded a decisive victory at the Presidential Election. A two-thirds majority at a General Election had never been won since the proportional representation (PR) system of voting was introduced in 1989, but the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna

(SLPP) won 145 seats. This is just short of the 150 seats required for a two-thirds majority. However, there are several other parties which will add to the Government's ranks. This includes the Eelam Peoples' Democratic Party (EPDP) with two seats and one Member who contested on the Sri Lanka Freedom Party (SLFP) ticket.

The Government is therefore confident that it will be able to obtain the required 150 seats to ensure the smooth passage of the 20th Amendment through Parliament. This is despite reports of some internal rumblings of dissent within the Government's Parliamentary group and the Cabinet.

There have been reports that Minister of Water Supply Vasudeva Nanayakkara had indicated his opposition, particularly to the article allowing dual citizens to run for Parliament and President. Nanayakkara has publicly acknowledged this and also stated his views at meetings of the Cabinet.

Minister Nanayakkara is a respected politician with a long history of being a champion for causes he believes in. It is however expected

that the Minister will vote for the 20th Amendment as it is highly unlikely that he will aid in derailing what has become a priority issue for the incumbent Government.

A stronger voice of dissent has come from Dr. Wijeyadasa Rajapakshe. The former minister who held the Justice portfolio in the previous Government headed by former President Maithripala Sirisena has written to President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, re-iterating his opposition to the proposed Amendment.

Independence of the judiciary

In doing so, the former Minister has cited two main reasons. They are the removal of State institutions from being under Parliamentary scrutiny for audit purposes and what Rajapakshe perceives as an erosion of the independence of the judiciary, under changes proposed in the 20th Amendment.

In his letter, Parliamentarian Rajapakshe states that while he believes President Gotabaya Rajapaksa would not use his powers excessively and to the detriment of the nation, a future President armed with all the powers vested in him through the proposed 20th Amendment has the potential to do so.

Rajapakshe has a chequered political history. While being a State minister in the Government led by then President Mahinda Rajapaksa, he resigned on a matter of policy. However, he continued to serve as a parliamentarian in the Government group. He then crossed over to the United National Party (UNP).

In the previous coalition Government headed by former President Maithripala Sirisena, he was removed from his position as Minister of Justice at the request of the UNP after he repeatedly made public statements critical of the party's leadership and its policies while being in Government.

Later, when former President Sirisena appointed Mahinda Rajapaksa as his Prime Minister, Rajapakshe served briefly as Minister of Education and Higher Education in the 52-day Government that ensued. Since then, he has been supportive of the SLPP and its policies.

In his letter to President Rajapaksa, Parliamentarian Rajapakshe states that he is struggling with his conscience in trying to decide to vote for the 20th Amendment. However, whether this will translate into being defiant enough to vote against it or abstain from voting remains to

Another voice of dissent from within the Government's ranks comes from Kalutara District Parliamentarian Vidura Wickremanayake. Wickremanayake, who is the son of former Prime Minister Ratnasiri Wickremanayake polled the highest number of preference votes from the Kalutara district.

New Constitution

In media interviews, Wickremanayake has advocated the need for a new Constitution instead of a constitutional amendment. He argues that the 20th Amendment restores most of the changes brought about by the 18th Amendment which he says was detrimental to former President Mahinda Rajapaksa.

However, Wickremanayake has qualified his dissent stating that he will make a decision regarding the 20th Amendment after noting the Supreme Court verdict on the matter. Now that the verdict is in the public domain and provides for measures to enact the amendment, he may change his stance.

The Government also has to contend with opposition to the proposed 20th Amendment from an unexpected quarter, from religious denominations. The Catholic Bishops Conference, sections of the Amarapura and Ramanna sects of the Buddhist clergy and other monks have also expressed concern.

Of particular note is the opposition expressed by three prominent monks, Ven. Muruttetuwe Ananda Thera, Ven. Elle Gunawansa Thera and Ven. Bengamuwe Nalaka Thera who have written to President Gotabaya Rajapaksa expressing their views and their opposition to the 20th Amendment in its present form.

These monks have been supportive of former President Mahinda Rajapaksa on previous contentious issues. Hence their opposition to the 20th Amendment will strike a chord with the public which will note their concerns as not being politically motivated and therefore having greater credibility.

While the main opposition party, the Samagi Jana Balavegaya (SJB) has registered its vehement opposition to the proposed 20th Amendment, there is little the party can do by itself to mobilise masses in the current political and social climate, especially in the context of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The SJB has only 54 seats in Parliament and, even with the assistance of other opposition parties, it

is difficult to muster the 75 seats needed to thwart the passage of the proposed 20th Amendment. It is also handicapped in its efforts to organise public agitation because of the ongoing pandemic.

Therefore, despite the voices of dissent that are emerging from both within and without the Government, it is likely that the 20th Amendment, incorporating the changes suggested by the Supreme Court, will become law and take its due place within the annals of the 1978 Constitution.

The Government is then likely to concentrate its efforts on promulgating a new Constitution entirely. This is also a priority for President Gotabaya Rajapaksa who believes the present Constitution is not best placed to take the country forward as evidenced by its recent multiple

amendments. The Government has already appointed a committee headed by prominent lawyer and President's Counsel Romesh de Silva to formulate the contours of the proposed new Constitution. This is however a much more onerous task than enacting the 20th Amendment- and will take a longer time.

Electoral system change

That Constitution too is likely to incorporate a Presidential system of Government. A major reform being contemplated is a change to the system of elections. Both the first-pastthe-post and PR systems of elections have not been very successful in Sri Lanka over the past seventy-two years of self-rule.

Various modifications to the system of elections incorporating salutary aspects of both election methods are being considered. Countries which use a 'hybrid' system of elections are being studied to arrive at a method which will be most beneficial and practical to Sri Lanka.

The 20th Amendment, when enacted, will confer a significant degree of authority on President Gotabaya Rajapaksa. Already armed with a mandate from the people from December last year, it will enable the President to act swiftly and with sweeping authority to enact his programme of reforms.

While some opposition is expected to the 20th Amendment, those in Government do not doubt that it will be enacted. The focus will then shiftat least in the short term- to containing the Covid-19 pandemic, before the greater challenge of enacting a new Constitution is dealt with.

fter the outbreak of Covid-19 earlier this year, some predicted that the pandemic's economic reverberations in Sri Lanka would lead China to increase its already considerable funding to the island state. Indeed, as early as mid-March 2020, the China Development Bank agreed to lend Sri Lanka US\$ 500 million when it upsized an existing facility signed in 2018. More recently, the CDB agreed to lend a further US\$ 140 million to the state-owned Bank of Ceylon.

Predictions of Sri Lanka's closer ties with China have redoubled since the sweeping electoral victory of the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna—the party of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa—in the country's legislative elections on August 5.

Several factors could propel Sri Lanka and China to forge closer relations, but there are also some countervailing pull factors that may limit the extent of China's funding and influence. An underappreciated pull factor is the contribution of Multilateral Development Banks (MDBs) to alleviating the country's economic burdens. During the Covid-19 pandemic, MDBs like the Asian Development Bank have contributed far less to Sri Lanka than they have to other South Asian countries. This in turn has amplified China's bilateral role in the country. Increased funding from MDBs could reduce the depth of China's future footprint in Sri Lanka.

A recent paper by Chatham House, which I co-authored with other Sri Lankan colleagues, challenged the narrative that Sri Lanka is mired in a Chinese debt trap—noting that debt to China amounted to less than 6% of GDP in 2018. Nevertheless, it also recognised the risk of a debt trap in the future, and critics have pointed out that loans from China come with fewer procedural safeguards than those from MDBs.

The predicted negative economic growth in Sri Lanka this year as a result of the global pandemic will add pressure to the country's debt-to-GDP ratio, which stood at 87% last year, and to its ability to service that debt with limited dollar reserves. These concerns are despite Sri Lanka's success in containing the pandemic due to early and decisive steps like closing its borders in March and an active contact tracing system. At the end of July

2020, there were fewer than 2,900 cases and 11 deaths.

Sri Lanka's challenging economic reality is among the strongest push factors towards its greater dependence on Chinese bilateral aid. This is particularly because of China's reliably swift responses—a speed that was also evident after the devastating terrorist attacks on Easter Sunday last year, when China was the first country to relax its travel advisory about Sri Lanka.

New development projects

Further push factors include the new Government's need to garner global support to defend Sri Lanka's human rights record in international forums, increase foreign investment, modernise its technological capabilities and meet its significant infrastructure gap (at an estimated cost of US\$ 24 billion based on a 2014 World Bank study) through existing projects under the Belt and Road Initiative and new development projects. An additional push factor is the growth of China's public diplomacy, including with Sri Lanka's majority Buddhist community.

On the other hand, the logistical difficulties faced during the pandemic by many construction and other companies in Sri Lanka point to the country's need to diversify its supply chains from China. Other pull factors that sustain Sri Lanka's non-China relationships,

and can thereby limit China's influence, include Sri Lanka's need for economic assistance from diverse sources and its multifaceted security relationships with India and other partners. More generally, pull factors encompass Sri Lanka's need to give visible contours to a non-aligned foreign policy that it has pledged to continue, particularly in view of spiralling US—China tensions.

One pull factor that warrants special mention is the extent to which international financial institutions are aiding, or could aid, Sri

Lanka. After the outbreak of Covid-19, Sri Lanka sought US\$ 300 million from the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and an additional amount from the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB), and renewed its discussions with the International Monetary Fund (IMF). Sri Lanka is yet to receive substantial funding from MDBs, relative to its neighbours. As of the end of July, MDBs had committed US\$ 386 million to Sri Lanka, compared to, for example, over US\$ 1 billion allocated to Nepal.

Although media reports have highlighted Chinese assistance to Sri Lanka, these reports neglect a comparative perspective. In effect, Chinese loans in this pandemic year are helping Sri Lanka to close its funding gap from MDBs. The role of multilateral aid in shaping China's post-Covid footprint in Sri Lanka is particularly significant because of opposition in some quarters to bilateral assistance, particularly from the US—which has offered a compelling US\$ 500 million grant for transport and land administration projects—and India, from which Sri Lanka has nevertheless accepted a US\$ 400 million swap facility that contributed markedly to Sri Lanka's foreign reserves

Chinese assistance

In this context, middle powers like Australia—which partnered with the World Health Organization to commit A\$ 600,000 to Sri Lanka's COVID-19 response—would do well to continue to support MDBs and other multilateral initiatives. Australia should likewise continue to back multilateral institutions like the Indian Ocean Rim Association that help to maintain a rulesbased, peaceful Indian Ocean—an objective that Sri Lankan policymakers know is indispensable to the country's future and will require the cooperation of many nations beyond China.

China has established itself as an enduring partner of Sri Lanka. During the Cold War, Sri Lanka turned alternately to the West and the Soviet Union, depending on its leaders in power. There is little such local vacillation in the 'new cold war' between the US and China; even the presumed pro-Western Government between 2015 and 2019 relied heavily on Chinese assistance.

That China will solidify its partnership with Sri Lanka appears a given, but the extent to which it does so will depend on multiple factors that link Sri Lanka to its non-Chinese partners. International financial institutions have a key role to play in diversifying Sri Lanka's international partnerships and engagement, a role that middle powers can also support in different ways.

The pertinent question that should be answered is as follows:

Do we, as sovereign people need (A) a strong and effective 'Executive Presidential system' or (B) a 'Hybrid model' of governance, where a combined group consist of President-legitimate position as the 'Executive' and (in addition to their legitimate function as Legislature) the Speaker/Prime Minister and other members of Parliament should exercise the 'Executive Powers of the people' under Article 4.

Two governance models

(1) RW/SP/ RS/RH/RB/UNF - The neo-liberal economic model coupled with western backed Westminster style Parliamentary system of governance advocating a near federal style of Constitution is in the process of bringing more and more constitutional and economic reforms leading to dilution of a strong Sri Lankan identity.

(2) MR/SLPP/GR/MS/SLFP - Those who oppose such moves are reliant on more socialist oriented market based economic development model coupled with a strong presidential system of governance with a more pragmatic form of

devolution of power to the periphery.

Most suitable governance model

This is a matter for the people of this country to ascertain the most suitable governance model for Sri Lanka which needs a political solution rather than just interpreting constitutional provisions.

The President, Maithripala Sirisena had at that time categorically stated that he cannot head a government of UNP/TNA as their agenda is to go beyond federalism. Also, then President Maithripala Sirisena had pointed out that there are pending court cases against the UNF on Bond scam reports, threats to national security etc. Unfortunately, he was a prisoner of circumstances where he couldn't get the support of the



THIRST IN ANURADHAPURA TO END SOON

he Government has been endeavouring to provide safe drinking water to the public. It is reported that around Rs. 150,000 million was spent by the Government in the last seven years for the supply of drinking water to the public. At present, under the National Water Supply and Drainage Board (NWSDB), 350 major water supply projects are in operation. The World Bank, Asian Development Bank and Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) have been continuously supporting the Government's efforts to provide potable water to rural villages where the risk of kidney disease is high.

The Green Climate Fund in association with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) have come forward with a financial donation of Rs. 6,500 million for enhancing climate-resilient decentralized water supply and management solutions to provide access to safe drinking water in seven districts including Anuradhapura. The NWSDB has started 10 mega water projects and wastewater projects for which the cost is estimated as USD 1,331. It is envisaged to increase water supply coverage from 49 percent to 60 percent by 2021. In the Anuradhapura District, there are 3,000 rural tanks and 15 major tanks. The total water capacity of those major tanks is nearly 700,000 acrefeet. In addition, three major rivers namely Yan Oya, Kala Oya and Malwathu Oya are available. But a significant number, around 856,000 persons, have fallen prey to kidney diseases due to the acute shortage of safe potable water in the Anuradhapura District.

In this background, JICA has agreed to provide funds to commence two mega water projects for the benefit of around 295,000 people living in Rambewa, Medawachchiya, Padaviya, Kebithigollewa, Horowpothana, Kahatagasdigiliya Divisional Secretariat divisions who are suffering from the lack of safe drinking water. It is learnt that a majority of the population in the Anuradhapura North region suffer from different health issues. They highly depend on unsafe groundwater which leads to Chronic Renal Failure (CRF).

Mahakanadarawa Reservoir (36,250 acrefeet) at the foot of Mihintale rock is the main water source for the emerging Anuradhapura North Water Supply Project - Phase II. It has been planned to supply 6,700 cubic meters water daily from the Mahakanadarawa Tank and to remove a quantity of 10,500 cubic meters water daily from Wahalkada Tank considering the drinking water requirement. Project Director Riswan told the *Daily News* that it is expected to obtain an additional vol-

ume of water annually from Moragahakanda

Reservoir within the next three years.

"At present, a water treatment plant with a capacity of 9,400 cubic meters is under construction close to Mahakanadarawa Tank.

Under this project, three underground tanks are being built at Rambewa, Madawachchiya and Pihimbiyagollewa and a few water towers are being constructed at Rambewa, Ethakada, Isinbessagala and Pihimbiyagollewa," he said.

According to him, the length of the main transmission line is 163 kilometres and a length of 340 kilometres of the main distribution line has been completed. A sum of Rs. 300 million has been allocated under the water project to renovate the canal system of Mahakanadarawa Reservoir. There are 28 water towers in the area that come under the Anuradhapura North Water Supply Project Phase I, controlled by community-based organizations in 28 Grama Niladari divisions. There is a problem with the safety and the quality of water that is being distributed from these C.B.O mini water projects and these water towers lack potable water for distribution. It is planned to provide adequate water to these water towers ensuring the quantity and quality of drinking water.

Anuradhapura North Water Supply Project
- Phase II Project Director Engineer Sudath
Rathnayake, referring to the current progress
of the project, said under Stage I of Phase II,

a total drinking water quantity of 16,500 cubic metres/day will be produced and further it is expected to produce 33,000 cubic metres/day under Stage – II.

"Other components of the water project include the construction of a 34,800 cubic metres/day intake, nine ground reservoirs and 11 elevator towers. The total length of the transmission and distribution lines would be 152 kilometres and 1,050 kilometres respectively," he explained.

Rathnayake said newly-inaugurated Horow-pothana Yan Oya Reservoir is the main water source for Phase II. Under Stage I of Phase II, the intake has been designed with a capacity of 34,800 cubic metres/day which is scheduled to be started next year. The construction of the mega water project is being accelerated under the guidance of Water Supply Ministry Secretary Engineer Priyath B. Wickrama and NWSDB Chairman Nishantha Ranatunga in association with irrigation authorities as per the vision of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa to provide safe drinking water to all.

Govt assures stable rupee and low-interest rate


Blood Donation Drive by Win-Stone Alumni

hey will never kill anyone. They will never intentionally hurt anyone. They will never verbally abuse anyone. They will never emotionally abuse anyone. They will never physically abuse anyone. But they will steal our hearts. They are part of the 40,000 people with Cerebral Palsy (CP) in Sri Lanka and the 17 million around the world, and others with Down syndrome or other developmental disorders.

Now there is an Innovative Teletherapy App to support these children with disability. Dilmah's CSR wing – the MJF Charitable Foundation has joined hands with Millennium IT, Microsoft, Sarva and World Vision Lanka and have launched disA-BILITY – an App that is designed to support children with disability and their families by connecting them to expert guidance. This App is the first of its kind globally. It is available in Sinhala, Tamil and English. It offers invaluable teletherapy services for people with Cerebral Palsy (CP).

This is the power of collaboration for the common good. Microsoft provided access to its Azure platform, initiating the

problem is intensified by the lack of access to knowledge and advice. He proudly stated that the dream of his father, Merrill J. Fernando must come true. The beauty of it all is that these essential therapies will be made available to those who cannot afford those services. I say this because these children are different in their abilities," explained

Fernando went on to say that we can help these children by sharing knowledge about them and how to engage with them. So, people can see them for what they really are. We need to understand, then accept and then include them.

"We must not underestimate the power of collaboration." Covid19 showed us one thing and that is without cooperation nothing can be accomplished. And this applies to all levels. What we are doing with these children, we have accomplished through team work and unity. We could never have done it alone. This is the very best of Sri Lankan expertise. This is cutting edge technology. It is all about commitment and getting the message out. We must bring about the change which is so crucial," pointed out

Head of Rehabilitation Services MJF Charitable Foundation/ Director NCCCPDD (Centre for Children with Cerebral Palsy and other Developmental Disorders), Gopi Kitnasamy, pointed out that the Centre for Children with Cerebral Palsy and other Developmental Disorders (NCCCPDD) is a joint venture with the Cerebral Palsy Lanka Foundation opened in 2016.

"Since then two additional centers have opened in Kalkudah and in Kandy. Approximately 400 children and youth with disability receive daily support from the four centers. These centers offer educational and therapy services. We work with the community even offering a special kind of wheelchair designed to accommodate their unique disabilities. These services are offered where and when it is needed. We also offer screening camps, where in different regions we identify children with these unique disabilities through our multi-disciplinary team. The biggest need is reaching out to these children. By saying that, I feel that there is

> a bit of a gap where this is concerned. There is a barrier when it comes to reaching out to these children. So, we are studying how to bridge this gap and make our services available for these children. Some of

these children in wheelchair camps have never been to a hospital or seen by a doctor. This is shocking," lamented Kitnasamy.

He said that the wheelchair camps nad been started to somehow get these

children out of their homes. Otherwise they are housebound. With the lockdown, the services offered to these children got interrupted. This caused a decline in the services offered. So then came the teletherapy initiative. So, through a Whatsapp group we started a teletherapy initiative. This proved successful with benefits.

"So, we decided to take this approach to the society itself – teletherapy and tele-screening. So, we got together with Millennium IT and decided to design an APP- or a solution platform. Then this was also introduced to the You Tube channel. We then did the first trilingual You Tube channel to support the families of the disabled. The good thing about this disABILITY App is that it can screen every disability and identify developmental disorders. Most parents have no knowledge about these disabilities. Here time is of the essence when identifying these disorders. The therapy needs to be started as soon as possible. Early intervention is the best way to handle these disorders," explained Kitnasamy.

The progress of the child can also be monitored here through this APP. There are no multi-disciplinary teams in every hospital in rural areas. Through this APP whichever district you are in and whichever town you are in, you can obtain these services. This is a gift to these families who can directly obtain help.

"They can send their details to us and after answering a simple Q&A the team can identify what problem this child actually has," stated Kitnasamy.

National Director World Vision Lanka, Dr. Dhanan Senathirajah,in his statement said that the way we treat our children and the most vulnerable in society defines our culture, society and who we are. That is why he stressed that nobody should be left behind.

"Since 1977, World Vision Sri Lanka has been serving the people of Sri Lanka in development and relief programmes. The Area Development Programme (ADP) is a long-term program spanning from 12-15 years that primarily focuses on children and communities. We are a child focused organization. We work in 31 locations across 15 districts in Sri Lanka. We are perhaps the largest international NGO to operate in Sri Lanka. We are proud to say that we have made a significant impact in this country when it comes to the welfare of vulnerable Sri Lankan children," said Dr. Senathirajah.

He went on to say that it is the desire and focus of World Vision to work in the most vulnerable areas in Sri Lanka. Sri Lanka has also changed a lot since the end of the war against the LTTE. However, there still are pockets of vulnerability and pockets of poverty in Sri Lanka.

"So, there are children who really suffer because their parents do not have the necessary resources or knowledge. So, this is why we are involved in this collaboration. Our work has always been community driven. We work with local government bodies and communities in identifying the needs of these communities. We have field teams who work with communities and they are able to identify where these vulnerabilities are. Cerebral Palsy is one of those needs which we have identified. So, we want to bring the fullness of life to these children. The responsibility of building up the next generation is not only in the hands of the parents but it is a responsibility of the entire community," explained Dr. Senathira-

Head of Creative, SARVA, Nishantha Shantha Deva, explained that these children are extremely sensitive. They are possibly more sensitive than those who are considered 'normal'. Deva revealed to us that he too has a sister who is disabled. But he pointed out that though these children are disabled they have pure hearts - Hearts of gold.

"We all love people who are compassionate because they are able to receive and give love. These children are sensitive and love to be loved. They are innocent and trusting. They are more sensitive that the rest of us. I have personal experience. In a way I feel that what this world needs, is humans who are sensitive. A world with so many of these people is truly a beautiful world. These children have those qualities," said Deva.





Kandy was once a powerhouse of Sri Lanka football. But today it is in a forgotten state. When will the game of football that one time held its own and produced players of international class regain its former glory in. In the good old days Kandy enjoyed the glory of the football sport played by the British in Ceylon. Now this sport is on the decline and one wonders whether Kandy's football will

regain its former glory? looking back into Kandy football it reveals that football in Kandy had its origin in the 1930's during the World War when the British units were stationed in Kandy, with the onetime Commander in Chief of Allied Forces in South East Asia, Admiral Lord Louis Mountbatten had his headquarters in the hill capital, and gave a good flip up for the game. Today, all the facilities for the game are there, but the sport is virtually dead, especially in Kandy, no inter club domestic football is played. Schools continue to play in the Education Department tournament and some play their inter school matches. In the 1930's when football was given priority, some first class British football players displayed their versatility, representing the Kingstown and Queenstown regiments, the Royal Artillery and also the East African Rifles, who had quite a few Negro

gained popularity day by day, because it was played with great interest and enthusiasm. Some of the clubs which took in the game in the 1930's were, Old Antonians SC, Old Kingswoodians SC, Police SC, Kandy YMCA, Greenfield SC, Kandy Sports Club, Young Stars SC, Phoenix SC, St. Michael's SC, Gampola Chums, Rovers SC,

Kandy YMMA and Red Stars SC.

It was at that time the Kandy District Amateur Football League was formed. It subsequently changed its name to Kandy Association Football League. And served football in Matale, Gampola, Nawalapitiya, Kurunegala and Kegalle, and as the years passed by, these towns formed their own leagues. When Football in Colombo and elsewhere received a setback as far as Ceylonese exponents of the game were concerned, the game was more or less confined to the permanent population as well as to the services. Early in 1942, however, there appeared to be a lack of interest in the game, and the efforts made by S.C. Traill the then secretary to call a meeting of the League having failed he was compelled to return the trophies to the donors.

At that time the game seemed to be seriously affected. But fortunately G.H. Robins, T.P.C. Roberts who were then stationed in Kandy and M.S.Jainudeen were mainly responsible in resuscitating the game. A tournament for the Main Shield was inaugurated with the participating of the Services Footballers in Kandy and football

began to thrive again. At that time Bogambara was the location of


high activity. Football had wide acceptance amongst our people - particularly the common masses and the middle class. From its humble beginning almost over ninety years, it has come to stay as a popular mass sport. As years went on football flourished in Kandy, and several schools in and around Kandy took up the game. It was St. Anthony's College, who first played football. It must be recalled that late M.S.Jainudeen as Secretary of Kandy football, went all out to popularize the game in

Kandy. Kandy is a founder member of the football's controlling body. In the good old days league, knockout and seven a side tournaments were conducted with over 250 matches, with only one ground available, that is Bogambara. From the early years of barefoot competitions to the late age of modern football, Kandy played a vital role in its growth. Lately football has surprisingly taken a back seat in Kandy. Previously the game was promoted to great heights and also produced a President and Secretary from Kandy for the governing body. Then came the Kandy Football Referees Association. In the late '40's with pioneers like Philip Buultjens, Kingsley Abeyasinghe, R. Jaymon, S.A.C. 'Gunner' Mohideen as active referees and later A.J.M. Yusuf, M.E. Marikar, Tom Ossen, B.D. Alfred, Jinadasa, T. Kumala Mohamed, M. Jamaldeen, handled the whistle.

First president from Kandy at FFSL was DIG Bodhi Liyanage and the first secretary was Hafiz Marikar. And some of the people who gave a big hand for football in the early days were people like late Col. V. H. L. Anthonis, A. C. L. Ratwatte E.L. Senanayake, M.S. Jainudeen, Dr. C.D.L. Fernando, S. Nadaraja, Kumala Mohamed. William Premaratne L.P. Wijeratne, W.B Abeyasinghe, S. Sirisena and M. Mohamed to name a

Schools were the nursery of the clubs. Where St. Anthony's, Kingswood, Dharmaraja, Sri Rahula St. Paul's (now known as Sri Sumangala), Berravettes, Vidyaratha and St. Sylvester's excelled. In 1963 the Kandy Schools Football Association was formed and it did an excellent job to promote the game. Zahira Gampola, Nugawela Central, Gampola Vidyalaya, Wickrimabahu, Katherasen from Nawalapitiya, Highlands from Hatton and Zahira Matale played under the Kandy Schools Associa-

For the first time Kandy won the All Island Senior and junior League championship under the presidency of late B.M. Liyanage. The team was coached by Kumala Mohamed. With this win Kandy was offered a tour to Nepal to play in a tournament, for which teams from Pakistan, Bangladesh, India, Nepal took part and Kandy was placed second. It was the first ever Kandy team to tour overseas. Today not a single Kandy team participating in FFSL competi-



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Cricket in bio-bubbles can affect 'mental health', says Morgan

DUBAI, TUESDAY: England's white-ball captain Eoin Morgan said players should have the freedom to withdraw from tours if the biosecure bubbles are affecting their "mental health".

West Indies toured England in June, a month ahead of their three-Test series to restart cricket after the coronavirus pandemic halted most major sporting events across the globe.

Players have since been confined to bio-secure environments on tours and during tournaments, including at the ongoing Indian Premier League in the United Arab Emirates.

"We managed to fulfil all of our international fixtures for the summer," Morgan, who is also leading the Kolkata Knight Riders in the IPL, told various media.

"But to keep that level of bubble for 10 of the 12 months that we normally travel, I think is untenable. You can drill a player both mentally and physically. And it can cause extreme burnout, which nobody wants to see."



Planters' Association marks **World Habitat Day**

Completes 39,150 new houses for estate workers

The Planters' Association of Ceylon (PA) commended the exhaustive measures taken by Regional Plantation Companies (RPC) in completing 39,150 houses for estate workers on their plantations. In observance of World Habitat Day, earlier on this month, PA said that 10,000 more houses will be constructed in the next 5 years and handed over to registered estate workers, by the Plantations Human Development Trust (PHDT), a tripartite organisation of RPC's, plantation trade unions and Government of Sri Lanka. .

Currently there are 251,950 resident families on RPC estates with a total population of a little over one million; however, total number of registered workers is only 135,000. Of the total resident families on RPC estates 16% have got brand new houses while 57% have had their homes re-roofed.

Modular in design, each house is on a 7 perch block of land with a built up area

of 550 square feet, at a cost of LKR 1 Mn each. Each house comes complete with 2 bedrooms, a sitting area, kitchen, toilet and pipe borne water. Surrounding the house is an area of 3 perches that could be used


for home gardening. "Human resource is the backbone of the industry and the various housing projects re-iterate our commitment to improving the lifestyle and welfare of our worker population" explained Chairman of Planters' Association of Ceylon, Bhathiya Bulumulla who is also the Chief Exec-

Interbrand Releases 2020 Best Global Brands Report

Microsoft overtakes Google to enter top three

Amid a global pandemic with its significant impact on business in 2020, Interbrand has announced the brands that have fared best in its 2020 Best Global Brands ranking.

As expected, social media and communication brands have fared well in the past 12 months, with Instagram (#19). YouTube (#30) and Zoom (#100) entering the rankings for the first time.

Tesla has also re-entered the rankings at #40 with a brand value of US\$12,785m, having last appeared in the Best Global Brands table in 2017.

Other top performers include Amazon, ranking #2, increasing brand value by 60%, with a valuation of US\$200,667m. Media companies have also seen success among the turmoil created by Covid. Spotify (#70), saw brand value increase by 52% to US\$8,389m – jumping 22 places in the ranking, while Netflix rose to #41 with a 41% increase to US\$12,665m.

While Apple retained its top spot in the table, Microsoft's increase in value this year (US\$166,001m) means it has overtaken Google (#4) to reach the number 3 spot. Google has moved out of the top three for the first time since 2012. Meanwhile Samsung #5 (US\$62,289m) has broken into the top five for the first time

The remainder of the Top 10 comprises: Coca-Cola #6 (US\$56,894m), Toyota #7 (US\$51,595m), Mercedes-Benz

#8 (US\$49,268m), McDonald's #9 (US\$42,816m) and Disney #10 (US\$40,773m).

The top ten brands accounts for 50% of the total table value this year.

The 2020 Best Global Brands ranking also saw the 'Covid effect', with global shop closures causing the brand values of Zara (#35) and H&M (#37) to fall 13% and 14% respectively, with both dropping at least six places in this years' ranking. After two years as the top growing sector, luxury brands took a hit in 2020, with all but one brand value falling between 1-9%.

Other brands and industries have benefitted from the 'Covid effect', notably logistics which saw an average of 5% growth -UPS (#24), FedEx (#75) and DHL (#81) all saw positive brand valuation growth, as the logistics sector as a whole became more central to our lives in lockdown.

Hambantota Chamber partners HIPG to teach Chinese to local community

The Hambantota District Chamber of Commerce (HDCC) has joined hands with the Colombo University China Language Centre and the Hambantota International Port to provide Chinese language lessons to Hambantota district residents.

The Chamber began the language learning programme four vears ago, with the goal of educating the Hambantota business community, especially the tourism sector, on Chinese language and culture.

"With HIPG coming on board and support from the Colombo University China Language Center in sourcing teachers, the second phase of our Chinese language teaching project was a great success.

The one year study programme has benefited over 150 participants so far and has been extended to HIPG employees as well. The Chamber together with the Colombo University China Language Center, conducts classes structured for the Hambantota district community's public sector officials, school kids, tourism sector and the business community. Wickremanayake says their teachers and students are passionate about their lessons. The HDCC

suffered a setback when the pandemic hit, "although we began online lessons on WeChat during the lockdown, it has not been very successful where school kids are concerned, since parents are reluctant to send their children for lessons.
