Delay on first section from 2015 to 2019, caused loss of Rs. 8 billion

The Committee on Public Enterprises (COPE) held in Parliament last Friday disclosed that the construction of the Central Expressway has been surrounded by several irregularities.

Accordingly, it was revealed that the more than Rs. 1.7 billion had been spent on the feasibility study of this road alone, a statement issued by the Parliamentary Communication Division said on Saturday. It was revealed that the delay in the commencement of work on the first section of the Central Expressway extending from Kadawatha



to Mirigama during from 2015 to 2019, has caused a financial loss of Rs. 8 billion.

It was also revealed that the selection of SMEC for the first feasibility study took place without a procuretook place without a procure-ment process. Furthermore, the project which was under three phases as the North-ern Expressway in 2012 had been changed to four phases as the Central Expressway by 2015.

COVID dead: Cremations to continue
