The 23rd victim is a female (61) who died at her house in Colombo 15 yesterday. She was tested positive

after a post mortem.

The 22nd victim was a 68-year-old female, who was pronounced dead on November 1 at her home in Jampettah Street in Colombo, Government Information Department stated. The Health Director-General has confirmed that her cause of death was ruled as COVID
