India, West-Sindh Coast-Changes at the Mouths of the Indus.

The Officer in charge, Marine Survey of India, has given notice, that the spit in the neighbourhood of the Kakaiwari mouth, lat. 23° 51′ N., long. 67° 30′ E., no longer exists. The edge of the sand and mud dry at low water extends from Hajamro beacon S.E. for 22 miles to lat. 23° 50′ N., long. 67° 34′ E., then E. by S. 8 miles and E. by N. \(\frac{1}{2}\) N. 7 miles, to lat. 23° 50′ N., long. 67° 49′ E. The position of the 10-fathom line has not materially altered.

China-South-East Coast-Hongkong Harbour-Buoyage.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 653 of 1895) that on August 29, 1895, the two buoys (red and white in horizontal stripes) marking the western end of Central Fairway, of the western entrance into Hongkong harbour, would each show a fixed red light.
