Bay of Bengal—Madras Coast—Exhibition of fixed Red Lights—Artificial Harbour.

The Acting Presidency Port Officer, Madras, has given notice (No. 35 of 1895) that on or after January 1, 1896, a fixed red light will be exhibited from each of the towers marking the entrance to the artificial harbour. The lights will be dioptric port lights of the sixth order, showing all round the compass. Range six miles in clear weather. On the exhibition of these lights the buoys inside the entrance will be removed at an early date.

New Zealand—Port Nicholson—Time Signal at Wellington.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 662 of 1895) that the time signal (ball) at the inner end of the Railway wharf, Wellington, is only given when favourable weather has permitted satisfactory observations, or about once a week.

BENGAL.—No. 2.

*New Zealand, North Island—Manukau Harbour—
Alterations in South Channel and in North Head
Beacon Lights.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 668 of 1895) that owing to the extension of the shore bank westward of South head, Manukau harbour, the northern of the three beacons on North head has become useless as a leading mark, and the beacon has consequently been removed and the light (fixed white) previously shown from it discontinued.

There are now therefore only two leading beacons on North head, each showing a fixed white light.

Also, that the north end of Emma band has extended to the eastward, and the two beacons on North head in line lead over the edge of that bank.

Vessels entering Manukau harbour by South channel should keep the beacons on North head in line until Kaitaraki point is open of South head, and then bring the northern of those two beacons well open eastward of the southern one.

Approximate position, North head beacons : lat. $37^{\circ} 2' S.$, long. $174^{\circ} 33\frac{1}{4}' E.$

*Japan—Kiusiu Coast—Dangers on North-West side
of Gana She (Gani ze).*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 676 of 1895) that a recent survey of the dangers surrounding Gana she (Gani ze) shows that they extend considerably further north-westward than previously shown on the charts.

The outer north-western limit of the dangers extends from approximately lat. $33^{\circ} 4' 50''$ N., long. $129^{\circ} 35' 0''$ E., to lat. $33^{\circ} 5' 25''$ N., long. $129^{\circ} 35' 45''$ E.

*Eastern Archipelago—Lombok—Sunken Reef North-west of
Twins or Tveelings Islands.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 677 of 1895) of the existence of a reef, about $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables in length, east and west, and $1\frac{1}{2}$ cable in width, with a least depth of $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms on it, lying with the western point of Lawang, the north-western of the Twins, bearing S. 46° E., distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile, or approximately in lat. $8^{\circ} 15' S.$, long. $116^{\circ} 40\frac{1}{2}' E.$

*China Sea—Formosa, West Coast.
(1) Shoal Westward of Tyan kiang.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 678 of 1895) of the existence of a shoal of fine black sand, extending $1\frac{3}{4}$ mile westward from the entrance to Tyan kiang. From its outer edge, where there is a depth of 2 fathoms with 6 fathoms close seaward, Stone peak (501) bears S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. (S. 49° E.), distant 5 miles ; and Single peak N.E. (N. 45° E.).

Approximate position lat. $24^{\circ} 22' 55''$ N., long. $120^{\circ} 32' 45''$ E.

(2) *Sunken Rock North-westward of Oulan River.*

Also, of the existence of a sunken rock, about a cable in extent, with depths of $2\frac{3}{4}$ to 3 fathoms on it, lying with summit (south-eastern of two) of low hills north-eastward of Oulan river entrance bearing E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. (N. 82° E.), distant $3\frac{1}{10}$ miles ; and 2,227 feet summit S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. (S. 6° W.).

*Pacific Ocean—Fiji Islands.—Viti Levu—Rocks in
Albenghu Lagoon and depth in Sulphur Passage.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 679 of 1895) of the existence of a rock of small extent, nearly awash at high water, lying in Mbhenga lagoon, with southern summit (380) of Yanutha island bearing about N. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. (N. 3° W.), distant $3\frac{1}{10}$ miles ; and Stuart island E. by N. (N. 79° E.); or approximately in lat. $18^{\circ} 26' 0''$ S., long. $177^{\circ} 59' 20''$ E.

Also, that two small rocks awash at low water lie N. E. by E. (N. 56° E.), distant about 8 cables ; and N. E. (N. 45° E.), distant 6 cables, respectively, from the centre of Stuart island.

Also, that in passing out of the Sulphur passage, in approximately lat. $18^{\circ} 21' 40''$ S., long. $178^{\circ} 11' 30''$ E., a sounding of 6 fathoms was obtained in the centre.

*Australia, South Coast—Spencer Gulf—Intended
Lightvessel on Middle Bank.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 682 of 1895) that on or about December 15, 1895, a lightvessel will be moored near the western edge of Middle bank.

Middle bank lightvessel will show a fixed white light, visible from a distance of 10 miles in clear weather.

The lightvessel, painted red, will have one mast, with a ball at the masthead as a daymark, and will be moored in a depth of 4 fathoms at low water springs, with Riley point bearing S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. (S. 16° E.), distant $15\frac{1}{2}$ miles ; and Barn hill in line with Webling point E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. (N. 81° E.).

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 683 of 1895) that the lighthouse on Sugarloaf point is not situated on the hill (254), where it has hitherto been shown on the charts, but on the summit at the south-east extreme of the point marked 224, situated approximately in lat. $32^{\circ} 26' 20''$ S., long. $152^{\circ} 33' 40''$ E.

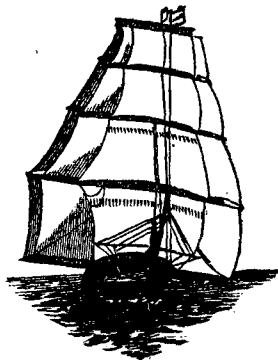
