# GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

- 1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions
- 2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time
- 3. Terms of Engagement.—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952
- (a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.
- (b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

- By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service, in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.
- (c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.
- (d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

- (e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.
- (f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.
- 4 Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese.
- A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.
- 5. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.
- 6. Other Requirements.—(1) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.
- (ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.
- (iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.
- (iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

#### **BY-LAWS**

- 1. These by-laws may be cited as the advertisements (Badulla Urban Council) by-laws, 1954.
- 2 (1) Subject to the provisions of by-law 7 of these by-laws, no person shall cause any advertisement to be displayed so as to be visible from any street, road, canal or lake, except on hoardings erected for the purpose by the Council and under the authority of a permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman
- (2) Every application for a permit to display any advertisement shall be made to the Chairman, at least 7 days before the date on which the display of the advertisement is intended to commence.

Provided, however, that the Chairman may in special circumstances entertain any such application which is not made within the time limit specified in the preceding provisions of this paragraph.

- (3) Every application referred to in paragraph (1) shall be accompanied by a copy of the advertisement which the applicant intends to display.
- (4) Where the Chairman approves an application referred to in paragraph (1), he shall direct the applicant to pay, for the permit to display the advertisement, a fee calculated at the rate of five rupees for each square foot, in respect of each year. Such permit shall not be issued to the applicant until such fee is paid
- 3 '(1) Where the permit to display an advertisement is issued to any person, the Chairman shall direct that person—
  - (a) to insert the number and date of that permit in every copy of that advertisement, or
  - (b) to cause every copy of that advertisement to be produced to the Chairman for the purpose of being stamped in token of the payment of the fee for that permit.

- (2) Every person to whom a direction under paragraph (1) of this by-law is given by the Chairman, shall carry out that direction.
- 4. (1) No person shall cause any advertisement to be displayed on any wall, building, house, any place of public worship, any public place or library or on any bridge, street lamp post, or telegraph or telephone post
- (2) No person shall on any street or road use any wireless set, gramophone, musical instrument, bell or other instrument for the purpose of displaying any advertisement.
- 5. (1) Where any advertisement is, in the opinion of the Chairman, in an unsightly or objectionable condition he may by written notice order the person causing the display of such advertisement to stop such display within the time specified in such notice.
- (2) A person to whom a notice under paragraph (1) is sent by the Chairman shall comply with such notice within the time specified therein.
- 6. No person shall deface or cause to be defaced any sign, mark, letter, word or figure which has been put on any advertisement by the Chairman in token of the payment of the fee for the permit to display that advertisement.
  - 7. No person shall cause-
  - (a) any advertisement to be displayed on a vehicle in a manner or form other than that approved by the Chairman, or
  - (b) any vehicle bearing any illuminated advertisement, other than an illuminated advertisement approved by the Superintendent of Police, to be driven on any street or road.
- 8. Any person who acts in contravention of any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees and in the case of a continuing contravention, to a further fine not exceeding fifteen rupees for every day during which the contravention is continued after conviction or after service of a written notice from the Chairman directing attention to such contravention
- 9. Nothing in these by-laws shall prevent any person in the course of or for the purposes of his trade or business displaying any advertisement relating to such trade or business upon the premises in which such trade or business is carried on.
- 10. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires -
  - "advertisement" includes any word, letter, number, sign, placard, board, notice, device, model or representation in the nature of or used wholly or partly for the purposes of advertisement, over or resting upon any land, building or structure;
  - "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council;
  - "Council" means the Badulla Urban Council;
  - "hoarding" means any structure, support, post, board, wall, case or any other contrivance erected or used for the purpose of displaying any advertisement.

The by-law relating to the attaching or affixing of posters, placards, handbills and other notices published in *Gazette* No 8,090 of November 16, 1934, is hereby repealed.

#### **BY-LAWS**

- 1. These by-laws may be cited as the Rambukkana Town Council Market By-laws, 1954.
- 2. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—
  - "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council;
  - "Council" means the Rambukkana Town Council;
  - "market area" means the area declared by by-law 3 to be the market area; and
  - "public market" means the public market established or maintained by the Council.
- 3. The area within the administrative limits of the Rambukkana Town Council is hereby declared to be the market area assigned to the Rambukkana public market.
- 4. Within the market area, no person shall sell, offer or expose for sale any meat, poultry, fresh fish, vegetables or fruit except in the public market:

Provided that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to—

- (a) the sale of poultry, fruit or vegetables by itinerant vendors who do not sell at fixed places, or do not for the purposes of such sale establish themselves on the public roads or other public places;
- (b) the sale by the licensee of an eating-house or a tea or coffee boutique, of ripe plantains or other fruits for consumption on the premises;
- (c) the sale by any person of young coconuts;
- (d) the sale of vegetables or fresh fruit at any authorised premises other than the public market. In this paragraph "authorised premises" means any premises authorised by a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman.
- 5 The licensee of any authorised premises referred to in by-law 4 (d) shall cause his name and the names of his salesmen to be registered at the office of the Council.
- 6. (1) No person shall hold, use or occupy any stall, seat or space in the public market, unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman or otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.
- (2) Every licence referred to in paragraph (1) shall be substantially in the form set out in Schedule A hereto.
- (3) Every holder of a licence shall pay rent at the rates prescribed in Schedule B. hereto
- 7. No person shall keep or expose for sale in any stall, seat or space in the public market any article the keeping or sale of which is prohibited by the Council.

- 8. Where by notice exhibited at the spot by or under the authority of the Chairman, the Council sets apart or any part of the market for the exclusive sale of any article or class of articles, no person shall—
  - (a) sell or expose for sale such article or class of articles in any place in such market other than the place so set apart, or
  - (b) sell or expose for sale any other article or class of articles in the part so set apart.
- 9. No person suffering from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease shall occupy any stall, seat or space in a public market or expose for sale thereat, any provisions whatsoever.
- 10. No person using or occupying any portion of the public market shall—
  - (a) behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about such market;
  - (b) carry on any cooking;
  - (c) damage in any way any portion of the buildings, stalls, lamps or any property of the Council in or about such market;
  - (d) enclose in any way any portion of such market, or any stall, seat or space therein;
  - (e) defile or pollute in any way water provided for use in such market;
  - (f) keep such portion in a filthy and unclean manner:
  - (g) introduce or cause to be introduced, or keep any dog, cat or other domestic animal, or bird or reptile in such market;
  - (h) remain in or loiter about such market after the place is closed for business without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself.
- 11. No person shall throw any rubbish, filth, dirt or refuse or any article likely to be offensive or injurious to the public health, except into a receptacle provided for the purpose
- 12 No person shall within the public market or its premises—
  - (a) keep any vehicle for a longer period than is necessary for the loading and unloading of goods, or
  - (b) bring any vehicle into the cemented portion of the premises of the market.
- 13 No meat or carcase of any animal which has not been slaughtered at the public slaughter-house of the Council shall be brought into the public market except with the written authority of the Chairman Provided, however, that the preceding provision of this by-law shall not apply to trozen meat, game or fish imported into the Island.
- 14. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer authorised by him in that behalf to inspect the market and to seize any article of food kept or exposed for sale therein which appears to him to be unwholesome and to convey such article to the Medical Officer of Health, and, if the Medical Officer of Health certifies that any article of food so seized is unwholesome and unfit for human consumption such article of food shall be destroyed without payment of any compensation to the person from whose possession it was seized
- 15 Whenever it appears to the Council that the use or the consumption of any article of food is

injurious or harmful to the public, it shall be lawful for the Council, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health after sufficient notice to the public, to prohibit for such time as may be necessary, the keeping or exposure for sale in the public market of any such article of food.

- 16. (1) It shall be the duty of the market keeper of the public market to maintain order and discipline within the market premises.
- (2) No person shall obstruct or resist the market keeper or any person appointed by the Chairman to superintend the public market or to collect rents and fees therein or to enforce order or cleanliness therein in the execution of his duty.
- (3) When any obstruction, or resistance to any officer on duty in the market premises is apprehended he shall be given Police assistance in the maintenance of order and discipline.
- 17.(1) No person occupying a stall, space or seat in the market shall wilfully or without reasonable cause neglect or refuse to serve the public during the time the market is open for business.
- (2) The public market shall be open for business daily between the hours of 630 a.m. and 10 p m
- 18. If the Council does not employ an officer to collect the rents and fees payable for the use or occupation of the market, it may lease the right of collecting such rents and fees to any approved person—
  - (a) by private treaty, or
  - (b) by calling for tenders, or
  - (c) by putting up the right the public auction
- 19. The rents and fees payable in respect of a public market shall be paid on demand or paid to the Council in terms of an agreement or article of contract signed therefor by the occupier or lessee of the market.
- 20. No occupier of a stall, seat or space in the public market shall, without the written permission of the Chairman—
  - (a) transfer or assign his right to any other person,
  - (b) sub-let or allow the right of a occupation of any part of any such stall, space or seat allowed to him to any other person, or
  - (c) permit any person other than a servant or agent whose name has been registered at the office of the Council, to use or occupy any part of the stall.
- 21. No person shall use or occupy any stall in the public market or any part thereof under any alleged transfer or sub-lease, without the written permission of the Chairman
- 22. Every stall holder who pays a monthly rent to the Council and who decides to terminate the tenancy of his stall shall give the Chairman one calendar month's notice of his intention to terminate such tenancy or pay one month's rent in lieu thereof.
- 23. It shall be lawful for a court of competent jurisdiction to cancel any licence issued under these by-laws on a second or subsequent conviction of the licensee by such court for a breach of any of these by-laws.
- 24. Any person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws shall be punishable with a fine

not exceeding fifty rupees and with an additional fine not exceeding ten rupees for each day during which the breach is continued after a conviction thereof by a court of competent jurisdiction or after written notice from the Chairman directing attention to the breach.
