GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations the Populations of the

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers' (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of

their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by des-

cent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and

place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

VACANCIES FOR CADETSHIPS—I.M.M.T.S. "DUFFERIN"

TWO vacancies exist for Executive Cadetships on the Indian Mercantile Marine Training Ship "Dufferin" in Bombay for a 2 years' course of training commencing on August 1, 1955.

- 2. Qualifications required.—(i) Applicants should be Ceylonese. (ii) They should be between the ages of 15½ and 18½ years on July 1, 1955. (iii) They should have passed at least the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination or its equivalent from a school approved by the Department of Education for presenting candidates for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination.
- 3. Eligible applicants will be required to sit for an examination in Colombo. The date and place will be notified to each applicant in due course. The syllabus for the examination may be obtained from this office on application.
- 4. Full particulars of the course of training are given in the prospectus available for sale at the Colombo Port Commission Office at Re. 1.50 per copy (exclusive of postage).
- 5. The fees will be paid by Government, as well as the cost of uniforms, books travelling, and other reasonable items of expenditure. All other expenses will have to be paid by the parents or guardian of the Cadet.
- 6. The selected candidate will be required to enter into an agreement and bond with 2 sureties undertaking "inter alia" to serve the Government of Ceylon for a period of at least 5 years, if called upon to do so within a period of 5 years of his obtaining the Master Mariner's Foreign-Going certificate issued by the Ministry of Transport. Failure to comply with this requirement will make the trainee and/or the sureties liable to refund all expenses incurred on the training by the Ceylon Government.
- 7. Neither the Indian nor the Ceylon Government hold themselves responsible for finding employment for the Cadet on the completion of this course, although every effort will be made to place him with a steamship company.
- 8. Candidates who pass the qualifying examination will be interviewed by a Selection Board in Colombo. The selected candidate will be required by the Indian Government to undergo an eye sight test and medical examination in Bombay; but to minimize the risk of their being rejected at that stage, they will be required by the Ceylon Government to undergo a similar examination before leaving the Island, for which a fee of Rs. 20 will be charged. It must be understood that this examination is of a provisional nature and will not necessarily bind the Indian Government.
- 9. Applications should be made on forms obtainable at this office and should be accompanied by—
 - (i) A receipt from a Kachcheri or the General Treasury, Colombo, for the payment of Rs. 10 as examination fee. (A fee of Rs. 10 is charged for the examination.) This fee should be paid to the nearest Kachcheri or at the General Treasury, Colombo, and credited to Revenue Head VI, sub-head 3, item 4, and the receipt should be attached to the application form.

Note.—A candidate who withdraws or absents himself from the examination for any reason whatsoever or whose application is rejected for any reason whatsoever shall not be entitled to a refund of the whole or a portion of the examination fee of Rs. 10.

Fellowship for a Medical Officer under the Colombo Plan for obtaining Diploma Bacteriology with special emphasis on V. D. Serology

APPLICATIONS are invited from Medical Officers of the Department of Health for the award of a Fellowship under the Colombo Plan for obtaining the qualification in Diploma Bacteriology with special emphasis on V. D. Serology for a period of 2 years in the United Kingdom.

- 2. The conditions of eligibility are as follows:
- (1) Should be under 40 years of age on October 1, 1954.

Note.—Preference will be given to M. OO. working in the Anti-V. D. Campaign.

- 3. The candidate on obtaining the requisite qualification, viz., Diploma in Bacteriology should undergo a special training for a period of six to twelve months at a V. D. Research laboratory with special emphasis on V. D. Serology.
- 4. All applicants must be Ceylonese. "Ceylonese" means a citizen of Ceylon by descent or registration.
- 5. A high standard of both mental and physical fitness is necessary. The successful candidate will be required to pass a medical examination by a Board of Government Medical Officers as to his mental and physical fitness.

The said trainee shall while in the service of the Government devote himself exclusively to the duties of his office as a member of the Department of Health and shall not without the written consent of the Director of Health Services render any professional service to any person for fee or reward. Where such consent is given he shall be bound to strictly observe such terms and conditions as may be prescribed in writing from time to time by the Director of Health Services.

Posts of Inspector of Schools, Grade I

APPLICATIONS from men and women candidates, who satisfy the conditions in paragraph 4 below, are invited for the posts of Inspector of Schools, Grade I, in the Education Department. 
