A special operation had been launched by the Police to trace those who had travelled out of the Western Province prior to the quarantine curfew coming into effect disregarding the prior notifications issued by the Police and the Security Forces.

Accordingly, Police Spokesman DIG Ajith Rohan warmed that all such persons who had violated these orders would be charged under the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance.

He noted that reports regarding per-

sons who had somehow avoided being detected at Police checkpoints and had left the Western Province to vacation at lodges, tourist hotels and guest houses in other Provinces have been obtained
