B—Appointments

Appointments including promotions will be governed by the Public Service Regulations and Public Service Commission Rules.

(a) Appointments which carry salaries above Grades I and II will be made in such manner as the Public Service Commission may direct. Special merit, subject to the possession of appropriate qualifications, will form the main basis of selection. Seniority will be of secondary consideration. It should be noted that officers will be eligible to be appointed only to the higher posts of the Division to which they were originally appointed.

(b) Appointments to the Preliminary Grade of Medical Officers will be made as follows :—

All appointments will normally be made to the Preliminary Grade in the first instance.

Candidates successful in the Final Examination of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Ceylon, or possessing medical qualifications registrable in Ceylon, will be recruited to the Preliminary Grade on their own applications.

(c) Applications to the Grade of Medical Officers will be made as follows :—

Applications to Grade II of the Grade of Medical Officers will be made from the Preliminary Grade subject to Section D at page 28 hereunder.

(d) Appointments to the Grade of Medical Officers of Health will be made as follows :—

Appointments to Grade II of the Grade of Medical Officers of Health will be made from the Preliminary Grade subject to Section D hereunder.

Officers will be selected subject to the existence of vacancies, from those who opt to join this Grade. Officers appointed to this Grade will not ordinarily be permitted to revert to any other Grade.

(e) Appointments to the Grades of Medical Officers of the Psychiatric Service will be made as follows :—

(i) All new appointments generally will be to Grade II of the Service, and will be made from the general grade of Medical Officers of the Department, but in exceptional circumstances, appointments may be made to any particular post or grade of the division, either by direct recruitment or otherwise.

(ii) Appointments to Grade II will in the first instance be on an acting basis, and should an officer's service be found unsatisfactory during the acting period, he will be reverted to the general grade of Medical Officers of the Department. On such reversion, an officer will be placed at that point in the general grade of Medical Officers, at which he would have been had he remained throughout in this grade.

(f) Appointments to the Grade of Medical Officers of the Laboratory Services will be made as follows :—

(i) All appointments to the Grade of Medical Officers will be made from the general grade of Medical Officers of the Department, and will in the first instance be for a period of one year. During this period officers will be given a training in those subjects pertaining to the posts for which they have been selected. On successful completion of training, officers will be posted to permanent posts in the Laboratory Services and will have no right of reversion to the general grade of Medical Officers. Those who do not complete their training successfully or who are found unsuitable will be reverted to their substantive posts.

(g) The following terms of employment will be offered to Medical Officers rejoining Government Service and to Medical Officers who join after obtaining Specialist qualifications or after years of private practice :—

(i) *Medical Officers who resign their appointments to proceed to England and obtain any of the higher qualifications which are accepted by the Department and desire to rejoin the department immediately or after private practice in England or locally :—*

They will be placed at that point on the scale which they would have reached had they continued to serve the Government during their period of study for higher qualifications, provided that incremental credit will be given them only for such period as is normally allowed to a Government scholar of the Department to obtain that particular higher qualification. Recommendations for appointments above the initial salary of the appropriate scale, inclusive of any consideration for private practice subsequent to obtaining higher qualifications should be made after consultation with the Treasury.

(ii) *Medical Officers who resign their appointments to proceed to England to obtain higher qualifications but who fail to do so and desire to be re-admitted to the Department :—*

Ordinarily these officers will be taken on as New Entrants, on the initial salary of the grade from which they resigned.

(iii) *Medical Officers who join the department for the first time immediately after obtaining specialist qualifications at their own expense :—*

In these cases, the officers concerned may be placed at that point on the scale which they would have reached had they been in service for a period equivalent to their period of study for specialist qualifications provided that incremental credit will be given only for such period as is allowed to a Government scholar of the Department for obtaining these qualifications, after consultation with the Treasury.

(iv) *Medical Officers who join the Department for the first time after several years of private practice :—*

These officers will have to be taken after due considerations of the qualifications they possess and the experience they have gained and the number of years they have served as private practitioners. They will be allowed in respect of the qualifications obtained by them incremental credit only for such period as is normally allowed to a Government scholar of the Department to obtain such qualifications. As regards experience and the number of years of private practice it is difficult to lay down a general rule, but in respect of officers who possess special qualifications, e.g., Thoracic Surgeon, a Neuro-Physician, who would naturally be recruited at the instance of Government, special consideration should be given to the point of the scale at which he would be placed after consultation with the Treasury, but they should not normally be placed above the maximum of Grade II. If it is proposed to put the officer in Grade I, a special case should be made out to the Public Service Commission after consulting the Treasury.

(v) *Medical Officers who are lent to the University either on transfer or secondment and who revert :—*

The reversion of transferred officers will be discouraged but if agreed to, incremental credit will be given for the number of years service at the University. Seconded officers will be subject to the normal rules relating to reversion after secondment.

(vi) *Medical Officers and Medical Officers of Health entering Government Service after service with Local Bodies or Government sponsored Institutions —*

These officers will be given incremental credit and will be placed at a point in the scale corresponding to the number of years of service with the Local Body or the Government sponsored Institution concerned, subject to their not being placed above the maximum of Grade II. If it is proposed to put the officer in this category in Grade I, a special case should be made out to the Public Service Commission after consulting the Treasury.

N B—(i) In all cases other than secondment or employment of a quasi public character or cases (iii) and (iv) above, the period of service for pensionable purpose should count from the date of re-entry into the Department. This date will also determine an officer's seniority.

(ii) These rules will not apply to officers who are recruited on contract

(iii) In these cases the question of seniority will also be decided at the time of appointment

C—Seniority**(a) SENIORITY AT APPOINTMENT:**

Seniority in the Health Services will be governed by the provision of A. R. 141 in the Manual of Procedure subject to the following further provisions:—

(i) Where two or more grades are on a continuous time scale, they will be regarded as one grade for purposes of A. R. 141 (a).

(ii) Seniority among those appointed to the permanent service from the same date will be, in the case of Medical Graduates of the same examination, according to the order of merit in that examination and in the case of medical graduates of different examinations, by the dates of the examinations and the order of merit in each examination.

(b) SENIORITY IN SPECIALITIES:

(i) The only seniority that will be recognized is the official seniority dealt with under A. R. 141, that is, grade seniority. There will be no precedence amongst specialist officers.

D—Confirmation

(a) All officers appointed to the Permanent Grades of Medical Officers and Medical Officers of Health, will be on 2 years probation, and will be required to pass a departmental examination as specified below within 2 years of the date of their appointment.

(b) Failure to pass the examination within the period allowed will result in the deferment of the increment next due by a period equivalent to the period in excess of 2 years taken by the officer to pass examination with corresponding deferment of promotion to Grade II, and by loss of seniority. Failure to pass the examination within 3 years of the date of appointment will make an officer liable to discontinuance.

(c) The departmental examination referred to in sub-paragraph (a) will be held in conjunction with the examination for Civil Service and other public service officers quarterly in the months of January, April, July and October each year. Notice of this examination will be published in the *Government Gazette*, and applications to take up the examination should be made on forms obtainable from the Commissioner of Examinations. All Officers of the Permanent Grade, irrespective of their length of service in the Grade, are eligible to take up this examination.

(d) The departmental examination referred to in paragraphs (a) and (c) will be in two parts as indicated below. Candidates must take up all the subjects in their first appearance for the examination. They need appear in subsequent examination only for subjects in which they have failed. Payment of travelling expenses in connection with these departmental examinations will be in accordance with the Financial Regulations.

WRITTEN EXAMINATION:

PART I consists of a written examination in the subjects set out below. The percentage of marks required for a pass on these subjects are indicated against each of them.

Candidates will be expected to have a knowledge of the subjects only up to the standard required under-graduate medical students.

ORAL EXAMINATION:

PART II consists of an Oral Examination in whichever of the Ceylon Vernaculars not spoken by or familiar to the candidate as a child.

This oral examination will be conducted by Staff Officers of the Department of Health. The purpose of the Examination is to ascertain whether the candidates can carry on a conversation fluently in either language on subjects which will arise in the course of their normal duties.

Candidates are advised to pay attention to :—

- (a) General Regulations of the Department of Health.
- (b) All Public Service Regulations relating to discipline.
- (c) D. H. S' Circular No C. 685/EX/67/44 of September 16, 1944, relating to Departmental Inquiries.
- (d) Regulations for Stores Accounting, Department of Health
- (e) Financial Section of the Manual of the Department of Health.
- (f) Financial Regulations applicable to the day to day administrative duties of a Medical Officer or a Medical Officer of Health.
- (g) Hospital and Dispensary Charges as published in the *Government Gazette*.
- (h) Health Unit Procedure as given in the book entitled "A Guide to Health Unit Procedure in Ceylon" by Dr. S. F. Chellappah, O.B.E., and Dr. W. P. Jacocks, M.D., D.P.H.
- (i) Public Health Laws as given in the Legislative Enactments
- (j) Annual Administration Report of the Director of Health Services.
- (k) Annual Administration Report of the Registrar-General as far as it relates to Vital Statistics.

E—Training

(a) *Clinical Training*—Every Medical Officer will be required, as soon as it can be arranged, to undergo a course of Clinical Training for a period of 1 year, either in Colombo or in an outstation Provincial Hospital. The Clinical Training in Colombo will be confined to officers who have obtained a First or Second Class pass in their qualifying examination. This period of training will be divided into a period of six months in Medicine and six months in Surgery. Appointments to Clinical Training Posts will be made strictly in order of seniority.

(b) *Public Health and Other Specialist Training*.—Medical Officers and Medical Officers of Health in Grade II will be required to undergo short courses of training in Public Health, Midwifery and V. D. according to the requirements of the Department. These courses will normally be for a period of one month.

(c) *Refresher Course for Medical Officers*—Medical Officers, Grade I (Curative) not over the age of 50 years, if they so desire, may be permitted to follow a refresher course in the Ceylon University. The duration of the course will be for two months beginning from January 15 to March 15 every year. Only officers who have not, during the previous 5 years, had their post-licentiate course of training will be selected. This course will not be open to specialist officers. The number of admission to each course will be limited to six, and the selection will be made according to seniority.

F—Efficiency Bars

1. Medical Officers of Health in Grade II will be required to follow the course in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene conducted by the Faculty of Medicine, University of Ceylon, and pass the examination at the end of it before they can proceed beyond Rs. 6,240 which is the initial salary of the grade—that is, to earn the salary step of Rs. 6,600.

Facilities will be given by the department for officers to comply with this requirement in time.

The fees for the course will be paid by Government and the period of the course, viz., 6 months, will be set off as leave against—

- (a) Accumulated vacation leave of 3 preceding years.
- (b) Available commuted half-pay leave.
- (c) Special duty leave (up to maximum of 6 months)

2. Medical Officers in Grade II of the Psychiatric Service will be required to pass an examination in order to earn the salary step of Rs. 8,040. The examination will consist of three parts—

- (a) Written Paper (2 hours) : three questions ;
- (b) Clinical—(1) Long case, (2) Short case, and
- (c) Oral.

The syllabus for the Efficiency Bar examination shall be as follows :—

- (1) The symptomology, diagnosis and treatment of Psychosis.
- (2) The symptomology, diagnosis and treatment of Neurosis.
- (3) General Psychopathology
- (4) Law relating to mental disorders with special reference to Ceylon Lunacy Ordinance, Criminal Lunatics and relative sections of the Criminal Procedure Code.

Reading advised :—

- (1) Introduction to Psychological Medicine by Gordon, Harris and Rees.
- (2) Psychological Medicine by Curran and Gulman.
- (3) Conybeare Text Book of Medicine—Section of Psychological Medicine.
- (4) Psychology of Insanity by Beonard Heart.
- (5) Psychopathology by H. V. Dick.
- (6) Psycho-Analysis and its Derivation by Crichton Miller.
- (7) Psycho-Analysis by Glover.
- (8) Lunacy Ordinance.

G—Promotions

1. Promotion to the Special Grade will depend on merit especially in administrative ability. Seniority will be a secondary consideration.

2. Medical Officers will be required before receiving promotion to Grade I to obtain the following qualifications in addition to the satisfactory record of service and conduct:—

- (i) D.T.M. & H. (Cey.) and the 6 months Clinical Training Course at the Ceylon University, or
- (ii) D.T.M. & H. (Eng.) and six months Clinical Training at a British University, or
- (iii) Specialist qualifications recognized by the Department as set out in Appendix I. This list is subject to revision from time to time and due notice of any change will be given.

Officers who are selected to qualify for promotion in terms of item 1 will be required to follow the Post-Graduate Course conducted by the University of Ceylon. Selection will be made strictly according to seniority under normal circumstances with the proviso that a junior officer may be given preference if he has reached such a salary point as entitles him to follow the course ahead of his seniors to avoid undue stagnation in Grade II. Should an officer who is required to follow the Post-Graduate Course decline to do so, his name will be considered in the year following, but no guarantee will be given that he will be selected if there are other officers whose promotions will get deferred. The fees for the course will be paid by the Government and the period of the course, viz., 1 year, will be set off as leave against—

- (a) Available vacation leave of 3 preceding years;
- (b) Available commuted half-pay leave;
- (c) Special duty leave (up to 6 months).

3. Medical Officers of Health should possess, in addition to a satisfactory record of service and conduct, one of the professional qualifications set out in Appendix I for promotion to Grade I.

4. Medical Officers (Psychiatric Service) will be required before receiving promotion to Grade I to possess the qualifications set out in Appendix I in addition to a satisfactory record of service and conduct.

5. Those qualified for promotion to Grade I as required above will proceed to Grade I, without waiting for vacancies after completion of two years on the maximum salary of Grade II (vide page 92 of Sessional Paper VIII of 1946).

6. Medical Officers (Curative) in service on December 31, 1945, who have qualified for promotion to Grade I would be given salary according to the Conversion Table appearing on page 197 of Sessional Paper X of 1947, and will proceed by normal annual increments to Rs. 10,800.

7. Medical Officers (Curative) in service on December 31, 1945, who have not qualified for promotion to Grade I, would receive conversion in terms of the Table for Grade II Officers on page 197 of Sessional Paper X of 1947, but they would not proceed beyond the salary of Rs. 9,360 until they obtain qualifications necessary for promotion to Grade I.

8. Medical Officers (Curative) on Rs. 6,720 and less on December 31, 1945, on the Sessional Paper VIII of 1934 scales would remain on Rs. 8,400 on the revised scale for two years before proceeding above that salary.

H—Transfers

1. (a) All Medical Officers and Medical Officers of Health belong to a transferable service, and they are liable to be transferred in accordance with the needs of the Department. The posts to which Medical Officers and Medical Officers of Health are liable to be transferred will be graded and transfers will be made as far as possible in accordance with the grading.

(b) As far as possible, all Medical Officers will be notified 2 months in advance of the probable vacant stations and they will be required to indicate their stations in order of preference. No guarantee, however, could be given that an officer will be appointed to a station of his preference. Notice of the station to which an officer is transferred will as far as possible be given a month earlier, except in the case of Institutions where Government quarters are available.

(c) Except in the case of officers who have not had their Clinical Training, an officer will be kept normally in a station for 3 years subject to the exigencies of the service.

2. (a) Appointments to Specialist posts will be made on merit, experience and qualifications and not on seniority. No such appointment, however, will be made to any institution if there is no need for such appointment, or no suitable officer is available.

It may be noted that there is no formal differentiation between Specialist posts and ordinary grade posts. A Specialist post is one which is normally filled by any officer possessing certain recognised specialist qualifications, and the appointment to the post is effected merely by departmental transfers. The number and the nature and the venue of such posts are therefore liable to be altered without notice.

(b) All specialists are liable to transfer like all other officers amongst institutions and amongst stations. Such transfers will be made according to the needs of the Department. A Specialist is as liable to transfer from Colombo as to Colombo. In making such transfers of Specialists, merit, experience, qualifications and period of service in a station will be considered.

(c) As is laid down above, all specialist officers are transferable, but certain institutions may in certain circumstances or at all times be regarded as more important than others (e.g., Colombo General Hospital takes precedence over Kandy. Then come Jaffna, Galle and Kurunegala hospitals. These take precedence over the other provincial hospitals). Transfers or postings to such institutions will be subject to the overall consideration of suitability. Subject to that consideration, the main basis of selection will be grade seniority and experience; the date of obtaining the specialist qualifications will be of secondary consideration. Selections will be made in order of grade seniority, preference being given to juniors in the grade only where seniors are deemed to be unsuitable for the particular appointment.

(d) Postings of Specialists will be made on the recommendations of a Departmental Committee, the Chairman of which will be the Deputy Director concerned. Such postings will be subject to the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary.

3. Officers required for posts in the Faculty of Medicine, Medical Research Institute and the other institutions which may confer a claim on officers for post-graduate studies abroad, will be selected by a Board constituted for the purpose, except in the case of University posts for which selections will be made by the Faculty.

Notice of vacancies for these posts will be given by the usual departmental circular. Claims of officers who apply for such appointments will be considered on the basis of qualifications, aptitude and merit.

I—Study Leave

(a) In view of the fact that it will not be necessary for a Grade II Medical Officer to proceed abroad to obtain qualifications which entitle him to promotion to Grade I, study leave abroad will be granted normally to those officers who will be required by the Department to obtain specialist qualifications to meet the requirements of the Department.

(b) Whenever Government decides to send officers abroad to obtain specialist qualifications, applications will be called for by the Director of Health Services by circular letter and by *Gazette Notification* indicating the specialties in which the Department proposes to train officers and the number of officers it proposes to train in each specialty. Applications will be received for training in particular specialties and selections for each specialty will be made from the applicants for training in this specialty. Selections will be made from those who have already given indication that they are specially suited for training. High academic qualifications, practical experience in the subject they wish to specialise in and aptitude for the speciality applied and other relevant claims will be given due consideration. Subject to these considerations, senior officers will be given preference. The specialist qualifications each candidate will have to acquire and the amount of leave he will be given, will be prescribed by the Department. Recommendations for selection will be made by a Board appointed for the purpose and the selection will be made by the Public Service Commission.

(c) Officers will be granted the under-mentioned assistance by the Department :—

- (1) Full pay (exclusive of rent allowance) during the prescribed period ;
- (2) A passage to and from England at Government expense ,
- (3) Reimbursement of all fees (except private tuition fees) of approved courses of study training and examinations ;
- (4) Family allowance of Rs. 1,500 per annum during the period the officer is compelled to be away from the Island.

(d) Officers will have to enter into a Bond embodying the following conditions :—

- (1) To obtain the prescribed specialist qualifications ;
- (2) To serve Government for ten years after return to Ceylon—Dismissal, resignation, discontinuance, and refusal to serve as a specialist, to be construed as a failure to continue in service ;
- (3) To refrain from engaging in private practice except on terms and conditions that may be specified by notice by the Director of Health Services.

(e) Failure to fulfil or observe the above-mentioned conditions of the bond will make an officer liable to payment of a penalty determined according to the expenses incurred by the Government on the officer.

J—Allowances

The following allowances are payable to Medical Officers of the Department in the circumstances set out below :—

(a) *Allowances in lieu of Private Practice.*—Non-new entrant Medical Officers may be paid allowances not exceeding 25 per cent. of their substantive salaries for any period during which the exigencies of the service require that they should be prevented from engaging in private practice. New entrant Medical Officers, i.e., those appointed on or after April 24, 1933, and all Grade Medical Officers of Health will not be eligible to draw this allowance.

(b) *Minor Specialists Allowance.*—An allowance of £50 will be payable only to those officers who possess minor specialist qualifications and are in receipt of such allowance at present until they continue to function in their present posts. This allowance will cease when salary plus allowance equal or exceed the initial step of the Grade I segment of the scale the officer is on.

(c) *D. P. H. Allowance.*—An allowance of £50 will be paid to Medical Officers and Medical Officers of Health who possess the D. P. H. or M. P. H. qualifications and who are employed in Public Health appointments until such time as the officer's salary plus D. P. H. Allowance do not exceed £840 in the case of non-new entrant M. O. H. and Rs. 11,280 in the case of new-entrant M. O. H., and £660 in the case of a non-new entrant Medical Officer temporarily employed as a Health Officer. In the case of a new entrant Medical Officer temporarily employed as a Health Officer salary plus D. P. H. Allowance plus the special allowance referred to in (d) below should not exceed Rs. 11,280.

(d) *Allowance to Medical Officers functioning temporarily and who are drafted on to do health work in posts of and who are temporarily employed as Medical Officers of Health.*—New-entrant Medical Officers who have opted to join the Curative side and who are drafted on to do health work in posts of Medical Officers of Health will be paid an allowance equivalent to the difference between their grade pay and the corresponding point of the salary scale of the Medical Officers of Health:

K—Private Practice

1. Non-new entrant Medical Officers are entitled to private practice.

2. New entrant Medical Officers are not entitled to Private Practice. New entrant medical officers are however permitted private practice in circumstances where this is considered to be necessary in the public interest. The circumstances in which this is considered to be necessary at present are the following:—

(a) in districts where private medical practitioners are not available to meet the needs of the district; approval of the Director of Health Services is necessary.

Note.—A list of such districts is in course of preparation.

(b) in towns where officers of the Department holding senior clinical appointments such as Physicians, Surgeons and Obstetrician to the larger hospitals and District Medical Officers are invited by private medical practitioners to attend on cases as consultants with a view to obtaining their opinion or assistance,

Note.—A list of such senior clinical appointments is in course of preparation

(c) private practice under the Medical Wants Ordinance;

Note.—This practice should normally be done by the Senior Officer at a station, and by his assistants only if he is not available.

(d) Judicial fees for medico-legal work subject to the provisions of the Financial Regulations.

Note.—Payment for medico-legal work will be limited to hurt cases and post-mortem examinations. In places where more than one officer is stationed, judicial cases should be reported on by the senior officer, the junior officers furnishing such reports only if the senior officer is not available. Specialists trained at Government expense and employed as such are not entitled to these fees when they are called upon to perform this work for Government.

(e) New entrant Specialist Officers may be allowed private practice in their own specialities on terms and conditions that may be specified by notice by the Director of Health Services.

(f) Unauthorised private practice may lead to an officer's discontinuance from the service. The Director of Health Services has the right to call for monthly returns of all income from private practice from any officer of the Medical Services certified to be correct by the officer.

3. New entrant Medical Officers who have specialised at Government expense and have entered into the bond mentioned in paragraph (d) of Section I are permitted to engage in consultation practice on the terms and conditions prescribed in the bond. It may be noted that such consultation practice is not permitted in the Specialist's home.

4. Medical Officers of Health and Medical Officers doing health work temporarily are not permitted to engage themselves in private practice of any nature under any circumstances.

L—Retirements

Officers holding pensionable appointments may retire, if they so desire, on reaching the age of optional retirement (55 years). They may be permitted to continue in service after reaching this age, subject to the provisions of Public Service Regulations 62 and 65.

Acting Service for purpose of Pension.—Acting service of an officer in an office carrying claim to pension when continuous with permanent employment shall be reckoned for pension purposes provided no other officer was earning pension for the same period in respect of the same office.

Commutation of Pension (Non-new Entrants).—Officers appointed to the Government Service before April 24, 1933, may, at their option, be paid in lieu of the pension granted under the Government Pension Minute a pension at the rate of three-fourths of such pension together with a gratuity equal to ten times the annual value of the reduction so made in the pension.

M—General

(a) Departmental Officers may be required to give lectures on subjects they are proficient in to officers of the Department and to others, if required.

(b) Medical Officers are liable to serve Government in South India at the Quarantine Establishments when they will be entitled to such expatriation allowance as may be sanctioned by Government from time to time. They will also be required to give medical attendance to the resident camp population and to credit to revenue any fee received therefor.

(c) All Officers of the Health Services are subject to General Orders, Public Service Regulations, Financial and other regulations and orders of Government in force from time to time.

THE RAILWAYS ORDINANCE

IN terms of section 18A of the Fisheries Ordinance, No. 24 of 1940, as amended by the Fisheries (Amendment) Act, No 25 of 1952, the Honourable

the Minister of Commerce, Trade and Fisheries has referred a dispute regarding fishing in the Puttalam lagoon that has arisen between residents of Puttalam, Talawila, Kurinjanpitiya and Karatavu on the one hand, and migrant fishermen from the area between Negombo and Puttalam on the other hand, to us for public inquiry and report.

2 The subject-matter of the inquiry is as follows —

A dispute has arisen between fishermen permanently resident on the foreshore adjoining the Puttalam lagoon on the one hand, and migrant fishermen from the area between Negombo and Puttalam on the other hand. The resident fishermen fish in the Puttalam lagoon throughout the year. The migrant fishermen settle on the foreshore adjoining the Puttalam lagoon for short periods every year and fish in this lagoon when they have no other employment in their own areas

The local fishermen complain that the influx of this migrant group is increasing annually and that consequently their catches of fish are being reduced annually. They therefore request that the number of migrant fishermen who fish in the Puttalam lagoon be restricted

3 We invite all persons concerned or interested in this dispute, who desire so to do, to make written representations relating to this dispute to the Director of Fisheries, to reach his office at Galle Face, Colombo, on or before January 31, 1955

4 We shall commence a public inquiry into the subject matter of the dispute at the Magistrate's Court House, Puttalam, on Tuesday, February 15, 1955, at 9.30 a.m. At the inquiry we shall receive all evidence, whether oral or documentary, which parties to the dispute may wish to place before us.
