The Customs Ordinance

IT is hereby notified that the following resolution under section 9 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,773 of September 24, 1947, was passed by the House of Representatives at its public session on February 1, 1955.

RESOLUTION

This House resolves under section 9 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,773 of September 24, 1947, that with effect from the date on which this resolution is notified in the *Gazette*, export duty on tea shall be levied and paid (in lieu of the existing export duties payable thereon under the Customs Ordinance) at the rate of one rupee per pound in addition to the export duties payable thereon under any written law other than the Customs Ordinance.

Provided, however, that in the case of any tea in respect of which a certificate is issued by the Principal Collector of Customs to the effect that such tea—

- (1) was prior to the midnight of 18/19 November, 1954, the property of the shipper and in the stores of the shipper or his vendor within the municipal limits of Colombo, and
- (2) is being exported before December 31, 1954, in fulfilment of a valid contract for the sale of such tea to a buyer outside Ceylon which was entered into by the shipper prior to the midnight of November 18/19, 1954,

export duty shall, notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this resolution, be levied and paid at the rate of seventy-five cents per pound in addition to the export duties payable thereon under any written law other than the Customs Ordinance
