GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay), appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers' (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese.

A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

CONDITIONS OF TENDER FOR IMPORTED BROAD GAUGE SLEEPERS FOR THE C. G. R.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the supply of 75,000 Broad Gauge sleepers in hardwoods. Tenders will be considered for the whole or part supply of sleepers in lots of not less than 10,000. The sleepers should be of timber of the following species:—

2. Delivery of these sleepers in Colombo must be effected as follows:—

(i) Full delivery of 75,000 sleepers within a period of six months commencing from the date of acceptance of tender, in one or more shipments at seller's option.

(ii) In the case of offers in minimum lots of 10,000 sleepers, delivery should be completed within a period of four months from date of acceptance of tender.

3. The sleepers must be in accordance with the description, specification and conditions furnished below:—

- The sleepers are for the 5 feet 6 inches gauge track and are to be 9 feet long, 10 inches wide and 5 inches deep, subject to a variation of length of 1 inch either way, and a tolerance of one quarter of an inch in both thickness and width.
- All sleepers shall be cut from well matured trees of the true species of timber named in paragraph 1, felled in the proper season when the sap is not in circulation.
- All sleepers shall be of good, sound, strong timber free from heartshake, sapwood, dry rot and knot holes.
- Allowance may be made for sound gum veins, gum pockets up to 6 inches by 3 inches, surface sun shakes, end shakes up to 6 inches, a few pin holes but not in groups, firm sound knots not exceeding 2 inches in diameter.
- Sap or wane must not occur under rail seat and must not exceed 2 inches on either face.
- The sleepers may be sawn or hewn. They shall not be cut on full quarter: shall be cut square out of winding and straight, except that hewn sleepers may have camber to the extent of half an inch.

4. Tenderers must state the country or state in which the timber for the sleepers was grown, and must give the correct botanical name of the timber. No tender will be considered which does not give this information.

5. Tenderers should state the number of each species they are prepared to supply and, if more than one kind is offered in any tender, the rate for each kind should be specified, with the minimum and maximum number of each kind that can be supplied. Tenderers must also state whether the sleepers are sawn or hewn.

6. *Inspection.* Sleepers from Australia must be passed before shipment by the Government Inspector of the State from which the timber is obtained and Certificates of Quality must be furnished from the Forestry Department.

Tenderers of sleepers from countries other than Australia, must state what facilities exist for inspection, prior to export, by recognised sleeper passing officers of the Railway and/or Forestry Services of the country of supply, and if facilities for inspection are available, Inspection Certificates must be furnished with each shipment.

The requirement for the production of Certificates of Quality and Inspection Certificates in respect of sleepers prior to shipment, from any of the countries mentioned, is without prejudice to the right of the Ceylon Government to re-inspect the sleepers on arrival in Colombo and to reject sleepers which do not comply with the above specification. Any sleepers so rejected shall not be paid for.

If desired by tenderers, the Ceylon Government will, at the cost of the tenderers, arrange for its representative to visit the country of supply and acquaint the inspecting authorities regarding the quality and standard to which the required sleepers should conform.

7. Should a tenderer whose tender is accepted fail to complete delivery by the specified date, the purchase price of the sleepers delivered to and accepted by the General Manager of the Railway (hereinafter called the "General Manager") after

the specified date shall be subject to a deduction as damages of 10 per cent. of the accepted price and such deductions shall be regarded as a reasonable pre-estimate of actual damage which the General Manager will and may sustain by reason of the default of the tenderer to complete delivery within the specified time, and shall for all purposes be deemed to be, and be regarded as, liquidated damages, and not as a penalty.

8. Should the successful tenderer at any time during the period of supply find that he will be unable to deliver the full quantity of sleepers or any portion of them, within the stipulated period, he will at once give notice accordingly to the General Manager, by registered letter, and thereupon the General Manager shall have absolute discretion either to grant an extension of time or to determine the contract and recover damages as provided hereinafter in clause 29.

9. If any difference or dispute shall arise between the parties such difference or dispute shall be referred to two (2) arbitrators for arbitration in Ceylon, one to be appointed by each party with liberty to the arbitrators, in case of difference or their failing to reach an agreement within one month of their appointment, to appoint an umpire resident in Ceylon and the award which shall be made by the two arbitrators or umpire, as the case may be, shall be final and conclusive and binding on the parties. If either party in difference shall neglect to appoint an arbitrator for the space of fifteen days (15) after notice in writing to do so has been given by the other party or shall appoint an arbitrator who shall refuse to act, then the arbitrator appointed by the other party shall make a final decision alone and the making of any award in such reference shall be a condition precedent to any right of action against any of the parties in respect of any such difference. The party who requests arbitration shall if so required by the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Transport and Works deposit with him prior to the appointment of arbitrators such sum as shall be fixed by him towards the cost of arbitration.

10. The successful tenderer shall inform the General Manager by telegraph immediately the vessel has sailed. As each consignment is shipped, the successful tenderer must send direct to the General Manager—

- (1) Bill of Lading (Stamped)
- (2) Copy of Invoice, and
- (3) Copy of Certificate of Quality and Inspection

11 THE PRICES TENDERED SHOULD PREFERABLY BE QUOTED IN CEYLON CURRENCY, AND SHOULD INCLUDE ALL COSTS TILL DELIVERED IN SHIP'S SLINGS AT VESSEL'S SIDE IN COLOMBO HARBOUR. 10. The work should be commenced within 2 weeks of notice of acceptance and completed to the satisfaction of the Director of Irrigation on or before the date specified, the monthly output being equal to not less than 25 per cent. Default will en ail immediate determination of the contract.

11. The contract should not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Chairman, Tender Board, or his authorized representative nor should a Power of Attorney be issued to a person on the list of Crown defaulting contractors for performance of the contract.

12. The Government reserves to itself the right to reject, without question, any or all tenders and to accept any portion of any tender.

13. No agreement or arrangement regarding the contract should be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors either individually or jointly with any other person whose name is on such list with a person of whom the Chairman, Tender Board, for reasons which appear to him sufficient objects.

14. Access to plans will be allowed by the Irrigation Engineer, Galle Sub-division, to all tenderers during office hours at any date up to the closing date. The Department will not accept liability for errors in tenders, due to inadequate description of services on the tender schedule of quantities. Intending tenderers should satisfy themselves as to what is required by inspection of the site and plans and by questioning the Irrigation Engineer, Galle Sub-division, who will give any further information required during office hours.

15. It should be noted that in all cases where security deposit is obtained in terms of paragraph 8, the agreements are liable to stamp duty based on the amount security and therefore the successful tenderer should produce stamps of the appropriate value when summoned for the purpose of signing the agreement. The amount of security and the value of the stamps necessary will be intimated to the successful tenderer at the time the notice specified under paragraph 8 is sent to him.

16. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for. The employment of only Ceylonese labour will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated

as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided however that in exceptional circumstances the Director of Irrigation may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Lands and Land Development. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence is forbidden.

The term Ceylonese shall mean and include—

A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration

The term "Labour" shall mean both skilled and unskilled labour

17. The contractor shall, whenever required to do so by the Commissioner of Labour, supply him with full particulars of the categories of workers employed by the contractor under the contract for this work.

18. The contractor will be required to supply his own tools, plant and equipment necessary for the satisfactory execution of the work. All necessary materials required for the satisfactory execution and completion of the work, unless otherwise stated on the specification, shall be supplied by the contractor.

19. The contractor shall indemnify the Government against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934, or any statutory modification thereof. Any such claim which may be paid by the Government shall be deducted from and out of any sum or sums of money that shall be due or become due to the contractor under the terms of the agreement.

20. All notices to be served upon the contractor shall be deemed to have been duly served if given to him personally or to his agent (including in the case of the Company, the Agent or Secretary of such Company) or sent through the post addressed to his house/office which place the contractor selects for the purpose. Should the contractor change his office/house he shall forthwith by writing notify to the Engineer the fact of such change and until such notification is communicated to the Engineer, the posting of such letters, notices or other documents to the address provided in the agreement shall for all purposes be deemed to be and constitute sufficient delivery of the same.

21. Any person employed by the contractor on the works, who in the opinion of the Engineer, is incompetent or who shall act in an improper manner or is objected to by the Engineer shall be dismissed from the works by the contractor at the request of the Engineer and such person shall not be again employed upon the works without the written permission of the Engineer.

22. The contractor shall comply with all sanitary and health regulations for the time being in force and applicable to the site of the works.

23. The Laws of the Dominion of Ceylon shall apply to the contract.

24. The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any damages from the Government by reason of not being awarded work up to the extent specified in the contract or at all in the event of any reduction in or the cessation of the work being deemed necessary by the Engineer.

25. The Engineer will be entitled to retain an amount equal to ten per cent. of the value of work executed monthly until the amount so retained aggregates a sum equal to 5 per cent. of the amount of tender.

The amount so retained shall be held by Government as security for the completion of the works until the whole of the works have been completed in accordance with the contract and to the satisfaction of the Engineer and until the Engineer has issued a Completion Certificate in respect of the whole works whereupon one moiety of the amount retained shall be paid to the contractor and the other moiety thereof shall be held until the issue of the Final Certificate whereupon the said moiety shall be paid to the contractor

2. Tenders are to be made on forms obtainable from the Chief Engineer, Department of Broadcasting, Torrington Square, Colombo 7.

3. All tenders should hold good for acceptance for a minimum period of sixty (60) days from the date of closing of tenders.

4. Tenders should be priced in the currency of the country from which the said machinery and equipment will be imported and supplied and should also be expressed in Ceylon Rupees and cents at the rate of exchange prevailing on June 1, 1954. The rates should be clearly stated in figures and words against the appropriate items

(a) The rates should be exclusive of customs duty payable in Ceylon as arrangements can be made to clear the said machinery and equipment duty free but should include all other charges for delivery and installation of the said machinery and equipment at Radio Ceylon.

(b) It should be clearly understood that when the rates quoted exclusive of customs duty are accepted by the Tender Board, the tenderer will have to pay second warehouse rent and further harbour dues accruing as a result of delay in clearance.

5. Tenderers should state precisely when supply, delivery and installation of each item of machinery and equipment could be made as all things being equal, preference will be given to tenderers who specify early delivery.

6. The supply, delivery and installation of the said machinery and equipment should be completed within the period specified by the tenderer to the entire satisfaction of the Chief Engineer, Department of Broadcasting.

7. All tenders should be made in duplicate under one sealed cover and marked "Tender for the supply of machinery and equipment" on the

outside of the envelope which should be addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Posts and Broadcasting.

8. Tenders should either be deposited in the Tender Box in the Ministry or be sent through the post under registered cover and should reach the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Posts and Broadcasting, not later than 12 noon on July 3, 1954.

10. Before tender forms are issued to tenderers they must, if called upon to do so, satisfy the officer issuing the forms as to their ability to carry out the installation of the machinery and equipment. The Director-General of Broadcasting may refuse to issue tender forms, if an applicant is unable to comply with this requirement.

11. No tender forms will be issued to any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors either individually or jointly with any other person, nor to any person objected to by the Director-General of Broadcasting.

12. The Tender Board reserves the right of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender. Tenderers should be prepared to accept and execute a portion of the tender at the rates quoted in such tenders.

13. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to or left at the address given by the tenderer in the tender form.

14. The successful tenderer shall when requested by the Director-General of Broadcasting enter into and execute an agreement with the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Posts and Broadcasting, for the supply, delivery and installation in good working order of the used machinery and equipment ordered from him on or before the date fixed by the Director-General of Broadcasting.

15. As security for the due fulfilment of the contract the successful tenderer will be required to deposit with the Director-General of Broadcasting a sum of money equal to 5 per cent. of the value of the service in cash which said sum he should mortgage, assign and set over to the Crown after the tender is accepted or to furnish a Bank Guarantee for a like amount.

16. All expenses incurred in the preparation of the agreement and bond will be borne by the Director-General of Broadcasting; the stamp fees, if any, shall be met by the successful tenderer.

17. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond or fail to furnish the security referred to in condition 15 hereof within one week of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted, the deposit made under condition 9 hereof will be forfeited to the Crown and the tenderer will be placed on the list of Crown defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract.

18. The contract when entered into shall not be assigned or sublet without the consent in writing of the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Posts and Broadcasting.

The Tender Board reserves the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by the successful tenderer to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on his behalf.

19. If at any time between the acceptance of the tender and the completion of the said supply,

delivery and installation of the said machinery and equipment the successful tenderer shall become an insolvent or have a receiving order made against him or shall present his petition in insolvency, then the Director-General of Broadcasting, may, after giving seven days' notice in writing to the successful tenderer, terminate the contract and forfeit the security deposit to the Crown.

20. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labour in carrying out the work hereunder. Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances he may be permitted by the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Posts and Broadcasting to employ any non-Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

21. The Government shall not be liable for or in respect of any damages or compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Cap. 117), or any statutory re-enactment, extension or modification of that Ordinance in consequence of any accident or injury to any workman in the employment of the successful tenderer.

22. The Director-General of Broadcasting shall be entitled for reasons which appear to him to be sufficient, to give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the successful tenderer of any person specified in such notice. On receipt of such notice the successful tenderer shall forthwith terminate the engagement of that person. Failure to carry out this condition shall be deemed to be a breach of agreement.

23. If any difference or controversy shall arise between the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury and the successful tenderer such difference or controversy shall be referred to the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Posts and Broadcasting, who will appoint a competent person to investigate and arbitrate upon the matters in dispute and the decision or award of such person shall be final and binding on the said parties. The name of the arbitrator will be communicated to the successful tenderer.

24. All notices to be served upon the successful tenderer shall be deemed to have been served if given to him or left at the address given by the tenderer in his tender.

25. Payment will be made after the supply, delivery and installation of the machinery and equipment at Radio Ceylon, Torrington Square, Colombo, and the Chief Engineer, Department of Broadcasting issues a certificate to the effect that the machinery and equipment are in a good working order and in accordance with the specifications and have been duly installed.

SCHEDULE

SPECIFICATIONS FOR SUPPLY AND ERECTION OF TWO DIESEL ENGINE DRIVEN 60 K.W. ALTERNATOR SETS AND AUXILIARIES

Diesel Engines.—The Diesel Engines shall be of the vertical four stroke high speed type approximately 1,000/1,500 R.P.M. and shall be sufficiently powerful to drive the alternators of 60 K.W. 400/416 volts 3 phase star connected 50 cycles at 0.8 power factor. The rating of the engines shall comply with B.S.S. 649 of 1949. When using any of the brands of liquid fuel marketed in this Island the engines should be capable of driving the alternator at normal full speed for

one hour when the alternator is delivering 10 per cent. more than its specified output. The engines shall be directly coupled on to the alternator.

Cooling.—The engine cooling is to be with fan and tropical radiator of sufficient capacity to cool the water so that the water temperature when the engines are working on full load does not exceed the normal temperature allowed for the sets offered. Under the contract all water pipes, together with the necessary valves, drains, pipe fittings and pumps are to be supplied and installed.

Cyclic Variation.—The engines should be of the electric lighting type with special flywheels so that cyclic irregularity shall be within the limits specified in B.S.S. 649 of 1949, for alternating generators working in parallel.

Lubrication.—Provision should be made for all moving parts to be sufficiently and automatically lubricated, whilst the engines are running. Oil cooler shall be suitable for using under tropical conditions and arrangements should be made to prevent oil or water leaking or splashing over the floor.

Governor.—The engines should be fitted with a sensitive governor capable of controlling the speed during changes on load from full load to no load within the limits laid down in B.S.S. 649 of 1949. The engines should work throughout their entire range of steady and varying load without hunting of any kind whatsoever. It should be further capable of adjustment by hand while running so that it may be reduced by at least 5 per cent. below full speed at no load and 5 per cent. above full speed at full load.

Speed Indicators.—Tachometer of suitable size and range are to be fitted to the engines to indicate the engine speed in R.P.M. The normal running speed of the engines should be clearly marked in red on the dial of the tachometers. The tachometers should preferably be geared to the crankshaft.

Thermometers.—These are to be provided to indicate the temperature of lubrication oil inlet to the engine, the outlet water temperature of the engine, and also the exhaust gas temperature from each cylinder of the engines.

Starting.—The engines should have arrangements for electrical starting with trickle charges operated from the mains for charging the batteries when the engines are not running. Under the contract the starting motors, batteries and two trickle chargers are to be supplied and installed.

Silencers.—The engines should be provided with large and efficient silencers to reduce the sound of the exhausts to a minimum. The silencers placed on rollers to be installed outside the engine room wall and the exhaust pipes from the engines to the silencers and from the silencers to a height of about a foot above the ridge of the roof is to be provided with all the necessary supports. The top of the exhaust pipes are to be fitted with a half bend turned away from the Power House, to prevent exhaust gases from soiling the roof.

Special Tools and Spanners.—One complete set of special tools and lifting tackle for the erection and dismantling of each engine is to be provided. Also one complete set of spanners to fit the nuts of each engine and alternator, together with a suitable rack for wall mounting are to be supplied and erected.

Fuel Service Tank.—One fuel service tank of approximately 60 gallons capacity is to be provided and mounted with suitable brackets for each engine. The tanks should be fitted with an easily removable dust proof cover and also have a means of visibly indicating the quantity of fuel in the tank. Adequate means are to be provided

whereby the fuel oil is thoroughly filtered before entering the service tanks and again filtered before it is delivered to any of the atomisers on the engine, such fittings should be easily removable for cleaning and inspection. All necessary fuel pipes, valves, cocks, drains, pipe supports, fittings and semirotary hand pumps are to be provided between the main storage tank, the service tanks and the engine.

Platform and ladders.—Access to all parts of the plant which are not easily reached from the floor level is to be provided by means of suitable platforms and ladders. The platforms are to be arranged at convenient heights for their respective services and are to be easily removed if required for overhauling or repairing the plant.

Alternator.—The 60 K. W. alternators should be 3 phase, 50 cycles 400/416 volts star wound, suitable for heavy unbalanced loading. The alternators should be of the screened protected rotating field type with amortisseur or damper winding and direct coupled exciter. It shall comply in all respects with B. S. S. 168 of 1936. All windings are to be specially impregnated to withstand a tropical climate with high humidity at a normal air temperature of 85°F. All cabling between generator, exciter and switch-board are to be provided. The alternators should be guaranteed not to cause any interference to broadcast transmission or reception and telephone and telegraph communication. It should operate satisfactorily, continuously in parallel with each other and all of the other engine alternator sets in the Power House under all conditions of steady and varying loads from no load to full load. The neutral point of the alternator shall be earthed through knife switch to an earth electrode having a resistance of less than one ohm.

Switch Board.—The switch board should be provided with a three phase and neutral bushars, a panel for each alternator, an adjustable synchronising panel and a feeder panel.

Each Alternator panel shall consist of the following:—

- (a) 1 (back of the board pattern) oil circuit breaker with overload trip coils (with time lag device) using current transformers and suitable for an earthed system.
- (b) 1 ammeter range 0-150 amps worked off current transformer with rotary switch to measure current in any one of the phases.
- (c) 1 intergrating KWH meter suitable for 3 phase, 4 wire, unbalanced load.
- (d) 1 volt meter range 0-600 with selector switch for reading voltages between phases.
- (e) Synchronising plug receptacles.
- (f) Field rheostat with field switch and discharge resistance for alternator exciter with hand wheels for regulating the voltage of the alternator and the following instruments:—
1 volt meter 6" dial, 1 ammeter 6" dial
1 neutral link with slot and butterfly nut for disconnection

The synchronising panel shall consist of:—

- (a) A synchroscope with two lamps at the top wired for bright synchronising.
- (b) Two volt meters, range 0-600, one for indicating running machine voltage and the other arranged to show incoming machine voltage.
- (c) A frequency meter.
- (d) A switch to cut off the synchroscope when not wanted.

The feeder panel shall consist of:—

- (a) One oil circuit breaker.
- (b) One ammeter, range 0-300, with rotary switch to measure current in any one phase.

Except synchronising wires, all pressure leads to the switchboard instruments shall be connected between the outgoing terminals of the circuit breaker and the isolating switch, so that the alternator and the connecting cables are completely isolated for testing purposes when the circuit breaker is switched off and the neutral link removed. All instruments shall comply with B.S.S. 89 of 1937, all switch gear shall comply with B.S.S. 116 of 1937, in the case of oil circuit breakers, and B.S.S. 862 of 1939, in the case of air circuit breakers.

Foundations and Trenches.—The tenderer shall provide for concrete foundations utilizing the approved brands of cement with necessary bolts, plates, &c., for the plant offered to suit the nature of the ground at site. The contractor must take full responsibility for the size and strength of the foundations, foundation bolts, and engine bed-plates for a period of three years from the date of test and rectify, at his own expense, and defects that may disclose themselves during this period. The floor round the engine must be separated from the rest of the floor by 1" gap which should be filled with a mixture of pitch and sand to avoid the transmission of vibrations to the Power House. The engines must be capable of running at normal full speed at any condition of steady or varying load without transmitting any undue vibrations to the surroundings and the critical speed must be well above normal speed. Trenches should be of adequate size to accommodate water pipes, oil pipes, exhaust pipes, electrical cables, &c., and well drained. The sides should be built in brickwork in cement and covered with checker plates fitted into cast iron curbs laid firm to the concrete floor. Trenches running across walls should be provided with adequate recess with reinforced concrete lintels where necessary.

Spare.—A comprehensive list of standard spares and accessories supplied with and forming part and parcel of the diesel engine alternator sets should be given with tender. It should be understood that a sufficient stock of essential spares is to be provided for three years normal running of the plant at 10 hours per day. If therefore spares listed below are insufficient the tenderer is to submit an amended list

Tests after Erection.—The contractor shall provide all apparatus artificial load, instruments, fuels lubricants, &c., and carry out the following tests in the presence of the Engineer.

- (1) General examination of the plant and equipment.
- (2) Preliminary run for a few hours of the generating sets at full load.
- (3) Fuel oil consumption, lubricating oil consumption and temperature tests on the generator set which is to be run for six hours at full load followed by 10 per cent. overload for one hour and one hour run at $\frac{3}{4}$ load and one hour run at $\frac{1}{2}$ load respectively.
- (4) Tests of parallel operation of the generating set.
- (5) Speed regulation and voltage regulation tests.
- (6) Insulation and other tests as may be required.
- (7) Usual temperature and operating tests on water cooling auxiliary plants

The contractor must supply duplicate copies of duly certified results of tests carried out by the manufacturer. Should the whole plant or part of it fail under test, the test will be repeated within one month. Should the test results fall short of the guaranteed figures, the Engineer shall be at liberty to reject such portion of the plant or in the alternative assess the losses to the buyer in consequence and the contractor shall make good the loss. In assessing the cost of extra fuel and lubricating oil consumption the Engineer will base his calculations on the assumption that the engine will run continuously for six years for 8 hours daily, i.e. 2 hours on full load, 2 hours on $\frac{3}{4}$ load, 2 hours on $\frac{1}{2}$ loads, and 2 hours on $\frac{1}{4}$ load. The cost of fuel and lubricating oil will be based on prices at which they are delivered at the Power Station at the time of assessment.

Drawings.—Tenderers should furnish in their drawings sufficient detail showing the layout of the plant in plan or elevation including details of dimensions, fuel service system, all trenches and piping, switch board and details thereof, and water cooling system including layout. The successful tenderer shall submit three further sets of his tender drawings for inclusion with the contract documents. The contractor shall also submit three sets of the followings—

- (a) Drawing showing in sections the internal parts of the engine and governor, fuel pipes, lubricating oil pipes, circulating water pipes.
- (b) Printed instruction for the operation, maintenance and repair of the engine set.
- (c) Assembly and erection drawing.
- (d) Switch board wiring diagram.
