#### GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service, in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

5. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

(vii) Applications should be made substantially in the form appended below and should be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, and NOT personally to him.

(viii) Applications received in this office after the closing date will not ordinarily be entertained.

### Sixteen Posts of Engineering Overseer, Mechanical Engineer's Department, Municipal Council, Colombo

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Local Government Service Commission for the above post.

2. *Salary Scale*.—

Grade I : Rs. 1,680—7 of 120—Rs. 2,520, efficiency bar before Rs. 2,040 per annum.

Grade II : Rs. 840—10 of 72—Rs. 1,560, efficiency bar before Rs. 1,200 per annum.

Grade III : Rs. 660—16 of efficiency bar before Rs. 996

A candidate possessing any qualifications prescribed below salary points as follows :—

Certificate of the Junior Technical Officer's Course, or the Diploma Course in Municipal Engineering or the Building Construction Course of the Ceylon Technical College or an equivalent qualification, will be placed on the step Rs. 1,344 per annum, on the scale for Grade II Overseers mentioned above. The salary payable to those candidates who have completed parts of the above courses is given in paragraph 4 below.

*Allowances*.—

Rent allowance, a temporary cost of living allowance and a special living allowance will be paid in accordance with Government rates and conditions. A transport allowance for the maintenance and use of a bicycle for official travelling will be fixed by the Commission.

3. *Qualifications required*.—

- (a) Age : Not less than 18 years than 30 years of age on February 1955.
- (b) Applicants should have S. S. C. (English) or higher with Physics and Residence within the Municipal will be compulsory for the candidates. They will also be on probation.

**4. Conditions of Service.—**

The selected candidates will be required to carry out such work and duties as may be allotted to them by the Engineers under whom they are placed. They will be required to attend evening classes at the Ceylon Technical College, if they do not already possess a recognized technical qualification, and to follow the Diploma Course (evening) in Municipal Engineering. While following the first-year course they will be paid a salary of Rs. 660 on the scale for Overseers, Grade III. On passing the First-year Sessional Examination of the Municipal Engineering Course, they will be paid a salary of Rs. 1,200 per annum, on the scale for Overseers, Grade II. They will receive the next increment on that scale on passing the Second-year Sessional Examination and the increment following on obtaining the Diploma. On successful completion of the three-year course by obtaining the Diploma in Municipal Engineering, they will be eligible for promotion as Sub-Inspectors on the scale Rs. 1,440—120—Rs. 3,000 per annum, on the occurrence of vacancies.

5. If they fail to pass the First-year Sessional Examination of the Municipal Engineering Course, they will continue to draw salary on the scale for Overseers, Grade III, provided their conduct and work are satisfactory. They will be considered for promotion to Grade II and thereafter to Grade I along with others on the occurrence of vacancies, but they will not be eligible for promotion to the grade of Sub-Inspectors

6. The selected candidates will be required to enter into a bond with two sureties for a sum of Rs. 500 to serve the Local Government Service for a period not less than three years after obtaining the diploma of the Technical College

### Examinations, Results of Examinations, &c.

#### EXAMINATION FOR PROMOTION FROM GRADE II TO GRADE I OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CLERICAL SERVICE

AN examination for promotion to Grade I of the Local Government Clerical Service will be held in Colombo, on Saturday, March 19, 1955.

The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. *Salary and Conditions of Service.*—(a) Successful candidates will be appointed, as vacancies occur, to Grade I of the Local Government Clerical Service on the scale Rs. 1,440 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,480 per annum. In this scale, an efficiency bar operates before Rs. 3,000 per annum. Rent allowance in accordance with Government rates and conditions, a temporary cost of living allowance and a special living allowance at Government rates are payable.

(b) All successful candidates will be appointed to Grade I of the Local Government Clerical Service subject to confirmation after one year. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Applications.*—(a) Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, on forms which may be obtained from the office of the Commission up to February 19, 1955.

(b) Applications must be sent to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than February 26, 1955. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

4. The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, will issue admission forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their admission forms. A candidate not producing such a form will be refused admission to sit for the examination.

5. *Eligibility.*—Clerks in Grade II of the Local Government Clerical Service, who complete four years' satisfactory service as Grade II Clerks under any local authority on or before March 19, 1955, will be eligible to take up the examination. They should forward their applications through the Municipal Commissioners, Special Commissioners or Chairmen of the local authorities in which they are serving.

6. Municipal Commissioners, Special Commissioners and Chairmen of the local authorities are kindly requested to grant to officers serving in their Councils or Committees, whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, duty leave to present themselves at the examination.

7. *Subjects.*—The subjects for the examination are as follows:—

This paper will be regarded as a qualifying test only and every candidate will be required to obtain a minimum of 30 per cent. of the marks allotted for the paper. The marks obtained in this paper will not, however, be taken into consideration when selecting officers for promotion.

- (iv) Viva Voce Test . . . . . 150

8. The examination will be held in two parts. The written examination will be held first, and on the results of it candidates will be selected to attend the viva voce test, which too will be held in Colombo. The number to be called for this test will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission. In all written papers, marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.

#### Efficiency Bar Examination for Officers in Grade I of the Local Government Clerical Service

YOUR reference is requested to my Circular letters No. D. 13/1 of January 16, 1953, and January 30, 1953, on the above subject. The next Efficiency Bar Examination for Officers in Grade I of the Local Government Service will be held in Colombo on March 12, 1955. The scheme of examination is given below :—

#### SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

I. The subjects of the examination will be—

- (a) the two National languages, Sinhalese and Tamil ;
- (b) (i) the system of Accounts employed in local authorities and the Government Financial Regulations, Part II, excluding Chapters XIX and XX ;
- (ii) Local Government Law. (This paper will be based on the Municipal, Urban and Town Councils Ordinances, regulations and by-laws framed thereunder and the Local Government Service Ordinances, amending legislation, and regulations framed thereunder.

II. The examination in Sinhalese and Tamil will be divided into—

- (a) Conversation and Interpretation ;
- (b) Reading and Writing.

III. Officers of Sinhalese, Tamil and Moor parents will be required to pass in one language and Accounts and Local Government Law.

IV. Officers of other parentage will be required to pass Accounts and Local Government Law, and one language. (Conversation and interpretation only.)

V. In the examination under Rule II (a) above, the candidate will be tested in conversation so as to satisfy the Examiner as to his power of understanding Sinhalese or Tamils of different classes and of making himself understood by them, both in common conversation and in the course of official business. He will also be required to act as an interpreter between the Examiners and Sinhalese and Tamils entirely ignorant of English ; the interpretation to be on matters connected with ordinary official business. The candidate will be required in this examination to obtain a minimum of 50 per cent. of the total marks.

VI. In the examination under Rule II (b) above, the candidate will be required to write an English translation of two short Sinhalese or Tamil reports written in different running hands, to translate a short extract from a Sinhalese or Tamil notarial deed and from the proceedings of a Rural Court case put into his hands for the first time. The candidates will be required in this examination to obtain a minimum of 50 per cent. of the total marks.

VII. Candidates for the examination under Rule I (b) above will be required to obtain a minimum of 50 per cent. of the total marks in Accounts and Local Government Law.

#### EXEMPTION FROM THE NATIONAL LANGUAGES PAPER

*All officers who were transferred to the Local Government Service on April 1, 1946, are exempted from the National Languages Papers of this examination. Transferred members may, if they so desire, sit for the special examination which will be held shortly instead of this examination.*

VIII. Applications.—Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from this Office and forwarded to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than February 19, 1955. Any applications received after that date will be rejected. Each candidate will receive a time table stating the date and place of examination, sufficiently in advance of the date fixed for the examination.

IX. A candidate may take up the Languages and the Accounts and Local Government Law papers, if he so desires, separately and on different occasions..

#### Village Committee Clerical Service, Grade I Examination, April 5, 1955

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter Grade I of the Village Committee Clerical Service will be held at Colombo, Kandy, Galle and Jaffna on April 5, 1955.

The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. (i) *Salary*.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to serve Village Committees on the salary scale of Rs. 660 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 42 to Rs. 1,668 per annum. An efficiency bar operates

before Rs. 1,206 per annum. Rent allowance, temporary cost of living allowance and a temporary special living allowance are payable according to Government regulations.

(ii) *Conditions of Service.*—(a) The posts are permanent and pensionable and the selected candidates will be eligible for the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension benefits.

(b) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be governed by the by-laws of the Village Committee, the Village Committee Rules framed under the Village Communities Ordinance and the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the regulations framed thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years' probation. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder.

(d) Successful candidates may be required to furnish security either in cash or by fidelity guarantee bond through guarantee associations approved by the Local Government Service Commission in sums which may be decided upon by the local authorities to which they will be appointed.

3. The names of the successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments, as and when vacancies occur.

4. *Eligibility.*—(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least one of the following examinations:—

- (a) The Senior School Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil) Examination with English as a subject, or
- (b) The Senior School Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil) Examination and the Sixth Standard English.

*Note.* TRUE COPIES OF CERTIFICATES OF EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS SHOULD BE ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION FORM.

(iv) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph (6) (iv) (a) except that if necessary Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct period of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

(v) Candidates must furnish satisfactory proof that they have been resident in an area specified in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945,\* for at least three years immediately prior to February 1, 1955.

5. Candidates in the permanent employ of a local authority with not less than five years' service on February 1, 1955, will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age and educational qualifications prescribed above.

6. *Applications.*—(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from the office of the Local Government Service Commission, Room No. 29 1/5, Gaffoor Building (First Floor), Fort, Colombo, up to February 8, 1955, and forwarded by registered post to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo 1, to reach him not later than February 15, 1955. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

(ii) Candidates who are already employed in Government departments or local authorities, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must forward their applications through the Heads of Departments or the Chairmen, Special Commissioners or Commissioners of local authorities in which they are serving. Any candidate who fails to do so will be disqualified.

(iii) The applications must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 3.

(iv) The following documents must be attached to the form of application:—

- (a) A certificate of registration of a candidate's birth showing him to have been born not earlier than April 5, 1930, and not later than April 5, 1938.

*Note:* 1 (a) Affidavits will not ordinarily be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(b) The special certificate of birth issued for purposes of admission to schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(2) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of birth, under section 18 (i) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chap. 94), will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced, that the birth certificate is that of the candidate, and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, application should be made to the Registrar-General's or the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Registrar's Office in the district in which the birth took place under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, for the amendments of the entry in case 2 of the birth registration entry, and in other cases application should be made to the District Court under section 20 for the rectification of the entry in case 2.

(b) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he had attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or school master by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

(c) † A certificate of residence in the form appearing at the end of this Notification from a Divisional Revenue Officer, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary to the effect that the candidate has been resident in an area specified in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, for at least 3 years immediately prior to February 1, 1955.

(d) True copies of the certificate of educational qualifications.

N.B. (1) ANY APPLICATION WHICH IS NOT ACCOMPANIED WITH ALL OR ANY ONE OF THE DOCUMENTS REQUIRED BY THIS NOTIFICATION WILL BE REJECTED.

8. *Withdrawals and refunds.*—In no circumstances will a refund of the value of stamps be made.

9. *Leave to officers to attend examination.*—Heads of Departments, Chairmen, Special Commissioners and Commissioners of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant duty leave to officers of their departments and of Local Bodies, whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, to present themselves at the examination.

10 *Identity Cards.*—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

- (b) A valid passport issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination.
- (c) Any certificate, licence or other document embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination on the authority of a Government Department.

No candidate will be admitted to the examination hall without one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card.

12. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held, and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the “Viva Voce” test. The number to be called for the “Viva Voce” test will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and mistakes in spelling. Candidates, whose writing is illegible, are liable to be disqualified. The “Viva Voce” test will be held in Colombo.

13. *Medical Examination.*—The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

#### Rules

1. The Chairman shall cause to be kept a book, to be called the "Register of owners of property" in which the names of persons who claim to be owners of property and their addresses shall be registered in accordance with these rules.

2. Any person who claims to be the owner or joint owner of any immovable property situated within the administrative limits of the Council and who desires his name to be registered in the said register shall make application to the Chairman in writing in the form appearing in schedule "A" and pay a fee of Rs. 5 to the Council.

3. On compliance with the requirements of rule 2 the Chairman shall, if he is satisfied that the full particulars connected with the description of the property or otherwise necessary for its proper identification have been furnished by the applicant, cause the particulars so furnished relating to

the assessment number of the premises, the name of the owner or joint owner and his address to be registered in the said register and cause the applicant to be notified of such registration in form appearing in schedule "B".

4. The following classes of amendments shall be made in the register on a written application made by the registered owner and on his paying a fee of Re. 1 to the Council in respect of each such application :—

- (a) Amendment of the registered address.
- (b) Amendment of name or description of registered owner as a result of assumption of a new name or marriage or similar cause.
- (c) Amendment of the name of the registered owner on his death by the substitution therefor of the legal designation of the executor of his estate.

5. Notwithstanding the provisions of the foregoing rules it shall be lawful for the Chairman to make appropriate amendment of the particulars inserted in the register whenever :—

- (a) A new assessment number is assigned to the premises,
- (b) A division of the premises is made for the purposes of assigning new assessment numbers to the premises ; or
- (c) A consolidation of the premises with other premises is made for purposes of assigning a new number to each consolidated premises.

6. The Chairman shall notify any amendment so made to the registered owners of the premises affected by the amendment.

7. The register shall at all times during office hours of the Council be open to the inspection of any person on payment of a fee of twenty-five cents to the Council.

**By-laws**

**LAUNDRIES**

1. (1) No person shall keep a laundry unless he is the holder of a permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every permit issued under paragraph (1) shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it was issued.

2. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any other officer of the Committee duly authorized by the Chairman in writing, at all reasonable times, to enter upon and inspect any laundry and to inspect any furniture, equipment, vehicle or utensil, which is, or appears to be, used for the purpose of the laundry.

3. No person shall keep a laundry unless the premises used for the purpose are in conformity with the following requirements:—

- The premises must be in good repair, well ventilated and well lighted and every room must be provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open must be not less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor-space.
- The walls of every room in every part must be not less than seven feet in height with the inside thereof lime-plastered and lime-washed.
- The premises must have a sufficient supply of water for all purposes of the laundry unless the soiled linen is washed in a tank, pond or pool which is approved for the purpose or in a well approved by the Committee.
- A separate room must be provided for the storage of soiled linen and the floor of such room must be cemented throughout.
- The laundry must be provided with sufficient latrine accommodation, being not less than one latrine for every ten persons employed therein.

4. Every person who keeps a laundry shall cause every part of that laundry, its surroundings, drains, furniture, utensils, and the equipment used for the purposes of the laundry to be kept clean and in good repair.

5. No person who keeps a laundry shall bring soiled linen from outside the village area, or allow any person who is suffering or who, to his knowledge, has recently suffered from any infectious, contagious or cutaneous disease or has been in attendance on any person suffering from any such disease, to enter the laundry or to take part in the work thereof or in the transport of any article thereto or therefrom, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

6. No person who keeps a laundry shall take, or receive, or permit to be taken or received, soiled linen from a house where there is, or has recently been, a case of infectious or contagious disease, unless the clothes have been disinfected in the manner directed by the Medical Officer of Health or the Chairman.

7. Every person who keeps a laundry shall, on the occurrence of any infectious or contagious disease in his premises—

- forthwith cease to carry on the business of the laundry;
- notify the Chairman of the occurrence of the disease;
- retain all the clothes in the laundry until the written permission of the Chairman is obtained for the return of the clothes; and

(iv) not resume the business of the laundry until the premises have been declared by the Chairman to be free from infection.

8. No person who keeps a laundry shall keep washed linen in any room used as a sleeping room.

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;

“Committee” means the Village Committee of village area, and

“village area” means the Ambatalenpahala village area.

**By-laws****TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS**

1. (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Ordinance, every person who has possession, custody or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars relating to such vehicle or animal in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee

(2) The schedule referred to in paragraph (1) shall be filled up and sent to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt by the person to whom such schedule is delivered

2 If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal, which is not mentioned in such schedule and which is liable to the tax under the Ordinance, or if any person who has not furnished any schedule under by-law 1 for the first time, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal liable to such tax, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires or commences to keep or use any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, shall without further notice be liable, in respect of each vehicle or animal entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on each vehicle or animal referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicle or animal was acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession or custody.

4. Every person who, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption, specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Committee or to any person authorised by the Chairman in writing, on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year: Provided that in any case where the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2 is furnished to the Chairman after the thirty-first day of March in any year, the tax in respect of each vehicle or animal referred to in such schedule or notice shall be payable within one month of the date on which such schedule or notice is so furnished.

6. On payment of the annual tax for any vehicle by any person, the Chairman shall issue to the person in respect of that vehicle, a metal plate with such of the distinguishing letters for vehicles specified in the Schedule hereto as are appropriate to that vehicle and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced, by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of twenty-five cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by

affidavit or otherwise that any such plate had been lost or stolen, issue to the owner a fresh plate on the application of that owner and on payment by him of fifty cents.

7. The person having possession, custody or control of any vehicle in respect of which a plate has been issued under by-law 6, shall cause that plate to be affixed to a conspicuous part of the vehicle.

8. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or the Revenue Overseer or any other officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, to stop and detain any vehicle proceeding on any road or path, for the purpose of inspecting the plate which is required by by-law 7 to be affixed to that vehicle, and the driver or person in charge of any such vehicle shall, on being requested by the Chairman, Revenue Overseer or authorised officer to do so, stop the vehicle and permit and assist the Chairman, Revenue Overseer or authorized officer to inspect such plate.
