GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay), appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers' (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese.

A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

TRAINING FACILITIES UNDER THE INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers in the Public Service for the award of a traineeship under the International Monetary Fund Training Programme for a period of one year beginning September 27, 1954. Applications which should be on a special form obtainable from this office, should reach me on or before May 15, 1954.

(ii) Applications should be forwarded through the Head of the Department to which the candidate is attached or the Head of the service to which he belongs and must reach me on or before the date specified above.

2. *Terms of Award.*—The Fund will pay the trainee a living allowance of \$275 (U. S.) per month. This is adequate to cover the minimum living expenses of a *single* person in Washington. In addition, the Fund will assume the transportation expenses of each trainee to and from Washington.

3. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (a) is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration,
- (b) is of excellent moral character and physically sound,
- (c) is a graduate of a recognized University with Economics and Finance as major subjects of study,
- (d) is employed in duties requiring a knowledge of Economics and Finance.

4. *Agreement and Security.*—The selected candidate will be required—

- (i) to enter into an agreement with the Government of Ceylon, undertaking *inter alia* to follow the prescribed course and to complete satisfactorily the course of training and to serve the Government of Ceylon if so required for a period of not more than 10 years (to be decided by Government) on the successful completion of the course of training,
- (ii) to enter into a personal bond in a sum covering the full costs of the traineeship as indemnity in the event of his failure to comply with the terms and conditions in the agreement.

5. The selected candidate will be required to pass a medical examination by a Medical Board appointed by Government as to his physical and mental fitness to undergo a course of training in the country in which it is to be undertaken. A high degree of physical and mental health is required. The fee for this examination will have to be paid by the candidate.

6. A person who desires to recommend a candidate should do so by giving him a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

7. Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview in Colombo at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid.

8. Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to withdrawal of award if discovered after the selection.

9. Applications or any other communication relating to these awards must be addressed to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, and not personally to any officer in this Department.

10. Applications which do not conform in every respect with the requirements of this notification will be rejected.

11. Award of a traineeship under the International Monetary Fund is subject to the acceptance of the nomination by the Fund.




