Government Notifications

THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS (REGULATION) ORDINANCE, No. 29 OF 1939

Notification under Section 6

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 6 (1) of the Agricultural Products (Regulation) Ordinance, No. 29 of 1939, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Junius Richard Jayewardene, Minister of Agriculture and Food, after consultation with the Agricultural Products (Regulation) Board, do by this notification—

(1) prescribe—

- (a) that in order to obtain a licence to import a specified quantity of any of the regulated products mentioned in Column I of the schedule hereto, an importer must purchase a quantity of the local product mentioned in the corresponding entry in Column II in the ratio and at the price mentioned in the corresponding entries in Columns III and IV respectively of that Schedule; and
- (b) that the place at which the above-mentioned local products will ordinarily be delivered shall be Colombo; and

(2) cancel all notifications previously made under the said section 6 (1).

THE INDIAN IMMIGRANT LABOUR ORDINANCE

Notification

It is hereby notified that, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by regulation 1A of Chapter 1 of the regulations made under section 14 of the Indian Immigrant Labour Ordinance (Chapter 111), and published in *Gazette* No 7,339 of July 13, 1923, as amended by the regulation published in *Gazette* No. 7,358 of October 26, 1923, and modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, the Acting Minister of Labour has been pleased to direct that the quarterly instalments of acreage fees payable to the Commissioner of Labour by employers of Indian Immigrant Labourers on estates of the description named in Schedule A attached to the said regulations shall, in respect of the quarter ending on June 30, 1954, and of all subsequent quarters in respect of which this Notification remains in force, be determined in accordance with the following scale :—

(1) Tea	} .. 30 cents per acre
(2) Tea interplanted with rubber	
(3) Tea interplanted with cacao	
(4) Tea interplanted with cardamoms	} . 10 cents per acre
(5) Rubber	
(6) Cacao	
(7) Cardamoms	
(8) Rubber interplanted with cacao	
(9) Rubber interplanted with cardamoms	
(10) Cacao interplanted with cardamoms
