MINISTRY COMMITTEE TO PROBE RECENT COVID DEATHS

GMOA WANTS THOROUGH REVIEW INTO HOME CASUALTIES

The Health Ministry has taken meas-

The Health Ministry has taken measures to conduct a probe into the recent COVID-19 deaths in Colombo amidst the second wave of infections, Health Services Deputy Director General Dr. Hemantha Herath said yesterday.

Accordingly a three-member committee comprising the Primary Health Services Director Dr. Priyantha Atapattu, Consultant Dr. Hasitha Tissera of the Epidemiology Unit and Consultant Dr. Ajith Tennakoon has been appointed to conduct a scientific review into the COVID 19 related home deaths reported recently.

Dr Herath stated that eight out of the 22 deaths with the onset of the second corona wave were reported as home

deaths. Some of them died while under-

deaths. Some of them died while under-going quarantine and certain deaths were reported from isolated areas. "There had been several reports of coronavirus patients dying at home in the Colombo district. Investigations were underway to determine whether there was an epidemiological or health cause for the deaths at home. Coronavi-rus infection could lead to pneumonia or other complications and we want to

rus infection could lead to pneumonia or other complications and we want to see whether the COVID-19 virus had directly or indirectly contributed to the recent deaths." he said. Dr. Fernando told the media yesterday that about 50 percent of recent COVID-19 deaths have occurred at home and that these conditions need
