Amendment to National Dangerous Drugs Control Act on the cards



A discussion on the need to amend the National Dan-gerous Drugs Control Act to suit the current situation in the country was held under the guidance of the Minister of Instite Presidents Counsell of Justice Presidents Counsel Ali Sabry at the Ministry of Justice vesterday.

Senior officials representing the National Dangerous Drugs Control Board, Police, Attorney General's Department, Govern-ment Analyst's Department and the Ministry of Health expressed their views on the need to amend the National Dangerous Drugs Control Act

to suit the current situation. In particular, there has been a strong focus on the latest form of non-traditional drugs that are becoming more prevalent in society, and how to deal with ms associated with and the need to regulate certain drugs.

The need to rehabilitate addicts through the Department and the Ministry of Youth Affairs in order to reduce congestion in prisons due to an increase in the number drug addicts in prisons was also discussed.

The Minister was told of the

difficulties in storing drugs which are widely found in soci-ety at present. Some of it are stored by in the Department of Government Analyst and the need to formulate a comprehensive programme through the coordination of all the relevant institutions

ICG nabs SL boat with 100 Kg of heroin

The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) has seized drugs including 100 kilogrammes of heroin from a Sri Lankan boat.

The seizure was made south of Thoothukudi during an operation which began on November 17. Sources say that actionable intelligence led to the seizure of the drugs. The drugs were meant to be sent to Western countries from Sri Lankan the drugs have been transferred onto the Sri Lankan vessel by a Pakistani dhow from Karachi. The Indian Coast Guard found 99 packets of heroin of 100 kilograms, 20 boxes of synthetic drugs, a Thuraya satellite phone and five 9 mm pistols.

The number of people who have recovered from COVID-19 in Sri Lanka crossed 15,000 yesterday. According to the statistics of the Epidemiology Unit, the total number of coronavirus recoveries reported in the country increased to 15,447 with 485 recoveries reported yesterday.

The total number of COVID-19 positive cases detected from the country reached 20,967 with 5,426 of them still under medical care.

Cyclone 'Nivar' hovers closer to Northern coast

The Met Department has issued The Met Department has issued a 'red' alert for the Severe Cyclonic Storm 'Nivar' as it was only 220 km to the east of Kankesanturai coast, adding that the system is likely to intensify into a cyclonic storm and may move closer to the Northern coast before making landfall in Tamil-Nadu coast.

"It is very likely to intensify into

a very severe cyclonic storm and expected to move closer to the Northern coast of Sri Lanka and cross Tamil-Nadu coast, India dur-ing the next 24 hours," the Depart-

ment warned.
Under the influence of the aforementioned system, the Department forecasts the possibility for intermittent showers or thunder-

Forty five schools in the Kandy City limits have been ordered to remain closed until 4th December, the Governor of the Central Province Lalith U. Gamage said in a directive as a measure to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The decision comes after a number of COVID-19 cases in Kandy has been increasing at a steady rate in the past few days. Sixteen COVID-19 cases were confirmed in the Kandy district yesterday. A total 346 COVID-19 cases in total have been confirmed from the district thus far.

The Governor said that the decision was taken following the detection of several COVID-19 positive patients, including Mahaiyawa, Akurana and the Kandy Central Market.
